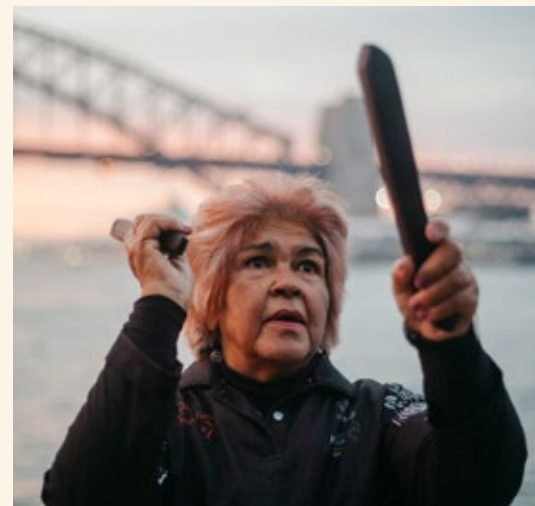

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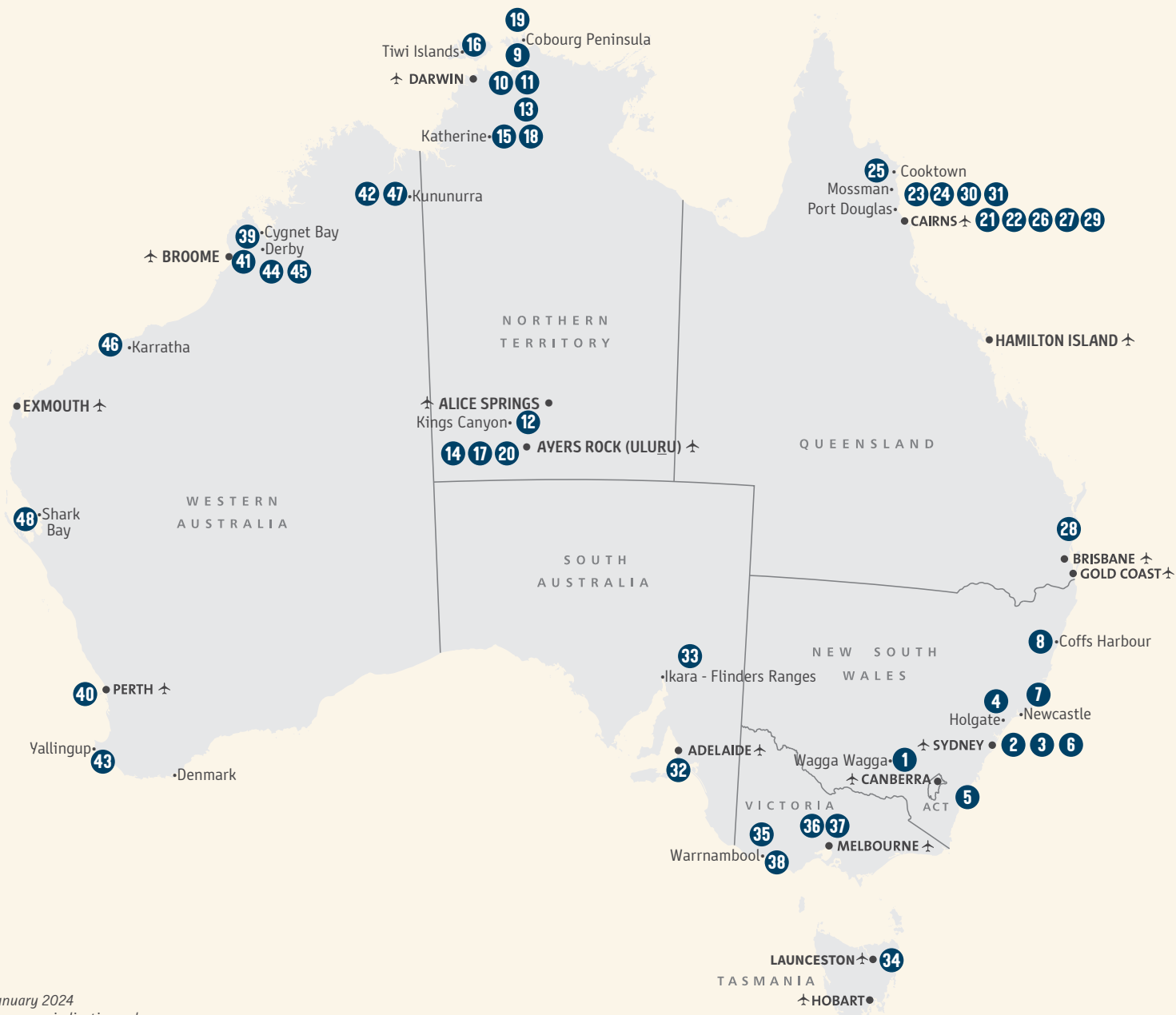

## Nature and Wildlife Experiences

View Australia's distinctive landscapes through different eyes, helping you gain a deeper appreciation of the natural environment and the nation's unique wildlife – and enjoy great fishing!

