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



### Omine-Okugake Trail



The Omine-Okugake Trail is a World Heritage path that runs through Totsukawa and connects Yoshino and Omine with the sacred Kumano Sanzan shrines in Wakayama.

#### Mt.Kasuga Primeval Forest

Untouched for thousands of years, Mt. Kasuga Primeval Forest stretches out, behind Kasugataisha Shrine. This is a rare ecosystem with over 175 types of trees, wild animals, rare birds and insects.



### Soni Highland 🚟

The grasses are at their ethereal best in November. In summer, fireflies can be seen along the Soni River.



#### Mt.Wakakusa 🎇

a Buddhist temple dedicated to the art of tea.




Imaicho is a compact, beautifully preserved Edo period (17th-19th century) merchant town. Strolling its narrow streets is like wandering through an open museum of living history.

#### Somen

#### 三輪そうめん

Somen noodles were brought from China in the Nara period (8th century). There's a story that the son of a shinto priest from Ohmiwa Jinja Shrine planted wheat seeds in the area about 1,200 years ago, and started making somen. Don't leave Nara without trying this historic dish.



#### Yamato Yasai

#### 大和野菜

Nara's rich soil, clean air and pure water are ideal for growing the vegetables used in shojin ryori, Buddhist vegetarian food. The area was once known as Yamato, and Yamato Yasai has become a formal brand, indicating high quality, organic produce.

#### Sake

#### 奈良の酒

Sake wasn't invented in Nara, but the process of refining it was pioneered here. In 689, an official Imperial sake brewery was established, producing high quality sake. With dozens of small breweries across Nara, you have a chance to taste many types.



#### Yoshino-honkuzu

Cold weather and good quality water are essential to produce Yoshino-honkuzu, arrowroot starch. Only the root part is used, so that only a small amount of Kuzu powder can be produced making it a little luxury product called "white diamond." It is often used when cooking Japanese cuisine as a precious supporting actor.



#### Yamato-cha tea

It is said that Kenne (9th century), a pupil of Kobo Daishi, planted tea-seeds at Butsuryuji Temple in Haibara, Uda City, and it was the beginning of Yamato-cha tea. Cold upland is best suited for growing tea thanks to the large temperature differential within a day. The blessed nature makes high quality tea with brighter aroma.

### Kasugataisha Shrine



The approach to Nara's most famous and impressive Shinto shrine takes you along an atmospheric forest path, lined with hundreds of stone lanterns.

Nara Park is what many think of as "Nara." Stretching over about eight square kilometres, it encompasses major sites like Todaiji Temple, Kohfukuji Temple and Kasugataisha Shrine, along with museums and almost 1,200 deer.



### Yakushiji Temple

薬師寺

You will be struck by the scale of this temple complex, built in a Chinese style around 680. One of the most famous temples in Japan, its historical and architectural significance has earned it World Heritage status.

### Former Site of Heijokyu Imperial Palace

平城宮跡

It is the site upon which Heijo Palace or Heijokyo once stood. The site now features reconstructions of the Imperial Audience Hall where the Emperor's throne was located, the Suzaku Gate and the East Palace Garden.

#### Asuka

Spend a relaxing time walking through the Asuka district, which long ago prospered as a centre of Japanese politics, economics and culture. Travellers can stop by cultural properties including the former site of the Fujiwara Palace, which is registered as an "important scenic landscape."



#### Inabuchi Tanada Terraced Rice Fields



Asuka is famous for its terraced rice paddies, which look spectacular at sunset in late spring, when the sun reflects off the water.



### Asukadera Temple

One of the oldest Buddhist temples in Japan, Asukadera Temple was founded in 596 by the prominent Soga clan shortly after Buddhism was introduced from China and Korea.

This beautiful home was originally a farmhouse, built around 1910 and recently restored.

Commanding a hill above the Asuka plain, Okadera Temple is famed for both its beautiful gardens and its interesting legends.

This impressive megalith is believed to be the tomb of Soga no Umako, a powerful figure who worked closely with Prince Shotoku in the Asuka period (6th-8th century) to promote Buddhism.

### Horyuji Temple



This impressive World Heritage temple complex is a must-see, because it is such a beautiful place to visit, not just because it boasts 48 World Heritage monuments. Approaching the outer gate along a wide, pine-lined avenue, you are faced by high walls which conceal the temples within, creating a mini-city of manicured gardens and wide streets.





#### Shigisan Chogosonshi-ji Temple 信貴山朝護孫子寺

Known as the "tiger temple" for its many legends and tiger figures, Shigisan Chogosonshi-ji Temple is popular with kids. Following a winding path through the forest, you encounter Fukutora, the world's largest papier-mâché tiger.

#### Hasedera Temple EAS



The village of Hase in central Nara lies in a deep valley with spectacular scenery. It is especially popular when the mountains blaze red and gold in autumn. The main draw is Hasedera Temple, accessed by an impressive covered stairway, flanked by thousands of peonies in May.



#### Tanzan Jinja Shrine Kulipat Right Ri



An easy bus ride from Sakurai Station, Tanzan Jinja Shrine is known for its spectacular autumn colours. The main approach to the shrine includes steep stairs, but you can avoid these by cutting through the carpark on the left side of the shrine.

Believed to be Japan's oldest existing Shinto shrine, Ohmiwa-jinja Shrine is a rare example of the ancient form of a Shinto sacred site. Unlike other shrines, Ohmiwa Jinja Shrine does not have a main hall (Honden) since it worships Mt. Miwa, and it retains the form of primitive Shinto.






