INTRODUCTION

The roadmap for the road cycling at the Paris 2024 Olympic Games contains an overview of the documents relating to the competition and provides a variety of other information designed to help teams with their planning and preparation for the Games.

All of the information contained in this guide is correct at the time of publication, but some details may change prior to the Games. NOC representatives are therefore invited to regularly consult the information published by Paris 2024 for the latest updates or to contact their Paris 2024 NOC liaison officer.

This road cycling roadmap has been designed as an operational manual for the Paris 2024 stakeholders and must not be shared publicly.

FOREWORD



On behalf of the Paris 2024 Organising Committee, it is my pleasure to present the *Cycling Road Roadmap* for the Games of the XXXIII Olympiad.

A century after the last Games were held in France, Paris 2024 is set to be a spectacular celebration that will bring sport to unique locations, with iconic competition venues both in Paris and across the country.

The road cycling competition embodies this ambition to its fullest. It will also open the Games wide by allowing thousands of inhabitants of the Île de France region to watch several of the events for free as they pass by their very front doors, and to cheer on the world's top cyclists.

Not only will the Paris 2024 Games be the first in history to have an equal number of male and female athletes, but for the first time also women and men will compete on the same time trial course: a spectacular out and back route from Invalides to the Bois de Vincennes, passing the Vélodrome Jacques Anquetil which hosted the 1924 Games and Place de la Bastille, before crossing the finish line on Pont Alexandre III bridge.

Starting from Trocadéro in Paris, the road race events will first take male and female riders through the Vallée de Chevreuse with its rolling woodland, before taking on the cobblestones and ascent of Butte Montmartre to arrive at the breathtaking and unique finish with the Eiffel Tower as the backdrop.

We cannot wait to welcome to you to the City of Light in summer 2024 for what will be an unforgettable edition of the Games.




Patients whose state of health may be life threatening in one of the venue zones will be taken to the nearest hospital.








COMPETITION RULES

EVENTS

The cycling road competition at the Paris 2024 Olympic Games will be held on Saturday 27 July, Sunday 3 and Sunday 4 August 2023. The individual time trial event will start from Invalides and the finish shall be judged on Pont Alexandre III bridge. The road race event will start in the vicinity of Pont d'Iéna bridge on Place de Varsovie (opposite the Eiffel Tower) and the finish shall be judged at Trocadéro.





COMPETITION FORMAT

For the individual time trial, riders set off at staggered times. The fastest rider in each event is declared the winner.

The cycling road competition (road race) is a mass start event. The first rider to cross the finish line in each event is declared the winner.

RULES

The cycling road competition will be held in accordance with the editions of the following documents that are in force at the time of the Games:

In accordance with Rule 46 of the IOC Olympic Charter, UCI will be responsible for the control and direction of the cycling road competition at the Paris 2024 Olympic Games.

CLOTHING AND EQUIPMENT

NOC RACE VEHICLES AND TECHNICAL VEHICLES

Vehicles — Toyota Corolla Touring Sports, hybrid — with 7-bike roof rack (Thule brand) and radios will be supplied to NOCs with athletes participating in the road cycling events, in addition to the number of vehicles allocated to NOCs depending on delegation size. NOCs with two athletes participating in the same time trial event will receive two vehicles with roof racks for this race only.

Toyota vehicles with roof racks will be handed over to the nations at the Pablo Neruda stadium, 34 rue Salvador Allende, 93400 Saint-Ouen-sur-Seine.

Some NOCs will be requested to share race vehicles during the road events, given the limited number of convoy vehicles authorised (27 for the men's event and 26 for the women's event) (the pooling list will be announced by UCI).

The order of nations' vehicles will be determined in accordance with article 2.3.024 of the UCI Regulations.



Vehicles will be driven by a member of the NOC with a UCI licence during the events (Paris 2024 will not provide NOCs with drivers). Vehicles and keys will be managed by the respective NOCs. As part of the Paris 2024 fleet, vehicles will be supplied with a multi-functional map paid by the OCOG, insurance and VAPP (P3 CYC non-transferable). VAPP will remain active after the end of competition.

For technical vehicles, NOCs may use their NF/NOC vehicle to travel to the competition venue, subject to allocated quotas, the instructions regarding vehicle size given by Paris 2024 and possession of the correct access pass.

