very year, the UCI Road World Championships give rise to a level of excitement and range of emotions that mark not only the athletes, but millions of fans worldwide eager to witness this magnificent sporting show.

The prospect of winning the rainbow jersey and joining road cycling's prestigious list of UCI World Champions is a source of unparalleled motivation for cyclists competing at the very top of our sport.

This year, that motivation will be all the higher, given that we are celebrating the centenary of the UCI Road World Championships. Our 2021 UCI World Champions will be crowned exactly 100 years after Sweden's Gunnar Sköld raced to victory in Copenhagen, Denmark, in 1921.

Since then, our UCI Road Worlds have crowned a great many champions, men and women, who have contributed to our sport's incredible history. Cycling's ever-evolving story continues this year in the renowned cycling region of Flanders. Flanders has already hosted our UCI Road World Championships four times – in Moorslede in 1950, Waregem in 1957, and Ronse in 1963 then again in 1988 – and is also famous for its organisation of some of the great Classics that see riders tackle the region's challenging cobbles and demanding "monts".

We therefore have no doubt that the 2021 UCI Road World Championships will be of the highest quality. For this, I would like to extend my sincere thanks to everyone involved in their organisation, not least Flanders 2021, EventFlanders, the Flemish Government, the host cities Knokke-Heist, Brugge, Antwerp and Leuven, as well as all the event's partners, sponsors, officials and volunteers, all of whom have an important part to play in the success of this major competition. As always, we can also rely on the commitment and support of Belgium's National Cycling Federation, the Royale Ligue Vélocipédique Belge, and its President Tom Van Damme.

The 2021 UCI Road World Championships will be a major celebration of the last 100 years. The UCI has invited its former and current UCI World Champions from the world over to join us in Flanders for this celebration, and to take part in numerous activities organised in their honour. Never before have so many UCI World Champions been gathered in the same place at the same time. Between 19 and 26 September, their number will swell when we discover who will be crowned 2021 UCI World Champions.

We can be sure to witness exciting battles, and on behalf of the UCI, I wish the best of luck to all participants in the centenary edition of the UCI Road World Championships.

WELCOME TO FLANDERS

Exactly 100 years after the very first edition which took place in Copenhagen in Denmark in 1921, the UCI Road World Championships is coming home to the heart of Europe, in the Flanders region of Belgium, from 19 to 26 September 2021. This historical edition will be marked by different celebrations including a gala dinner with former UCI Road World Champions as guests of honour.

Bordering the North Sea to the west, Flanders lies between the Netherlands and France. Flanders is the northern, Dutch-speaking region of Belgium and is the gateway to Europe. The main cities are Antwerp, Ghent, Brugge and Leuven.

Cycling is an integral part of Flanders' heritage. With a terrain of winding, narrow and sometimes brutal roads, the ancient cobbles stand testament to the pain, courage and endurance of many of the most hardened cycling champions.

Races such as the Tour of Flanders – Ronde van Vlaanderen (one of the five cycling Monuments) and Gent-Wevelgem in Flanders Fields offer a labyrinth of intricate routes that weave between traditional villages and farmland. Flanders' line between the epic and the ordinary, the mortal and the hero, the dream and the reality, is sometimes as thin as it gets. The region is the territory of the true "Flandriens": strong and relentless cyclists, who never give up and keep on riding, even in the most inclement of weather conditions. In Flanders, the honorary status of "Flandrien" is only granted to cycling legends such as Eddy Merckx, Johan Museeuw, Tom Boonen or Yvonne Reynders.

It's more than just bicycle routes, Flanders is a unique place for every cycling passionate. The cobbled climbs set it apart from other destinations. You can experience the four K's of Flandrien heritage: the fabled Koppenberg, the everlasting Kwaremont, the legendary Kapelmuur and the ferocious Kemmelberg. Anyone calling themselves a real cyclist, must have conquered the Flanders' bergs and cobbles at least once in their life.

Flanders is an all-year-round cycling mecca. Every weekend in winter, there are races in muddy, or frozen fields or forests.

Cycling - recreationally as well as competitively -, is not merely popular: it is deeply loved in Flanders. The region was awarded the UCI Bike City Label in February 2021. This label supports and rewards cities and regions which not only host major UCI cycling events but also invest in developing community cycling, related infrastructure and programmes.

The Flemish government invests up to 300 million euro a year to maintain or build cycle paths. Safety is an absolute priority for cycle policy in Flanders. That's why there's been heavy investment in the necessary infrastructure.

Flanders is equally ambitious when it comes to sport. This is apparent through the region's commitment to organising large sporting events and constructing modern sports infrastructure, but even more so in the sports participation rate of its population. Almost 65 percent of the population engages frequently in sport.