**Sample highlights:** Near the Great Ocean Road in Victoria, you can take an Aboriginal-guided tour with Worn Gundidj @ Tower Hill to discover a nature reserve inside a dormant volcano where kangaroos, wallabies, emus, koalas, echidnas and hundreds of bird species roam freely. Alternatively, explore lush, fertile wetlands in the heart of Kakadu National Park in the Northern Territory with Kakadu Cultural Tours to see crocodiles and colourful birdlife and discover the traditional uses for plants and animals. In New South Wales, Wiradjuri man Mark Saddler brings the magnificent landscapes of the Riverina region to life on his suite of Bundyi Cultural Tours. Spot kangaroos and other native wildlife as you explore sites of cultural significance. And in Tropical North Queensland, the well-camouflaged critters of the lush Daintree Rainforest are best spotted with the help of Indigenous guides. On a Dreamtime Walk run by the Mossman Gorge Cultural Centre, you might be lucky enough to admire a beautiful Boyd's forest dragon.

## Active Adventures

You'll find a wide selection of exhilarating experiences on offer in Australia's beautiful landscapes, from paddling, quad biking and hiking to 4WD adventures and a bridge climb with a difference.

**Sample highlights:** Perhaps you'd care to enjoy an inspiring four-day, three-night Aboriginal-guided wukalina Walk along the white sand beaches of Irapuna (Bay of Fires) and wukalina (Mount William) in north-eastern Tasmania/lutruwita staying in domed huts inspired by the traditional homes of the palawa people, Tasmania/lutruwita's Traditional Custodians. Or maybe you'll take a tailor-made safari with Lords Kakadu & Arnhemland Safaris to explore some of the Northern Territory's towering red escarpments, dramatic waterfalls and expansive wetlands, as well as discover remarkable rock art. In New South Wales, explore Aboriginal connections to the Coffs Coast on a thrilling cultural paddle along culturally significant waterways with Wajaana Yaam Gumbaynggirr Adventure Tours, or scale Sydney Harbour Bridge in the company of a First Nations storyteller on the Burrawa Aboriginal Climb Experience, which reveals glimpses of sacred sites and fascinating insights into the Aboriginal significance of the city.

## Culinary Experiences

Guided bush tucker walks reveal the surprising fecundity of the Australian landscape, while outback dining, infused with the unique flavours of the Australian bush, offers a deliciously immersive experience. Alternatively, try your hand at traditional hunting.

**Sample highlights:** Join an immersive exploration with Walkabout Cultural Adventures in Tropical North Queensland, where a Kuku Yalanji guide – whose ancestors have lived in the region for tens of thousands of years – will take you on a deeply personal tour. Or feast on a gourmet hamper featuring Indigenous flavours crafted by renowned Aboriginal Chef, Mark Olive, as part of the Wintjiri Wiru Experience - a spectacular light show at Ayers Rock Resort beside Uluru. On the New South Wales Central Coast, take an alternative winery tour with respected Elder Kevin 'Gavi' Duncan from Firescreek Botanical Winery Aboriginal Experiences. Taste native flora and learn about local Aboriginal culture before sampling the botanical winery's distinctive beverages. Or enjoy a seven-course alfresco dining experience amid thousands of twinkling lights with Flames of the Forest in Tropical North Queensland.

## Coastal and Aquatic Experiences

Aboriginal cultures are not only connected with the outback but also with Australia's spectacular coastal regions. Sail, fish, search for mud crabs, snorkel, kayak and swim in beautiful beaches and aquamarine waterways.

**Sample highlights:** Discover the Creation story of the Great Barrier Reef with Dreamtime Dive & Snorkel's First Nations cultural guides. Take an optional snorkel tour to better understand the ancient relationship between humankind and marine life. Also departing from Cairns/Gimuy in Tropical North Queensland, cultural tours with Mandingalbay Authentic Indigenous Tours begin with a scenic cruise to Mandingalbay Yidinji Country. Further south, forge a new connection to Queensland's Sunshine Coast as you cruise the serene Mooloolah River on a century-old sailing boat with Indigenous owned and operated Saltwater Eco Tours. Go on a kayaking adventure with Wula Gura Nyinda Eco Cultural Adventures to explore Gutharraguda (the Aboriginal name for UNESCO World Heritage-listed Shark Bay in Western Australia) to learn how the Country talks to you. And in Victoria, you can visit Budj Bim Cultural Landscape, a World Heritage-listed site that contains one of the world's most extensive and oldest aquaculture systems.

## Exclusive Accommodation

When you want to immerse yourself fully in Australia's remarkable and remote landscapes, unique Aboriginal-owned accommodations, including wilderness retreats, safari tents and architecturally designed huts make your experience all the more special.

**Sample highlights:** In the heart of the traditional homeland of the Adnyamathanha (Yura) people in the spectacular Ikara-Flinders Ranges National Park in South Australia, Wilpena Pound Resort is set inside an extraordinary 800-million-year-old natural amphitheatre and offers 'glamping' safari tents as well as hotel rooms and camping. Then there's Davidson's Arnhemland Safaris' remote wilderness lodge nestled against the majestic Arnhem Land escarpment in the Northern Territory's Top End – the perfect place to unplug and reconnect with nature while exploring the Aboriginal cultural landscape surrounding the ecolodge. And on the transformative Aboriginal-guided wukalina Walk in Tasmania/lutruwita, you'll spend the first two nights in architect-designed huts inspired by the half-dome shelters traditionally used by palawa people, the state's Traditional Custodians.

## Art and Museum Experiences

Explore Australia's excellent Aboriginal art galleries and museums, visit ancient rock art sites offering profound insights into Dreaming stories, or take part in artist-led workshops in contemporary art practice. All help you understand the fundamental role of art in the transmission of culture.