However, the following rules must strictly observed:

- ➡ Brand vehicles must be parked in the Paris 2024 designated car parks only. Parking is not authorised in the vicinity of the competition/training venues.
- ➡ NOCs and NFs may not capture content on or around these brand vehicles and attempt to associate it with the Olympic/Paralympic Games. Furthermore, sponsors appearing on these vehicles may not communicate.

VEHICLE ROOF RACKS

Roof racks can hold up to a maximum of 7 bikes, without individual wheel trays. These roof racks will have a fixture system that can be adapted to all types of frame. All bikes will be positioned vertically in accordance with NOC mechanic working practices and to optimise the aerodynamics of each vehicle.

The rack will already be in place on receipt of the vehicle. NOCs will therefore only need to load their bikes.

In order to provide the best possible service, racks will be equipped with a noise reduction system to optimise comfort within the vehicle.



STARTING INTERVAL FOR INDIVIDUAL TIME TRIALS

The starting order for each event will be determined by UCI on the day of the team leaders' meeting, scheduled for 25 July at 16:30.

Riders will set off at an interval of 90 seconds, for both women and men.

INTERMEDIATE TIMING POINTS

There will be two timing points on the time trial course:

- ➔ **Km 13.1:** first intermediate timing point, Avenue Daumesnil (Paris)
- ➔ **Km 22:** second intermediate timing point, Cours des Maréchaux (Paris)

SHIMANO NEUTRAL SERVICE

A Shimano neutral service will be provided to athletes on familiarisation and competition days throughout the courses and at the venues, in accordance with UCI Technical Regulations. The neutral service during races will be provided by 4 cars for time trials and 4 cars and 2 motorbikes for the road races. There will also be a team at the start venues: Invalides for the time trial and Émile Anthoine for the road race events.

FEED ZONES

TIME TRIAL ON SATURDAY 27 JULY

There will be no feed zone on the course. Feeding is not authorised during the event.

MEN'S ROAD RACE ON SATURDAY 3 AUGUST

There will be three feed zones and breakdown assistance along the route:

- ➔ **Zone 1:** Les Mesnuls - Km 81, feed zone and wheel change
- ➔ **Zone 2:** Rue du pavé des gardes - Km 204, feed zone and wheel change
- ➔ **Zone 3 (2 passages):** Rue Lepic: Km 225.1 and Km 243.4 at the start of the Montmartre climb, feed zone and bike change

WOMEN'S ROAD RACE ON SUNDAY 4 AUGUST

There will be two feed zones along the route:

- ➔ **Zone 1:** Rue du pavé des gardes - Km 89.5, feed zone and wheel change

➔ **Zone 2 (2 passages):** Rue Lepic: Km 110 and Km 129 at the start of the Montmartre climb, feed zone and bike change.

Transport for NOC team assistants will be organised by Paris 2024 buses to the feed zones. The feed zones will be accessible via Paris 2024 buses only.

NOC assistants will meet at the start venue on Quai Jacques Chirac in the NOC car park. NOCs will have a maximum of 2 representatives authorised per feed zone. They must carry their supplementary accreditation (SACD)

➔ **NOCs with 3 or 4 competing athletes = 2 assistants**

➔ **NOCs with 1 or 2 competing athletes = 1 assistant**

These feed zones are marked "start" and "end".

They will be closed off and secured by the organisation.

Each zone will be equipped with toilets for athletes and team members, team tents (with the exception of the feed zone on Rue Lepic where there will be no team tents).



After the athletes have passed through, team assistants will take the Paris 2024 bus back to the Trocadéro venue, Complexe sportif Emile Anthoine.

WASTE ZONES

Paris 2024 will provide waste zones to collect litter throughout the women's and men's courses.

Riders may not throw litter, bottles or any other objects outside of these zones marked by "start" and "end" signs.

See images in the "course signage" section.

The zones cover between 300m and 500m depending on the terrain

Not only will there be no feed zones on the course, but there will also be no waste zones during the time trial on Saturday 27 July.

OUT-OF-TIME RULE FOR ROAD RACE EVENTS

UCI REGULATIONS

Article 2.3.039 of the International Cycling Union (UCI) regulations sets the time limit for a one-day race at 8% of the winner's time in order to be classified.

