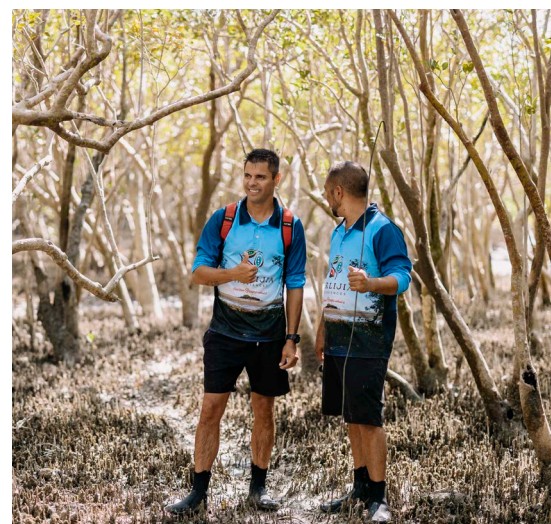
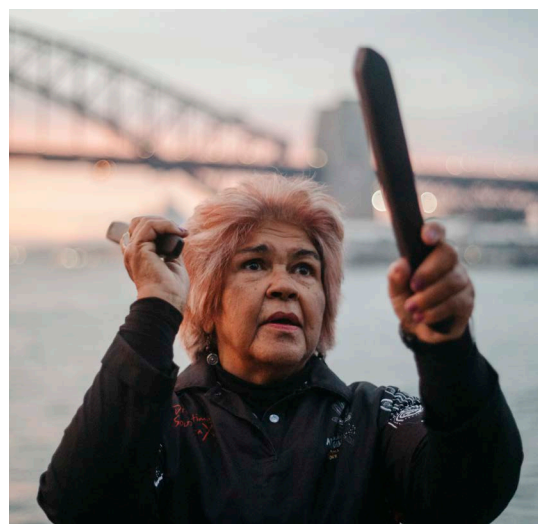
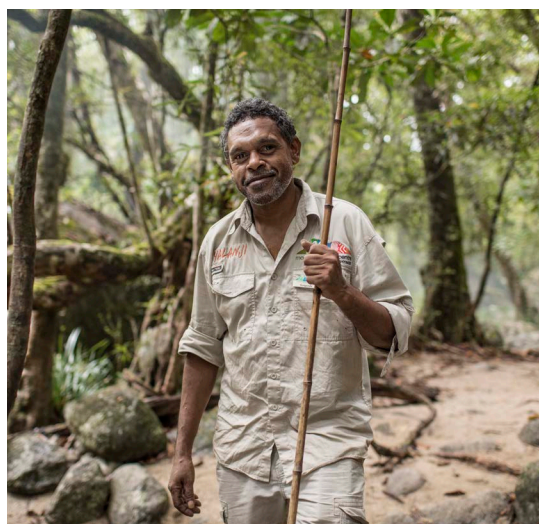

Whilst the following themes preview the range of activities on offer, it is worth noting that all operators are able to cater to specific guest requirements, including tailor-made experiences and private tours.



Adventure North Australia, QLD



Voyages Indigenous Tourism Australia – Mossman Gorge Cultural Centre, QLD

Nature and Wildlife Experiences

View Australia's distinctive landscapes through different eyes, helping you gain a deeper appreciation of the natural environment and the nation's unique wildlife – and enjoy great fishing!

Sample highlights: Near the Great Ocean Road in Victoria, you can take an Aboriginal-guided tour with Worn Gundidj @ Tower Hill to discover a nature reserve inside a dormant volcano where kangaroos, wallabies, emus, koalas, echidnas and hundreds of bird species roam freely. Alternatively, explore lush, fertile wetlands in the heart of Kakadu National Park in the Northern Territory with Djabulukgu Association – Kakadu Cultural Tours to see crocodiles and colourful birdlife and discover the traditional uses for plants and animals. In New South Wales, Wiradjuri man Mark Saddler brings the magnificent landscapes of the Riverina region to life on his suite of Bundy Cultural Tours. Spot kangaroos and other native wildlife as you explore sites of cultural significance. And in Tropical North Queensland, the well-camouflaged critters of the lush Daintree Rainforest are best spotted with the help of Indigenous guides. On a Dreamtime Walk run by the Mossman Gorge Cultural Centre, you might be lucky enough to admire a beautiful Boyd's forest dragon.



Koomal Dreaming, WA

Culinary Experiences

Guided bush tucker walks reveal the surprising fecundity of the Australian landscape, while outback dining, infused with the unique flavours of the Australian bush, offers a deliciously immersive experience. Alternatively, try your hand at traditional hunting.

Sample highlights: Join an immersive exploration with Walkabout Cultural Adventures in Tropical North Queensland, where a Kuku Yalanji guide – whose ancestors have lived in the region for tens of thousands of years – will take you on a deeply personal tour. Or join Wadandi man, Josh Whiteland, from Koomal Dreaming on one of his immersive tours in Western Australia's Margaret River region and forage for bush tucker such as saltbush and bush celery along the Cape to Cape walking track. On the New South Wales Central Coast, take an alternative winery tour with respected Elder Kevin 'Gavi' Duncan from Firescreek Botanical Winery Aboriginal Experiences. Taste native flora and learn about local Aboriginal culture before sampling the botanical winery's distinctive beverages. Or try your luck catching one of the Northern Territory's famed barramundi on a fishing tour with Kakadu Tourism.

Active Adventures

You'll find a wide selection of exhilarating experiences on offer in Australia's beautiful landscapes, from paddling, quad biking and hiking to 4WD adventures and a bridge climb with a difference.

Sample highlights: Perhaps you'd care to enjoy an inspiring four-day, three-night Aboriginal-guided wukalina Walk along the white sand beaches of Irapuna (Bay of Fires) and wukalina (Mount William) in north-eastern Tasmania/Lutruwita staying in domed huts inspired by the traditional homes of the palawa people, Tasmania/Lutruwita's Traditional Custodians. Or maybe you'll take a tailor-made safari with Lords Kakadu & Arnhemland Safaris to explore some of the Northern Territory's towering red escarpments, dramatic waterfalls and expansive wetlands, as well as discover remarkable rock art. In New South Wales, explore Aboriginal connections to the Coffs Coast on a thrilling cultural paddle along culturally significant waterways with Wajaana Yaam Gumbaynggirr Adventure Tours, or scale Sydney Harbour Bridge in the company of an Aboriginal storyteller on the Burrawa Indigenous Climb Experience, which reveals glimpses of sacred sites and fascinating insights into the Aboriginal significance of the city.

Art and Museum Experiences

Explore Australia's excellent Aboriginal art galleries and museums, visit ancient rock art sites offering profound insights into Dreaming stories, or take part in artist-led workshops in contemporary art practice. All help you understand the fundamental role of art in the transmission of culture.

