# A MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT AND CHAIRMAN OF THE BOARD AND THE CEO

Dear Friends.

2013 was an extraordinary year by any measure. The southern Alberta floods presented challenges of a magnitude we had never experienced in our history. They also reminded us, as disasters do, of what matters and why we do what we do.

We did what we do best: we came together as a community. Against all odds, we opened our gates on time. Stampede 101 became a symbol of our community's resiliency and optimism.

Throughout the flood, our volunteers' spirit shone through. During the initial hours of the flood evacuations, Stampede volunteers were mobilized to greet and help at the City of Calgary's 24-hour reception centres. Some of our board members created a "We're Greatest Together" Facebook group, which organized volunteers to help with relief efforts in hard-hit neighbourhoods, as well as fold, package and deliver more than 160,000 Hell or High Water t-shirts as the orders poured in. That volunteersupported t-shirt campaign raised more than \$2.4 million for Canadian Red Cross Alberta Floods Response. We cleaned flooded basements, served food to relief troops in Canmore, and provided warm breakfasts to a severely impacted Siksika First Nation.

Our employees were heroic, pulling out all the stops to ready for Stampede - cleaning buildings, repairing facilities and overcoming unimaginable obstacles. When it was safe to begin Stampede set-up, our volunteers and employees worked collaboratively and diligently under a compressed schedule to ensure everything was ready for opening day.

Flood recovery did not stop at the conclusion of Stampede 101. Right after Stampede ended we began full restoration of our facilities to their pre-flood state. This \$51 million job is ongoing and we anticipate completing virtually all our facility repairs in time for the 2014 Stampede. We expect our insurance policies will cover the vast majority of the repairs. There will be additional flood mitigation and riverbank work that will fall under the auspices of the Province's disaster and flood erosion funding programs.

While we will always remember 2013 as the year of the flood, we are also proud to report that we made significant progress last year against our 2013-2015 strategic plan. The three-year plan has six focused strategies and here are the highlights of what we accomplished in year one.

# SUPPORT OUR PEOPLE TO RIDE FOR THE BRAND

We invested in programs, training and leadership to help our people reflect our brand values in the experiences we deliver to our guests and community.

Over the course of the year, committee leadership reviewed and updated each of the mandates of our 47 volunteer committees, ensuring each committee was aligned with our strategic plan. In 2013 we redesigned our total compensation offering, to be introduced in 2014, to ensure a competitive offering to our current and future employees.

We received two people related awards in 2013 that recognized the strength of our culture and our status as a top provincial employer. Please see the awards section of this report for more details.

# STRENGTHEN AND BUILD URBAN AND RURAL CONNECTIONS

After a year's ownership, and in consultation with stakeholders, we achieved our goal to create an authentic working cattle operation at the OH Ranch. More than 200 bred cows arrived in 2013 and 204 live calves were born in the spring.

Our Corporate Relations committee hosted the 2013 President's Event and President's Ride at the OH Ranch. In 2013 the Calgary Stampede's Artist Ranch Project was also held at the OH Ranch. Under this program, which is led by our Western Showcase committee, five artists learn about life on a working ranch and then create artwork inspired by this experience, for exhibit and sale at the Calgary Stampede. These kinds of activities show how the OH Ranch can connect urban audiences with our rural neighbours in new and meaningful ways.

We also made significant infrastructure enhancements to help deliver the western events that connect urban and rural audiences. We shortened the racetrack and completed a new tunnel to the infield. The two-lane tunnel separates people from vehicles and livestock, reduces vehicle traffic on the track, brings all livestock safely to the infield, and supports two-way vehicle traffic. Ultimately, the new tunnel will also provide exhibitors and competitors with better access to the Agrium Western Event Centre.

# CO-CREATE GATHERING SPACES

The Calgary Stampede and the Calgary Stampede Foundation made incredible progress on the "We're Greatest Together" Capital Campaign. At the end of 2013, we raised more than \$92 million of the \$100 million goal. This funding, a mix of individual, government, foundation and corporate donations, will be allocated to the three major Stampede Park development projects: the Agriculture Discovery Zone, Riverfront Park and the Youth Campus.

Local entrepreneur and philanthropist Don Taylor's \$15 million donation was the largest private donation ever made to the Stampede Foundation. The money will be used to create the SAM Centre, a western interpretive centre. The SAM will be a central piece of the future Youth Campus on Stampede Park, and will give local and global visitors a place to learn about the history of Stampede and southern Alberta throughout the year.

We are also appreciative of a number of other donations that were pledged in 2013 and will be publicly announced over the course of 2014.

Supportive volunteers and employees have also contributed through the family campaign, a number of whom made multi-year pledges as part of the 1912 Society– a special recognition for generous individuals. We thank every donor for their support of the Stampede's vision.

In May, our Historical and Public Art committees completed a major restoration of the eight murals at Stampede Park. The artworks depict icons and moments of significance from the Stampede's history. Our volunteers also created a new Art Walk guide to help visitors enjoy the prominent pieces of western art at Stampede Park.

In 2013, we worked with event promoters and producers to ensure Stampede Park continues to be a year-round gathering place for a myriad of events and occasions. We hosted everything from Cirque du Soleil to the Monster Jam motorsport event to a long-time Calgary Halloween attraction - Screamfest. The Social Enterprise World Forum Convention attracted delegates from more than 30 countries devoted to resolving the world's most complex social challenges. The Gas and Oil Expo, which alternates with the biennial Global Petroleum Show, drew more than 20,000 local and international visitors and more than 600 exhibiting businesses. To wrap up the year, we

worked with corporate Calgary to bring more than 35,000 employees and guests together for holiday parties where they could celebrate their organizations' success.

# COMMUNICATE ANIMAL CARE PRACTICES AND PROGRAMS

Prior to Stampede 101, we launched a new Animal Q and A website where anyone can pose their questions about animal care and get straight-up answers from experts. In 2013, we created and posted more than 30 new animal care videos on our YouTube channel, another information resource for community members interested in the Calgary Stampede and animal care.

We also engaged Calgarians in dialogue, bringing several community members to take part in animal care discussions and behind-thescenes educational tours during Stampede so they could meet the animals and animal experts involved in our Rodeo and Chuckwagon events.

Committed to continuous improvement, in 2013 we expanded the scientific research program we have with the University of Calgary's School of Veterinary Medicine. In 2013, researchers introduced the use of infrared thermography, known as IRT, to detect temperature levels amongst bucking stock and determine if this tool can add to the animal observational research already being conducted.

One significant capital improvement was our \$500,000 investment in new state-of-the art rodeo chute steel, featuring improved safety features for animal and human competitors.

Our research showed that an overwhelming majority of Calgarians support animals being involved in competition, exhibition or education events at the Stampede - a strong indication of community support for our animal care program.

# ENGAGE CALGARIANS IN THEIR COMMUNITY BACKYARDS

In early summer, the Community
Development committee and volunteers from six other committees hosted two Community
Roundups in two busy Calgary community centres. In partnership with local community groups, these mini fairs brought neighbours together to celebrate the diversity, western heritage, and community spirit of Calgary.

In the fall, the Indian Events committee brought First Nations culture to CultureFest at

the Genesis Centre, part of the Province of Alberta's culture days celebrations.

Over the school year, several hundred school kids from across the Calgary area learned about western heritage and agriculture in the hands-on educational environment known as Stampede School.

On a regular basis, our Promotion committee visited Calgary-area seniors' homes and provided residents with a Stampede experience in the form of line dancing and sing-a-longs.

Through the course of the year, activities such as these helped the Stampede connect with Calgarians of all ages and backgrounds outside of our 10-day celebrations.

# SHOWCASE THE CALGARY STAMPEDE TO THE WORLD

In January we hosted "An Evening with Oprah", where Oprah Winfrey delivered inspirational messages, humorous anecdotes and personal moments with a sold out Saddledome audience. The post-event photo of Oprah wearing a white hat and giving two thumbs up received great attention-going viral via twitter and other social networking vehicles.

In the spring, we took the Stampede to outer space when we tweeted Commander Chris Hadfield while he was aboard the International Space Station with an invitation to lead our Parade. He came to Calgary in July, and led a memorable Stampede parade through downtown Calgary, creating a buzz across Canada and around the world

When we opened our gates on time for Sneak-a-Peek on Thursday, July 4, 2013, even more of the world was watching, thanks to the ongoing interest in the flood. In fact, CBC's the National ran a 10-minute documentary on our opening night chronicling our efforts to rebuild Stampede Park in two weeks.