- Cars cannot be left at the Vehicule Delivery Office. If transfer from Brussels Airport (Zaventem) to the official Fleet Contact Centre for vehicle collection is required, please contact <u>transportation@flanders2021</u>. <u>com</u> no later than by 05/09/2021.
- Allow for 30 min to collect your car
- National Federation personnel will need to provide an international driving license, an identity card/ passport, and an attestation by the National Federation:
- Payment of a deposit of 2'050,00€ by bank/credit card. Cash payments are not accepted. This amount contains a deposit of 1'700,00€ for the vehicle as well as an advance for the fuel of 350,00€
- The deposits will be returned by bank transfer to the National Federation, 30 days after the event. The advance of the fuel card is calculated on the basis of use. If there is a surplus, this amount will be refunded along with the deposit. If additional payment is required, an invoice will be issued.
- No vehicle will be provided without the payment of the deposit.
- Two documents need to be filled in and signed : Fleet vehicle use agreement and driver conduct requirements.
- The vehicle check will be carried out with a team member after which the car pack, car key and fuel card will be transferred to the driver.

OTHER INFORMATIONS

- The vehicles are equipped with roof racks for a minimum of 9 bikes
- The vehicles are fitted with radio equipment that receives Radio Tour
- The removal, modification or addition of any elements of the vehicle decor is strictly prohibited
- Refueling is only permitted with the fuel card available in the car and this only at Esso petrol stations
- National Federations pay for cleaning of their cars
- In the event of a Road accident:

- The maximum authorized rate of alcohol while driving is 0% - Zero tolerance in Belgium
- The speed limit on motorways is 120km/h 75mph.
- In city centers, the maximum speed is 50km/h 30mph in Flanders and Wallonia, and 30km/h – 15mph in the Brussels-Capital Region.
- Outside city centers, the speed limit is 70km/h 45mph in Flanders and 90km/h – 55mph in Brussels and Wallonia.
- In other areas speed limits does vary.

ROAD TOLLS

All drivers, regardless of nationality, must pay road tolls. These are payable by cash or card at the end via a toll booth (for cash payments) or at the automatic lanes (for payments by card).

Any teams, broadcasters, press and any other individuals planning to use radio equipment in Belgium must request a licence for the use of private radio communication stations from BIPT (the federal regulatory body responsible for regulating the electronic communications market, the postal market and the electromagnetic spectrum of radio frequencies).

Make sure to apply for a licence in time. For temporary licences, if an application is submitted less than five working days before the desired date of use, the handling fees are doubled. If an application is submitted less than two working days before the date of operation, the handling fees are quintupled. The BIPT advises to submit the application **twenty working days** before the desired date of licence use.

The date considered is that of the postmark in case of an application by letter or the date of receipt by the Institute in case of an application sent by fax or e-mail.

Medical permanence is provided at the finish zone of time trials and road races.

The permanence opens 1 hour before the start of the race. The medical permanence is equipped with all necessary first aid facilities and staffed by a doctor, a nurse and a paramedics team.

A paramedics team with a doctor will also be provided at the departure zone.

The UCI Anti-Doping Rules apply in their entirety. Furthermore, the anti-doping legislation of Belgium applies in accordance with the prevailing national laws.

The location of the doping control for each race is indicated in the special regulations of each race.

ARTICLE 8 - EQUIPMENT AND CLOTHING

DISC BRAKES

The use of disc brakes is allowed by all riders during all the events

JERSEYS AND DISTINCTIVE SIGNS

It is compulsory for all riders to wear their national team clothing (identical jersey and shorts for all riders).

World, Continental and National Champions must wear national team clothing that does not feature any distinctive bands on the sleeves or shorts

Furthermore, as the World title is at stake, it is strictly forbidden for any rider to use not only the World Champion's jersey but also rainbow bands on a bicycle or clothing during the UCI Road World Championships (including Team Time Trial Mixed Relay).

The sport directors of national teams must submit their national jersey and shorts to the Commissaires' Panel for approval during the confirmation of starters. They must describe the panels on the clothing approved by the National Federation for the use of each rider's sponsors.

ARTICLE 9 - PODIUM CEREMONIES

All podium ceremonies will take place immediately after the finish of the event. The organisation will provide an escort to guide the riders to the podium ceremony area without delay.

The World Champion and the second and third-placed riders must present themselves for the podium ceremony within 10 minutes of the finish of the event. This requirement also applies to the World Champion team, and se-cond and third-placed teams, in the Team Time Trial Mixed Relay.

Riders must present themselves in race clothing, wearing their national jersey and shall not wear a cap, headband, glasses or any other accessory until they leave the podium ceremony area.