Sample highlights: Join a Maruku Arts dot-painting workshop at Ayers Rock Resort in Australia's spectacular Red Centre to learn about Tjurkurpa Creation symbols, and then paint your own Creation story. Visit some of the finest rock art galleries in the world with Davidson's Arnhemland Safaris in the Top End of the Northern Territory and learn about the distinctive screen-printing techniques used by the artisans of the Tiwi Islands on SeaLink NT's Tiwi by Design tour. Or take an interactive tour of Waringarri Aboriginal Arts & Tours, a creative hub in Western Australia's Kimberley region where local artisans also guide you into the epic landscapes that inspire their works. You can also explore one of the world's most significant First Nations collections at the Australian Museum in Sydney/Warrane and admire ever-changing First Nations art exhibitions at the Koorie Heritage Trust in Melbourne/Narrm.

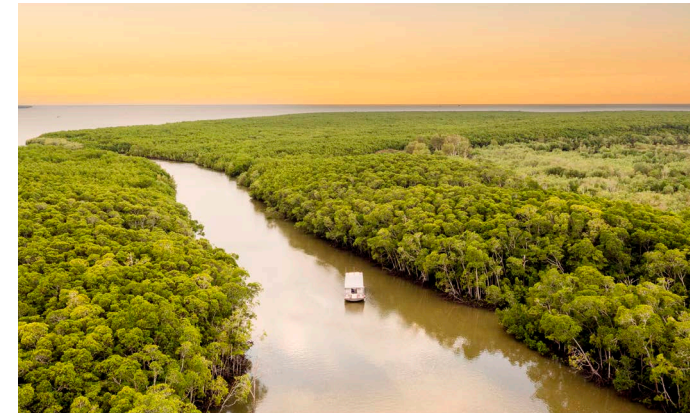


Venture North Safaris, NT

Immersive Journeys

Go off the beaten track and you'll soon learn that there is not one, but many Aboriginal cultures, each with its own language, belief system and powerful connection to place. On an immersive journey, you'll gain both insight into the world's oldest living cultures and an understanding of Aboriginal spirituality and connection to Country.

Sample highlights: Make a deep connection with the Yuin people of the New South Wales South Coast through Ngaran Ngaran Culture Awareness, which shares sacred ceremonies, ancient stories and traditional dancing. Join a multi-day 4WD adventure in the Northern Territory with Venture North Safaris. On your journey from Darwin/Gulumerrdgen to the Cobourg Peninsula, one of Australia's wildest corners, you'll visit one of Arnhem Land's most significant rock art sites with an Aboriginal guide. It's impossible not to feel moved by the spirituality of this sacred place as you learn about how this spectacular landscape has sustained the Aboriginal communities of the Gunbalanya region for millennia.



Mandingalbay Ancient Indigenous Tours, QLD

Coastal and Aquatic Experiences

Aboriginal cultures are not only connected with the outback but also with Australia's spectacular coastal regions. Sail, fish, search for mud crabs, snorkel, kayak and swim in beautiful beaches and aquamarine waterways.

Sample highlights: Discover the Creation story of the Great Barrier Reef with Dreamtime Dive & Snorkel's Indigenous sea rangers. They will also guide you on a snorkel tour to better understand the ancient relationship between humankind and marine life. Also departing from Cairns/Gimuy in Tropical North Queensland, cultural tours with Mandingalbay Ancient Indigenous Tours begin with a scenic cruise to Mandingalbay Yidinji Country, where you will experience the ultimate taste of local traditions. Further south, forge a new connection to Queensland's Sunshine Coast as you cruise the serene Mooloolah River on a century-old sailing boat with Indigenous owned and operated Saltwater Eco Tours. Go on a kayaking adventure with Wula Gura Nyinda Eco Cultural Adventures to explore Gutharraguda (the Aboriginal name for UNESCO World Heritage-listed Shark Bay in Western Australia) to learn how the Country talks to you. Or hop on a quad bike with Sand Dune Adventures in Port Stephens, New South Wales, and dig for fresh water, discover Aboriginal midden shell sites, and ride the Worimi sand dunes – the longest moving coastal sand dunes in the Southern Hemisphere.



Kingfisher Tours, WA

Bush & Outback Adventures

The Australian outback is a wild, ancient place. With an Aboriginal guide, explore working cattle stations, outback gorges, ancient rock art galleries and waterholes, and learn about the bounties a seemingly barren desert can provide.

Sample highlights: After you've explored the famous sites at Uluru-Kata Tjuta National Park, go deep into the heart of the Red Centre with SEIT Outback Australia and join the traditional Uluru family in their homelands. On a Karrke Aboriginal Cultural Experience & Tours experience in the Northern Territory's Watarrka National Park, you can immerse yourself in the Luritja and Pertame language and culture. Discover native foods such as bush plum and honey ants, learn more about dot painting and see how mulga wood can be transformed into weapons and artefacts during this hands-on one-hour experience. You can also explore the far reaches of Western Australia's breathtaking Kimberley region with Kingfisher Tours, which whisks guests to remote attractions – including World Heritage-listed Purnululu National Park and its famous Bungle Bungle Range – by plane, with ground tours led by Aboriginal guides.

Exclusive Accommodation

When you want to immerse yourself fully in Australia's remarkable and remote landscapes, unique Aboriginal-owned accommodations, including wilderness retreats, safari tents and architecturally designed huts make your experience all the more special.

Sample highlights: In the heart of the traditional homeland of the Adnyamathanha (Yura) people in the spectacular Ikara-Flinders Ranges National Park in South Australia, Wilpena Pound Resort is set inside an extraordinary 800-million-year-old natural amphitheatre and offers 'glamping' safari tents as well as hotel rooms and camping. Then there's Davidson's Arnhemland Safaris' remote wilderness lodge nestled against the majestic Arnhem Land escarpment in the Northern Territory's Top End – the perfect place to unplug and reconnect with nature while exploring the Aboriginal cultural landscape surrounding the ecolodge. And on the transformative Aboriginal-guided wukalina Walk in Tasmania/lutruwita, you'll spend the first two nights in architect-designed huts inspired by the half-dome shelters traditionally used by palawa people, the state's Traditional Custodians.



Burrawa Indigenous Climb Experience, NSW

Urban Culture Experiences

Aboriginal cultures also thrive in Australia's urban centres, with walking tours as well as museums, galleries and cultural centres offering easily accessible ways to connect with Indigenous cultures.

