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"The new sleek design, factory lighting and updated tech make this bike a true purpose-built police motorcycle."



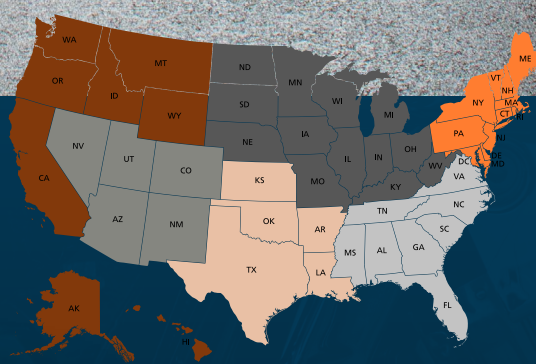

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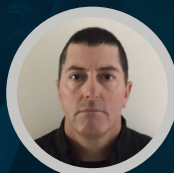

Harley-Davidson has collaborated with police agencies nationwide for over 117 years. And while the motorcycles themselves have changed over that time, the Motor Company's dedication to serving law enforcement has remained steadfast.

Now that dedication continues with the Road Glide—the purpose-built motorcycle crafted for the challenges and demands of the job and the exclusive model for Harley-Davidson® police motorcycles going forward.



First introduced at the 2023 Harley-Davidson Homecoming® Festival marking Harley-Davidson's 120th anniversary, the Road Glide police motorcycle is the result of a four-step development process: listening to police agencies and motor officers, translating that feedback into design, rigorous testing and delivering a refined final model.

LIGHTING THE WAY TO PERFORMANCE AND PRECISION

With the 2026 Road Glide, Harley-Davidson introduces factory-installed lighting, which streamlines production and gets the motorcycles to officers faster. Police agencies still have options when it comes to lighting customization.



Redesigned hand controls make operating the bike's LED lighting simple.

“You can program the lights to red, white, blue and amber,” said Rob Grimsley, Police & Fleet Sales Representative, Harley-Davidson. “You can also program the bike so that after it comes to a stop and is tilted at eight degrees, your light pattern will slow down, from ‘pursuit fast’ to ‘blocking,’ and the siren turns off so the officer can hear the dispatcher and other officers. Then, when the bike goes above 10 miles an hour, the lights will return to a flashing pattern.”

The 2026 Road Glide also introduces Intersection Clear, which automatically adjusts lights and sirens for seven seconds to help officers safely clear intersections before reverting to regular operation.

“Harley took everything we said over the past few years and put it into this 2026 model,” stated Commander Scott Lundquist, Jacksonville Sheriff's Office. “The escort mode allows you to turn off the rear emergency light when running an escort at night or following other officers so they can see their brake lights better.”





ENGINEERED FOR POWER AND MANEUVERABILITY

Equipped with Harley-Davidson's high-performance CVO™ engine, the 2026 Road Glide® police motorcycle accelerates from 0 to 60 in just 4.46 seconds, helping officers intercept and stop violators faster. The engine's variable valve timing automatically adjusts based on RPM to deliver optimal performance when it's needed most.

Weighing less than many other police motorcycles on the market today, Road Glide offers exceptional low-speed maneuverability. "The Road Glide handles beautifully at both low and high speeds, so you get the best of both worlds," Grimsley noted.

"I had the opportunity to see the 2026 Road Glide in Milwaukee alongside other members of Harley-Davidson's Police Advisory Board, which includes representatives from police agencies," said Eric Anderson, Service Manager at Indianapolis Southside Harley-Davidson. "Riding it on Harley's test track, we were very impressed with its handling and overall performance."

A Mobile Command Center Designed for Comfort

A motorcycle serves as a motor officer's mobile command center, and the 2026 Road Glide was designed with comfort and ergonomics in mind. "The comfort and control features, like an adjustable seat (front and rear), and an adjustable brake lever, give the rider better control of the bike," said Captain Harold Morris, Fairfax County Police Department.

"As motor officers, we're looking for comfort and reliability," said Peter DeMayo, Special Operations—Motorcycle Unit, Boston Police Department. "The new 2026 model has better engine cooling, making it comfortable for the officer, and I like the redesigned hand controls."

LIVEWIRE® S2 DEL MAR® PATROL

When Harley-Davidson unveiled the LiveWire in 2019, it marked the Motor Company's entry into electric motorcycles. What started as a groundbreaking innovation has since evolved into its own brand—the first publicly traded electric motorcycle company in the U.S. Today, the S2 Del Mar Patrol represents the next evolution, redefining police motorcycles with performance, efficiency and zero emissions.



Built with motor officer units in mind, the S2 Del Mar Patrol combines instant torque, swift acceleration and near-silent operation—making it an ideal fit for urban police work, emergency response, security details, events and motorcades. Its clutch-free design allows riders to operate the bike using just the traditional right-hand throttle and foot brake, helping them stay focused on their surroundings and duties while reducing fatigue during extended shifts or low-speed patrols.

“Police agencies that have tested the bike have overwhelmingly positive feedback, praising its ease of use and outstanding performance,” said Min Shik Ahn, Manager EV Customer Dealer Advocate, LiveWire. The St. Cloud Police Department in St. Cloud, Florida, is the first agency to officially add the S2 Del Mar Patrol to its fleet, with five units now in operation.