Our brand saw solid exposure on either side of Stampede when we teamed up with Disney on promotions related to their western film The Lone Ranger. The Stampede was showcased at cinemas across Canada and at select screenings our volunteers and Royalty delivered some Stampede spirit and Calgary flair.

There was ongoing interest in our flood story, with the flood video we launched in July becoming the most watched You Tube video in Canada for that month. As well, over the remainder of the year, we took advantage of numerous opportunities to tell our story in person at events, conferences and meetings across Canada and the United States.

In November, the Stampede Queen and Princesses carried the CS banner at the CFL Grey Cup, promoting the Calgary Stampede spirit to our nation's football fans. That same month, the 2014 Calgary Stampede Indian Princesses traveled to Germany to promote the Stampede and Alberta to international tourists.

In December, we provided more than 600 German travel writers and agents with a taste of Stampede as we hosted them at Stampede Park with an authentic Stampede breakfast and bull riding performance.

In summary, we managed our planned and unplanned work with discipline and passion. We advanced our brand and our mission with concrete results as we executed the first year of our strategic plan. The response to the flood uncovered new levels of spirit across our city and throughout our organization. An entire community came together to create a rallying point during very difficult circumstances.

All of our success is because of people. We are appreciative and thankful for our passionate volunteers, hard-working employees, diligent contractors, resilient neighbours, committed sponsors and loyal guests. The entire Stampede family can be proud. 2013 was a terrific year and the CS brand has never been stronger.



# **HELL OR HIGH WATER**

#### JUNE 20, 8:30 A.M.

Elbow River Rising







#### **JUNE 20, 12:45 P.M.**

Calgary Stampede's Emergency Command Centre (ECC) activated.

#### JUNE 20, 1:11 P.M.

City of Calgary declares State of Emergency.

#### JUNE 20, 1:24 P.M.

Jersey barriers installed to protect track. Indian Village evacuated. (Jersey barriers are modular concrete or plastic barriers.)

#### JUNE 20, 2 P.M.

Flood defense priorities established: track, Grandstand, BMO Centre and electrical substation. Park combed for anything that might float away.

#### JUNE 20, 2:38 P.M.

Evacuation begins for Calgary and area communities.

#### JUNE 20, 4:30 P.M.

Sluice gates closed. Flood walls and sandbags installed around track. (Sluice gates prevent storm sewers from upwelling.)

#### **JUNE 20, 8 P.M.**

Calgary Stampede volunteers deployed to City of Calgary Reception Centres. Employees called back to Park to move files, computers, phones, uniforms and all other valuables from basements to higher ground.

#### JUNE 20, 11 P.M.

Tiger Dams<sup>™</sup> installed around electrical substation. Sandbags and pumps put in BMO Centre. (A Tiger Dam<sup>™</sup> system consists of elongated flexible tubes which may be joined end to end, stacked and filled with water. Together, they form a pyramid-shaped structure that creates a barrier.)

# JUNE 21, MIDNIGHT - 1 A.M.

Calgary transit and bridges closed. Stampede Park evacuated. A handful of employees stay through the night pushing water away from the electrical substation with pumps, brooms and squeegees.

#### **JUNE 21, OVERNIGHT**

Blue bridge washed away, Infield tunnel and Indian Village submerged. Track, barns, Stampede Foundation buildings, Big Four Building, Agriculture Building, Headquarters Building and People Centre all flooded. Scotiabank Saddledome flooded to row 10.

#### **JUNE 21, OVERNIGHT**

Elbow River peaks at 1,240 cubic metres per second, 12x the normal rate and 3x the 2005 flood.

Bow River peaks at 2,400 cubic metres per second, 8x the normal rate and 3x the 2005 flood.

#### JUNE 21, 8:43 A.M.

Water flowing in and out of the reservoir equalizes.

#### JUNE 21, 10:20 A.M.

Materials to rebuild track found and ordered.







#### JUNE 21, 6:45 P.M.

Fuel deliveries and cleanup organized, including contractors, suppliers, pavers, track builders, elevator repair technicians, pumps and washers.

#### JUNE 22, 8 A.M.

Water recedes. North American Midway Entertainment and independent vendors postpone arrival for recovery efforts.







#### JUNE 22, 10:40 A.M.

Top priorities established: repair the breach of the track, pump out Grandstand, restore electrical, clean out BMO Centre, get the lights back on in the parking lots.

#### **JUNE 23**

Park and Facility Services, one of the few functional buildings and running on a generator, is established as home base for employees coming back to work.

#### **JUNE 24**

Press conference held to confirm that Stampede 101 will go ahead "Come hell or high water."

Hell or High Water T-shirts go on sale.

#### **JUNE 24 - JULY 3**

Contractors from across Canada and the United States arrive to help with flood recovery. Many stay on to help surrounding communities in the days and weeks to follow.

Dirt removed from track and 88 million pounds of new dirt moved in to rebuild it.

63 buildings (or parts of buildings) remediated (emptied, repaired, cleaned, sanitized, dried and inspected).

900 flowers and 4 tandem trailers full of bark mulch replaced.

200 hours of people power to pull grass out of the fencelines.

A citizen brings 220 bagged lunches, each with a personal message, to the cleanup crew at the Grandstand, another community member provides hotdogs outside of the Saddledome, while yet another brings a carload of treats and food for relief workers.

#### **JUNE 27**

Employee orientations for 10-day Stampede begin. Midway vendors and volunteer committees begin to set up in a compressed timeline. The TransAlta Grandstand Show, which usually has eight to nine days for rehearsals, now has only three.

#### **JULY 2**

Downtown reopens.

#### **JULY 3**

Calgary Transit reopens. (About 50 per cent of Stampede guests arrive every year using Transit.)

#### **JULY 4**

Stampede Park opens on time for Sneak-a-Peek.

#### **JULY 5 - JULY 14**

1.1 million guests join us for The Greatest Outdoor Show on Earth.

#### JULY 15, 10:30 A.M.

Calgary Stampede presents a \$2.1 million cheque to the Canadian Red Cross Alberta Floods Fund.



# LOOKING TO THE FUTURE

#### AGRICULTURE DISCOVERY ZONE

A focal point on Stampede Park, the Agriculture Discovery Zone will draw public audiences to agriculture events and educational opportunities year-round. At its heart is the Agrium Western Event Centre, a multipurpose complex that will triple the Stampede's capacity to host international and domestic, cattle and equine events. The building's rotunda will be home to Journey 2050: Growing Responsibly —an inquiry-based educational experience for Calgary and area middle school children. This world-class program will challenge students to consider how to sustainably feed the world's projected nine billion people in 2050.



#### RIVERFRONT PARK

Riverfront Park will be a vital green space for festivals, recreation and educational programming. The land along the Elbow River will be transformed into a beautiful, new city park and outdoor community gathering place. During the 10-day Stampede, the park will be the new home for Indian Village presented by Penn West Exploration. Year-round, Riverfront Park will celebrate our western heritage, our history and the environment.



#### **YOUTH CAMPUS**

Youth Campus will position Calgary's youth for success. Here, youth will develop strong roots in the community through education, performing arts, and making meaningful connections with southern Alberta's heritage. Youth Campus will feature ample green space and be custom-designed for indoor and outdoor classrooms, training and performing. Youth Campus will be home to The Young Canadians School of Performing Arts, Calgary Stampede Showband, Stampede School and the relocated Calgary Arts Academy. The SAM Centre will be a central piece of Youth Campus. This western interpretive centre will enhance the learning environment with galleries and education spaces, and be the new location for the Stampede's archives.

#### CALGARY STAMPEDE LOTTERIES

The Gaminde family, John and Natalie and their daughters Eoin (3) and Euan (1), became the proud new owners of the Rotary Dream Home on October 29. Over the past decade, Stampede Lotteries has donated more than \$22 million to local charities. This year's ticket sales totalled \$1.2 million and benefited the Rotary Club, the Kinsman Club, the Calgary Stampede Foundation and the Calgary Stampede Showband.



# CALGARY STAMPEDE SHOWBAND PERFORMS AT THE CIBC RUN FOR THE CURE

The Stampede Showband performed at the 2012 and 2013 CIBC Run for the Cure as one of several community performances showcasing Stampede youth programs. The Showband-related programs make approximately 50 individual appearances annually at schools, community centres and private functions.