Art 2.3.039: Any rider finishing in a time exceeding that of the winner by more than 8% shall not be placed. The time limit may in exceptional circumstances be increased by the commissaires panel in consultation with the organiser. At the world championships and at the Olympic Games, any rider who is dropped and lapped by the lead riders before they start their final lap shall be eliminated and must leave the race. All other riders shall be classified in accordance with their position.

BACKGROUND

The courses for the road races at the Paris Games are particularly long, compared with previous Olympic Games: 273km for men and 158km for women.

The route through the inner city of Paris requires particularly heavy security arrangements and relatively long road closures.

It is hoped that once the race leaders and the main peloton have passed through, in accordance with the spirit and rules of the competition, the security arrangements and the opening of the roads can be completed within reasonable time frames, as presented by Paris 2024 at the time of meetings with the authorities.

OUT-OF-TIME ARRANGEMENTS

Before late-arriving athletes affected by the out-of-time rule enter the Paris loop, it is necessary to be able to stop them safely.

The purpose of the broom wagon at the end of the convoy of vehicles, with a UCI commissaire on board, is to pick up riders who drop out or are declared out of time by the commissaires. In this case, the time is 19 minutes for both the men's and women's events.

OUT-OF-TIME ARRANGEMENTS IN PARIS

Quai de Conti / Quai Malaquais, 47km from the finish, athletes (men and women) who are out of time at this stage of the race, i.e. 19 minutes behind the main peloton, are stopped by the UCI commissaires, who remove their race numbers then:

- ➡ take them in the broom wagon
- ➡ or offer them the chance to cycle to the finish along the race route escorted by police motorbikes: Quai Voltaire, Quai Anatole France, Quai d'Orsay, Quai Jacques Chirac and diversion towards Stade Émile Anthoine (athletes' changing rooms, athletes' lounge)

In addition, on the Paris loop, if the race leader overtakes one or more late riders, in accordance with the regulations, the overtaken athletes will be stopped by the UCI commissaires and invited to join the broom wagon.

HOT SEAT

A “hot seat” for the time trial event will highlight the 3 best riders with the best 3 provisional times. The “hot seat” will be located at the arrival area, on Pont Alexandre III. Immediately after their arrival, the riders having established the best provisional times will join the “hot seat”, guided by Paris 2024 volunteers. As soon as a best time is beaten, the rider(s) will give way to the new rider(s) at the top of the provisional classification and so on.

BIKE CHECK

A bike check may be organised by UCI before the start and at the arrival of the road cycling events: road race and time trials.

Within the framework of the fight against technological fraud, a random bike control will be organised for each event. The riders concerned will be notified immediately after their arrival.

DOPING CONTROLS

The anti-doping programme for the Olympic and Paralympic Games is put in place by Paris 2024 under the responsibility of the International Testing Agency (ITA), to which the International Olympic Committee (IOC) has delegated certain responsibilities, and the International Paralympic Committee (IPC).

This programme complies with the International Olympic Committee (IOC ADR) and IPC anti-doping rules and the World Anti-Doping Agency (WADA) Code.



These rules are accompanied by the prohibited list, athlete whereabouts requirements and therapeutic use exemptions (TUEs).

There will be two doping control stations for the time trial:

- ➔ One station for the first three riders at the Alexandre III venue
- ➔ One station at the Invalides venue

There will be two doping control stations for the road race:

- ➔ One station at the Trocadéro arrival venue
- ➔ One station at the Émile Anthoine venue near the athletes' lounge

TRAINING VENUE

POLYGONE DE VINCENNES

Training for the cycling road competition (individual time trial and road race) will take place at the Polygone venue in the Bois de Vincennes, in Paris' 12th arrondissement.

The cycling ring covers a distance of 3.13km, with top-quality asphalt surfacing. The circuit is entirely flat and does not present any difficulties.

POLYGONE DE VINCENNES CYCLING RING TRAINING COURSE

Training will be available to athletes from 10:30 to 13:30 on the 3.13km course from 20 July to 3 August.

It will exceptionally be closed on 24 July for the time trial familiarisation. The course will also be closed on 26 July from 10:45 to 12:00 for the Opening Ceremony.

Last hectometre familiarisation will take place on 2 July. As such, there will be no training on this day.

The facilities and changing rooms at the Polygone flat course are reserved for athletes during the slots booked.

Located 17km from the Olympic Village (40 mins), the venue will be serviced by Paris 2024 shuttle buses for athletes accommodated at the Olympic Village and their staff. Their bikes and equipment will be transported by Paris 2024 logistics resources.

