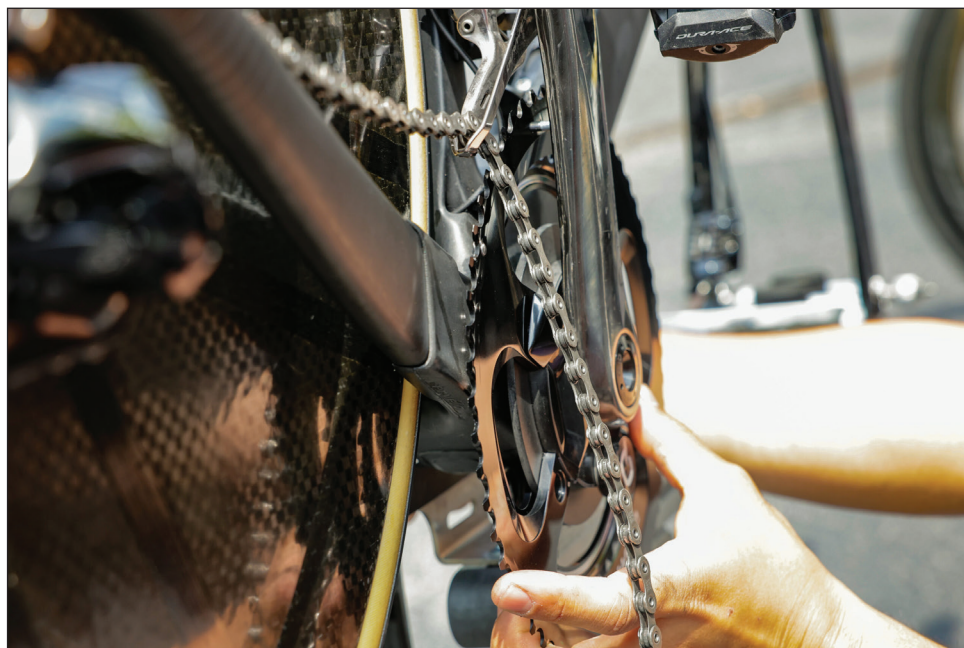

TRAINING

TRAINING SESSION

Cummings Research Park — Individual Time Trial course only. Thursday, September 3rd, 17:00–19:00.

- All handcycle riders must have a flag on their handcycle.
- Team cars are NOT ALLOWED on course during the training session.
- All riders must follow the Time Trial course as it is laid out.
- The Road Race course will not be open at this time for training.

TRAINING ON OPEN ROADS

All handcycle riders must display a flag on their handcycle so that they are visible to vehicles (if you need a flag, visit your hotel front desk or the Race Office at the Westin).

All riders must follow the rules of the road when training during unofficial times. Riders who do not follow road rules may be subject to standard road violations.



RACE OPERATIONS

SCORING & RESULTS

Race timing is managed with a finish-line camera and transponders. Race times will be posted on the race clocks above the finish line, and results will be posted on-site as well as on the event website:

TRANSPONDERS

All athletes are required to use transponders. No deposit is required. Should a rider, mechanic or team member damage or lose a transponder, a charge of \$100.00 USD per transponder will be applied to the team, payable upon confirmation of the damaged or lost transponder and billed by the end of the event.

Transponders will be distributed to team managers after the Team Managers Meeting on Thursday, September 3rd, 2026.

RACE NUMBERS

Athletes will be issued race numbers required for classification at the team managers meeting, by nation. A communiqué will be sent to athletes with more details and instructions concerning race number placement.

HANDCYCLE MIXED TEAM RELAY — TEAM COMPOSITION (ART. 16.7.012)

- Teams consist of 3 riders plus substitutes.
- The relay is mixed-gender; each team must include at least one female rider.
- Eligible classes — Men: H1, H2, H3, H4, H5 · Women: H1, H2, H3, H4, H5
- A team's classification points cannot exceed 9 points.
- The team must include at least one rider worth 2 points or fewer.

ON COURSE

VEHICLES & DOPING CONTROL

Any team or support vehicle wishing to use official team parking and/or access the field of play must submit its vehicle details during the accreditation process. Vehicles without accreditation will be turned away from official event spaces.

TEAM CARS

Team cars are permitted to follow athletes during time trials. Drivers must hold a UCI license as well as a national driving license and/or an International Driving Permit (IDP) valid in the USA. Please keep a hard copy of your UCI license on the dash, or a digital copy on your phone/tablet, while on the race course.