#### **CULTURAL ACCESS PASS**

For the second year in a row, the Calgary Stampede participated in the Institute for Canadian Citizenship's (ICC) Cultural Access Pass program. In 2013, more than 150 new citizens picked up their passes for The Greatest Outdoor Show on Earth at TELUS Spark. Since the Cultural Access Pass program's launch five years ago, more than 60,000 new Canadians have received free access to more than 1,200 Canadian cultural attractions from coast-to-coast.



#### **CULTUREFEST**

In late September 2013, the Indian Events committee participated in CultureFest at the Genesis Centre of Community Wellness. Along with First Nations dancers and a tipi display, visitors enjoyed Bollywood and Hollywood movies, cultural pavilions, art exhibits and food booths.



#### DONATION PROGRAM

The Calgary Stampede donation program made more than 190 donations to not-for-profit organizations that work to make southern Alberta a better place. In October, the Stampede donated an ultimate Stampede experience worth \$2,200 to the Stockmen's Memorial Foundation that included an exclusive "behind-the-chutes" of the Stampede Rodeo tour.



# PROMOTION COMMITTEE AT FAMILY FUN DAY

The Calgary Stampede Promotion committee proudly took part in the Canadian Paraplegic Association's Family Fun Day celebration on Saturday, June 15, 2013. ## PROFESSIONAL RODEO COWBOYS ASSOCIATION (PRCA)


Calgary Stampede stock received recognition at the 2013 National Finals Rodeo with S83 Special Delivery placing third in the World Bareback standings. Also, the top bronc riders of the PRCA presented legendary Calgary Stampede bucking horse, John Wayne, with the first ever "Hell Ya" Award. The "Hell Ya" award is an expression used by rodeo champion, Chet Johnson, during callbacks when he says "sometimes a guy draws a horse and isn't too pumped, and then there are the times when you'll say Hell Ya!" John Wayne may not have been the "rankest ride", but more than \$300,000 has been won on the buckskin throughout his career. He will be retired after his final performance in the 2013 Wrangler National Finals Rodeo.

#### ELLENSBURG RODEO HALL OF FAME

The Calgary Stampede was honoured with three inductions into the Ellensburg Hall of Fame. Gary Rempel, a Stampede pickup man whose career spans three decades, was inducted for his outstanding work saving cowboys and keeping shows running smoothly and safely. Grated Coconut, now retired and enjoying his job as top stud at the Stampede Ranch, was recognized for his outstanding contributions to the world of rodeo. The Stampede Ranch Born to Buck breeding program was also recognized for five decades of horse breeding and training programs at the Stampede Ranch.

The City of Calgary is a long-time partner of the Calgary Stampede, providing our 100-year lease and support for our credit facilities. With this year's flood in June, the organizations worked together to facilitate the city getting back in operation as quickly as possible for Calgarians. This partnership enhances the community's ability to participate in our activities at Stampede Park and throughout the city, both year-round and during our annual 10-day event.

The Government of Alberta, through the Alberta Lottery Fund, supported a number of the Stampede's programs and facilities. We received a \$9.3 million operating grant, as well as \$250,000 that was used to renovate the Stampede Corral washrooms. Support from the Community Enhancement Facilities Program of \$125,000 enabled the complete repair of the BMO Centre dividing walls. The Department of Agriculture and Rural Development provided a \$100,000 annual operating grant for agriculture activities and \$75,000 to assist the Rodeo and Chuckwagon offices moving into the Agriculture Building. Alberta Livestock and Meat Association provided \$17,500 towards educational and business to business initiatives. A \$25 million matching grant from Alberta Agriculture supported the new infield tunnel, reconfigured track and construction of the Agrium Western Event Centre.

The Government of Canada, through a \$255,646 Canadian Heritage-Building Communities through Art and Heritage grant, invested with the Stampede to restore eight murals on Stampede Park and develop an online public art walk tour. The Canadian AgriMarketing program committed \$40,000 to profile our international agriculture initiatives. A matching investment of \$25 million from Infrastructure Canada enabled the construction of a new infield tunnel, officially opened in October 2013, a reconfigured track and the Agrium Western Event Centre, which will be open for the 2014 Stampede.



#### I. PURPOSE OF THE ORGANIZATION

THE PURPOSE OF CALGARY EXHIBITION AND STAMPEDE LIMITED ("CALGARY STAMPEDE") IS TO PRESERVE AND PROMOTE WESTERN HERITAGE AND VALUES. THE CALGARY STAMPEDE IS INCORPORATED UNDER THE COMPANIES ACT OF ALBERTA AS A NOT-FOR-PROFIT ORGANIZATION AND IS EXEMPT FROM INCOME TAXES UNDER THE CANADIAN INCOME TAX ACT. THE DIRECTORS OF THE CALGARY STAMPEDE ARE ELECTED OR APPOINTED VOLUNTEERS WHO CANNOT BE PAID IN ANY FORM FOR THEIR SERVICES UNDER ITS BY-LAWS. THE SHAREHOLDERS OF THE CALGARY STAMPEDE, WHO ARE ALSO VOLUNTEERS, CANNOT RECEIVE ANY DIVIDENDS, NOR CAN THE SHARES APPRECIATE IN VALUE. SHARES CAN NEITHER BE SOLD NOR HELD BY PERSONS OUTSIDE OF THE PROVINCE OF ALBERTA NOR IN THE ESTATES OF DECEASED SHAREHOLDERS.

#### 2. CHANGE IN ACCOUNTING POLICIES

IN FISCAL 2013, THE CALGARY STAMPEDE EARLY-ADOPTED THE PROVISIONS OF THE CPA CANADA HANDBOOK ("HANDBOOK"), PART III – ACCOUNTING FOR NOT-FOR-PROFIT ORGANIZATIONS SECTION 3463, REPORTING EMPLOYEE FUTURE BENEFITS BY NOT-FOR-PROFIT ORGANIZATIONS ON A RETROSPECTIVE BASIS. AS A RESULT, THE CALGARY STAMPEDE IS REQUIRED TO USE A MEASUREMENT DATE OF DECEMBER 31 (PREVIOUSLY SEPTEMBER 30). IN ADDITION, IT IS REQUIRED TO DETERMINE THE AMOUNT OF REMEASUREMENTS AND OTHER ITEMS FOR THE PERIOD IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE HANDBOOK, PART II – SECTION 3462. ACCORDINGLY, ALL REMEASUREMENTS AND OTHER ITEMS SHALL BE RECOGNIZED DIRECTLY IN "COMMUNITY INVESTMENT" IN THE CONSOLIDATED STATEMENT OF FINANCIAL POSITION RATHER THAN IN THE CONSOLIDATED STATEMENT OF OPERATIONS AND COMMUNITY INVESTMENT AND PRESENTED AS A SEPARATELY IDENTIFIED LINE ITEM IN THE AGGREGATION OF COMMUNITY INVESTMENT.

IN FISCAL 2012, THE CALGARY STAMPEDE RETROSPECTIVELY ADOPTED THE IMMEDIATE RECOGNITION APPROACH FOR ITS DEFINED BENEFIT PENSION PLANS IN ACCORDANCE WITH CICA HANDBOOK, PART II – SECTION 3461. IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE STANDARD, THE DATE OF TRANSITION WAS THE BEGINNING OF THE FISCAL 2011 AND ALL OUTSTANDING UNRECOGNIZED BALANCES WERE RECOGNIZED AT THE DATE OF TRANSITION AS ADJUSTMENTS TO THE ACCRUED BENEFIT ASSET (LIABILITY).

