Bachelor degrees

Our Health Science Bachelor degrees combine theory and practical experience across a range of specialist areas including Naturopathy, Nutrition, Acupuncture and Chinese Medicine.

Bachelor of Health Science (Acupuncture Therapies)

Acupuncture is a branch of Chinese medicine that stimulates specific points on the body to regulate the flow of Qi (vital energy) to restore health and balance the functions of the body, mind and spirit.

Acupuncture therapies combine Chinese medicine theory (philosophy and principles) with Chinese manual therapy practices including acupuncture, moxibustion, Qi Gong, and Chinese remedial massage (Tui Na), supported by Chinese dietary therapy and prepared Chinese herbs.

Chinese medicine is a whole medical system that seeks to balance the functions of the body, mind and spirit and restore health. Chinese medicine combines theory (philosophies and principles) and practices including acupuncture, moxibustion, medical Qi Gong, Chinese remedial massage (Tui Na), Chinese herbal prescribing and dispensing, and Chinese dietary therapy.

Bachelor of Health Science (Naturopathy)

Student Visa holders may study this course by completing our Diploma of Health Science or a one-year equivalent credit pathway first.

Naturopathy is a whole medical system combining an array of natural therapies to support healing and maintain health. Naturopaths aim to treat the underlying causes of illness and disease. Students experience a holistic learning environment, broadening their studies across biological sciences to understand the human body and its functions. The core principle of “healing through nature” guides the naturopath’s use of nutrition, dietary counselling, herbal medicine, manual therapies, flower essences, lifestyle education and homeopathy.

Bachelor of Health Science (Clinical Nutrition)*

Student Visa holders may study this course by completing our Diploma of Health Science or a one-year equivalent credit pathway first.

Clinical nutritionists integrate traditional food wisdom and current evidence to motivate individuals and communities to eat well and live healthier lives.

Disease prevention is approached and managed through a multidimensional lens. Nutrient adequacy, food quality, dietary behaviours and lifestyle are assessed to develop individualised Nutrition Care Plans. Clinical Nutrition studies broaden during the degree to include nutritional biochemistry, weight management, clinical nutrition, dietary planning, sports nutrition, nutritional physiology research and public health nutrition.

Higher Education Diplomas

A higher education diploma is the perfect entry qualification towards a career in natural health. Our higher education diplomas are structured to provide you with future study pathways and career opportunities across Nutrition, Naturopathy, Acupuncture, and Chinese Medicine.

Why choose a Diploma of Health Science?

The Diploma of Health Science can be studied entirely overseas, from your home country. International students can complete the Diploma of Health Science in familiar surroundings, while building a relationship with lecturers and the College community online.

Upon graduation, students will have study credits and may have the option to pathway into the second year of our nutrition or naturopathy degrees, which can be studied in Australia. The benefit for you as an international student, is that you will already have foundational knowledge and an established network ready to welcome you to Australia if you wish to further your studies beyond the Diploma of Health Science (and a lowered cost of study due to the ability to complete initial studies from overseas).

While it's important to note that the Diploma of Health Science does not guarantee an Australian Student Visa, what it does provide is the possibility to qualify for a Genuine Temporary Entrant (GTE) Visa, which allows students to come to Australia for the purpose of gaining a quality education.

- › Study the Diploma of Health Science from overseas
- › Lower cost due to the ability to study from your home country and continue with current employment
- › Choose to study full time (one year) or part time (two years)
- › Classes delivered via live stream in AEST but are then available online to view at a time that suits you

Diploma of Health Science (Chinese Remedial Massage)

Chinese remedial massage utilises a range of manual therapy techniques developed within Chinese medicine to assess and support conditions commonly experienced within the community.

Techniques including Tui Na (Chinese remedial massage), acupressure, moxibustion, cupping, gua sha, topical herbal applications and medical Qi Gong are utilised to holistically support clients across the lifespan with special emphasis on clinical and musculoskeletal conditions.

Once you graduate you are eligible for membership with professional associations relevant to your field of study, such as Complementary Medicine Association, The Nutrition Society of Australia, and the Australian Natural Therapists Association.

These levels have been set to ensure the student will have the ability to successfully engage in study.

Applicants with English as their native language are not required to undertake an assessment of their English skills.

A high school transcript or subsequent qualification would be sufficient evidence that education was conducted in the English language.

Visa requirements

What is an International Student?

Endeavour defines an International Student as someone who is not an Australian citizen, permanent resident or a New Zealand citizen. This definition includes students studying onshore on a range of visas. Information that applies only to students studying on specific visa classes (e.g. Student Visa) will be specified when relevant. Endeavour College of Natural Health is registered on the Commonwealth Register of Institutions and Courses for Overseas Students (CRICOS) to deliver courses to international students studying on a student visa.

Student visas

There are a number of visa subclasses accepted for study by Endeavour College of Natural Health.

Higher Education (500)

Applies to a Bachelor degree:

- You must meet the conditions of your student visa at all times
- Report any change to your enrolment to the Department of Home Affairs (DHA)
- A full time (100%) study load must be undertaken unless a reduced workload is approved due to compassionate or compelling circumstances

Temporary visa holders

Australian international temporary visas are varied and many subclasses of visa may be eligible to study in Australia. Please confirm with DHA that your visa allows you to study prior to enrolling at Endeavour.

The following types of visa may allow you to study in Australia:

- Employer Sponsored Workers visa (subclass 457)
- Other Professional and Work visas (various subclasses)
- Visitor visas (subclass 600) Working Holiday visas (subclass 417 and 462)
- Retirement visas (subclass 410 only)
- Medical Treatment visas (subclass 602, 675, 685)
- Bridging visas (various subclasses)

Other visas not listed above may allow you to study in Australia for a fixed period of time. If you hold another visa and are interested in studying at the College, please check with DHA if you are eligible to study.

