

Basic tips to guide your color choices.

Explore your neighborhood

How will your home fit in with surrounding properties? Look at the color schemes of neighboring houses. If your home is flanked on both sides by white houses, consider choosing something different to avoid the monotony of the same color lining the entire street.

Examine your landscape

Keep in mind that your home's exterior will create a look and feel for your entire property. To set your house apart from the surrounding environment, pick a more vibrant shade. Or select warm, neutral hues to blend in with the landscape.

Keep it real

Ensure whatever colors you choose complement elements of your home that you cannot or do not want to change, such as your roof, garage doors and any brick or stone accents.

Get color samples

Before you commit to a color or colors, get samples so you can see how they look in natural light. Because colors will change based on the angle of the sun and the amount of sunlight, it's important to look at samples at multiple times of day and in different types of cloud cover to ensure you select the right color for your home.






Horizontals

Switch up body colors in horizontal bands, rather than vertical stripes. Doing so will allow you to add dimension without being too distracting to the eye.



Accent Color

An accent color is another way to elevate your home's exterior. If you have a large home, an accent color can break up the expanse of a single color. An accent can also draw attention to gables or other architectural details.




Multiple Colors

Door and window trim does not have to be the same color as corners and other trim. Feel free to use both high-contrast and monochrome color schemes to highlight different areas of the home. For example, using contrasting trim on an otherwise monochrome home is an eye-catching way to create a distinctive entry way.



Dark Body

Deeper body colors are becoming increasingly popular these days and using them can conjure a warm, cozy feeling that makes your home feel more inviting.



Soft Contrast

Selecting colors for body and trim that are only subtly different helps create a soft contrast that makes your home appear larger. When creating a monochromatic look, choose the lightest color for the body and the darkest for trim, windows and doors.



Light Trim

Using trim that is lighter than the body of your house will draw attention to the trim. Because it creates contrast against darker siding, light trim can make architectural details, such as doors and windows, more prominent.



Commonly Asked Color Questions

How many colors should I use on my home?

The number of colors used in an exterior color scheme depends on the home and how many details there are to highlight. Typically, traditional homes have three colors: body, trim and accent.

Newer architectural styles (and occasionally larger houses) can benefit from more than three colors. By adding a second body or trim color, you can make your home more visually appealing.

Can I use trim that is a darker color than the body of my home?


Absolutely, using darker trim can create a modern look that sets your home apart from others in your neighborhood. Dark trim can also make your home look bigger and draw attention to landscaping and surrounding scenery.

Keep in mind that not all trim has to be the same color. If you have horizontal or vertical banding, you may want to choose it in a different color than the trim surrounding your windows. You may also want your soffit and eaves to be a different color than your window trim.

Will a dark body color make my home look smaller?

A house looks smaller as a result of strong contrast in colors or using light and dark colors together. This is not always a bad thing and can actually enhance design.

If you like deeper colors and don't want your house to look smaller, then don't use white trim; instead use a mid-tone-color trim to make the main color look brighter.



What if I don't want to use color am I being too boring?

As much as color can add to a house, sometimes it looks best not to use any at all. Don't be afraid to have an all-white house. White reflects light and will actually appear to vary in tone throughout the day.

Rest assured, if you do select all-white, your Hardie[®] siding, trim and soffit will all be color matched and on-tone.

Should my garage door be the same color as my front door or trim?

In most cases, no! It only draws attention to the least attractive part of your home. Also, an accent color can throw off your house's balance, making the garage look larger than it actually is. To help it blend in, select colors that are either the same as the body color, or slightly lighter or darker.