The time slot pre-booking/amendment system for training sessions will be available from the Sport Information Centre at the Olympic Village or the Sport Information Desk located at the competition venue. Paris 2024 has also put in place a digital booking platform. Only athletes who have booked a training slot will be authorised to use the transport provided by Paris 2024.

Parking spaces are also available at the training venue for NOCs wishing to arrive with their NOC technical vehicle.



FAMILIARISATION

MEN'S AND WOMEN'S TIME TRIAL

The time trial course familiarisation will be held on 24 July 2024 between 16:30 and 19:30. It shall cover the whole course (32.4km), which will be secured and closed to traffic, enabling familiarisation under competitions security conditions. The neutral breakdown service will be available to NOCs during this familiarisation session.

Only one technical vehicle per NOC will be authorised at the Invalides venue, located on Rue Saint-Dominique. Please note that the latter must not exceed a maximum of 9 cubic metres (5.04 in length, 2.47 in width, 2.30 in height).

In addition, one vehicle per NOC will be authorised on the course. This NOC Toyota vehicle with roof rack – with VAPP access for the venue and course – will be parked on Rue de l'Université and Rue Fabert.

Only athletes will cross the Pont Alexandre III bridge and the finish line, located at the end of a 110-metre straight.

No vehicles (motorbikes or cars) will be authorised to cross the Pont Alexandre III bridge. All vehicles will be diverted at Quai d'Orsay to return to Rue Fabert and Rue de l'Université.

At the Invalides “Start” venue, athletes will have the following services at their disposal: team tents, changing rooms, toilets, athletes’ lounge, water, ice, towel, bottle, neutral assistance, home trainers, bike racks.


ROAD RACES

Two familiarisation sessions will be open to athletes for the road race:

- ➔ Paris loop familiarisation: Thursday 1 August 2024
- ➔ Last hectometre familiarisation: Friday 2 August 2024

During these two familiarisation sessions, athletes will have the following services at their disposal at the Émile Anthoine “Start/Finish” venue: team tents, changing rooms, showers, toilets, athletes’ lounge, water, ice, neutral breakdown service.

PARIS LOOP FAMILIARISATION: THURSDAY 1 AUGUST 2024



The familiarisation with the Paris loop will take place on Thursday 1 August 2024 from 16:00 to 18:00.

The start and finish are organised from Trocadéro, at the Émile Anthoine venue. The athletes and the entire operation will have priority right-of-way status: traffic lights, one-way streets, etc.

The entire operation will be supervised by the race managers (International Commissaires Jury President and Technical Delegate) from their vehicles.

The peloton, for both women and men, will follow a police escort.

Familiarisation is scheduled on the official 18.4km of the loop in Paris. The aim is to enable athletes to get their bearings on the route and identify obstacles and street furniture.

The entrance to the loop will be on Boulevard de Clichy. The entire Paris loop will be reconnoitred during this familiarisation process. The peloton will be escorted to the Trocadéro venue (Émile Anthoine) without crossing the Pont d'Iéna and the finish line.

Toyota cars with roof racks and technical vehicles belonging to the NOCs, officials, the medical service and Paris 2024 will be parked at the Trocadéro venue: Quai Jacques Chirac and Avenue de Suffren

Athletes will be dropped off and picked up at Quai Jacques Chirac. A small number of NOC cars will be authorised to follow the athletes on the course during familiarisation, in accordance with a policy specified by UCI (see above paragraph: NOC vehicle quota for road events)

A Paris 2024 medical service will accompany the peloton of athletes (doctors and ambulances).



LAST HECTOMETRE FAMILIARISATION: FRIDAY 2 AUGUST 2024

Familiarisation with the final hectometres of the road races will take place on Friday 2 August 2024 from 14:00 to 16:00.

The aim of this familiarisation is reconnaissance of the final hectometres of the course, the turn onto Pont d'Iéna, the final straight, the finish line and the deceleration platform located after the finish line and built at the Trocadéro fountains.

Familiarisation is open to the entire women's and men's peloton within the same time slot.

The start and finish will be organised at Trocadéro, Émile Anthoine sports complex.

Athletes will be dropped off and picked up at Quai Jacques Chirac, where the NOC vehicles will be parked.

Official vehicles and the medical service will be parked on Avenue de Suffren.

Please note that there will be no NOC vehicles on the course during this familiarisation.

