Sins of Kujo

On Netflix April 2, 2026 | Series

A live-action adaptation of Shohei Manabe's latest work ("Ushijima the Loan Shark"), *Sins of Kujo* asks: Does defending "bad people" make you a crooked lawyer? This crime drama pushes viewers to rethink everything they know about law and morality.

Taiza Kujo is a lawyer who defends only society's worst: thugs, yakuza, and ex-convicts. Often called unscrupulous by others, he wields the law as a weapon to protect the morally reprehensible, all in pursuit of his own view of justice.

Yuya Yagira stars as the unconventional lawyer Taiza Kujo, with Hokuto Matsumura as the elite lawyer Shinji Karasuma, who finds himself suddenly working for Kujo. The all-star cast includes Elaiza Ikeda, Keita Machida, Takuma Otoo, Tsuyoshi Muro and more, each playing characters navigating the corrupt world of the original manga. Produced by TBS hit-maker Atsushi Nasuda, written by Nonji Nemoto, and directed by Nobuhiro Doi, Takeyoshi Yamamoto and Hiroshi Adachi, the series digs into the characters' humanity and vividly depicts the gritty underbelly of society with striking realism.

Straight to Hell

On Netflix April 27, 2026 | Series

Japan's most famous fortune-teller, Kazuko Hosoki, once held the nation in her thrall. Was she a savior...or a devil? Wealth, fame, romance: she had it all. But what shocking, untold past was she hiding?

Kazuko Hosoki was a fortune teller who swept Japan with her Six-Star Divination practice to make her predictions, giving ominous, blunt warnings like the "Great Calamity Period" and "You'll go to hell." She climbed out of post-war poverty by becoming a key figure in Tokyo's nightlife, establishing multiple successful nightclubs in her twenties and becoming the "Queen of Ginza." Hosoki went on to dominate television and publishing as a fortune teller, with her books setting a Guinness World Record. But her rise was clouded by accusations of fraudulent business practices and rumored connections to the criminal underworld. What was the true nature of this dark hero? Spanning 60 years, from the mid-20th century to the early 21st, this drama series offers an unfiltered look into the awe-inspiring struggles and insatiable desires of a truly enigmatic woman.

Erika Toda portrays Hosoki, powerfully realizing her unstoppable drive as well as her loneliness born from her greed and arrogance. Sairi Ito plays Minori Uozumi, a writer tasked with ghostwriting Hosoki's autobiography. The confrontations between the two women call to mind the strength one needs to face life's challenges. The long-obsured half of this fortune teller who achieved great fame and wealth is finally revealed.

Director Tomoyuki Takimoto praised Toda's performance: "Her portrayal helped me make discoveries about how this generational trickster came to be."

Their journey takes them through Berlin, Seoul and Tokyo, where they experience a breadth of emotions: unforgettable pain, suffering and, ultimately, joy. *Soul Mate* is a tender romance between two young men, unfolding over the course of 10 years.

Ryo is played by Hayato Isomura (*Extremely Inappropriate*, *(Ab)normal Desire*, *The Moon*). Johan is played by Ok Taec-yeon of 2PM (*Vincenzo*, *La Grande Maison Paris*). The series is written and directed by versatile up-and-coming creator Shunki Hashizume, who has established himself as an author, screenwriter and director with works such as his novel “Scroll,” which was adapted into a film, and the drama *More than Words*, which he also directed.

Following its bold dives into the hidden corners of society in *The Naked Director* and *Tokyo Swindlers*, Netflix now shines a spotlight on the world of cosmetic surgery. Set in an alternate Japan, the narrative revolves around a government-sanctioned quiz show with supreme authority, as established by the Japanese Constitution. Contestants who win have any wish granted by the government, but those who lose face severe consequences, such as fines, forced labor or conscription. This deadly game tests the participants' resolve to pursue their deepest desires — and the greater the ambition behind the wish, the greater the punishment upon losing. The charismatic quiz host, KK, uses his exceptional performance skills to captivate audiences and enthrall the nation. Originally written by Reiichi Sugimoto and illustrated by Shinkichi Kato, “Kokumin Quiz” was serialized in 1993 and remained a rare find until its reissue by Ohta Publishing Company due to high demand. This is I is a moving, genre-defying film that brings to life the remarkable true story of Ai Haruna and Dr. Koji Wada — a pair who challenged convention and changed each other's lives forever.

The film follows Kenji Onishi, a young person who dreams of becoming an idol but struggles with identity under society's judgmental gaze. Kenji's life changes dramatically after meeting Dr. Koji Wada, a compassionate physician who becomes an advocate for people living with gender dysphoria. 
Starring Ko Shibasaki & Eiji Akaso, this series brings together screenwriter Yoshikazu Okada and director Hiroki Kazama to adapt a best-selling novel of an unconventional, borrowed time love story.

"Saving money is the best entertainment and the perfect way to kill time." So said Yui Kataura, a 40-year-old single woman. She has deliberately avoided anything she deems to be uneconomical, including romance, marriage and childbirth. During a free medical examination, she is diagnosed with cancer and told she only has a year left to live. Although the doctor urges surgery, Yui secretly feels relief. "If I'm going to die, there's no need to save money anymore."

Her life shifts when Sena, a pink-haired nightclub host down on his luck, unexpectedly approaches asking "Can you lend me some money?". Yui responds by "buying" him for 720,000 yen. What begins as an odd arrangement gradually becomes a warm, unconventional bond, and to their surprise, an unpredictable love gradually starts to take shape between.

This film is based on a 2021 novel of the same name, which won the 28th Shimase Romantic Literature Award, and stars Ko Shibasaki and Eiji Akaso. Directed by Hiroki Kazama (*silent, The Beginning of the Sea*), the story delicately explores the subtleties of the heart in a faithful adaptation of the original novel's meditation on life and how to live it. Together with veteran screenwriter Yoshikazu Okada (*Beyond Goodbye, The Last 10 Years*), they have teamed up to create a film that offers a fresh perspective on one's remaining years and reexamines the brilliance of life.

Love Village Season 3

A group of men and women aged 35 to 60 search for the last love of their lives in this romance reality show — now set against the stunning backdrop of Mount Fuji.

Love Village is a romance reality show that follows singles between 35 to 60 who hope to find their “final love” while living together in a traditional Japanese house. Season 1 premiered in May 2023 and spent six weeks in Netflix’s Weekly Top 10 Shows in Japan, followed by a second season in November 2024. The participants have all experienced life’s hardships — from divorce and grief to breast cancer and choosing to freeze their eggs — and their honest, vulnerable journeys struck a deep chord with many viewers. The series’ unprecedented commitment to depicting realistic romance has resonated with audiences and earned it a fiercely loyal following.

Season 3 shifts to a communal house at the foot of Mount Fuji, where a new group of adults will again look for love. Atsushi Tamura and Becky return as in-studio hosts to watch over the residents’ endearing attempts at connection. Will the residents be able to find true love and leave the house with a partner?