No team cars are allowed in the road race convoys. Teams may service riders at the feed zone on the road race course. If Shimano neutral service is unable to repair an athlete's equipment on the road, a broom wagon service is available to return athletes and their cycles to Start/Finish/Athlete Village.

Follow-car and windscreen stickers will be handed out with team packets after the team managers meeting, based on UCI regulations.

DOPING CONTROL

All anti-doping testing will take place within the Athlete Village area. Signs will direct you to the Anti-Doping location at 701 McMillian Way NW, Suite C (north of the village).

Doping Control Officers and chaperones will be on site and will notify any athlete selected for doping control; chaperones will guide selected athletes and support staff to the doping control station.

Awards and podiums will be on the stage located in the Athlete Village throughout the day — please see the competition schedule for exact times.

- All athletes are required to attend and to follow UCI rules for podium attire.
- Athletes who do not attend the podium ceremony, or who do not wear appropriate attire, will face a fine by the UCI.

STARTING ORDER FOR TIME TRIAL

Per Article 16.7.010 of the UCI Regulations:

The UCI may decide to have several sport classes and/or age categories start together as one group. The starting order of sport classes in time trials shall be established so as to minimise the possibility of athletes of one sport class passing athletes of another sport class (e.g., C5–C4–C3).

Within each sport class, age category or group, for events that are solely time trials, the starting order shall be determined as follows:

- The reverse order of the most recently published general UCI Ranking; then
- The reigning Time Trial World Champion or outgoing Time Trial World Champion.

RADIO-TOUR

For Individual Time Trial only — radios will be provided to each team car following its designated rider. Radios will be handed out at the ITT start house area, prior to entering the race course, and collected from each team car after it exits the course at the designated deviation point (Farrow Rd, 300 metres before the finish line).