**Sample highlights:** Join a Maruku Arts dot-painting workshop at Ayers Rock Resort in Australia's spectacular Red Centre to learn about Tjurkurpa Creation symbols, and then paint your own Creation story. Visit some of the finest rock art galleries in the world with Davidson's Arnhemland Safaris in the Top End of the Northern Territory and learn about the distinctive screen-printing techniques used by the artisans of the Tiwi Islands on SeaLink NT's Tiwi by Design tour. Then go off the beaten track with Jarramali Rock Art Tours on day or overnight trips from Laura in northern Queensland exploring jaw-dropping Quinkan art galleries, which UNESCO recognises as one of the 10 most significant rock-art sites in the world. Alternatively, take an interactive tour of Waringarri Aboriginal Arts & Tours, a creative hub in Western Australia's Kimberley region where local artisans also guide you into the epic landscapes that inspire their works. You can also admire ever-changing First Nations art exhibitions at the Koorie Heritage Trust in Melbourne/Narrm.

## Urban Culture Experiences

Aboriginal cultures also thrive in Australia's urban centres, with walking tours as well as museums, galleries and cultural centres offering easily accessible ways to connect with Indigenous cultures.

**Sample highlights:** Enjoy an Aboriginal Heritage Walk in the Royal Botanic Gardens Melbourne, be immersed in native flora and fauna exploring the Botanic Garden in Adelaide with Southern Cultural Immersion, or explore Sydney/Warrane's harbour foreshore with the Royal Botanic Garden Sydney. You may also wish to embark on a coastal journey with Dreamtime Southern X, where the spiritual significance of the New South Wales's capital's famous harbour is revealed on a stunningly intimate walking tour. Or ascend the Sydney Harbour Bridge accompanied by a First Nations storyteller on the Burrawa Aboriginal Climb Experience, learning about the city's lesser-known history en route. It's not just the big cities where you can discover Aboriginal cultures in an urban environment. Yawuru man Bart Pigram offers a walking tour of historic Broome's mangroves and mudflats, highlighting the impact this unique ecosystem had on the history and settlement of this dynamic pearling town; you can also see Broome/Rubibi through the eyes of a born-and-bred local on Kimberley Cultural Adventures' tour around the city, with a side of bush tucker and a didgeridoo performance.

## Immersive Journeys

Go off the beaten track and you'll soon learn that there is not one, but many Aboriginal cultures, each with its own language, belief system and powerful connection to place. On an immersive journey, you'll gain both insight into the world's oldest living cultures and an understanding of Aboriginal spirituality and connection to Country.

**Sample highlights:** Make a deep connection with the Yuin people of the New South Wales South Coast through Ngaran Ngaran Culture Awareness, which shares sacred ceremonies, ancient stories and traditional dancing. Wander to the heart of Purnululu National Park with Kingfisher Tours, where the Bungle Bungle Range is as imposing as it is inspiring. Or join a multi-day 4WD adventure in the Northern Territory with Venture North Safaris. On your journey from Darwin/Gulamerdgen to the Cobourg Peninsula, one of Australia's wildest corners, you'll visit one of Arnhem Land's most significant rock art sites with an Aboriginal guide. It's impossible not to feel moved by the spirituality of this sacred place as you learn about how this spectacular landscape has sustained the Aboriginal communities of the Gunbalanya region for millennia. You can also join Jarramali Rock Art Tours for multi-day visits to Quinkan rock art sites, where you can bed down at an exclusive camp site and sleep under a blanket of stars.

## Bush & Outback Experiences

The Australian outback is a wild, ancient place. With an Aboriginal guide, explore working cattle stations, outback gorges, ancient rock art galleries and waterholes, and learn about the bounties a seemingly barren desert can provide.

**Sample highlights:** After you've explored the famous sites at Uluru-Kata Tjuta National Park, go deep into the heart of the Red Centre with SEIT - Patji and join the traditional Uluru family in their homelands. On a Karrke Aboriginal Cultural Experience & Tours experience in the Northern Territory's Watarrka National Park, you can immerse yourself in the Luritja and Pertame language and culture. Discover native foods such as bush plum and honey ants, learn more about dot painting and see how mulga wood can be transformed into weapons and artefacts during this hands-on one-hour experience. You can also explore the far reaches of Western Australia's breathtaking Kimberley region with Kingfisher Tours, which whisks guests to remote attractions – including World Heritage-listed Purnululu National Park and its famous Bungle Bungle Range – by plane, with ground tours led by Aboriginal guides.

## BUNDYI CULTURAL TOURS

Wagga Wagga, New South Wales

*Look, smell, touch and taste your way around Wagga Wagga, discovering Wiradjuri Country and culture on immersive, customisable tours.*

Exploring by vehicle, or on foot, every tour around Wagga Wagga is different with Bundyi Cultural Tours – the company's owner and guide, Wiradjuri man Mark Saddler, tailors locations visited and stories told to your interests. Bundyi offers customisable packages including the two-hour Aboriginal Walkabout Tour, exploring Wagga Wagga, visiting Wiradjuri cultural sites and learning the language. The four-hour Aboriginal Special Places Tour includes a similar walk, before you visit Galore Hill Scenic Reserve for morning tea featuring native ingredients, accompanied by stories about bushrangers and 'scar trees'.

The six-hour Aboriginal Cultural Tour: Taste of Wiradjuri extends the above further, visiting The Rock Nature Reserve – Kengal Aboriginal Place, a spiritual Dreaming and ceremonial site. A barbecue lunch is included. If you have a full day, join the Wiradjuri Culture & Winery Private Tour. The experience covers destinations of your choice, followed by lunch and a visit to the Courabyra Wines estate.