As far as safety is concerned, the last few hundred metres of the route will be hermetically sealed and fully secured. The course turnaround will be organised upstream of the Pont de l'Alma where the athletes will take the race route, the last bend before crossing the finish line and using the deceleration platform.

CONFIRMATION OF STARTERS

One or two representative(s) from each NOC must attend in order to confirm their starters. All NOCs must present licences for all entered riders and support staff. They must also present an example of the race clothing that will be worn by their riders during the time trial and road race events in order to ensure that it complies with Rule 50 and the Bye-Law to Rule 50 of the Olympic Charter and the IOC Manufacturer Identification Guidelines.

NOC representatives will park their NOC Toyota vehicle on Quai Jacques Chirac, near the Émile Anthoine sports centre.

Time trial: Confirmation of starters for the women's and men's events will take place ahead of the team leaders' meeting, on 25 July from 13:30 and 16:00.

TEAM LEADERS' MEETING

The team leaders' meetings will be held in accordance with UCI regulations in the presence of the President of the UCI Commissaire Panel, the UCI Technical Delegate, the International and National Technical Officials, the Paris 2024 Cycling Sport Manager, the Paris 2024 Road Cycling Discipline Manager, and anti-doping officers. All team leaders (2 representatives max per NOC) are required to attend the meeting, which will provide critical information on subjects such as venue access, accreditation, protocols, confirmation of starters, order of vehicles on the course, radio frequencies, and feed zone operations.

For the time trial event, the team leaders' meeting will take place on Thursday 25 July 2024 from 16:30 to 18:00.

The meeting for the road race will be held on Friday 2 August 2024 from 17:00 to 18:00.

Both meetings will take place at the Émile Anthoine sports centre at 9 rue Jean Rey 75015 Paris.

NOC representatives will park their NOC Toyota vehicle on Quai Jacques Chirac, near the Émile Anthoine sports centre.

DISTRIBUTION OF RIDERS' NUMBERS AND TRANSPONDERS

For the time trial, each athlete will receive a race number and a timing transponder with a GPS tracking device, which must be used during the event.

For the road race, athletes will receive two race number bibs, a personalised timing transponder specific to the event, without a GPS tracking device, and a frame plate.

This equipment and the start list will be distributed at the confirmation of starters on 25 July for the time trial and on 2 August for the road race events.

TIMING

Each rider taking part in both events (time trial and road race) will receive two transponders which must be used during the road events. The timing chip and its clamp and the GPS tracking device support will be issued to team leaders during confirmation of starters.

For the time trial, each athlete will receive a timing transponder with a GPS tracking device, which must be used during the event. The timing chip, installed on the front fork, will be mandatory and must be positioned as low as possible.

For the road race, athletes will receive a personalised timing transponder specific to the event, without a GPS tracking device.

Both transponders will be collected after each event directly after the finish line. If a rider does not finish (DNF) or a bike change is carried out during the race, the transponders must be directly handed to the official Omega timekeeper.

RADIO TOUR

Each car in the race convoy (Toyota Corolla TS with roof rack) will be fitted with a radio transmitter-receiver.

The frequency will be 170.1125 MHz

During the Paris loop familiarisation on 1 August, the radio-tour system will enable race management to transmit information to all of the convoy vehicles.

ACCREDITATION

For more information, see Accreditation at the Olympic Games - Detailed Specifications (published in March 2023) and Paris 2024 — NOC Accreditation Update (published in April 2023), available on NOCnet.

The quota of "P" accreditations for road cycling is 3 per NOC.



ACCESS CONTROL FOR TEAM VEHICLES

To enter a competition venue, NOC Toyota vehicles will be equipped with a VAPP (Vehicle Access and/or Parking Permit) which will be checked in the VSA (Vehicle Screening Area). Cars will be inspected by duly authorised security personnel.

NOC technical vehicles must be at their VSA at the time indicated at a later date, in possession of a VAPP to access the venue (Primary VAPP).

To access the course (FOP) from the team car park, NOC Toyota convoy vehicles with roof rack must be issued with a second VAPP checked by the Paris 2024 organising team. This second VAPP will be issued by the Paris 2024 Sport team to team leaders on the day of the time trial familiarisation, 24 July.


NOC cycling vehicles must also be at their VSA at the time indicated at a later date, in possession of their VAPP to access the FOP.