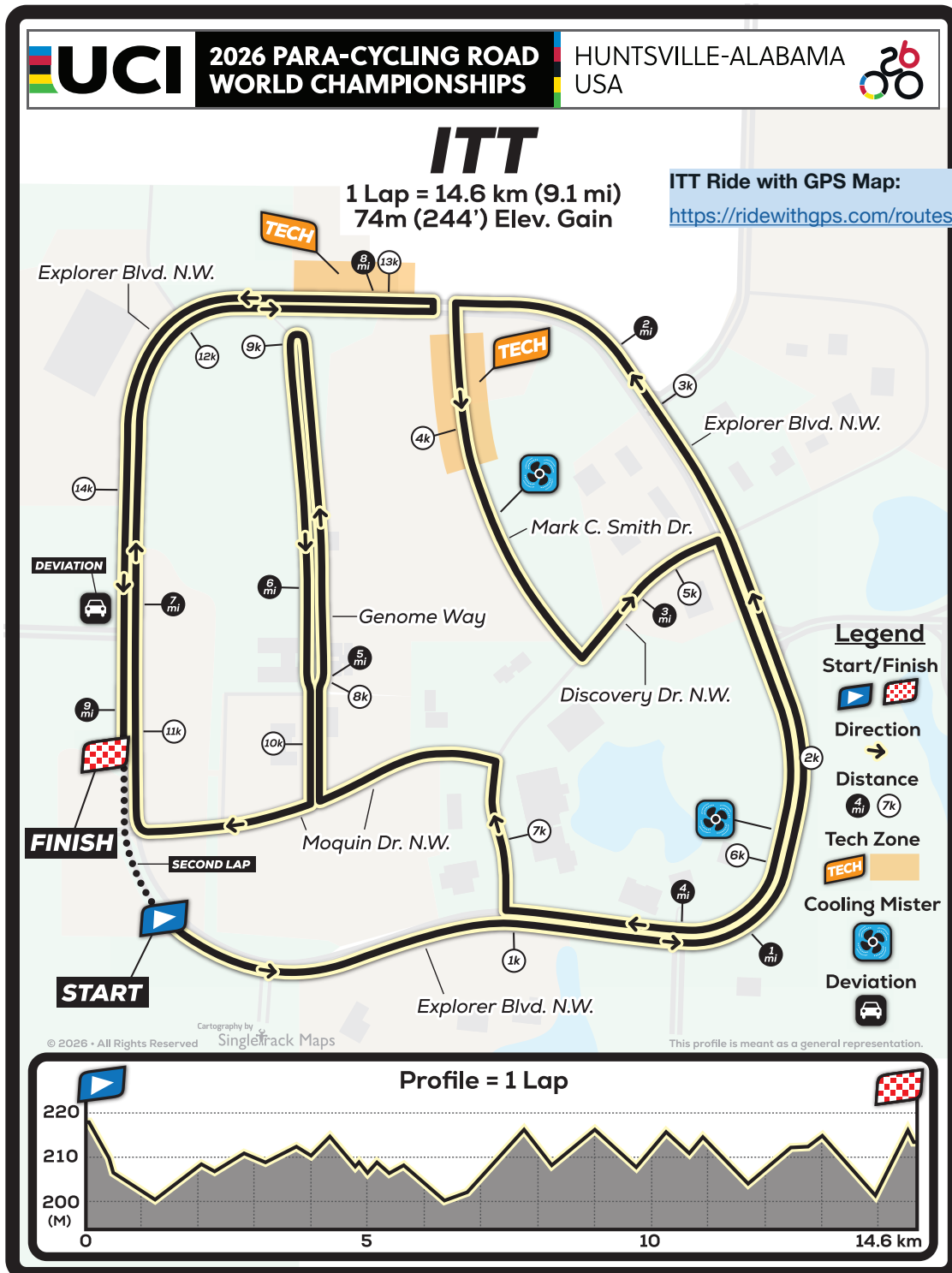

PPO/ATHLETE VILLAGE ACCESS MAP