ARTICLE 10 - DISTRIBUTION OF COMMUNIQUES AND RESULTS Results will be available on the <u>UCI Website</u> after each race and commu-niques will be sent by email to the sport directors of each team. Teams may also collect printed versions of the start lists and results at UCI

Headquarters.

The ranking by nations for the UCI World Championships is calculated by adding the points scored by a nation in the team time trial mixed relay, individual time trial and road race events, based on the points scale below:

The riders shall start at identical intervals; the riders' start order is drawn up by the UCI and communicated after the confirmation of starters.

ARTICLE 5 - EQUIPMENT CHECK

Riders must attend the equipment check at least 15 minutes before their start time. All bikes will be checked using a measuring jig that complies with UCI Regulations. A protocol ceremony will take place immediately after the last rider of the event has finished.

The first 3 riders must present themselves for the podium ceremony immediately after the last rider has crossed the finish line. The UCI awards a jersey to the UCI World Champion. Each rider on

the podium receives a medal.

Riders must present themselves in race clothing, wearing their national jersey and shall not wear a cap, headband, glasses or any other accessory until they leave the podium ceremony area.

ARTICLE 4 - START ORDER

The teams will start at identical intervals; the start order of the teams is drawn up by the UCI and communicated after the confirmation of starters. Men will start first and relay to their women teammates.

ARTICLE 5 - EQUIPMENT CHECK

The riders of each team must attend the equipment check at least 15 minutes before the scheduled start time of the team.

All bikes will be checked using a measuring jig that complies with UCI Regulations. Once checked, bikes will not be allowed outside the start area. A pre-check of bikes will be organised two hours before the first team starts in each of the events. Teams may present their bikes for checking at this time.

ARTICLE 6 - FOLLOWING VEHICLES

Each team will be allowed to follow their riders in a maximum of one team vehicle per gender.

The Team vehicle for the Men must take the deviation before the finish line and a second Team vehicle will follow the women. The nations following the Men and then the Women with the same vehicle must inform during the Sport Directors Meeting on Saturday 18 September, a specific bypass procedure having to be organized for these team vehicles.

Feeding from a following vehicle is prohibited.

ARTICLE 7 - RELAY ZONE

At the start, the riders shall be held side-by-side on the ramp and then released by the holders upon the relay signal, but not pushed.

The signal for the Women start will be given by a green light. Riders must respect the instructions given by the Commissaires who will supervise the relay zone and assign the start lanes.

ARTICLE 8 - TIMING POINTS

Intermediate timing points will be set up at different locations on the course. Times will be communicated by Radio Tour.

The finish time will be taken on the 2^{nd} rider of each team.

If there is a mechanical malfunction of the relay system provided by the race organisation that leads to an early or late start, the commissaires' panel may adjust the final results to take into account the actual times recorded.

ARTICLE 9 HOT SEAT AND PODIUM CEREMONY

HOT SEAT

For the benefit of the TV production, a Hot Seat will accommodate the team that has set the best provisional time.

The Hot Seat will be located in the finish area along the podium ceremony. Immediately after they have finished, the team having established the best provisional time is guided to the Hot Seat by an escort provided by the organisation.

As soon as a new best time is set, the team gives up its place to the new team at the top of the provisional standings.

A waiting area will be set up for the Men that are waiting for the Women finishing the race. All Men teams will have to go there while waiting for their Women team to pass.

Sport directors shall inform the riders and team assistants of these arrangements.

PODIUM CEREMONY

A podium ceremony will be held immediately after the last team has crossed the finish line.

Riders of the top three teams must attend the podium ceremony immediately after the final team has crossed the finish line. The UCI awards a jersey to all riders of the winning teams. Every rider of the podium-finishing teams is awarded a medal.

ARTICLE 4

TECHNICAL SERVICE AND FEEDING ZONES

SHIMANO will provide neutral service for the road races using four vehicles and two motorcycles.

A main Feed zone will be located on the right just after the finish line, 2 minutes' walk from team parking.

Wastes zones will be located after each feed zones. Riders must respect the environment and use the wastes zones. The UCI rules for waste zones apply. Teams can carry out technical assistance and change wheels and bikes at the team pits provided for this purpose after the finish line. Feeding will be also authorized from the Team's vehicle in accordance to the UCI regulations.

ARTICLE 5 FOLLOWING VEHICLES

Sport directors will be allowed to provide technical assistance from their team vehicles in accordance with the following arrangements:

Each nation is allowed one vehicle in the race convoy, in the following order:

- 1. the vehicles of nations with five or more riders in their team;
- 2. the vehicles of nations with fewer than five riders, arranged in descending order by the number of riders entered.
- 3. A maximum of 25 Team vehicles will be authorized in the race convoy. The groupings of nations will be communicated by the UCI after the riders' confirmation.
- 4. For those Individual riders who will not have a team vehicle in the race convoy, Neutral support will be provided.