COMPETITION VENUES

INVALIDES (INV)

Esplanade des Invalides – 75007 Paris – France

The Esplanade des Invalides will be the starting point for the men's and women's individual time trial event.






PONT ALEXANDRE III (ALX)

Pont Alexandre III – 75007/75008 Paris – France

Pont Alexandre III will be the finishing point of the men's and women's individual time trial events at the far end of a 110m-long and 5m-wide finishing straight.


Diversion for all vehicles (cars, motorbikes): no vehicles will be authorised to circulate on Pont Alexandre III nor cross the finish line. All vehicles will be diverted at Quai d'Orsay, 110m from the finish, to park on Rue Fabert and Rue de l'Université. A Paris 2024 team will be in place at this diversion.



TROCADÉRO (TRO)

At the Trocadéro venue, races will start and finish on Pont d'Iéna bridge, at the far end of a 230m-long and 12m-wide finishing straight.

Diversion for all vehicles (cars, motorbikes): no vehicles will be authorised to circulate on Pont d'Iéna nor cross the finish line. All vehicles will be diverted via the Pont d'Iéna tunnel, 400m from the finish line, to return to the car park on Quai Jacques Chirac and Avenue de Suffren. A Paris 2024 team will be in place at this diversion.





SERVICES PROVIDED

ATHLETES' LOUNGE

There will be an athletes' lounge for each event at each Paris 2024 venue. A refreshment station will serve cereal bars, fruit and drinks.

This space will contain TVs showing the live feed of the competition as well as the ceremonies following the events. This space will be equipped with Wi-Fi access.

ICE AND WATER DISTRIBUTION

During the time trial familiarisation on 24 July, 1kg of ice will be provided to each athlete at Invalides in the sport equipment distribution tent. During the time trial competition, 2kg of ice will be provided for athletes.

During the familiarisation sessions on 1 and 2 August, 1kg of ice will be provided to each athlete in the sport equipment distribution tent.

On competition days on 3 and 4 August, 3kg of ice will be provided to each rider in the sport equipment distribution tent.

Bottled water can be collected at the sport equipment tent at Invalides.

Bottled water can be collected for the road races at Émile Anthoine at the sport equipment tent.

ATHLETE TENTS

NOCs will share the 15 team tents installed at the Invalides venue on the familiarisation day (24/07) and competition day (27/07).

On the day of competition, each tent will accommodate 1 to 3 athletes per event for both women and men.

INDIVIDUAL TIME TRIAL

On the day of competition, NOCs with 2 to 4 athletes in the road events will have an individual tent.

The tent division by nation will be announced.

ROAD RACE EVENTS

The athlete tents at the Trocadéro venue will be located within the Stade Émile Anthoine.

NOCs with 2 to 4 athletes in the road events will have an individual tent.

NOCs with 1 athlete in the road events will share their tent with other athletes from other NOCs.

The tent division by nation will be announced.

HOME TRAINERS AND BIKE RACKS

A limited number of home trainers (30) will be available for teams to use on loan if required. They will be available in the equipment distribution area, near the team tents at the Invalides and Trocadéro venues. They must be used in the warm-up area and returned to the organising committee after use. NOCs will be charged for the amount of any equipment that is not returned or is returned in a damaged condition.

Paris 2024 will also have home trainers in the athlete recovery area at the time trial arrival venue on Pont Alexandre III.

The same system will be used for the 90 bicycle racks.



TOWELS

Each athlete will be provided with a towel for the time trial familiarisation session. For the road race familiarisation on 1 and 2 August and for the time trial events on 27 July and road race events on 3 and 4 August, each athlete will be provided with two towels.

Athletes are requested to leave these towels in the container provided at the end of each day so that they can be washed and redistributed. These towels will be collected from and deposited at the end of the day at the sport equipment tent.

SPORT EQUIPMENT: WATER BOTTLES, COOLERS AND FEEDING MUSETTES



Each athlete will have one feeding musette and 3 water bottles for the time trial event. For the road race, men will each have 4 feeding musettes and 15 water bottles and women will have 3 musettes and 15 water bottles. Please note that all water bottles used in training, during familiarisation and in the time trial competition must meet the requirements of Rule 50 and the Bye-Law to Rule 50 of the Olympic Charter, and the IOC Guidelines Regarding Authorised Identifications for the Games of the XXXIII Olympiad, Paris 2024. Please note that the water bottles provided will have a capacity of 550ml and a diameter of 74mm.