#### 3. SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

THE CONSOLIDATED FINANCIAL STATEMENTS OF THE CALGARY STAMPEDE HAVE BEEN PREPARED BY MANAGEMENT IN ACCORDANCE WITH CANADIAN ACCOUNTING STANDARDS FOR NOT-FOR-PROFIT ORGANIZATIONS, PART III OF THE CPA CANADA HANDBOOK. A PRECISE DETERMINATION OF MANY ASSETS AND LIABILITIES IS DEPENDENT UPON FUTURE EVENTS AND CONSEQUENTLY, THE PREPARATION OF PERIODIC FINANCIAL STATEMENTS NECESSARILY INVOLVES THE USE OF ESTIMATES AND APPROXIMATIONS. AREAS SUBJECT TO ESTIMATION INCLUDE VALUATION OF ACCOUNTS RECEIVABLE AND INVENTORY, USEFUL LIVES OF TANGIBLE CAPITAL ASSETS, IMPAIRMENT OF LONG-LIVED ASSETS, THE FINANCIAL IMPACT OF THE 2013 FLOODING EVENT (NOTE 4), ACCRUED LIABILITIES, EMPLOYEE FUTURE BENEFITS AND POTENTIAL CONTINGENCIES. THOSE ESTIMATES ALSO AFFECT THE DISCLOSURE OF CONTINGENCIES AT THE DATE OF THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS AND THE REPORTED AMOUNTS OF ASSETS, LIABILITIES, REVENUES AND EXPENSES. ACTUAL RESULTS COULD DIFFER FROM THOSE ESTIMATES.

THE CONSOLIDATED FINANCIAL STATEMENTS HAVE BEEN PREPARED WITHIN THE FRAMEWORK OF THE ACCOUNTING POLICIES SUMMARIZED BELOW.

#### (A) BASIS OF PRESENTATION

THE CONSOLIDATED FINANCIAL STATEMENTS INCLUDE THE ACCOUNTS OF THE CALGARY STAMPEDE, ITS WHOLLY OWNED SUBSIDIARIES, WEADICK PROPERTIES LIMITED ("WEADICK"), CALGARY STAMPEDE (GP) INC., CALGARY STAMPEDE TRUST ("TRUST"), IN WHICH THE CALGARY STAMPEDE CONTROLS THE TRUST AS ITS SOLE BENEFICIARY, AND ITS 50% INTEREST IN STAMPEDE ENTERTAINMENT INC. ("SEI"). THESE SUBSIDIARIES ARE COMPRISED OF NOT-FOR-PROFIT AND FOR-PROFIT ORGANIZATIONS THAT ARE SUBJECT TO OR EXEMPT FROM INCOME TAXES AS PRESCRIBED BY THE CANADIAN INCOME TAX ACT.

THE PURPOSE OF WEADICK IS TO ACQUIRE LANDS FOR FUTURE CALGARY STAMPEDE EXPANSION AND DEVELOPMENT PURPOSES.

THE PURPOSE OF CALGARY STAMPEDE (GP) INC. (0.01% GENERAL PARTNER) AND CALGARY STAMPEDE TRUST (99.99% LIMITED PARTNER) IS TO OWN THE STAMPEDE (CASINO) LIMITED PARTNERSHIP WHICH OPERATES COWBOYS CASINO AND ITS ANCILLARY OPERATIONS, INCLUDING FOOD, BEVERAGE AND ENTERTAINMENT. THE TRUST WAS ESTABLISHED THROUGH A TRUST AGREEMENT IN WHICH THE CALGARY STAMPEDE IS THE SOLE BENEFICIARY OF THE TRUST AND THE TRUST'S ANNUAL TAXABLE INCOME IS DISTRIBUTED TO IT.

THE PURPOSE OF SEI IS TO PRESENT VARIOUS WESTERN AND CALGARY STAMPEDE RELATED ENTERTAINMENT DURING THE ANNUAL STAMPEDE FESTIVAL AND THROUGHOUT THE YEAR VIA TELEVISION, MOVIES AND LIVE PERFORMANCE. THE CALGARY STAMPEDE HAS JOINT CONTROL OF SEI, AND THEREFORE PROPORTIONATELY CONSOLIDATES SEI'S OPERATIONS INTO THE RESULTS OF THE CALGARY STAMPEDE.

THE CALGARY STAMPEDE IS ASSOCIATED WITH THE CALGARY STAMPEDE FOUNDATION ("FOUNDATION") DUE TO ITS ABILITY TO APPOINT THE MAJORITY OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE FOUNDATION. THE FOUNDATION'S FINANCIAL ACCOUNTS HAVE NOT BEEN CONSOLIDATED WITH THOSE OF THE CALGARY STAMPEDE. THE CALGARY STAMPEDE HAS ELECTED TO DISCLOSE ALL PERTINENT FINANCIAL INFORMATION OF THE FOUNDATION IN THE NOTES TO THESE CONSOLIDATED FINANCIAL STATEMENTS. THE FOUNDATION HAS THE PRIMARY OBJECTIVE OF ESTABLISHING PROGRAMS FOR THE BENEFIT OF YOUNG RESIDENTS OF SOUTHERN ALBERTA TO ADVANCE THEIR KNOWLEDGE AND UNDERSTANDING OF THE HISTORY, HERITAGE, TRADITIONS AND CULTURE OF ALBERTA.

#### (B) CASH AND SHORT-TERM DEPOSITS

CASH AND SHORT-TERM DEPOSITS COMPRISE CASH ON HAND, DEMAND DEPOSITS AND DEPOSITS HELD IN TRUST, HAVING A MATURITY OF THREE MONTHS OR LESS FROM THE DATE OF PURCHASE, AND ARE RECORDED AT FAIR MARKET VALUE. INVESTMENT REVENUE IS RECOGNIZED WHEN IT IS RECEIVABLE.

## (C) INVENTORY

INVENTORY IS RECORDED AT THE LOWER OF COST AND NET REALIZABLE VALUE. COST IS DETERMINED ON A WEIGHTED AVERAGE BASIS, AND NET REALIZABLE VALUE IS DETERMINED USING ESTIMATED SELLING PRICES LESS CORRESPONDING COSTS. THE ESTIMATED SELLING PRICE TAKES INTO ACCOUNT MANAGEMENT'S BEST ESTIMATE OF THE MOST PROBABLE SET OF ECONOMIC CONDITIONS.

#### (D) TANGIBLE CAPITAL ASSETS AND AMORTIZATION

BUILDINGS AND EQUIPMENT ARE STATED AT COST LESS ACCUMULATED AMORTIZATION. MAJOR OVERHAULS AND IMPROVEMENTS ARE CAPITALIZED, WHILE NORMAL REPAIRS AND MAINTENANCE ARE EXPENSED AS INCURRED. PARK DEVELOPMENT PROJECTS INCLUDE THE DESIGN AND CONSTRUCTION COSTS INCURRED ON A NUMBER OF PROJECTS RELATED TO THE CALGARY STAMPEDE'S EXPANSION PLANS. INTEREST INCURRED ON DEBT SPECIFICALLY OBTAINED TO FINANCE CAPITAL PROJECTS IS CAPITALIZED DURING THE CONSTRUCTION PERIOD. AMORTIZATION IS PROVIDED ON A STRAIGHT-LINE BASIS AT RATES DESIGNED TO AMORTIZE THE ASSETS OVER THEIR ESTIMATED INSEPTIL LIVES.

TITLE TO THE LAND ON WHICH CERTAIN PORTIONS OF STAMPEDE PARK IS LOCATED IS VESTED IN THE CITY OF CALGARY AND IS USED BY THE CALGARY STAMPEDE UNDER A NOMINAL LONG-TERM LEASE EXPIRING IN THE YEAR 2060, WITH AN ADDITIONAL 50-YEAR RENEWAL TERM.

LANDS OWNED DIRECTLY BY THE CALGARY STAMPEDE ARE RECORDED AT COST AND ARE HELD FOR CALGARY STAMPEDE EXPANSION AND DEVELOPMENT PURPOSES.

#### 3. SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES (CONTINUED)

#### (E) IMPAIRMENT OF LONG-LIVED ASSETS

LONG-LIVED ASSETS ARE TESTED FOR RECOVERABILITY WHENEVER EVENTS OR CHANGES IN CIRCUMSTANCES INDICATE THAT THEIR CARRYING AMOUNT MAY NOT BE FULLY RECOVERABLE. IF THERE IS AN INDICATION OF IMPAIRMENT THE FIRST STEP IN THE IMPAIRMENT TEST IS TO COMPARE THE CARRYING VALUE OF AN ASSET GROUP WITH THE TOTAL UNDISCOUNTED CASH FLOWS EXPECTED FROM THEIR USE AND EVENTUAL DISPOSITION. IF THE CARRYING VALUE OF THE ASSET GROUP EXCEEDS THE UNDISCOUNTED CASH FLOW AN IMPAIRMENT LOSS IS REQUIRED TO BE DETERMINED. AN IMPAIRMENT LOSS IS RECOGNIZED TO THE EXTENT THAT THE CARRYING VALUE OF AN ASSET GROUP EXCEEDS THE TOTAL DISCOUNTED CASH FLOWS EXPECTED FROM THEIR USE AND EVENTUAL DISPOSITION.