Temporary visa holders (students that hold a temporary visa other than a student visa) may enrol in any available course at any campus and may also study part time and online.

If the prospective student's visa does not cover the length of the course, they must provide the College with a statement that explains the way in which they intend to complete the course.

Overseas Visitor Health Cover (OVHC) for students on other temporary visas: All students are encouraged to arrange Overseas Visitor Health Cover (OVHC).

Bottlebrush

This striking plant known for its bright red blooms is a rich source of essential nutrient including potassium, manganese, and selenium. Traditionally, bottlebrush was used to treat kidney ailments, bleeding, ulcers, and tuberculosis. Studies have shown that bottlebrush's antioxidant and antihyperglycemic presence may act a therapeutic agent in diabetes.





Finger Lime

Used by Indigenous peoples for centuries, finger limes provide a number of health benefits. Studies have shown that the citric acid content in finger limes can act as an antibacterial agent which can treat wounds and ulcers. It's high in vitamin C which can help boost immunity as well as aid in collagen formation for healthy skin. On top of this, finger limes contain vitamin E – an antioxidant which protects our cells from damage.

Insurance requirements

Insurance requirements assist international students meet the costs of medical and hospital care you may need while in Australia.

What is Overseas Student Health Cover (OSHC)?

OSHC is insurance to assist international students to meet the costs of medical and hospital care that they may need while in Australia. OSHC will also pay limited benefits for pharmaceuticals and ambulance services.

Who has to take out OSHC?

People who must take out OSHC are overseas students undertaking formal studies in Australia and their dependents (for example, spouses and children under 18 years old).

For the purposes of OSHC, 'overseas student' means:

- a person who is the holder of a student visa (subclass 500); or
- a person who:
 - > is an applicant for a student visa; and
 - > is the holder of a bridging visa; and
 - > was immediately before being granted the bridging visa, the holder of a student visa.

The Department of Home Affairs requires overseas students to maintain OSHC for the duration of time they are in Australia. For further information please visit the [Department of Home Affairs website](#).

Who doesn't have to take out OSHC?

Belgian, Norwegian and some Swedish students are not required to purchase OSHC as part of their visa requirements. International students on any other visa than a subclass 500 (i.e. another temporary visa) are encouraged to take out Overseas Visitor Health Cover (OVHC) but this is not a visa requirement.

How do I purchase OSHC?

You can purchase your own OSHC online by visiting insurer's websites. Please ensure it is an Australian OSHC product that you are purchasing, not travel or other medical insurance. You retain the right to choose your own OSHC provider even when your educational institution makes a specific recommendation because they have negotiated a preferred provider arrangement with a particular insurer.

How much does OSHC cost?

The cost of OSHC varies depending on the type of cover required. The average cost of minimum cover is \$685 for 12 months singles cover, \$2354 for 12 months couples cover, and \$3582 family cover (Australian dollars).

After you apply

Step 1: Submit certified documents to support your application

You will need to arrange certified copies of the following:

- Passport
- All academic qualifications that satisfy course entry requirements
- Evidence of English language proficiency that satisfy course entry requirements
- Current visa (If you are already in Australia)

Step 2: Enrolment interview

To finalise your application (and enrol you as a student) we will need to connect with you to talk through your study needs and confirm your details.

This process is called an enrolment interview. Please be assured this process is designed to ensure we understand your needs as a student and that these match what Endeavour can offer.

In addition, we will discuss with you the Inherent Course Requirements of the course you have chosen to study, to ensure you understand the task requirements of the course (and of practitioners in these fields) and that you will be able to meet those requirements.

Step 3: Offer, written agreement and payment

Once your interview is completed and it has been determined that you meet the entry requirements, the following documents will be sent to you via email:

- Letter of Offer
- International Student written agreement
- International Student Handbook

Upon receiving these documents, you will be required to sign and return the written agreement and make upfront payment of fees as outlined within that document (including enrolment fee, first semester tuition fees and any OSHC fees).

Step 4: Confirmation of Enrolment (Student visa holders only)

Once acceptance and payment have been received, we will issue you with a Confirmation of Enrolment (COE). This is the document that is required for your student visa application.

Step 5: Welcome email

You will be enrolled into the subjects as per the course structure and a welcome email including the following information will be sent to you:

- Orientation details
- Timetable
- Student ePortal information
- Learning Management System (LMS) and free online enabling courses
- Policies and Procedures

Step 6: Arrive in Australia and prepare to commence your studies

It is important that you present to your campus as soon as possible after your arrival in Australia, to provide us with a copy of your student visa and your local contact details (as required by your visa conditions, must be provided within seven days of arrival).

Prior to course commencement we encourage you to prepare for your study by studying our online enabling courses, available free on your LMS (ask your Admissions Adviser if you can't find them).

Step 7: Orientation and course commencement

Orientation normally takes place during the week before your course commencement date. A number of activities during orientation week will be offered to fully prepare you for successful study at the College. It is important that you attend as many orientation activities on your campus as possible, and particularly the international student orientation which will be an online livestream session with our dedicated Student Support Coordinator.

Credit transfers and prior learning

If you have already studied an Australian qualification or degree, or are currently studying one, you may be eligible for advanced standing towards an Endeavour degree.

Likewise, if you have completed informal learning or a structured course that did not lead to a qualification, you may be eligible for a credit transfer. These options are known as Educational Pathways.