The LAPD and LA County Sheriff’s Department have conducted the same testing and grading that standard Harley-Davidson® police motorcycles complete, with the riding officers positively noting the Patrol’s agility and handling. Final testing results to come at the end of 2025.





Upfitted with patrol-ready features, including lights, siren, top case, side carriers, hand controls, windshield and hand guards, the S2 Del Mar Patrol is built for duty. Riders can choose from four preset ride modes—sport, road, range and rain—plus two customizable modes defined by the rider. An adjustable suspension further enhances comfort and control, allowing for a tailored riding experience.

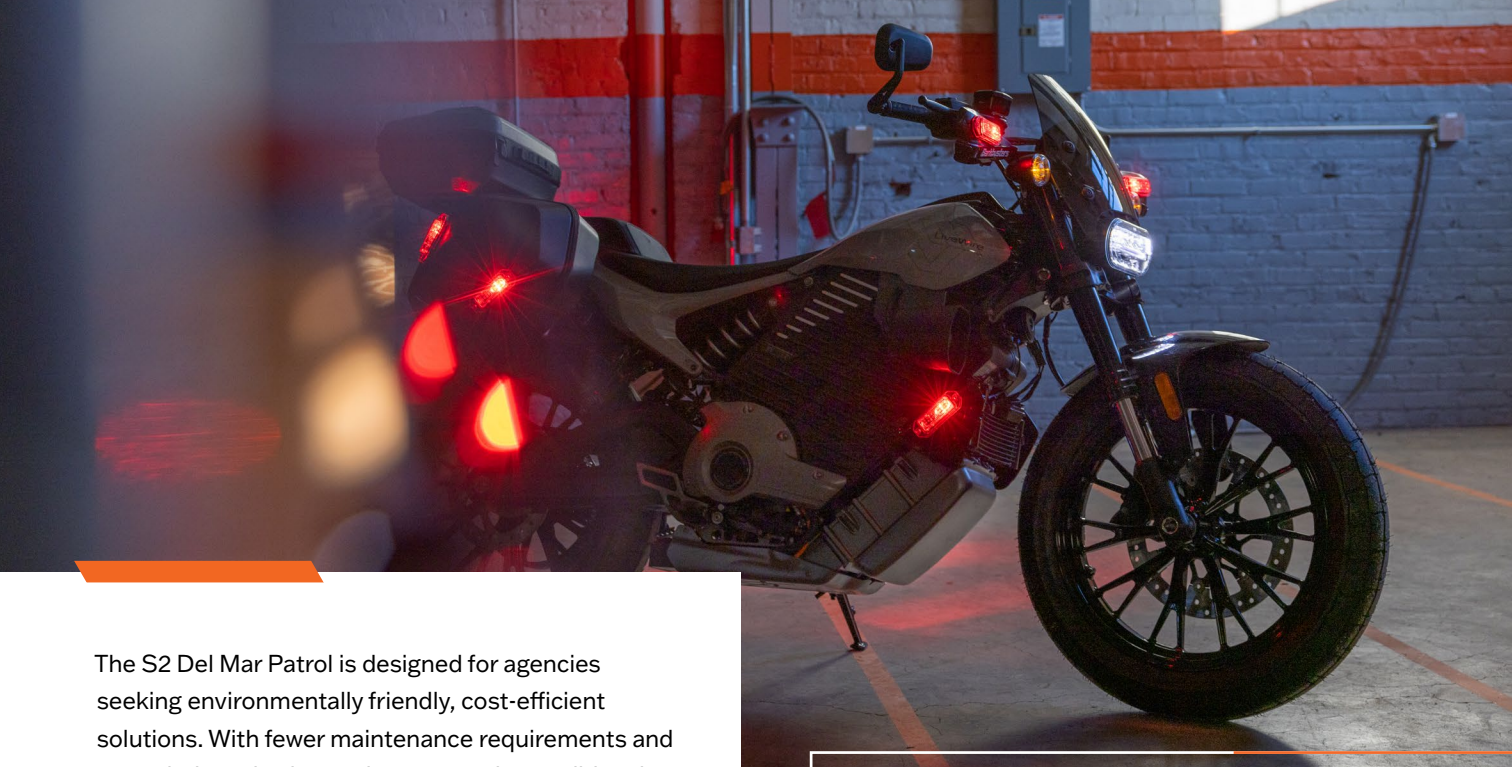

With zero emissions, quiet operation and no engine heat, the incredibly versatile S2 Del Mar Patrol is suited to both outdoor use and enclosed environments such as stadiums and airports. Its lighter weight makes it accessible to a broader range of operators. “EMS agencies have told us that they’re really looking forward to getting some of their smaller team members on the bike,” Ahn shared. “The Del Mar can get specialized EMTs to the accident scenes in congested cities much quicker.”

The S2 Del Mar Patrol represents the next generation of police motorcycles, combining impressive power, clean performance, simplified maintenance and operator comfort. As law enforcement and emergency agencies look for more sustainable solutions for their fleets, the S2 Del Mar Patrol will be there to answer the call.