#### (F) ADVANCES ON FUTURE EVENTS

ADVANCES ON FUTURE EVENTS REPRESENT FUNDS RECEIVED IN ADVANCE FOR EVENTS INCLUDING THE STAMPEDE FESTIVAL, CONVENTIONS AND TRADE SHOWS AND FACILITIES, BUILDING AND ICE RENTALS. REVENUE FROM SUCH EVENTS IS RECOGNIZED AS INCOME IN THE PERIOD IN WHICH THE EVENTS TAKE PLACE.

#### (G) EMPLOYEE FUTURE BENEFITS

THE CALGARY STAMPEDE HAS A NUMBER OF DEFINED BENEFIT PENSION PLANS AS WELL AS A DEFINED CONTRIBUTION PENSION PLAN THAT PROVIDE PENSION BENEFITS TO MOST OF ITS EMPLOYEES. THE DEFINED BENEFIT PENSION PLANS ARE BASED ON YEARS OF SERVICE AND HIGHEST AVERAGE SALARY. PENSION BENEFITS ARE NOT AUTOMATICALLY INCREASED FOR INFLATION.

THE CALGARY STAMPEDE ACCOUNTS FOR ITS DEFINED PENSION PLANS USING THE IMMEDIATE RECOGNITION APPROACH. THE COST OF PENSION BENEFITS EARNED BY EMPLOYEES IS ACTUARIALLY DETERMINED USING THE PROJECTED BENEFIT METHOD PRORATED ON SERVICE AND MANAGEMENT'S BEST ESTIMATE OF EXPECTED PLAN INVESTMENT PERFORMANCE, SALARY ESCALATION AND RETIREMENT AGES OF EMPLOYEES. PLAN OBLIGATIONS ARE DISCOUNTED USING CURRENT MARKET INTEREST RATES AND PLAN ASSETS ARE PRESENTED AT FAIR VALUE.

#### (H) FINANCIAL INSTRUMENTS

FINANCIAL INSTRUMENTS ARE RECORDED AT FAIR VALUE ON INITIAL RECOGNITION. FREE-STANDING DERIVATIVE INSTRUMENTS THAT ARE NOT IN A QUALIFYING HEDGING RELATIONSHIP AND EQUITY INSTRUMENTS THAT ARE QUOTED IN AN ACTIVE MARKET ARE SUBSEQUENTLY RECORDED AT FAIR VALUE. ALL OTHER FINANCIAL INSTRUMENTS ARE RECORDED AT COST OR AMORTIZED COST, UNLESS MANAGEMENT HAS ELECTED TO RECORD AT FAIR VALUE. THE CALGARY STAMPEDE HAS NOT ELECTED TO CARRY ANY SUCH FINANCIAL INSTRUMENTS AT FAIR VALUE.

TRANSACTION COSTS RELATED TO FINANCIAL INSTRUMENTS MEASURED AT FAIR VALUE ARE EXPENSED AS INCURRED. FOR ALL OTHER
FINANCIAL INSTRUMENTS, THE TRANSACTION COSTS ARE ADDED TO THE CARRYING VALUE OF THE ASSET OR NETTED AGAINST THE CARRYING
VALUE OF THE LIABILITY AND ARE THEN RECOGNIZED OVER THE EXPECTED LIFE OF THE INSTRUMENT USING THE STRAIGHT-LINE METHOD.
ANY PREMIUM OR DISCOUNT RELATED TO AN INSTRUMENT MEASURED AT AMORTIZED COST IS AMORTIZED OVER THE EXPECTED LIFE OF THE
ITEM USING THE STRAIGHT-LINE METHOD AND RECOGNIZED IN THE EXCESS OF REVENUE OVER EXPENSES AS INTEREST INCOME OR EXPENSE.

WITH RESPECT TO FINANCIAL ASSETS MEASURED AT COST OR AMORTIZED COST, THE CALGARY STAMPEDE RECOGNIZES AN IMPAIRMENT LOSS, IF ANY, WHEN IT DETERMINES THAT A SIGNIFICANT ADVERSE CHANGE HAS OCCURRED DURING THE PERIOD IN THE EXPECTED TIMING OR AMOUNT OF FUTURE CASH FLOWS. WHEN THE EXTENT OF IMPAIRMENT OF A PREVIOUSLY WRITTEN-DOWN ASSET DECREASES AND THE DECREASE CAN BE RELATED TO AN EVENT OCCURRING AFTER THE IMPAIRMENT WAS RECOGNIZED, THE PREVIOUSLY RECOGNIZED IMPAIRMENT LOSS SHALL BE REVERSED IN THE PERIOD THE REVERSAL OCCURS.

## (I) INTEREST RATE SWAP

INTEREST RATE SWAPS ("SWAPS") ARE UTILIZED TO MANAGE INTEREST RATE RISK ON THE CALGARY STAMPEDE'S LONG-TERM DEBT. THE CALGARY STAMPEDE DOES NOT ENTER INTO FINANCIAL INSTRUMENTS FOR TRADING OR SPECULATIVE PURPOSES. THE SWAPS ARE CONSIDERED TO BE EFFECTIVE ACCOUNTING HEDGES, BOTH AT INCEPTION AND OVER THE TERM OF THE INSTRUMENT. THE SWAP AGREEMENTS PROVIDE FOR THE PERIODIC EXCHANGE OF PAYMENTS (WITHOUT THE EXCHANGE OF THE NOTIONAL PRINCIPAL AMOUNT UPON WHICH THE PAYMENTS ARE BASED), WHICH ARE RECORDED AS AN ADJUSTMENT OF INTEREST EXPENSE ON THE HEDGED DEBT INSTRUMENT. THE RELATED AMOUNT PAYABLE TO OR RECEIVABLE FROM COUNTERPARTIES IS INCLUDED AS AN ADJUSTMENT TO ACCRUED INTEREST.

# (J) GRANTS AND CONTRIBUTIONS

THE CALGARY STAMPEDE FOLLOWS THE DEFERRAL METHOD OF ACCOUNTING FOR GRANTS AND CONTRIBUTIONS. UNRESTRICTED CONTRIBUTIONS ARE RECOGNIZED AS INCOME WHEN RECEIVED OR RECEIVABLE. AMOUNTS EXTERNALLY RESTRICTED FOR CAPITAL PURPOSES ARE INITIALLY RECORDED AS "DEFERRED CONTRIBUTIONS" WHEN RECEIVED OR RECEIVABLE AND SUBSEQUENTLY INCLUDED IN INCOME IN THE SAME PROPORTION AS THE AMORTIZATION OF THE RELATED ASSETS FOR WHICH THE CAPITAL CONTRIBUTIONS WERE EXPENDED. AMOUNTS THAT RELATE TO OPERATING EXPENDITURES OF A FUTURE PERIOD ARE DEFERRED UNTIL THE RELATED EXPENDITURES ARE INCURRED.

# (K) REVENUE RECOGNITION

REVENUE, WITH THE EXCEPTION OF GRANTS AND CONTRIBUTIONS, IS RECOGNIZED WHEN PERSUASIVE EVIDENCE OF AN ARRANGEMENT EXISTS, DELIVERY HAS OCCURRED, THE PRICE IS FIXED OR DETERMINABLE AND COLLECTION IS REASONABLY ASSURED.

### 3. SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES (CONTINUED)

#### (L) VOLUNTEER SERVICES

A SUBSTANTIAL NUMBER OF UNPAID VOLUNTEERS MAKE SIGNIFICANT CONTRIBUTIONS OF THEIR TIME IN DEVELOPING AND DELIVERING CALGARY STAMPEDE PROGRAMS. THE VALUE OF THIS CONTRIBUTED TIME IS NOT REFLECTED IN THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS SINCE OBJECTIVE MEASUREMENT OR VALUATION IS INDETERMINABLE.

