KOMODO (Labuan Bajo)

SURREAL PANORAMIC LANDSCAPE

Surrounded by seductive waters, panoramic hills and soft white sand, Labuan Bajo is your tropical paradise. Each islands offers its own unique trait and holds some of the most exclusive hideaways and sophisticated beach properties. Ideal for a romantic escape or idyllic family holiday.

The Komodo National Park constitutes unquestionably one of the most dramatic landscapes in all of Indonesia with a landscape of contrasts between starkly rugged hillsides of dry savanna, pockets of thorny green vegetation, brilliant white sandy beaches and blue waters surging over coral. Take your pick from every nautical pastime under the sun.





Existing nowhere else in the world, the most remarkable inhabitant of Komodo National Park is the Komodo Dragon. Besides the largest living lizard, the Park is a nature reserve for a great diversity of species such as manta rays, sea turtles, whales, dolphins and dugongs. The coral reefs fringing the coast of Komodo are diverse and luxuriant due to the clear water, intense sunlight, and rapid exchange of nutrient-rich water from deeper areas of the archipelago.



RAJA AMPAT

THE LAST PARADISE

Located at the heart of the world's Coral Triangle, almost every corner of this archipelago is worth discovering, with promises of rich wildlife and glorious views. It doesn't matter where you plunge for a dive or snorkel in Raja Ampat.

Raja Ampat is a stunning archipelago comprising over 1,500 small islands. These host thousands of species some of which are endemic to the region. With their sublime scenery of steep, jungle-covered islands, fine white-sand beaches, hidden lagoons, spooky caves, weird mushroom-shaped islets and pellucid turquoise waters, Raja Ampat is without question one of the most beautiful island chains in the world.









The Coral Triangle is recognized as the worldwide epicenter of marine biodiversity. Not only for corals and fish but many other marine organisms as well and therefore a global priority for conservation. The region covers only a very small portion of the planet's oceanic area. Yet, it has the majority of all known coral species in the world. It is habitat for roughly half of all Indo-Pacific reef fishes and almost half of the world's reef fishes.


BANDA SEA

UNTOUCHED UNDERWATER WORLD

Blessed with a colorful underwater world with a vibrant and healthy reef system, the untouched Banda Sea has clear waters that make it a comfortable home for large pelagic fish, beautiful reefs, and unspoiled corals bursting with life. Discover unique and spectacular landscapes above and below the waves, where volcanic activity has created a remote island paradise that divers can enter only through liveaboard.







Diving varies from island to island, and you will be able to see some great muck diving sites with droppings, great wall dives, some places that attract big pelagics, such as hammerhead sharks, and beautiful coral gardens. The diving sites have excellent conditions, great visibility, and mild to strong ocean currents. Not only that it offers an unforgettable diving experience, Banda Sea also has a rich and interesting history from their successful spice trades.

With no shortage of magnificent macro sites, Banda Sea is also home to many large pelagic fish. Large fish includes hammerhead sharks, dolphins, and even various whales. Mantas, Mobula rays, and large tuna often visit the area too. Macro species and small critters enthusiasts will not be disappointed either. Nudibranch, seahorses, frogfish, scorpion fish, mandarin fish, and many other small creatures can be spotted at various dive sites.

ALOR A DIVER'S DREAM

Alor, a small island north of West Timor in Eastern Indonesia, is a remote diving hotspot that offers absolute world-class scuba dive sites with coral reefs, big fish & muck diving. The locals have been sustaining a great effort in keeping the reefs healthy and protecting the area from overfishing. Hence, the dive spots are covered with stunning colorful healthy reefs and have abundant diverse marine species. The fact that Alor is in a remote area makes the underwater world a diver's dream.

Diving in Alor is extraordinary and full of surprises. Water has become a normal migration route for cetaceans. Expect to see some whales or other aquatic mammals passing by. This volcanic island offers you great underwater topography and is great for black sand and muck diving. The reefs and walls are colorful and full of life, even if you need a bit of experience to dive them. You will encounter not only large animals, but also creatures that need to be captured by a macro lens, such as nudibranch, leaf fish, frog fish, clownfish and other exotic macro biotas.







MOROTAI PEARL OF THE PACIFIC

Located in North Maluku, between the Pacific Ocean and the Philippines, Morotai Island has an amazing natural and marine charm. Beautiful sandy beaches are scattered throughout Morotai and the surrounding small islands. Not only that, Morotai is well-known for its diving locations with an abundance of coral reefs, various types of sharks, and the landscape of war wreckages post World War II. The beauty of Morotai with a myriad of history from World War II has earned it the nickname, "Pearl of the Pacific".







Nothing is more breathtaking than diving with sharks. Numerous sharks can be encountered across the island's dive sites, from blacktip, grey reef, bull shark, hammerhead, to the recently discovered walking sharks. The presence of top predators indicates the healthy conditions of the island's coral reefs. With the unique charm of the islands, the diversity of marine life, and a strong historical charm, Morotai Island is one of the most beautiful pearl islands in Indonesia.



SNORKELING & DIVING