Sample highlights: Enjoy an Aboriginal Heritage Walk in the Royal Botanic Gardens Melbourne, be immersed in Aboriginal histories and cultures at the Aboriginal Dinner Show hosted by Spirits of the Red Sand on the Gold Coast, or explore the fascinating First Nations collection at the Australian Museum in Sydney/Warrane. You may also wish to embark on a coastal journey with Dreamtime Southern X, where the spiritual significance of the New South Wales's capital's famous harbour is revealed on a stunningly intimate walking tour. Or ascend the Sydney Harbour Bridge accompanied by an Aboriginal storyteller on the Burrawa Indigenous Climb Experience, learning about the city's lesser-known history en route. It's not just the big cities where you can discover Aboriginal cultures in an urban environment. Yawuru man Bart Pigram offers a walking tour of historic Broome's mangroves and mudflats, highlighting the impact this unique ecosystem had on the history and settlement of this dynamic pearling town.

AUSTRALIAN MUSEUM

The First Nations collection showcases the richness and diversity of Indigenous Australia. Enjoy the interactive experience with a personalised guided tour of the diverse beliefs and lifestyles of Australia's First Peoples.



Learn about the beliefs and lifestyles of the world's oldest living cultures, in the country's oldest museum, with a personalised guided tour of the First Nations collection at the Australian Museum in the heart of Sydney/Warrane.

In one of the largest collections of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander artefacts, the museum provides custodial care to more than 20,000 Indigenous Australian body ornaments, tools, bark paintings, toys and contemporary art and sculpture from across the country. Located on the ground floor of the museum, the First Nations collection showcases a changing selection of the extensive holdings that also include stories, voice recordings and photographs that chronicle the diversity of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander cultures, from pre-European times to today.

The collection includes breadmaking tools dated to more than 32,000 years old. Marvel at how new materials were incorporated into cultural objects and their production, such as the glass and ceramic spear tips made from telegraph-line insulators found in the Kimberley. Other highlights include contemporary paintings and woven fish traps, as well as pearl shell ornaments that the women of Tasmania still collect and make today. There are also intricately woven baskets, art made from ghost fishing nets, exquisite shell jewellery, drums, canoes and tools for hunting and fishing.

BUNDYI CULTURAL TOURS



Look, smell, touch and taste your way around Wagga Wagga in the Riverina region of south-west New South Wales, discovering Wiradjuri Country and culture with Bundyi Cultural Tours. Immersive and fully customisable, each tour explores ancient sites and traditions, with eye-opening stories provided by guide and Wiradjuri man Mark Saddler.

Exploring by vehicle, motorbike, or on foot, every tour around Wagga Wagga is different with Bundyi Cultural Tours – the company’s owner and guide, Wiradjuri man Mark Saddler, tailors the specific locations you visit, and the stories you hear, to your interests. Mark knows the secrets of this land, and his encyclopaedic knowledge extends from bush foods to ancient medicines, to the relationship Aboriginal communities had with early colonial settlers.

Bundyi offers customisable packages ranging from a couple of hours to a full day. The two-hour Aboriginal Walkabout Tour is an easy stroll around Wagga Wagga and along the Murrumbidgee River, visiting Wiradjuri cultural sites, learning the language and discovering the town’s history. The four-hour Aboriginal Special Places Tour includes a similar walk, before Mark drives you to Galore

Hill Scenic Reserve for morning tea featuring native ingredients, accompanied by stories about bushrangers and “scar trees”.
The six-hour Aboriginal Cultural Tour: Taste of Wiradjuri experience extends the above further, visiting The Rock Nature Reserve – Kengal Aboriginal Place, a spiritual Dreaming and ceremonial site for the Wiradjuri. You’ll also stop at Marrambidya Wetland, a 20-hectare reserve home to all manner of native plants and animals. A barbecue lunch is included.
If you have a full day, join the Wiradjuri Culture & Winery Private Tour, for groups of up to ten people in a small luxury vehicle. The experience covers destinations of your choice, followed by lunch and a visit to the Courabyra Wines estate. Larger groups of up to 20 people can book the same tour, transported by bus.

BURRAWA INDIGENOUS CLIMB EXPERIENCE

See Australia’s largest city through Indigenous eyes on the Burrawa Indigenous Climb Experience. Glimpse historic and sacred sites and hear riveting Dreaming tales as you climb 134 metres above the glittering blue waters of Sydney Harbour in the company of an Aboriginal storyteller.



Ascending Sydney Harbour Bridge is a thrill, whichever tour you choose. It’s particularly exhilarating to scale the landmark with an Aboriginal storyteller. Held every Wednesday and Saturday, the three-hour Burrawa Climb ascends to the peak of ‘The Coathanger’ (as it’s known to locals) along BridgeClimb Sydney’s classic Summit Climb Route. Expect 1,332 steps there and back – not that you’ll notice, given the insightful stories shared by your guide, revealing sites significant to Australia’s Indigenous communities, both pre- and post-colonisation.

Discover where three-metre-high middens (ancient shell piles) once stood and communicated their message of intergenerational conservation, on the site now occupied by Sydney Opera House. Learn about hidden Indigenous art in Tallawoladah (The Rocks). Glimpse Kai’yamay (Manly Cove), where 18th-century Wangal man

Woollarawarre Bennelong was recruited to become a mediator and interpreter for the state’s founding governor, Arthur Phillip. Marvel at the Barangaroo precinct, named after a Cammeraygal woman and powerful leader of the Eora Nation, the Aboriginal clans of the Sydney area, during the time of European colonisation. Then look down on the shores where Patyegarang (Australia’s first Aboriginal language teacher) instructed botanist and explorer William Dawes on the language of Sydney/Warrane.

When you reach the top, you’ll understand how the climb got its name: Burrawa means ‘above’ or ‘upwards’ in the Eora languages. Back at ground level, you’ll see Sydney in a fresh light and carry with you a newfound appreciation for the city. You’ll also leave with a commemorative certificate and Burrawa hat to remind you of your sky-high survey of Australia’s long and nuanced history.

Delve deep into the bush tucker, medicines, music and Dreaming stories of the New South Wales Central Coast on a winery tour with a difference. Led by a respected Elder, the Firescreek Winery Aboriginal Storytelling and Wine Tasting Experience offers a unique sensory window into local Aboriginal history and culture.

Kevin ‘Gavi’ Duncan is not only one of the state’s most talented didgeridoo players; the respected Elder also has a passion for native flora and fauna, as you’ll discover on his 1.5-hour tour.

This delicious adventure is held on the lush grounds of Firescreek Botanical Winery in Holgate, where gardens are planted with everything from native Davidson plums and lemon myrtle to riberry and mountain pepper. This flora has been used by Australia’s Indigenous communities for millennia, as a source of nutrition and medicine. Botanicals grown on the estate infuse many of the winery’s distinctive drinks, which you’ll sample on a guided flight with Firescreek’s winemaker at the end of the tour – think chilli-citrus or elderberry wine.