## BURRAWA ABORIGINAL CLIMB EXPERIENCE

Sydney/Warrane, New South Wales

*Enjoy a dazzling perspective of Sydney climbing the Harbour Bridge, while discovering historic and sacred Indigenous sites with a First Nations Storyteller as your guide.*

BridgeClimb Sydney's Burrawa Aboriginal Climb Experience offers unbroken views over Australia's largest city while you ascend the Sydney Harbour Bridge. This Climb comes with a side of history, both humbling and enlightening courtesy of your Aboriginal guide. Each First Nations Storyteller brings different Dreamtime stories to your Climb, not to mention different Indigenous languages, and you'll learn a word or two before you reach the Summit.

Standing 134 metres above the water, it's hard not to lose your breath – likely due to a combination of the 1,332 steps, the 360-degree views and your guide's fascinating insights. From the Summit you'll see Tallawoladah (The Rocks), where Patyegarang (Australia's first Aboriginal language teacher) instructed botanist and explorer William Dawes on the languages of Sydney. You'll also spot one of the city's newest precincts, Barangaroo, named after a Cammeraygal woman and powerful leader of the Eora Nation during the time of European colonisation.

## DREAMTIME SOUTHERN X

Sydney/Warrane, New South Wales

*Aboriginal guides lead immersive tours showcasing Sydney's long Indigenous history and culture, all backdropped by one of the world's most spectacular harbours.*

Dreamtime Southern X is owned by Margret Campbell and her family who are coastal water peoples of the Dunghutti and Djerrinjah Nations. Tours are grounded in Aboriginal Dreamtime culture and are led by Aboriginal guides who are trained in Margret's cultural knowledge and wisdoms. Margret gives permission to share this expression that connects to Sydney's/Warrane's billion-year-old saltwater harbour, flora and fauna, marine life and sandstone rock beds. Gavi's coolamon (a traditional wooden carrying vessel) displays seasonal bush tucker, which you'll taste while he pulls out his collection of Aboriginal tools, artefacts, and instruments including his clapsticks and didgeridoo. Gavi's haunting performance speaks of Dreaming stories passed down through many generations. Botanicals grown on the estate infuse some of the winery's distinctive drinks, which you'll sample on a guided flight with Firescreek's winemaker at the end of the tour.

Enjoy exclusive access to a sandy adventure wonderland on this exhilarating quad bike tour around the largest mobile sand dunes in the Southern Hemisphere. Thrills are guaranteed as you tackle the towering dunes, cresting sand hills on the four-wheeled bikes or sandboarding down slopes.

The Stockton dunes, which flank a 32-kilometre beach, cover 4,200 hectares and can reach 40 metres high. Looking out across the endless expanse of sand, it's easy to imagine you are in the middle of the desert, rather than on the edge of the sea. This is Worimi land and the tour is run by the local Aboriginal Land Council, so while there's plenty of action, there's also bush tucker and storytelling, and guides will point out huge middens (mountainous piles of shells and animal bones) half-buried by the sands that move between one and four metres every year. All proceeds go back into the local community.

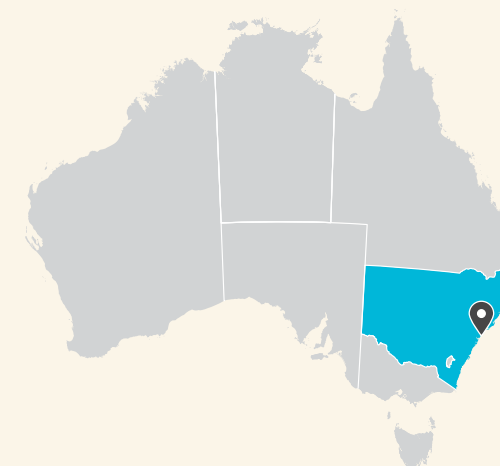

Just north of Coffs Harbour, Niigi Niigi (Sealy Lookout) in the Orara East State Forest is another important cultural site for the Gumbaynggirr community.

If you've signed up for Wajaana Yaam's full-day Coffs Creek or Moonee Creek tour, you'll pair your paddle with a walking tour in this culturally significant area, while the full-day Red Rock Creek tour will see you visit another key site. A percentage of all Wajaana Yaam's proceeds are invested back into the not-for-profit Bularri Muurlay Nyanggan Aboriginal Corporation.

They may not be easy to reach, lying 430 kilometres (five hours' drive) north of Adelaide/Tarntanya, but the travellers that head here find themselves enchanted by this ancient, unmistakably Australian landscape, with sheer escarpments and narrow gorges, lilac-tinged sunrises and blazing sunsets. The centrepiece of this dramatic landscape is Wilpena Pound, an extraordinary 800-million-year-old natural amphitheatre that is part of the homeland of the Adnyamathanha, or Yura, people.

Wilpena Pound Resort, the only accommodation within the Ikara-Flinders Ranges National Park, is owned and operated by the Adnyamathanha people, which makes it a great place to explore Adnyamathanha culture. Activities range from fossil hunting in the area's canyons to visiting ancient rock art sites. You can choose from a range of accommodation options, from hotel rooms and safari-style tents to no-frills powered or unpowered campsites.