#### (M) SUPPLIES AND SERVICES IN KIND

THE CALGARY STAMPEDE RECEIVES SUPPLIES AND SERVICES FROM SUPPLIERS IN EXCHANGE FOR VARIOUS SPONSORSHIP BENEFITS, SUCH AS ADVERTISING OR PROMOTION. THESE TRANSACTIONS ARE RECORDED WHEN A FAIR VALUE CAN BE REASONABLY ESTIMATED AND THE SUPPLIES AND SERVICES ARE USED IN THE NORMAL COURSE OF OPERATIONS AND WOULD OTHERWISE HAVE BEEN PURCHASED. THE CONTRIBUTIONS OF SUPPLIES AND SERVICES ARE REPORTED IN GROSS REVENUE, WHILE THE SUPPLIES AND SERVICES BEING PROVIDED ARE REPORTED IN DIRECT EXPENSES.

INCLUDED IN GROSS REVENUE AND DIRECT EXPENSES IN THE CONSOLIDATED STATEMENT OF OPERATIONS IS \$1,774 FOR SUPPLIES AND SERVICES IN KIND RECEIVED (2012 - \$1,753).

#### (N) GOVERNMENT REMITTANCES RECOVERABLE AND/OR PAYABLE

AT DECEMBER 31, 2013, THE CALGARY STAMPEDE HAD GOVERNMENT REMITTANCES PAYABLE OF \$538 (2012 - \$75).

#### 4. SIGNIFICANT EVENT - FLOODING OF STAMPEDE PARK

#### (A) OVERVIEW

ON JUNE 20, 2013, THE CITY OF CALGARY EXPERIENCED UNPRECEDENTED FLOODING AND AS A RESULT, THE CALGARY STAMPEDE WAS SEVERELY IMPACTED THROUGH SIGNIFICANT PROPERTY DAMAGE AND THE LOSS OF CERTAIN OPERATING REVENUES. THE CALGARY STAMPEDE INITIALLY COMPLETED THE WORK NECESSARY TO ENSURE THAT THE 2013 STAMPEDE FESTIVAL WOULD NOT HAVE TO BE CANCELLED. SINCE THEN, THE CALGARY STAMPEDE COMMENCED A PROCESS TO REMEDIATE DAMAGE TO ITS FACILITIES. RECOVERY AND RESTORATION EFFORTS HAVE BEEN ONGOING AND WILL CONTINUE ON THROUGH 2014.

THE CALGARY STAMPEDE MAINTAINS VARIOUS INSURANCE POLICIES WITH MULTIPLE INSURANCE PROVIDERS THAT HAVE BEEN UTILIZED TO FUND A CONSIDERABLE PORTION OF THE INITIAL CLEAN-UP COSTS AND THE REMEDIATION OF THE FACILITIES DAMAGED BY THE FLOOD.

MANAGEMENT ESTIMATES THAT THE AMOUNT THAT WILL BE EXPENDED TO REMEDIATE THE DAMAGE ASSOCIATED WITH THE FLOOD WILL RANGE BETWEEN \$50 - \$52 MILLION. THE CALGARY STAMPEDE ESTIMATES THAT ALL BUT \$1 - \$1.5 MILLION WILL BE COVERED BY ITS VARIOUS INSURANCE POLICIES. THIS DIFFERENCE WILL BE FUNDED INTERNALLY.

#### (B) IMPACT ON THE 2013 FINANCIAL RESULTS

COSTS INCURRED ON CLEANUP AND REMEDIATION EFFORTS ARE CAPITALIZED OR EXPENSED IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE ACCOUNTING POLICIES DISCUSSED IN NOTE 3 (I.E. CAPITALIZED TO TANGIBLE CAPITAL ASSETS IF THE EXPENDITURES QUALIFY AS A BETTERMENT OR ENHANCEMENT TO THE ASSET). PROCEEDS RECEIVED AND/OR RECEIVABLES ANTICIPATED FROM INSURERS ARE RECORDED AS GROSS REVENUE OR AGAINST THE RESPECTIVE COSTS INCURRED. AS SUCH, THE EXPENSES RECORDED IN THE CONSOLIDATED STATEMENTS OF OPERATIONS AND COMMUNITY INVESTMENT ARE NET OF THE RELATED PROCEEDS RECEIVED OR ESTIMATED TO BE RECEIVED.

BUILDINGS AND FACILITIES THAT WERE SIGNIFICANTLY IMPACTED BY THE FLOODING INCLUDED THE BIG FOUR BUILDING, ORIGINAL AGRICULTURE BUILDING, GRANDSTAND (INCLUDING THE RACE TRACK AND INFIELD INFRASTRUCTURE), PEOPLE CENTRE AND STAMPEDE HEADQUARTERS. AN IMPAIRMENT LOSS HAS NOT BEEN RECORDED ON THESE ASSETS FOR THE YEAR ENDED DECEMBER 31, 2013 AS THE CARRYING VALUE OF THE RELATED TANGIBLE CAPITAL ASSETS WAS IMMATERIAL, WITH THE EXCEPTION OF THE RACE TRACK. AS THE NEW TRACK CONSTRUCTION HAD BEEN COMPLETED JUST PRIOR TO THE FLOOD, ANY COSTS INCURRED TO REMEDIATE IT WERE COVERED BY INSURANCE PROCEEDS AND THEREFORE CHARGED TO THE CONSOLIDATED STATEMENT OF OPERATIONS AND COMMUNITY INVESTMENT. ACCORDINGLY, THERE WAS NO NET IMPACT TO THE CONSOLIDATED FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THIS REMEDIATION.

THE AGRIUM WESTERN EVENT CENTRE CONSTRUCTION SITE WAS ALSO IMPACTED BY THE FLOOD. THE TOTAL LOSS ASSOCIATED WITH THE SITE IS ESTIMATED AT \$0.3 MILLION, OF WHICH \$0.2 MILLION HAS BEEN INCURRED TO DECEMBER 31, 2013. IT IS EXPECTED THAT THESE AMOUNTS WILL BE RECOVERABLE, AND AMOUNTS EXPENDED HAVE BEEN RECOGNIZED AS A RECEIVABLE AS AT DECEMBER 31, 2013.

A PORTION OF THE CLEANUP COSTS AND REMEDIATION WORK AGGREGATING \$0.5 MILLION FELL OUTSIDE OF THE INSURANCE POLICY COVERAGE LIMITATIONS AND ACCORDINGLY, WAS CHARGED TO "ADMINISTRATION, MARKETING AND PARK SERVICES" IN THE CONSOLIDATED STATEMENTS OF OPERATIONS AND COMMUNITY INVESTMENT.

GIVEN THAT MANY OF THE COSTS ASSOCIATED WITH THE FLOOD ARE STILL IN THE ASSESSMENT PROCESS WITH OUR INSURANCE ADJUSTERS, A RESERVE OF \$0.3 MILLION WAS ACCRUED TO RECOGNIZE A PORTION OF THE UNASSESSED CLAIM THAT MAY NOT BE APPROVED. THIS AMOUNT IS RECORDED AS PART OF "ADMINISTRATION, MARKETING AND PARK SERVICES" IN THE CONSOLIDATED STATEMENT OF OPERATIONS AND COMMUNITY INVESTMENT.

#### (B) IMPACT ON THE 2013 FINANCIAL RESULTS (CONTINUED)

THE FLOOD RESULTED IN THE LOSS OF NET REVENUE ASSOCIATED WITH SEVERAL OF THE CALGARY STAMPEDE'S PROGRAMS AND/OR BUSINESS UNITS. THE CALGARY STAMPEDE HAS APPLIED TO RECOVER THIS LOSS THROUGH BUSINESS INTERRUPTION COVERAGE. AS AT DECEMBER 31, 2013, THE CALGARY STAMPEDE HAS RECOGNIZED INSURANCE PROCEEDS OF APPROXIMATELY \$0.9 MILLION RELATED TO THIS LOSS IN THE RESPECTIVE GROSS REVENUE LINE ITEMS IN THE CONSOLIDATED STATEMENT OF OPERATIONS AND COMMUNITY INVESTMENT. AS THE CALGARY STAMPEDE'S BUSINESS INTERRUPTION CLAIM HAS YET TO BE FINALIZED, THIS AMOUNT MAY DIFFER AT THE CONCLUSION OF THE CLAIM.

SUBSEQUENT TO YEAR-END, THE CALGARY STAMPEDE RECEIVED \$5.3 MILLION OF THE AFOREMENTIONED PROCEEDS RECEIVABLE FROM THE INSURERS.