Gavi’s coolamon (a traditional carrying vessel carved from wood) is stocked with seasonal bush tucker, which you’ll taste while he pulls out his collection of Aboriginal tools, artefacts, and instruments including his clapsticks and didgeridoo. Gavi’s haunting performance speaks of Dreaming stories passed down through many generations.

This is a hands-on experience, with guests encouraged to get involved playing instruments, learning how tools were made, sampling native sarsaparilla and lilly pilly, and asking as many questions of Gavi as possible. No topic is off-limits in conversation here, with your host willing to share his own tales of growing up on the land, and the experiences his Elders encountered over the decades. You’ll quickly discover Gavi is as adept at storytelling as he is at playing the ‘didge’.

You'll be taken on a cultural journey as owner and Gumbaynggirr/Bundjalung man Clark Webb, or one of his fellow Aboriginal guides, showcases the Gumbaynggirr language, bush tucker and location-specific Dreaming stories.

Half-day SUP tours (2.5 hours) depart from one of three locations within the Solitary Islands Marine Park (the Moonee, Coffs or Red Rock Creeks). Your experience begins with a Welcome to Country, then qualified instructors provide a SUP lesson before you set off (with kayaks also available for those who aren't comfortable on a SUP). As you bask in the extraordinary beauty of Gumbaynggirr Country's landscapes, your guide will point out sites of cultural significance, share related Dreaming

stories and collect bush tucker delicacies to sample along the way. You'll also learn some Gumbaynggirr words and phrases as guides identify marine life and animals you spot while you paddle.

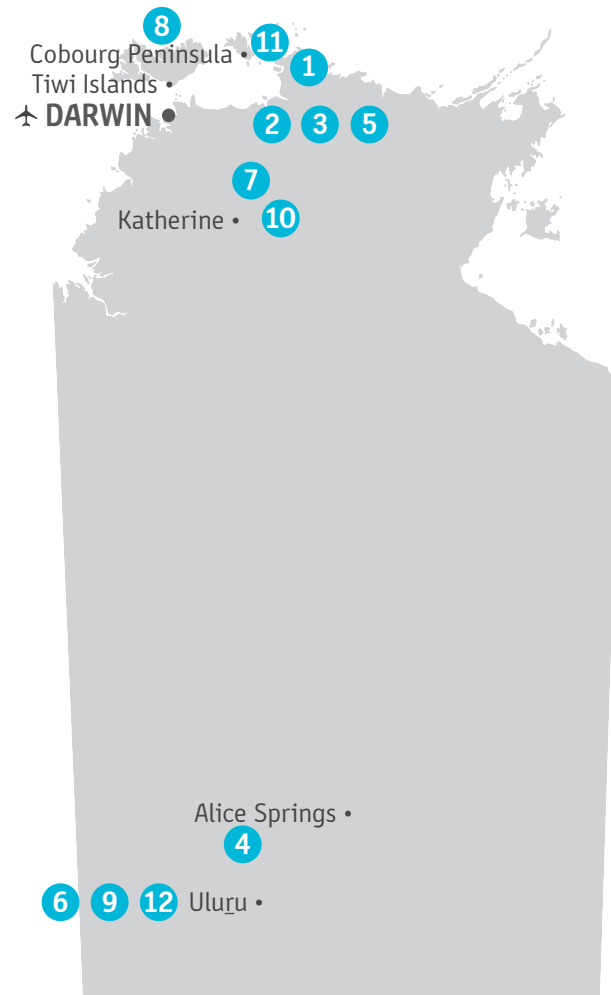

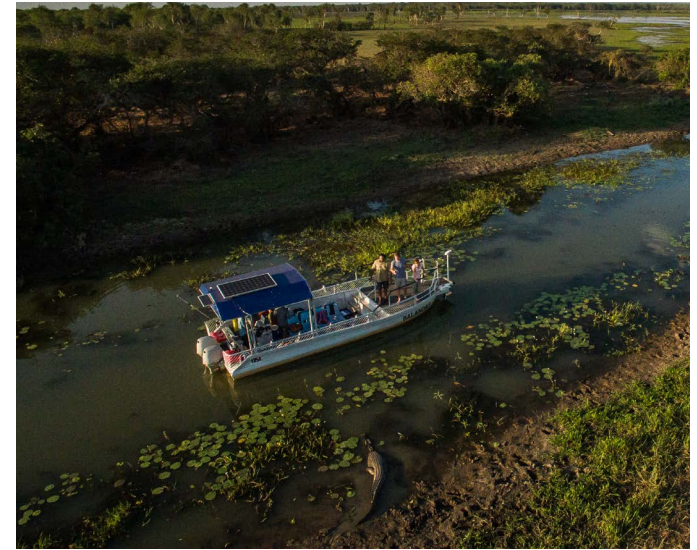

Christine and Peter manage to pack a lot into an hour. You'll be introduced to native foods such as bush tomato, bush plum, wild fig, bush bananas, wild onions and native bush peach (quandong), as well as honey ants and witchetty grubs.

Learn how Aboriginal peoples look at acacia roots to judge whether witchetty grubs are present, and how a grinding rock and grinding stone are important tools for turning plants such as rock fuchsia and emu bush into bush medicine.

Discover the significance of dot painting, and why it is still such an important medium through which Central Australian desert people tell their stories. And see how mulga wood is shaped into weapons such as spears and hunting clubs, and artefacts such as the multipurpose No.7 boomerang. Don't expect to throw it and see it come back – like all boomerangs in this region, it's the non-returning type. But it does have numerous uses, and is invaluable not just as a hunting weapon, but as a ceremonial clapstick and as a tool to tend campsite fires.

The experience is very hands-on, with the chance to touch and experience plants and artefacts for yourself, as well as ask as many questions as you like about how people have thrived for tens of thousands of years in this extreme but often bountiful Central Australian landscape.

CULTURE CONNECT AUSTRALIA

Culture Connect provides small-group tours that depart from Cooktown, Cairns and Port Douglas and last from half-a-day to two days. They can tailor tours that draw on a network of Indigenous operators and rangers throughout the Tropical North Queensland region. Rock-art enthusiasts, for instance, can tailor a Normanby tour that gives them more time and access to otherwise-unseen galleries.



Culture Connect offers visitors wonderful ways to connect with the region's ancient Indigenous cultures. The two most popular ways to visit the 31,000-hectare Normanby Station are on Culture Connect's half-day Aboriginal Rock Art Experience and the 4WD Aboriginal Rock Art and Ranger full-day tour (both depart Cooktown three times a week from April to November). At the station, you'll meet the Harrigan family, born and bred cattlemen who are the Traditional Owners of these Balnggarrawarra homelands. After walking beside a creek with the Harrigan brothers, guests come upon several galleries of rock art. One features animals such as turtles, dingoes and barramundi. Photography isn't permitted in some galleries, so guests

are often surprised when seeing the artwork for the first time. The full-day tour also includes learning about the station's Indigenous ranger program that prevents soil eroding into a river system that connects with the Great Barrier Reef.