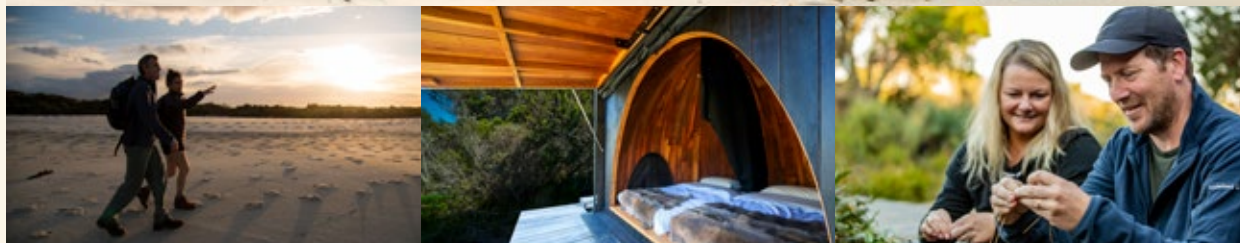

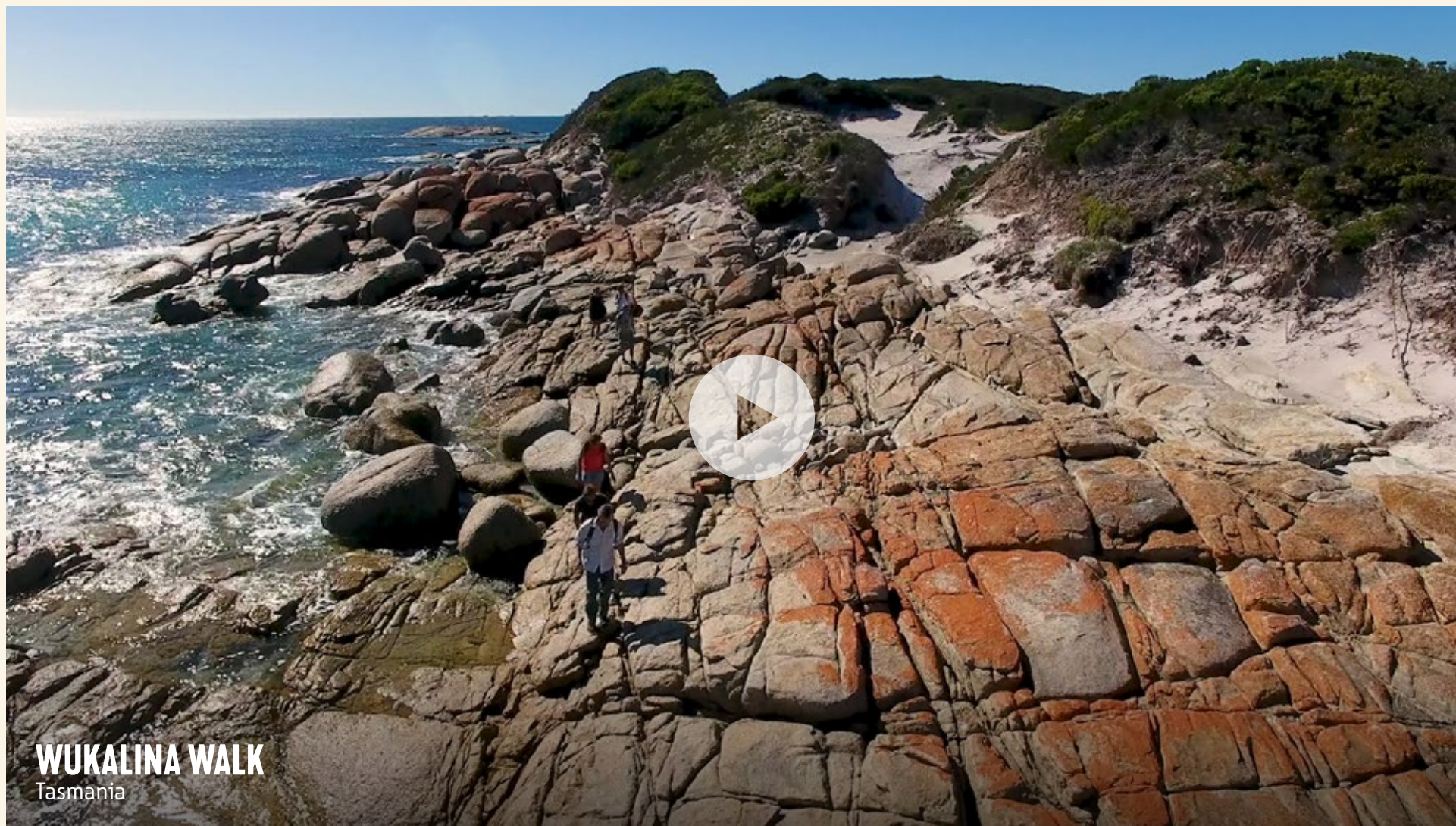

## BUDJ BIM CULTURAL LANDSCAPE TOURISM

Breakaway Creek, Victoria

*Marvel in the majesty of the World Heritage-listed Budj Bim site, home to one of the world's most extensive and oldest aquaculture systems.*

Located on southwestern Victoria's Budj Bim Cultural Landscape, the Gunditjmara-owned and -operated Tae Rak Aquaculture Centre stands on a unique UNESCO World Heritage site, listed solely for its Aboriginal cultural significance. This extraordinary region bears evidence of one of the world's oldest and most extensive aquaculture systems, dating back over 6,600 years. The Gunditjmara people ingeniously constructed an intricate network of channels, weirs and dams to capture and harvest kooyang (eels), showcasing their remarkable engineering prowess.