WITHIN "ACCOUNTS PAYABLE AND ACCRUED LIABILITIES" IN THE CONSOLIDATED STATEMENT OF FINANCIAL POSITION IS \$5.9 MILLION RELATED TO FLOOD RELATED CLEAN-UP AND REMEDIATION.

# (C) HELL OR HIGH WATER

THE CALGARY STAMPEDE CREATED AND MARKETED HELL OR HIGH WATER T-SHIRTS WHICH GENERATED NET PROCEEDS OF APPROXIMATELY \$2.4 MILLION TO SUPPORT FLOOD RELIEF PROGRAMS. AT DECEMBER 31, 2013, \$2.1 MILLION HAS BEEN DONATED TO THE CANADIAN RED CROSS ALBERTA FLOODS RESPONSE, WITH THE BALANCE TO BE PAID TO THEM IN THE NEAR TERM. INCLUDED IN "OTHER ACTIVITIES" IN THE CONSOLIDATED STATEMENT OF OPERATIONS AND COMMUNITY INVESTMENT IS \$3.2 MILLION IN REVENUES AND AN EQUIVALENT \$3.2 MILLION IN EXPENSES ASSOCIATED WITH THIS PROGRAM.

### (D) COMMITMENTS

AT DECEMBER 31, 2013, THE CALGARY STAMPEDE HAS OUTSTANDING COMMITMENTS FOR EQUIPMENT AND FLOOD RELATED RECOVERY PROJECTS AMOUNTING TO APPROXIMATELY \$4.7 MILLION.

#### (E) MEASUREMENT UNCERTAINTY

ESTIMATING THE IMPACT OF THE FLOOD INVOLVES A CONSIDERABLE NUMBER OF ESTIMATES PARTICULARLY AS IT RELATES TO THE TOTAL AMOUNTS TO BE EXPENDED, AND AMOUNT TO BE COVERED BY INSURERS. THE ESTIMATES MADE BY MANAGEMENT ARE BASED ON THE INFORMATION THAT IS AVAILABLE TO DATE. WHILST MANAGEMENT HAS MADE CONSIDERABLE EFFORT TO ASSESS THE ACCURACY OF THE ESTIMATES, THEY ARE SUBJECT TO ESTIMATION UNCERTAINTY. THE ESTIMATES MADE TO DATE INCLUDING THOSE THAT RELATE TO FUTURE

- THE PORTION OF COSTS INCURRED THAT WILL BE RECOVERED FROM INSURERS. THIS IS SUBJECT TO VARIOUS RESTRICTIONS WITHIN THE RELATED POLICIES AND AGREEMENTS AND THE INTERPRETATIONS WITH RESPECT THERETO.
- ESTIMATES OF ITEMS LOST OR DAMAGED. THERE MAY BE ITEMS LOST OR DAMAGED THAT HAVE NOT YET BEEN IDENTIFIED AND MAY NOT BE IDENTIFIED UNTIL ALL REMEDIATION PROJECTS ARE COMPLETED.

#### (F) MITIGATION EFFORTS AND GOVERNMENT GRANTS

THE CALGARY STAMPEDE IS PLANNING CERTAIN PROJECTS TO FURTHER PROTECT STAMPEDE PARK FROM FLOOD DAMAGE WHICH ARE NOT COVERED BY INSURANCE AND HAS APPLIED FOR VARIOUS GOVERNMENT GRANTS TOTALING \$15.6 MILLION TO PROVIDE FUNDING FOR THESE PROJECTS. AS AT DECEMBER 31, 2013, THE CALGARY STAMPEDE HAS INCURRED \$0.4 MILLION IN RELATION TO THESE PROJECTS AND HAS ADDITIONAL OUTSTANDING COMMITMENTS AMOUNTING TO \$0.1 MILLION.

### 7. TANGIBLE CAPITAL ASSETS AND CAPITAL COMMITMENTS (CONTINUED)

AS AT DECEMBER 31, 2013, THE CALGARY STAMPEDE, THROUGH THE CITY OF CALGARY, CONTINUES ITS EFFORTS TO EXPROPRIATE THE REMAINING 12 PROPERTIES IN VICTORIA PARK REQUIRED FOR THE PLANNED CALGARY STAMPEDE EXPANSION. THE FINAL PURCHASE PRICE OF THESE PROPERTIES WILL BE DETERMINED AT THE CONCLUSION OF THE EXPROPRIATION COMPENSATION HEARINGS.

THE CALGARY STAMPEDE HAS GRANTED A THIRD PARTY DEVELOPER THE RIGHT TO ACQUIRE HALF OF THE RAMSAY EXCHANGE LANDS FOR \$13.0 MILLION AT ANY TIME UP TO MAY 2014. RAMSAY EXCHANGE WAS PURCHASED FOR \$26.1 MILLION; THE LAND WAS VALUED AT \$19.9 MILLION AND THE ONSITE BUILDINGS AT \$6.2 MILLION. RAMSAY EXCHANGE IS STRATEGICALLY LOCATED PROVIDING ADDITIONAL STORAGE FOR THE CALGARY STAMPEDE IN CLOSE VICINITY TO ITS MAIN OPERATIONS. A MAJORITY OF THE BUILDINGS ARE OCCUPIED BY THIRD PARTIES AND ARE GENERATING BENTAL INCOME.

AS PART OF ITS PARK DEVELOPMENT PLAN, THE CALGARY STAMPEDE HAS INITIATED CONSTRUCTION ON THE AGRIUM WESTERN EVENT CENTRE AND SUPPORTING INFRASTRUCTURE PROJECTS AT AN APPROVED COST OF \$61.2 MILLION. AT DECEMBER 31, 2013, \$48.7 MILLION IN EXPENDITURES HAVE BEEN INCURRED RELATED TO THE AGRIUM WESTERN EVENT CENTRE AND SUPPORTING INFRASTRUCTURE PROJECTS AND OF THIS AMOUNT \$14.7 MILLION RELATED TO A NUMBER OF SUPPORTING INFRASTRUCTURE PROJECTS, SUCH AS THE RACE TRACK SHORTENING, INFIELD TUNNEL AND PAVING AND ORIGINAL AGRICULTURE BUILDING RENOVATION HAVE BEEN COMPLETED AND PUT INTO USE IN OPERATIONS. THE REMAINING \$34.0 MILLION IN ACCUMULATED COST HAS BEEN SPENT ON THE AGRIUM WESTERN EVENT CENTRE, WHICH IS EXPECTED TO BE COMPLETED IN JUNE 2014.

INCLUDED IN "CASH AND SHORT-TERM DEPOSITS" IN THE CONSOLIDATED STATEMENT OF FINANCIAL POSITION ARE DEPOSITS HELD IN TRUST OF \$487 (2012 - \$487) REQUIRED BY THE CITY OF CALGARY FOR THE VALUE OF CONSTRUCTION WORK BEING COMPLETED ON CITY PROPERTY. THESE DEPOSITS WILL BE RETURNED UPON CITY VERIFICATION THAT THE WORK HAS BEEN COMPLETED TO THEIR SATISFACTION.

DURING FISCAL 2012, THE CALGARY STAMPEDE ENTERED INTO A LAND SWAP TRANSACTION WITH THE FOUNDATION. GIVEN THAT THE LAND BEING EXCHANGED WITH THE FOUNDATION HAD BEEN RECORDED AT HISTORICAL COST AND THE TRANSACTION WAS RECORDED AT THE EXCHANGE AMOUNT, THE CALGARY STAMPEDE RECOGNIZED A GAIN AGGREGATING \$9.6 MILLION.

ALSO DURING FISCAL 2012, LAND KNOWN AS THE OGDEN LANDS WAS SOLD FOR NET PROCEEDS OF \$8.7 MILLION. THIS LAND WAS PURCHASED BY THE CALGARY STAMPEDE IN 2007 AND LEASEHOLD IMPROVEMENTS WERE MADE, RESULTING IN AN AGGREGATED COST OF \$11.6 MILLION.
AFTER ALL COSTS INCURRED PERTAINING TO THE SALE OF THE OGDEN LANDS. A LOSS OF \$2.9 MILLION WAS RECOGNIZED.