DREAMTIME DIVE & SNORKEL

Queensland’s Dreamtime Dive & Snorkel experience offers guests a rare opportunity to explore the Great Barrier Reef accompanied by Aboriginal guides from the region. Departing from Cairns/Gimuy, guests enjoy a day-long adventure, embarking on guided snorkel tours and learning about the ancient relationships between humans, marine creatures and the ecosystem they’ve shared for tens of thousands of years.



Dreamtime Dive & Snorkel combines a full-day Great Barrier Reef cruise with Indigenous cultural storytelling from Traditional Owners with historical connections to the sea country visited. The cruise offers a rare educational opportunity to explore the reef with Traditional Owners whose north Queensland sea country stretches from the Frankland Islands to Port Douglas.

Rangers from four Traditional Owner groups, the Gimuy Walubara Yidinji, Gunggandji, Mandingalbay and Yirrganydji people, as well as Torres Strait Islanders, help guests gain a deeper understanding of their traditional and cultural values in a relaxed, fun atmosphere. The land on which Cairns is situated was originally home to the Yirrganydji people. Historically they are rainforest and coastal dwellers with an intimate knowledge of their lands and waters, utilising resources from both environments for food, clothing and essential needs.

On the way to visiting two outer reef sites, Dreamtime Indigenous rangers welcome guests to the Sea Country and share Dreamtime

stories including the Great Barrier Reef Creation story. The Gimuy Walubara Yidinji Dreamtime story tells of a hunter spearing a sacred stingray which infuriated the spirit of the ocean. The sacred stingray flapped its wings making big waves and strong winds causing the sea to rise, and the spirit of the ocean unleashed a ferocious storm that threatened to wipe out the hunter’s tribe. His people heated up big rocks with fire and rolled these into the ocean which formed a barrier to appease the spirit who subsequently calmed the sea. The Great Barrier Reef was thus born. Rangers take guests on guided snorkel tours through waters their hunter-gatherer ancestors knew intimately, through foraging for barramundi and bream, catfish and cod, periwinkles and prawns. Guests learn about the ancient relationships between man, marine creatures and the ecosystem they’ve shared for tens of thousands of years. After a full day of water activities on the reef, a cultural performance showcases Dreamtime stories as Calypso XII steams back to Cairns.

FLAMES OF THE FOREST

A high-end dining experience, a unique insight into Aboriginal cultures and a magical setting in an ancient rainforest is a combination that results in an unforgettable evening in Tropical Far North Queensland. An opportunity to immerse yourself in the traditional grounds of the Kuku Yalanji, whilst connected to Country through storytelling, didgeridoo and song.



The Flames of the Forest Aboriginal Cultural Experience involves heading into the World Heritage-listed Wet Tropics rainforest for a seven-dish banquet dinner served under a silk canopy illuminated by hand-made crystal chandeliers. Cultural experiences are interwoven with the dinner, as your Kuku Yalanji hosts share music, ceremony and storytelling, as well as inviting guests to spend some time sitting quietly, listening to the sounds of the rainforest at night. The food is modern Australian, locally sourced where possible, and features plenty of bush tucker ingredients. Numbers are limited to 60, to ensure an intimate atmosphere and facilitate personal connections with your Kuku Yalanji hosts. It all adds up to an extraordinary experience.

After being picked from your Port Douglas hotel, it's a short transfer to your rainforest destination. Follow the flame-lit path to the alfresco pre-dinner drinks area for canapés and sparkling wine, before one of your Kuku Yalanji hosts welcomes you in the local language and invites you into the forest to eat. Drinks – including Australian wines – accompany the six-course dinner, which is interspersed with music and storytelling, including a fascinating insight into one of the world's oldest woodwind instrument, the didgeridoo, how it arrived in North Queensland and its cultural significance to the Kuku Yalanji people. The whole experience lasts three hours (plus transfers), which the organisers describe as 30 per cent rainforest, 30 per cent food, 30 per cent culture and 10 per cent imagination.

There is also the opportunity to meet the resident artist and understand cultural and artistic learnings and themes, something that is thoroughly enjoyed by locals and international visitors alike.

Aboriginal owned and operated Mandingalbay Ancient Indigenous Tours takes you on a deep dive into the culture of the Mandingalbay Yidinji, whose traditional lands east of Cairns/Gimuy straddle two World Heritage Sites: the Great Barrier Reef and the Wet Tropics of Queensland. Experiences are hosted by Traditional Owners who regale you with millennia-old stories passed down through generations, on experiences like the three-hour Hands On Country Eco Tour, which includes all transport, Indigenous guides, an immersive Welcome to Country ceremony, morning tea and interactive experiences.

The Deadly After Dark – Sunset, Canapes and Culture experience dishes up traditional foods on a tasty plate. Over two hours, guests are escorted to a dreamy waterside locale where a feast of native Australian flavours steals the show. Think smoked crocodile; green-ant salmon gravlax; or mud crab and barramundi steamed in banana leaves.

The experience also includes boat transfers to the dining destination. A three-hour, four-course Deadly Dinner experience is also available for groups.

The 2 Day Camping experience takes you even deeper into the rainforest, offering access to off-the-radar sacred sites and foraging for bush tucker and traditional medicines, followed by storytelling, food and fun around the campfire before you settle in to your tent with an airbed and linen. After a hearty breakfast, morning activities could include learning how to trap fish.

Each experience is intimate and immersive, offering memorable insights into the cultures and traditions of Indigenous communities from this corner of Tropical North Queensland, where freshwater meets salt, and the rainforest meets the sand.

WUKALINA WALK



This 4-day/3-night fully accommodated Aboriginal owned and guided hiking and cultural experience takes place within the magnificent landscape of wukalina (Mt William National Park) and larapuna (Bay of Fires) in North-East lutruwita (Tasmania). Enjoy innovative world-class accommodation, traditional foods, and cultural interpretation as you walk palawa Country.

palawa culture and heritage are distinctly different from Australia's many Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander cultures. We are the First Nations peoples of lutruwita and wukalina Walk is our invitation for you to walk with us and learn about us.

The walk takes place within wukalina (Mt William National Park) and larapuna (Bay of Fires) on the North-East coast of lutruwita (Tasmania). We have belonged to this place for thousands of generations. Our traditional homeland – that of the Trulwulway people of the North East nation – stretches out over the muka (sea) to tayaritja (the Furneaux Islands).

This journey will deepen your understanding of not only our history as palawa but who we are today. The award-winning experience represents self-determination and community resilience.

wukalina Walk involves two main days of hiking and a day dedicated to sharing some of the cultural practices that connect us to our Ancestors, such as shell-stringing and clapstick making.