From the Tae Rak Aquaculture Centre, visitors embark on cultural tours led by Gunditjmara guides, discovering ancient lava flows, fish traps, eel smoking trees and remnants of Aboriginal stone huts. On offer are a two-hour guided walk of the Tae Rak wetlands, a half-day tour visiting the Budj Bim National Park and the Kurtonitj Indigenous Protected Area, and a full-day tour that combines the two-hour walk and the half-day tour and includes a bush tucker lunch.

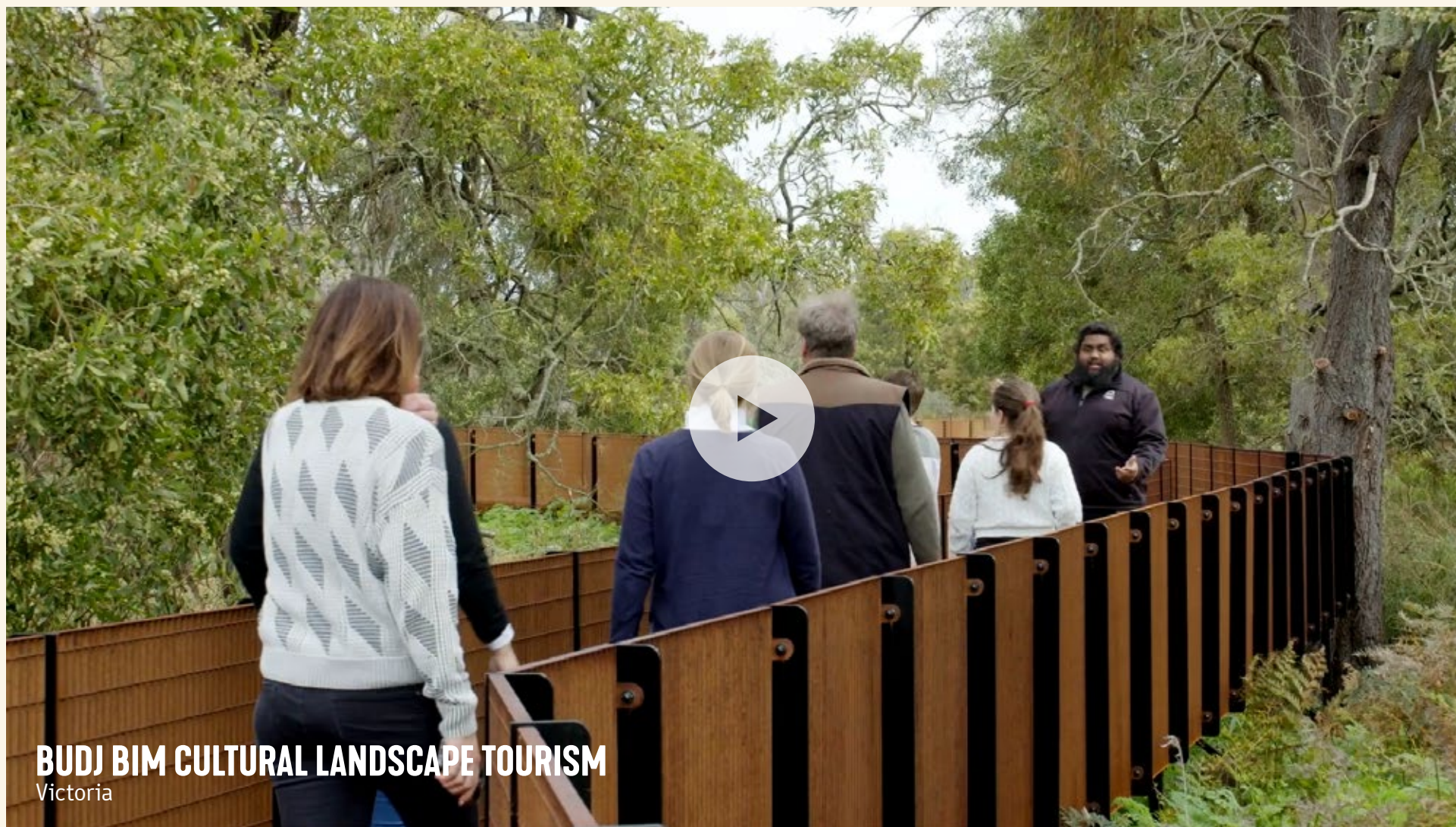

Visitors looking to experience Aboriginal Australia within an urban setting should look no further than Melbourne/Narrm's Koorie Heritage Trust. With a prominent location at Federation Square, the not-for-profit trust offers several ways to gain insight into how Aboriginal peoples in Victoria once practised their culture in this area and how they continue to keep it alive today.

Drop in to browse the museum-style collection, which includes oral histories, photography, art, boomerangs, possum skin cloaks, eel traps and ancient stone tools. The trust also offers informative walking tours led by an Indigenous guide who shares the city's Aboriginal history and their own story. The one-hour Birrarung Wilam (River Camp) Walk meanders along the banks of the Yarra River to the Birrarung Wilam art installation, celebrating the connection between Indigenous peoples and place. The Scar Tree Walk (1.5 hours) includes this route, then continues to the William Barak Bridge that connects Birrarung Marr park and Yarra Park.