# 8. BANK INDEBTEDNESS

A REVOLVING DEMAND OPERATING LOAN FACILITY HAS BEEN AUTHORIZED TO A MAXIMUM OF \$12.5 MILLION AND BEARS INTEREST AT THE BANK'S PRIME INTEREST RATE. AT DECEMBER 31, 2013, \$1.0 MILLION IS OUTSTANDING ON THE DEMAND OPERATING LOAN. AS SECURITY, A CANADIAN CHARTERED BANK HOLDS A FIXED DEBENTURE IN THE AMOUNT OF \$50.0 MILLION CHARGING CERTAIN LANDS AND LEASED FEE INTERESTS OWNED BY THE CALGARY STAMPEDE.

THE FUNDS ARE RESTRICTED TO CONSTRUCTION OF THE AGRIUM WESTERN EVENT CENTRE AND SUPPORTING INFRASTRUCTURE, AND ARE REQUIRED TO BE MAINTAINED IN A SEGREGATED BANK ACCOUNT, WITH ALL INTEREST EARNED ACCRUING TO THE CAPITAL GRANT. THE CALGARY STAMPEDE RECEIVES ANNUAL UNENCUMBERED FUNDING OF \$9.3 MILLION (2012 - \$9.3 MILLION).

#### (B) STAMPEDE GRANT

THE CALGARY STAMPEDE RECEIVES ANNUAL FUNDING OF \$250 (2012 - \$250) IN SUPPORT OF THE STAMPEDE FESTIVAL. THE GRANT, WHICH EXPIRES IN 2014, IS REQUIRED TO BE MAINTAINED IN A SEGREGATED BANK ACCOUNT TOGETHER WITH ALL INTEREST EARNED.

#### (C) AGRICULTURE GRANT

AS A "CLASS A" FAIR, THE CALGARY STAMPEDE RECEIVES AN ANNUAL OPERATING GRANT OF \$100 (2012 - \$100) TO SUPPORT AGRICULTURE PROGRAMS.

## 12. FINANCIAL INSTRUMENTS

THE CALGARY STAMPEDE'S FINANCIAL INSTRUMENTS RECOGNIZED IN THE CONSOLIDATED STATEMENT OF FINANCIAL POSITION INCLUDE CASH AND SHORT-TERM DEPOSITS, ACCOUNTS RECEIVABLE, RESTRICTED CASH, BANK INDEBTEDNESS, ACCOUNTS PAYABLE AND ACCRUED LIABILITIES, ADVANCES ON FUTURE EVENTS, DEFERRED GRANT REVENUE AND LONG-TERM DEBT.

#### (A) CREDIT RISK

AT DECEMBER 31, 2013, APPROXIMATELY \$10.4 MILLION OF ACCOUNTS RECEIVABLE RELATE TO PROCEEDS RECOVERABLE FROM INSURERS AS A RESULT OF THE 2013 FLOOD. IN ADDITION, APPROXIMATELY \$3.6 MILLION IS DUE FROM THE GOVERNMENT OF CANADA RELATED TO THE AGRIUM WESTERN EVENT CENTRE FUNDING AGREEMENT. MANAGEMENT HAS ASSESSED THE COLLECTION RISK RELATED TO THESE RECEIVABLES AS LOW.

THE BALANCE OF ACCOUNTS RECEIVABLE AT DECEMBER 31, 2013 AND THE AMOUNTS RECOVERABLE AT DECEMBER 31, 2012 ARE DUE FROM A DIVERSE GROUP OF CUSTOMERS AND ARE SUBJECT TO NORMAL CREDIT RISKS.

# (B) INTEREST RATE RISK

THE CALGARY STAMPEDE HAS ENTERED INTO SWAP TRANSACTIONS, AS DISCLOSED IN NOTE 9, TO MANAGE EXPOSURE TO INTEREST RATE INCREASES ON FLOATING RATE DEBT. THE OUTSTANDING BANK INDEBTEDNESS AND LONG TERM DEBT EFFECTIVELY BORE INTEREST AT A WEIGHTED AVERAGE OF 5.35% ON DECEMBER 31, 2013 (2012 – 5.35%) AFTER CONSIDERATION OF THE INTEREST RATE SWAPS.

THE FOUNDATION USES RESTRICTED FUND ACCOUNTING AND ITS FUNDS INCLUDE THE GENERAL, DESIGNATED YOUTH, DESIGNATED, UNDESIGNATED AND CAPITAL FUNDS. THE FOUNDATION'S INVESTMENTS ARE MANAGED BY A THIRD PARTY INVESTMENT FIRM AND ARE SEGREGATED INTO THREE ACCOUNTS: THE CAPITAL ACCOUNT AND THE NAT CHRISTIE ACCOUNT, WHICH ARE EXCLUSIVELY INVESTED IN FIXED INCOME BONDS, AND THE ENDOWMENT ACCOUNT, WHICH IS INVESTED IN BONDS, DEBENTURES AND BOTH POOLED AND NON-POOLED EQUITIES. THE INVESTMENTS ARE RECORDED AT FAIR VALUE AND ANNUAL INCOME INCLUDES DIVIDENDS, INTEREST AND BOTH REALIZED AND UNREALIZED GAINS AND LOSSES.

THE CALGARY STAMPEDE CONTRIBUTED \$837 (2012 - \$864) IN DONATIONS TO THE FOUNDATION.

THE CALGARY STAMPEDE CONDUCTED BUSINESS TRANSACTIONS WITH THE FOUNDATION TO ASSIST THE FOUNDATION IN DELIVERING ITS PROGRAMS AND TO HOST FUNDRAISING EVENTS. REVENUE EARNED FROM THESE TRANSACTIONS TOTALED \$217 (2012 - \$369). THESE TRANSACTIONS ARE IN THE NORMAL COURSE OF OPERATIONS AND HAVE BEEN MEASURED AT THE EXCHANGE AMOUNT, WHICH IS THE AMOUNT OF CONSIDERATION ESTABLISHED AND AGREED TO BY THE RELATED PARTIES.

THE NET PAYABLE TO THE FOUNDATION AT DECEMBER 31, 2013 IS \$689 (2012 - \$507). THE AMOUNT DUE IS NON-INTEREST BEARING AND HAS NO SPECIFIED TERMS OF REPAYMENT.

THE CALGARY STAMPEDE HAS COMMITTED TO A SPONSORSHIP AGREEMENT WITH THE FOUNDATION TO PROVIDE FUNDS FOR A FIVE YEAR PERIOD BEGINNING IN 2009. THE TOTAL SPONSORSHIP COMMITMENT IS \$550, WITH \$120 CONTRIBUTED IN 2013 (2012 - \$115).

AS A RESULT OF THE JUNE FLOODING, THE FOUNDATION HAS INCURRED LOSSES OF APPROXIMATELY \$125 - \$150 FOR ITEMS PAID FOR IN 2013 OR EARLIER YEARS. THESE ITEMS WERE NOT TANGIBLE CAPITAL ASSETS. NO AMOUNTS HAVE BEEN BOOKED IN THE FOUNDATION'S FINANCIAL RESULTS ASSOCIATED WITH THE FLOOD LOSSES. THE MAIN LOSS AREA RELATES TO SHEET MUSIC, WITH AN ESTIMATED REPLACEMENT COST OF \$100. WHEN THE ITEMS LOST ARE REPLACED, INSURANCE PROCEEDS, IF ANY, WILL BE OFFSET AGAINST THE EXPENSE.

#### **DONOR CONTRIBUTIONS - RESTATEMENT**

DURING 2013, IT WAS DISCOVERED THAT THE FOUNDATION WAS THE RECIPIENT OF DONOR CONTRIBUTIONS AGGREGATING \$175 THAT PERTAINED TO FISCAL 2012 AND WERE INAPPROPRIATELY RECORDED IN FISCAL 2013. ACCORDINGLY, CERTAIN BALANCES AS AT AND FOR THE YEAR ENDED DECEMBER 31, 2012 HAVE BEEN RESTATED TO REFLECT THE DONOR CONTRIBUTIONS RECEIVABLE AND THE CORRESPONDING INCREASE IN REVENUE.

#### 15. CONTINGENCY

IN THE NORMAL COURSE OF OPERATIONS, THE CALGARY STAMPEDE IS INVOLVED, FROM TIME TO TIME, IN VARIOUS LEGAL AND OTHER CLAIMS. MANAGEMENT BELIEVES THE EXPOSURE TO CURRENT AND POTENTIAL CLAIMS WOULD NOT HAVE A MATERIAL IMPACT ON THE FINANCIAL POSITION OR OPERATING RESULTS OF THE CALGARY STAMPEDE.