You will be well fed and will sleep in comfort. First, at our purpose-built coastal standing camp called krakani lumi (resting place) in timber pavilions inspired by the homes of our Old People. The last night is in a beautifully renovated lightkeepers cottage.

Visitors looking to experience Aboriginal Australia within an urban setting should look no further than Melbourne/Narrm’s Koorie Heritage Trust. With a prominent location at Federation Square in the heart of the city, they offer several ways to gain insight into how Aboriginal peoples in Victoria once practised their cultures and how they continue to keep it alive today.

Drop in to browse the museum-style collection, which includes oral histories, photography, historic and contemporary art, objects such as boomerangs, possum skin cloaks and eel traps, and ancient stone tools. The trust also offers incredibly informative walking tours, led by an Indigenous guide who shares not only the city’s Aboriginal history, but something of their own story, too.

The one-hour Birrarung Wilam (River Camp) Walk heads from Federation Square to the banks of the Yarra River. Rob Hyatt, the trust’s cultural education manager, says, “When we walk alongside the river, we talk about its history, what the traditional landscape looked like and how Aboriginal peoples lived in the area, the impact of colonisation on the land itself and on the people.” Walkers continue to the Birrarung Wilam art installation that celebrates the physical and spiritual connection between Indigenous peoples and place.

The longer Scar Tree Walk (1.5 to two hours) includes this route, then continues to the William Barak Bridge that connects Birrarung Marr (an 8.3-hectare park) and Yarra Park. Barak, born into the Wurundjeri clan, was a 19th-century leader and artist who worked to bridge the divide between European settlers and the country’s original inhabitants. “He was probably one of Australia’s first Aboriginal activists.”

At the Melbourne Cricket Ground, known as the MCG, participants will see the scar trees, a culturally protected site and remnants of Aboriginal occupation prior to Europeans arriving in the Melbourne area. The area was traditionally a ceremonial ground and Aboriginal Elders still practise ceremony at the MCG during major events such as the AFL grand final with a Welcome to Country.

One of the ways to experience the continuation of the First Peoples’ living cultures is through the Aboriginal Heritage Tours, walks and interpretation of the site.



Enjoy an authentic Aboriginal experience in the beautiful Royal Botanic Gardens Melbourne, just minutes from the centre of Melbourne/Narrm.

Aboriginal guides will take you on a journey through the gardens, incorporating the themes of spirit, connection and land. Learn about the stories and cultures of the oldest continuous civilisation on earth, along with the plant lore of traditional foods and medicine, tools and ceremony on this award-winning tour.

Royal Botanic Gardens Melbourne offers a picturesque setting of 38 hectares within walking distance of the city for you to visit and discover over 50,000 species of plants from around the world.

WORN GUNDIDJ @ TOWER HILL



Tower Hill offers an opportunity to see Australia’s iconic wildlife roaming free in a natural bush setting. Tours cover the park’s history, the unique revegetation project, Indigenous cultures and practices, and tastings of bush foods and plants growing in the reserve. This is a unique Australian experience.



Worn Gundidj @ Tower Hill conducts guided tours from the Visitor Centre located in the heart of the Tower Hill Wildlife Reserve. This reserve is a dormant volcano, being one of the world’s largest examples of a nested maar, comprising a series of scoria cones located inside the main crater, and surrounded by an extensive lake and wetland system.

Having been completely revegetated commencing in the 1960s, the reserve is now home to many of Australia’s iconic animals – kangaroos, wallabies, emus, koalas and echidnas, as well as a wide range of reptiles, and up to 200 species of birds.

Our tours provide the visitor with a wealth of information in relation to the history of the Reserve, both pre and post European settlement.

The Visitor Centre has a wide range of Indigenous artefacts, and our tours include the opportunity to learn about and handle these tools and implements.

Our guides are versed in the history and culture of the land’s original Indigenous inhabitants, and have a wealth of knowledge about the flora and fauna to be found in the reserve. Lasting for 2 hours, the tours include a guided walk through a section of the reserve that is home to many bush food plants, as well as many of the free-roaming wildlife species.

Our tours can be tailored to suit the needs of individuals and groups, and whatever options are chosen, the visitor is guaranteed a unique insight into Australia’s rich history, cultures and natural environment.

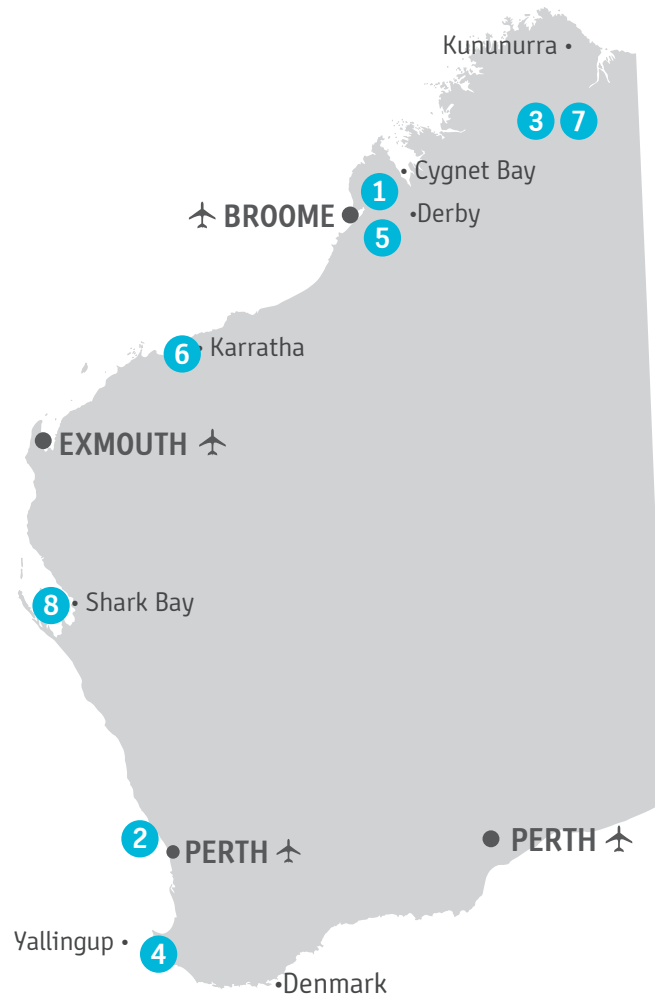

BORRGORON COAST TO CREEK TOURS



Come for a walk with an Aboriginal Custodian and find yourself immersed in a hands-on exploration of Bardi Jawi Country. Terry Hunter's Borrgoron Coast to Creek Tours unfurl the treasures of Western Australia's beguiling Kimberley coast, from its resource-rich mangroves and beaches, to the highs and lows of the region's pearling history.