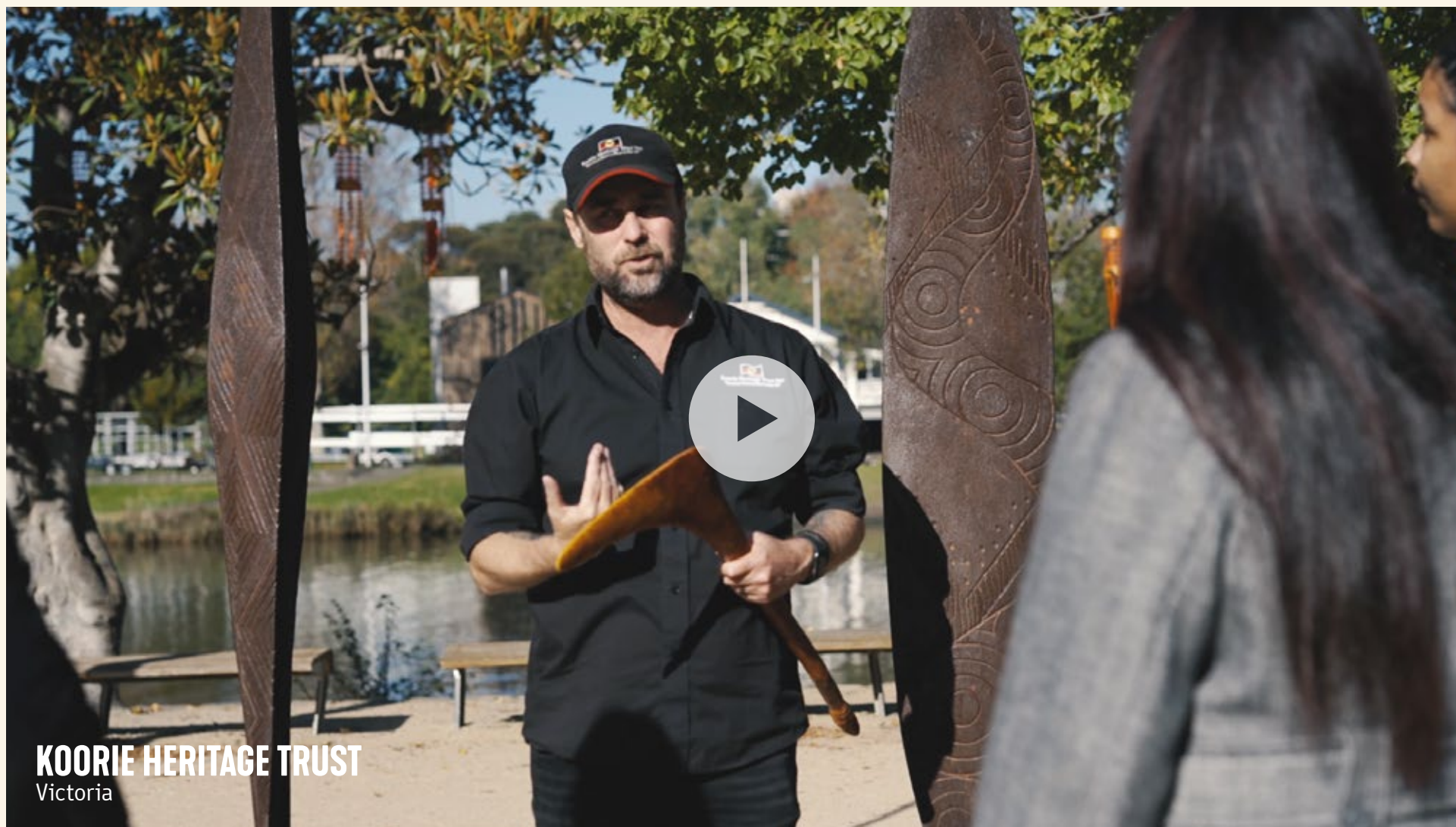

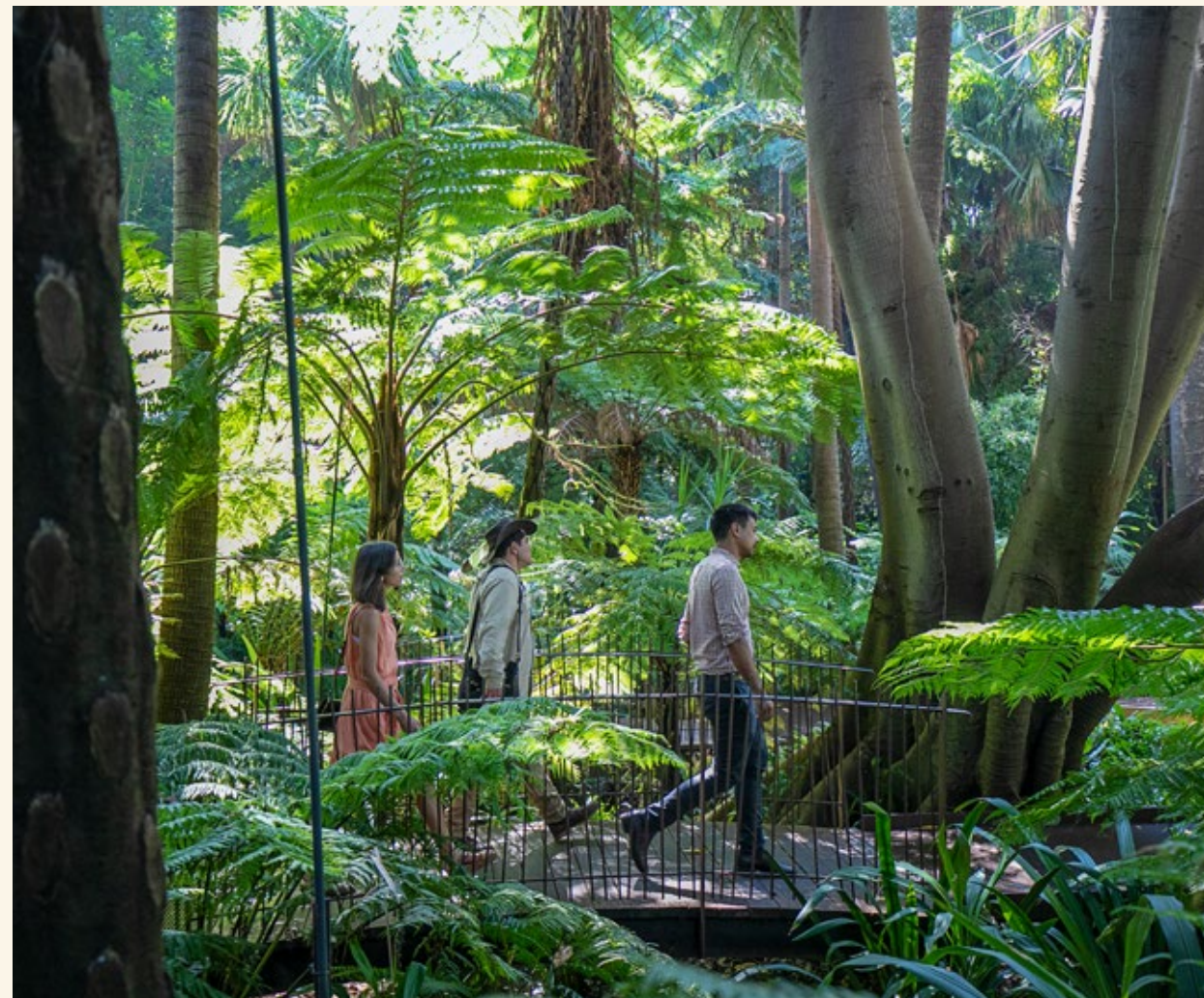

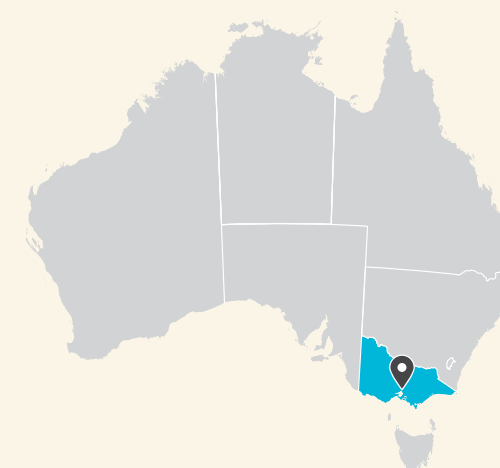

## WORN GUNDIDJ @ TOWER HILL

Warrnambool, Victoria

*Meet native Australian wildlife roaming free in a natural bush setting, then discover the park's Indigenous history and its unique vegetation.*

There are plenty of natural wonders to marvel at along the Great Ocean Road, Australia's most scenic drive. Its deserted beaches, lush rainforest and cascading waterfalls are all justly famous, but one of its best-kept secrets is Tower Hill Wildlife Reserve. Set dramatically within a volcanic crater, this reserve is a wonderful place to get up close with the local wildlife, from koalas and kangaroos to emus and echidnas, as well as 160 different species of bird.

A visit to Tower Hill is as much about cultural history as it is about natural history. Artefacts show that Aboriginal peoples have lived in the area for at least 30,000 years, right back to the days when violent volcanic explosions reshaped the landscape. Today the local Aboriginal cooperative, WG Enterprises, runs two-hour walking tours that introduce visitors to the area's colourful past, and also serve as an introduction to Aboriginal culture.