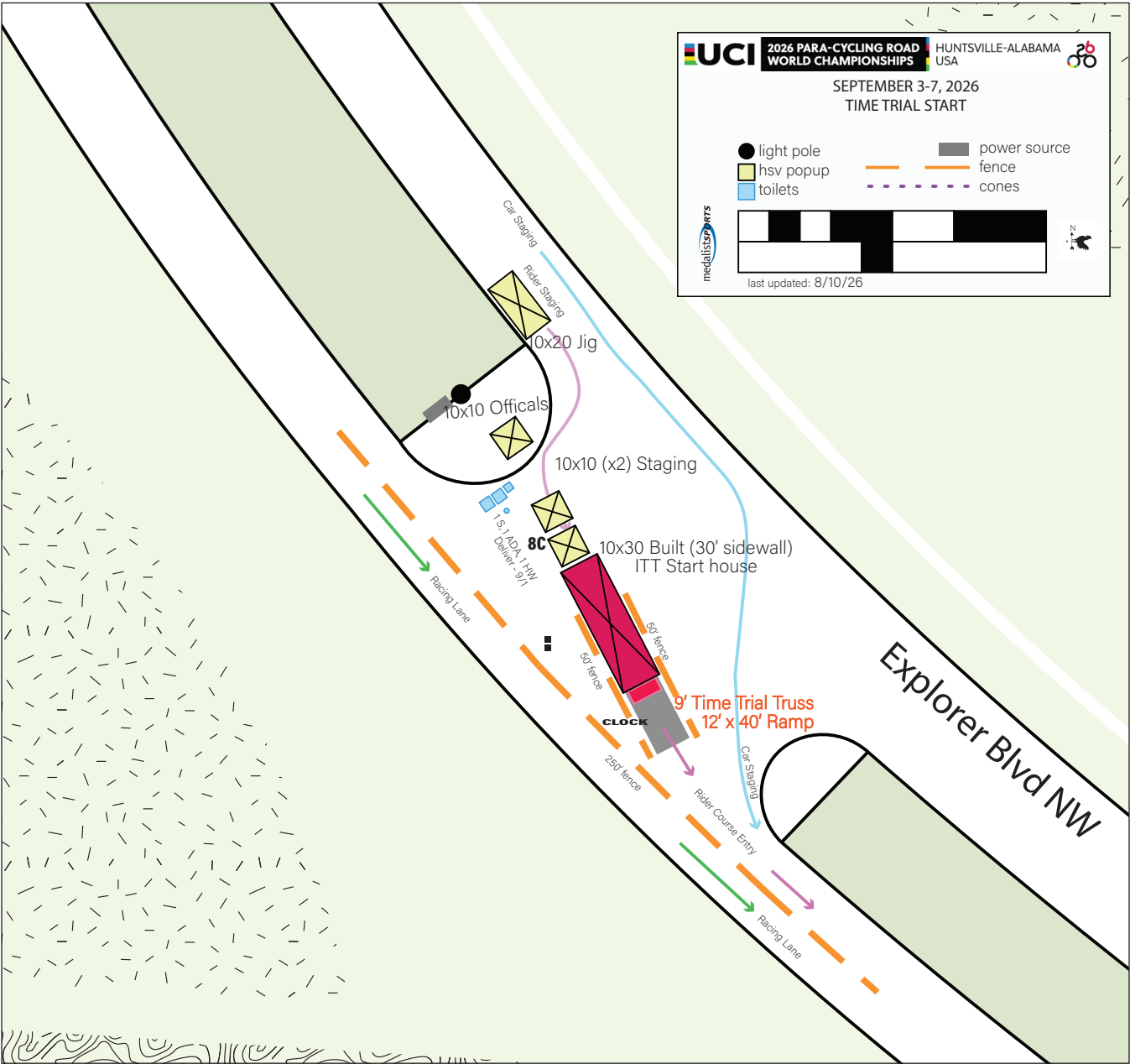