Borrgoron Coast to Creek Tours offers a fascinating opportunity to discover how the Bardi Jawi people of Western Australia's Dampier Peninsula have lived in harmony with the ruggedly beautiful landscape for millennia. The signature tour is led by Bardi man Terry Hunter, who has lived on Cygnet Bay Pearl Farm, 220km north of Broome/Rubibi, for most of his life. Terry knows this corner of the Kimberley region like the back of his hand, and his walking tour combines stories of his childhood exploring the remote bay, the teachings of Aboriginal cultures and bush knowledge, and reveals how his family history is tied to the pioneering beginnings of the region's pearl trade.

Terry's two-hour coastal walk begins in the shade of the pearl farm's tropical gardens, where he explains how the Hunter name came about

and sheds light on the practice of "blackbirding" – slave labour utilised by early pearlers. He leads guests to beach flats, where a freshwater spring bubbles up at low tide, and invites everyone to drink. Next, Bardi-style cooking of oysters still on the rocks, a myth-busting session about his peoples' culture, an art lesson on pearl-shell carving and even talk of the marine biology projects underway on the farm, where the future of the Australian pearling industry is being devised.

Terry is enthusiastic but considered; he likes to stop and talk before moving on. This means the journey is relaxed, although a reasonable level of fitness and agility is recommended to navigate the rocky and sandy surfaces of the toasty tropics.

Dale Tilbrook Experiences expands Dale’s work with Maalinup Aboriginal Gallery. Her experiences around bush tucker, Aboriginal cultures and art are engaging and always include bush tucker to try. She now offers a bush tucker and wellbeing experience that explores the beneficial qualities of plants. These experiences can be delivered at one of her venues or at yours.



Dale Tilbrook Experiences focuses on Aboriginal cultures, art and stories with an emphasis on bush tucker and the use of plant and animal resources of the bush as food and medicine. Food is our medicine and medicine is our food although some plants are specifically medicine.

Dale is a Wardandi Bibbulmun woman from the south west of Western Australia. Her experiences and activities are engaging and personal. She brings a lifetime of local knowledge and research to everything she does. Dale’s journey in Aboriginal tourism began 25 years ago after returning from 10 years overseas and starting a boomerang and artefact making enterprise with her brother, then an Aboriginal art and gift gallery with some bush food products. From there activities around bush tucker, culture and Aboriginal art emerged.

Today the focus is definitely the activities and experiences. These take participants on an in-depth, hands-on journey. Aboriginal native edibles as food and medicine are the two signature experiences. In these, participants get to eat the natural food and learn many interesting facts about the nutritional profile of Aboriginal food and medicine plants. Dale reveals some remarkable insights into Aboriginal food traditions such as the yam garden along the Swan River, moving across the land according to the Noongar six seasons and sustainable hunting and gathering. In the Art experience, the history of Aboriginal art and dot paintings is explored and participants create their own piece to take home. Dale’s storytelling skills come to the fore when she delves into local history and culture.

KINGFISHER TOURS

Explore the far reaches of the Kimberley region with Kingfisher Tours. Places that can take days to get to by car are shortcut with scenic flights, with ground tours led by local Aboriginal guides. Personal connections to this land run deep and are a key feature of expeditions into one of the world’s last true wilderness areas.



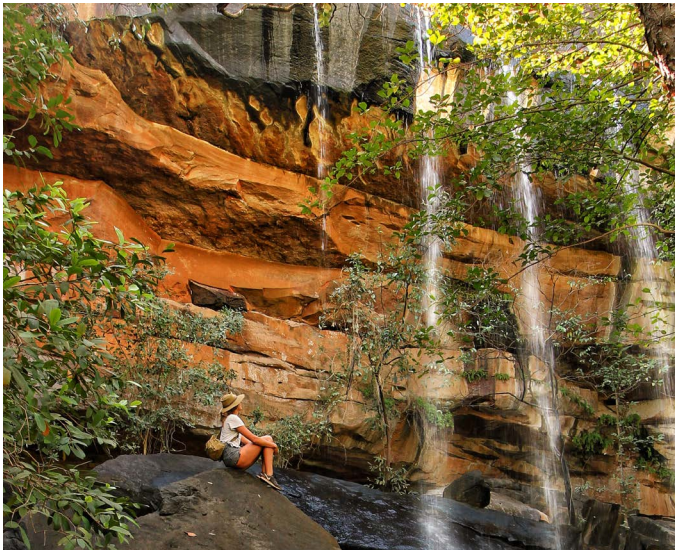
Most destinations are reached via scenic flight (typically from Broome/Rubibi or Kununurra). When you arrive, a Welcome to Country ceremony is performed to ensure the safe passage of everyone present, followed by nullaja (bush tea) and damper (bush bread). Then, it’s time to leave the beaten track behind and go exploring.

In Purnululu, a Gija Custodian leads guests to Cathedral Gorge, passing towering rock domes, pausing to smell medicinal plants and explain ancient Songlines (routes through the landscape). By night, the star-speckled sky is deciphered using traditional knowledge, and

Dreaming stories are shared. On visits to Punamii-Uunpuu, guests hike to various viewpoints to admire the iconic waterfall and see 30,000-year-old rock art. Visit a remote Aboriginal community on the Wandjina Explorer tour, forage for shellfish, croc-spot and explore its surrounding landscape by helicopter.

The company’s tour itineraries range from day trips to multi-day expeditions, with tailor-made experiences and 4WD adventures also available. Ground tours are all-inclusive of delicious meals and beverages, with various sustainability measures in place to lighten your carbon footprint.

KOOMAL DREAMING



Koomal Dreaming provides an opportunity for visitors to experience Wadandi and Bibbulman country (the Margaret River Region) through the eyes of the Traditional Owners. Wadandi cultural custodian, Josh Whiteland, provides guests with the opportunity to taste native foods, discover bush medicine, and experience traditional fire lighting. Josh recounts stories of the Dreaming spirits that relate to his traditional area, and takes visitors deep into Ngilgi Cave for a uniquely memorable didgeridoo cave experience.

The Wadandi and Bibbulman peoples of Australia's south-west have walked the ancient Margaret River lands for almost 50,000 years. Together with other Aboriginal groups from Kalbarri to Esperance, they are known as Noongar. The Noongar culture is as rich and varied as the countryside itself, and sharing in their knowledge of culture and the pristine environment is fascinating.

Josh Whiteland will help you explore the region on a number of tour options that show the local plants used for traditional medicines and provide you with a taste of native bush foods.

He'll also demonstrate the traditional ways of fire lighting, the ancient art of tool making and introduce you to the animals, plants and Dreaming Spirits that have enriched the lives of the local peoples and their ancestors.

Josh also happens to be a talented musician who will delight you with a mesmerising didgeridoo performance and stories about Dreamtime legends inside the spectacular Ngilgi cave, where the good spirit Ngili lives.