MEDICAL SERVICES

In collaboration with the medical service, the vehicle arrangements (motorbikes, cars, ambulances) have been adjusted to the venues and courses for familiarisation and competitions days.

TEAM ASSISTANCE AREAS

For each event, a team assistant is authorised to enter the athlete assistance zone to distribute water, towels, etc. This space is located at the end of the finish line area only duly accredited persons with SACD supplementary accreditation may enter this area. This supplementary accreditation will be issued to nations at the team leaders' meeting (25/07 for the time trial and 02/08 for the road race events).




VENUE TRANSPORT AND FACILITIES

ACCESS POINTS

PPO (MANDATORY PASSING POINT)

A smooth race start, for riders and followers alike, is dependent on the start operations. Access signage at the start venue, from all sources, is key to this success. This assembly area takes the form of the Mandatory Passing Point (PPO): located at Porte de Brancion for the time trial and road race events. Each entity will then be guided to their respective parking area (NOC, organisation) via suitable signage and/or personnel.





BIKE TRANSPORT

The Paris 2024 team encourages NOCs to use their NOC Toyota vehicle with roof rack to transport their bikes from the Olympic Village to the training and competition venues.


A logistics service for nations accommodated at the Olympic Village will be provided to transport bikes and sport equipment to the training and competition venues for nations submitting a request via the booking service.





Nation cars must be available to attach riders' name plates 15 minutes before the rider's start time and must be lined up in order at the start ramp 5 minutes before the rider's start time.

This neutral vehicle will be shared with other nations that also have two athletes competing. The Paris 2024 Sport teams will manage this attribution at the Invalides start venue. These neutral vehicles will be returned to Paris 2024 the day after the time trial.

POST-COMPETITION PROCEDURES

RACE FINISH

Athletes who complete their time trial in one of the three fastest times recorded at that point in the competition are required to take a position on the “hot seat” located on Pont Alexandre III, near the finish line. If an athlete’s time is subsequently beaten, they will be replaced on the “hot seat”.

All athletes must pass through the mixed zone after their time trial event, before returning to the athletes’ area.

The first three riders will be escorted from the moment they cross the finish line to attend the various procedures: “hot seat”, mixed zone, victory ceremony, press conference and doping control. Paris 2024 representatives will indicate to athletes the order to follow.

Transponders will be removed from bikes at the end of the finish line.


RACE FINISH






POST-COMPETITION PROCEDURES

RACE FINISH

After the finish, on the deceleration platform, riders leave the course to the left at the end of the finish line. Transponders will be removed at this stage.

Athletes will pass through the mixed zone before returning to the athlete area.

As soon as the first three riders cross the finish line, they will be escorted by Paris 2024 representatives who will assist them with the various procedures, including the mixed zone, the victory ceremony, the press conference and doping control. Paris 2024 representatives will indicate to athletes the order to follow.

POST-COMPETITION GENERAL PROCEDURES

MIXED ZONE

There will be a mixed zone at each competition venue which will be in operation for all competitions. Athletes will pass through the mixed zone when they leave the course. The mixed zone is located at the right-hand side behind the finish line for the time trial and at the left-hand side behind the finish line for the road races.

VICTORY CEREMONIES

There will be a preparatory meeting for the medallists before each victory ceremony. Athletes will be shown the route they will follow and will be reminded that they are required to comply with Rule 50 and the Bye-Law to Rule 50 of the Olympic Charter. Athletes and one member of their staff will attend this preparatory meeting, unless otherwise specified. Participants at the victory ceremony must not have flags, mascots, mobile phones, cameras, headphones, sport equipment or other objects on them during the ceremony; doing so is in breach of Rule 50. Athletes must wear their NOC uniform. Please also note that only athletes and members of the victory ceremony team (sport presentation) may participate in the victory ceremony.

PRESS CONFERENCES

Press conferences will be organised with medallists after each road cycling event. Professional interpretation services will be provided for all press conferences.

RESULTS PUBLICATION

For all events (time trial/road races), Paris 2024 will publish the results in accordance with UCI Regulations. For Olympic Games, times shall be taken and communicated to the nearest one-hundredth of a second (art. 2.4.016 of the UCI Regulations).

Results will be published via the Sport Information Centre after each event and officially announced.