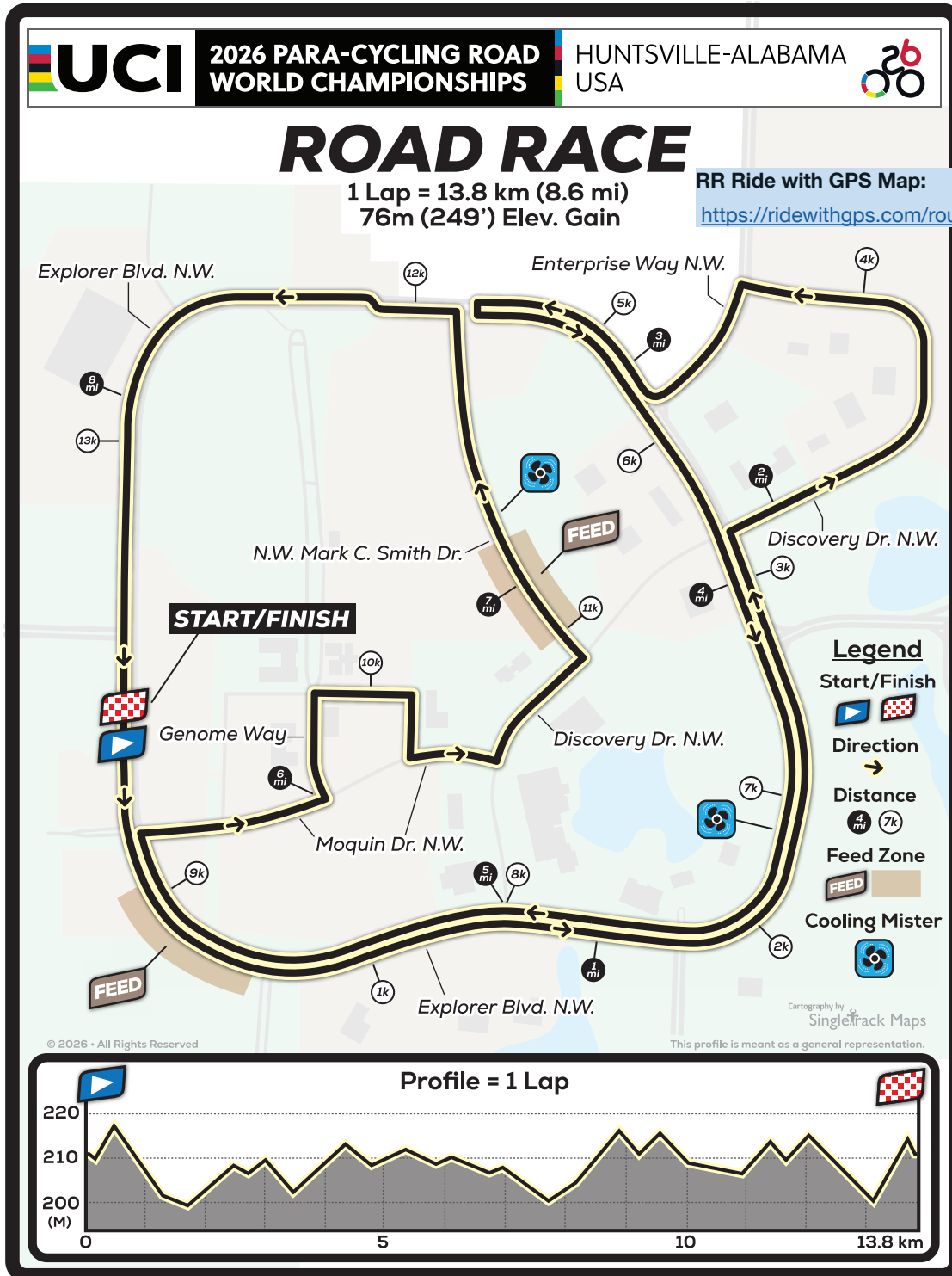


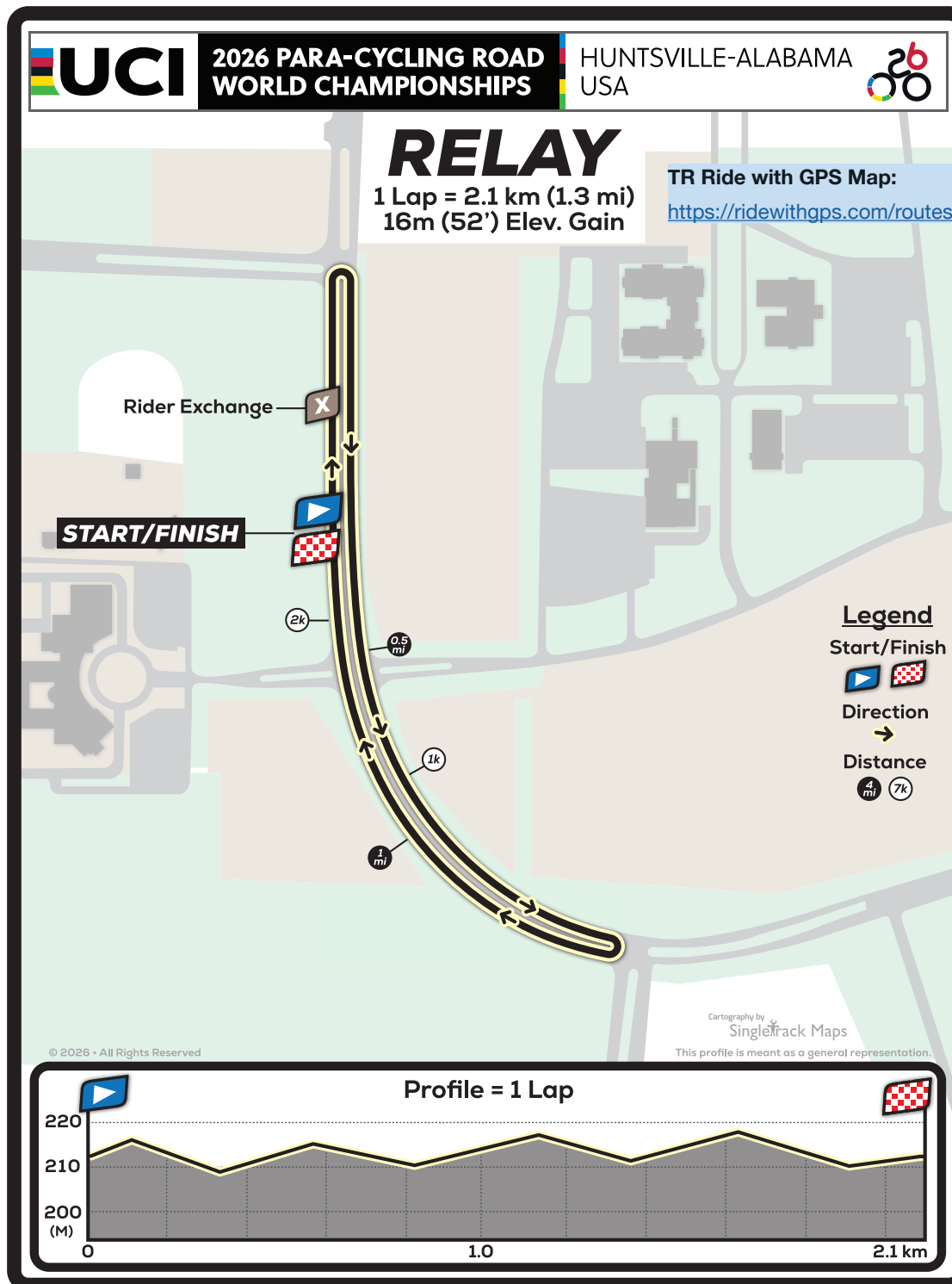