Within each group, the order is determined by the most recently published UCI Men or Women Junior Nations' Cup ranking published on the Tuesday before the races. The order of the remaining unclassified nations is determined by drawing lots. For vehicles representing more than one nation, the best-placed nation on the ranking is taken into account.

ARTICLE 6 TIME LIMITS

Any rider dropped who is over 15 minutes behind the leading group may be eliminated by the UCI Commissaires' Panel. He must remove his body number and hand it in to commissaire or to the broom wagon. If he chooses to ride his bike to the finish, he must respect the legislation of the vehicle circulation and NOT cross the finish line. Riders on the circuit that are about to be lapped will be stopped on the finish line.

ARTICLE 7 PODIUM CEREMONY

A protocol ceremony will take place immediately after the first three riders have finished the race.

The first, second and third-placed riders in the race must attend the podium ceremony at the latest 5 minutes after the first rider has crossed the finish line.

Sport directors shall inform the riders and team assistants of these arrangements.

The UCI awards a jersey to the UCI World Champion. Each rider on the podium receives a medal.

The UCI awards trophies to the top three nations of the Women Junior UCI Nations' Cup ranking.

At the end of the podium ceremony, the first 3 riders of the race will be escorted to the victory ceremony organized by the LOC at the Monseigneur Ladeuzeplein ipv Ladeuzplein in the center of Leuven.

Within each group, the order is determined by the most recently published Elite and Under 23 Women's UCI World ranking by nation published on Tuesday before the races. For vehicles representing more than one nation, the best-placed nation is taken into account.

MEN ELITE

Each nation is allowed one vehicle in the race convoy, in the following order:

- 1. the vehicles of nations with eight riders in their team;
- 2. the vehicles of nations with six to seven riders in their team;
- 3. the vehicles of nations with fewer than six riders, arranged in descending order by the number of riders entered.

- 4. A maximum of 25 Team vehicle will be authorized in the race convoy. However, based on the number of riders/countries without a team vehicle in the race convoy, UCI may add additional vehicles. The groupings of nations will be communicated by the UCI after the riders' confirmation.
- 5. For those Individual riders who will not have a team vehicle in the race convoy, Neutral support will be provided.

In each group, the order is determined by the most recently published Elite and Under 23 Men's UCI World Ranking by nation. For vehicles representing more than one nation, the best-placed nation on the ranking is taken into account.

ARTICLE 6 TIME LIMITS

Any rider dropped who is over 15 minutes behind the leading group may be eliminated by the UCI Commissaires' Panel. He must remove his body number and hand it in to commissaire or to the broom wagon. If he chooses to ride his bike to the finish, he must respect the legislation of the vehicle circulation and NOT cross the finish line. Riders on the circuit that are about to be lapped will be stopped on the finish line.

ARTICLE 7 PODIUM CEREMONY

A protocol ceremony will take place immediately after the first three riders have finished the race.

The first, second and third-placed riders in the race must attend the podium ceremony at the latest 5 minutes after the first rider has crossed the finish line.

Sport directors shall inform the riders and team assistants of these arrangements.

The UCI awards a jersey to the UCI World Champion. Each rider on the podium receives a medal.

The UCI awards trophies to the top three nations of the Men Under 23 UCI Nations' Cup ranking.

The UCI awards a trophy to the best nation in the ranking by nations for the UCI World Championships.

At the end of the podium ceremony, the first 3 riders of the race will be escorted to the victory ceremony organized by the LOC at the Monseigneur Ladeuzeplein ipv Ladeuzplein in the center of Leuven.

Flanders hosted the 2021 UCI Cyclo-Cross World Championships and will host the UCI Road World Championships in September 2021.

The Flemish cycling policy plan was adopted in 2016, while a new strategy for bicycle use will be implemented in the runup to the 2021 UCI Road World Championships, allowing for collaboration between all governments, knowledge institutes, social organizations and platforms.

The network of cycling highways in Flanders includes 119 individual routes and a total of 2,650 km, while investments in cycling infrastructure should increase to 300 million euro a year by 2024.

Safety for all of the riders, race support personnel and spectators during the race is the number one priority when operating a motor vehicle in the race convoy. Here is a summary of the main driving guidelines and regulations to follow and respect during the UCI Road World Championships in Flanders.

- Have a valid a UCI license for the 2021 season (including third-party liability insurance)

- Obligation to respect UCI Regulations and Guidelines for vehicle circulation in the race convoy

- Each driver must focus on one thing: driving the vehicle in a responsible manner! It is recommended that <u>the Sport Director or the National Team Coach in charge consider being the passenger and an experience driver focus on driving the vehicle exclusively.</u>
