Social Poverty

Social stigmas caused by the caste system involve discrimination which leads to social isolation and depression. Illiteracy, alcoholism and abuse plague families. Gender inequality treats women as property and they suffer from domestic violence and abuse.

Spiritual Poverty

According to Open Doors, India ranks 10th in the world for religious persecution which has increased 425% in the past five years. Religious minorities all live in constant state of fear, retaliation and intimidation. Anti-conversion laws limit religious freedom and result in unjust treatment and jail time."

Economic Poverty

About 28% of all Indians live on less than \$2 day (U.N.) which leads to child labor and malnutrition. All people deserve the opportunity to earn an income that can support their families and live a prosperous life. All Indians need access to quality education and training.

Child Development Centers

5,000+ children served

 Provides love, care, food, clothing, and education to 500 children in 12 communities.

United International School, K-12

10,000+ graduates

 Private school for 1,000 students coming from diverse economic and faith backgrounds.

ARISE! Women's Empowerment

1,800+ women gainfully employed

- Six-month vocational training program that offers literacy and tailoring skills resulting in an employment rate of 98%
- Builds trust, faith, selfesteem, and confidence to create self-sufficiency to support a family.
- ARISE graduates discover a renewed sense of life and purpose.

Community Transformation

1,600+ churches established.

- Two-year pastoral leadership training focused on a combination of education, vocational training, and field based training.

Introducing

UNITED INTERNATIONAL COLLEGE (UIC)

This is an incredible opportunity for deserving students to fulfill their academic dreams by pursuing their career aspirations which will break the bondage of systemic poverty.

- Nationally, only 33% of students graduate from grade 10. Of those, only 27% pursue higher education (AISHE).
- 23% of young adults are unemployed because they lack job skills (Statista).
- Only 8% of Indians are college graduates (2011 census)

Education is the key to opening the possibilities of God's purpose in these young lives. The obstacles they face, the lack of affordable tuition combined with a lack of scholarships and the ability to qualify for a loan, make college unattainable for students that attend our Child Centers and for many attending our private school.

The Impact

Our response is to provide a continuum of education for all students regardless of caste and faith that is affordable and at-

tainable. This concept is both daring and pioneering within the Indian culture by blending all castes to teach tolerance and collaboration in an inclusive campus.

UIC will provide a robust scholarship program to 40% of the student body.

Students attending the private school can now continue with their education. Children from rural areas attending our Child Development Centers will now have the opportunity to attend college by residing in the dormitories. Remedial learning will help these students to be able to achieve their goals.

Tuition will be affordable.

The annual tuition and fees will be set at \$1,800 and with room and board it will cost \$1,800. This is a fraction of the cost in comparison to other Indian colleges averaging around \$5,000.

UIC is located in Bangalore, a city regarded as the Silicon Valley of India, where job opportunities await for those with the skills and qualifications.

Nursing School

Our nursing school will include labs, clinics, lecture halls, classrooms, and a mobile clinic.



Leadership Training Center

The leadership training center will house a training program and be a conference hub for furthering leadership and education.



Student Activity Center

The student activity center will host:

- Cafeteria
- Gym with a pool
- Banquet hall
- 22 quad dorm rooms for 88 female students



Auditorium

The auditorium will seat 1,000 people in a state-of-theart facility. This multi-functional space can be used as a rental facility to generate a source of sustainable revenue.



Fellowship Hall

The fellowship hall will hold 250 people and serve as a multi-purpose area. The outdoor fountain will be a place for prayer and meditation.