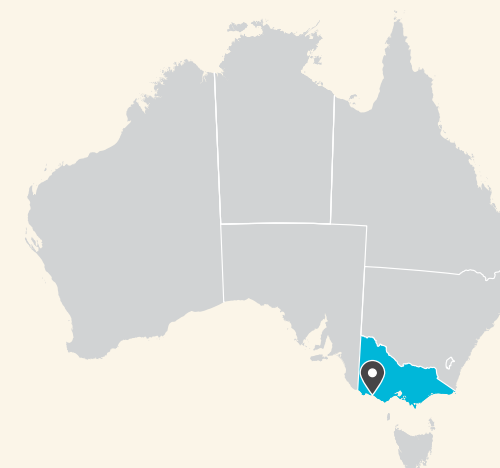

Borrgoron Coast to Creek Tours offers a fascinating opportunity to discover how the Bardi Jawi people have lived in harmony with this ruggedly beautiful landscape for millennia. The signature tour is led by Bardi man Terry Hunter, who has lived on Cygnet Bay Pearl Farm, 220km north of Broome/Rubibi, for most of his life. Terry knows this corner of the Kimberley region intimately, and his walking tour combines stories of his childhood, the teachings of Aboriginal cultures and bush knowledge, and reveals how his family history is tied to the pioneering beginnings of the region's pearl trade.

Terry's two-hour coastal walk leads guests to beach flats, where a freshwater spring bubbles up at low tide. Next, Bardi-style cooking of oysters still on the rocks, a myth-busting session about his peoples' culture, an art lesson on pearl-shell carving and even talk of the marine biology projects underway on the farm.