BROOME



The historic pearling town of Broome/Rubibi is revered for epic sunsets and magnificent beaches bounded by red pindan scrub, but to learn the complete story of its fascinating past and present, spend time with local Yawuru man Bart Pigram. Bart shares generational knowledge and recounts ancient stories of the saltwater Yawuru people through his fascinating tours.

In Yawuru Aboriginal language, Narlijia means ‘true for you’ and Bart embraces the opportunity to create a deeper connection between cultures. Bart’s tours are insightful and entertaining; he comes from a family of musicians and pearling workers who share a deep connection to Country.

He draws on his professional training in cultural development to create a unique experience – the Mangrove Discovery Experience that takes you on an adventure through the mangrove forest ecosystem.

During the two-hour Mangrove Discovery Experience, you’ll learn about the traditional use of mangrove wood, visit Buccaneer Rock and hear the Dreamtime stories of the region. There may be an opportunity to taste some bush tucker sourced from the mangrove forest and foreshore or an amazing oyster fresh off the rock. View the remnants of (Asian) fish traps and be regaled with stories from historic Broome’s pearling days.

NGURRANGGA TOURS



Experience Aboriginal cultures, vast landscapes, bush tucker and Dreaming stories of the Pilbara, Burrup Peninsula and Millstream Chichester National Park with Ngurrangga Tours led by a dedicated team of guides, descendants of the Ngarluma and Yindjibarndi peoples, Traditional Owners of the West Pilbara in the north of Western Australia.

It's estimated there could be up to a million rock-art images tucked into the Burrup Peninsula and Dampier Archipelago, some dating back as far as 40,000 years. Walker's tour of Murujuga National Park, home to the world's highest concentration of rock art, shows off some of the stunning images that document everything from first contact with Europeans to megafauna and other extinct species. The Park is an oasis in the desert with its rugged gorges, tropical rock pools and meandering watercourses.

Those happy to get a little dirty can head out on one of Walker's Bush Tucker and Rock Art tours. Guests must make their way through mud, spinifex and scrub as they forage for native bush tucker such as berries and potatoes. They might even catch a mud crab!

Many of Walker's former guests return wanting a longer tour and opt for an overnight experience that includes camping near the park and the Hamersley Range, and learning the Dreaming stories associated with the constellations. "You can actually see the Songlines in the sky," he says. This long-time favourite spot of Walker's is also a repository of artefacts such as stone axes, spearheads and grinding stones and can be experienced on a 4WD tag-along overnight tour.

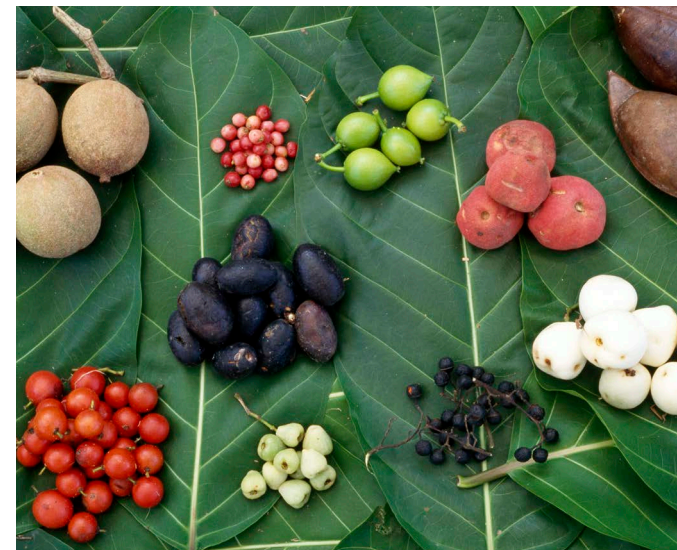
For guests who say, "I want to do everything you've got", Walker combines his individual tours into a super-tour that takes three days.

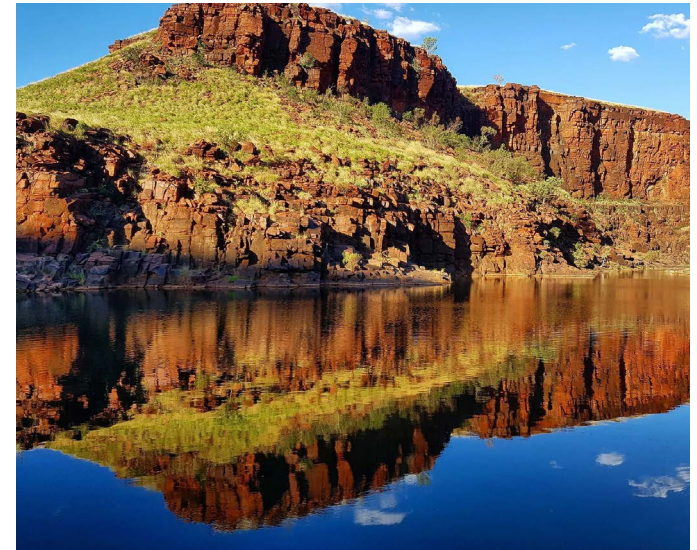

WARINGARRI ABORIGINAL ARTS & TOURS



See, hear, taste and feel how Miriwoong cultural traditions inform the contemporary artwork at Waringarri Aboriginal Arts & Tours in Western Australia’s Kimberley region. Here, creativity exists both within and beyond the walls of the first wholly Indigenous-owned art centre established in the state.

Waringarri translates to ‘people all together’ in the Miriwoong language, and that’s precisely what’s been happening at the Kununurra art centre since the 1980s – making it one of Australia’s oldest continuously operating art centres. It’s a place where Aboriginal culture is openly shared with visitors, the exchange supporting economic independence for artists and their community. A visit isn’t centred on buying art; instead the focus lies on the sensory experience of Miriwoong culture and Country. A 1.5-hour artist-led tour of the collection gallery, its sculpture garden and studios includes conversations with artists as they sculpt, paint, craft and carve. There’s also a tasting of Aboriginal bread, known as damper. Aboriginal guides also lead easy, 30-minute walks through the rusty red rock caverns of Mirima National Park,

a place described as a mini version of the Bungle Bungles, found in remote, UNESCO-listed Purnululu National Park. The 2.5-hour experience is only five minutes’ drive east of Kununurra. Witness the sunset’s visually spectacular impact on Mirima’s colourful rock formations during a 2.5-hour tour, as the music of a didgeridoo delights your ears. Meanwhile, a half-day, 4WD tag-along tour roams through the landscapes that inspire the artists; places where they grew up, learned their culture, and forged a lifelong connection to the land. There’s a lesson on bush tucker – expect to touch, smell and taste outback plants – followed by lunch cooked outdoors, on the coals. All proceeds from art sales and commissions, as well as tourism, are returned to the community. Bookings are essential.
