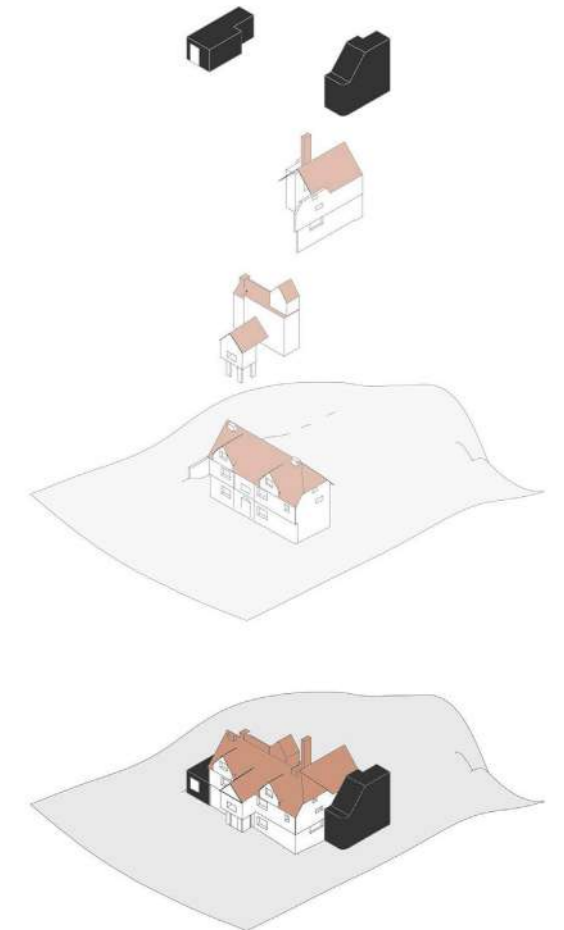

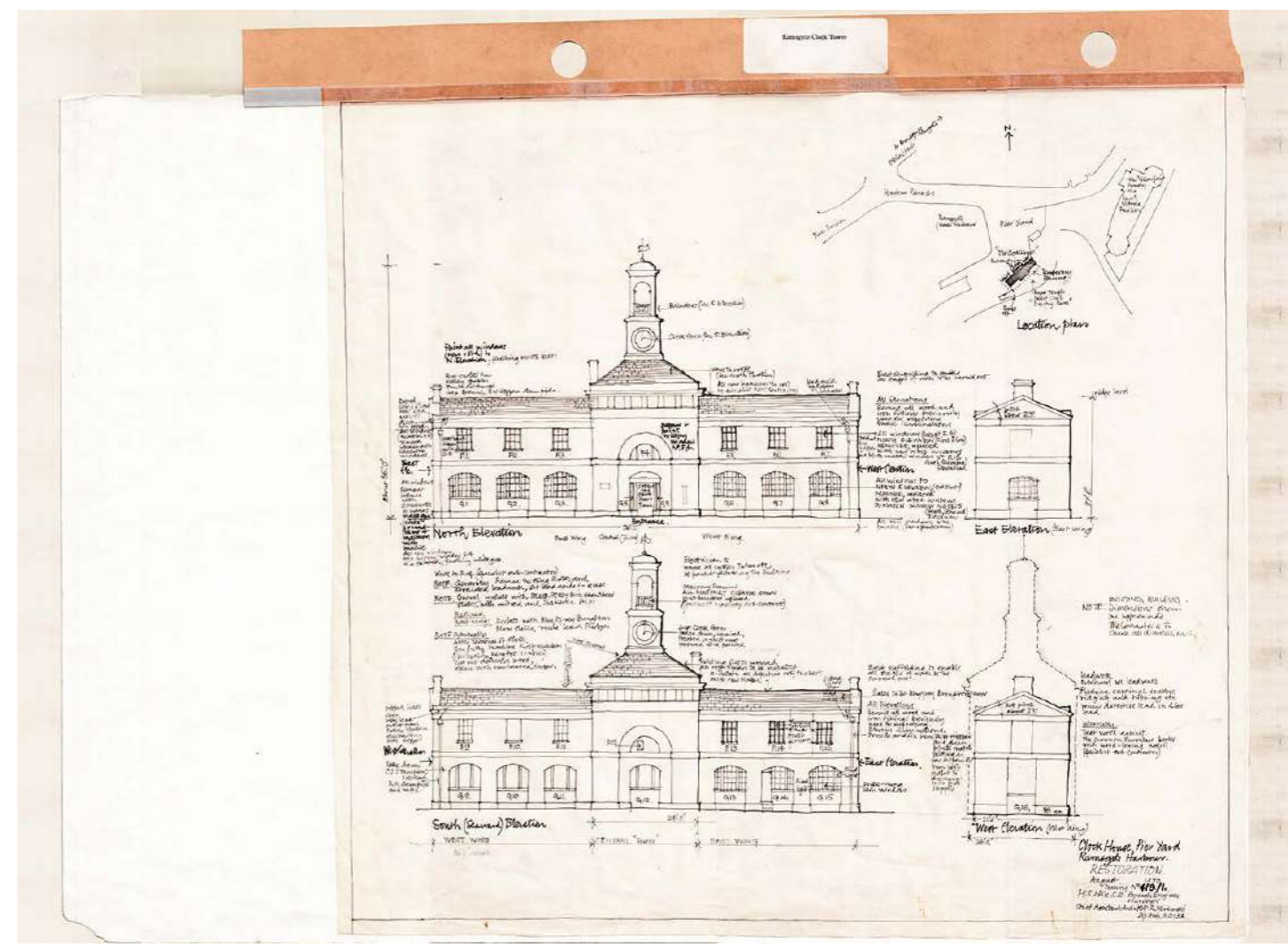

We retained the original book stacks with cord upholstery and glazed backing to maintain the mid-century modern character of the interior.

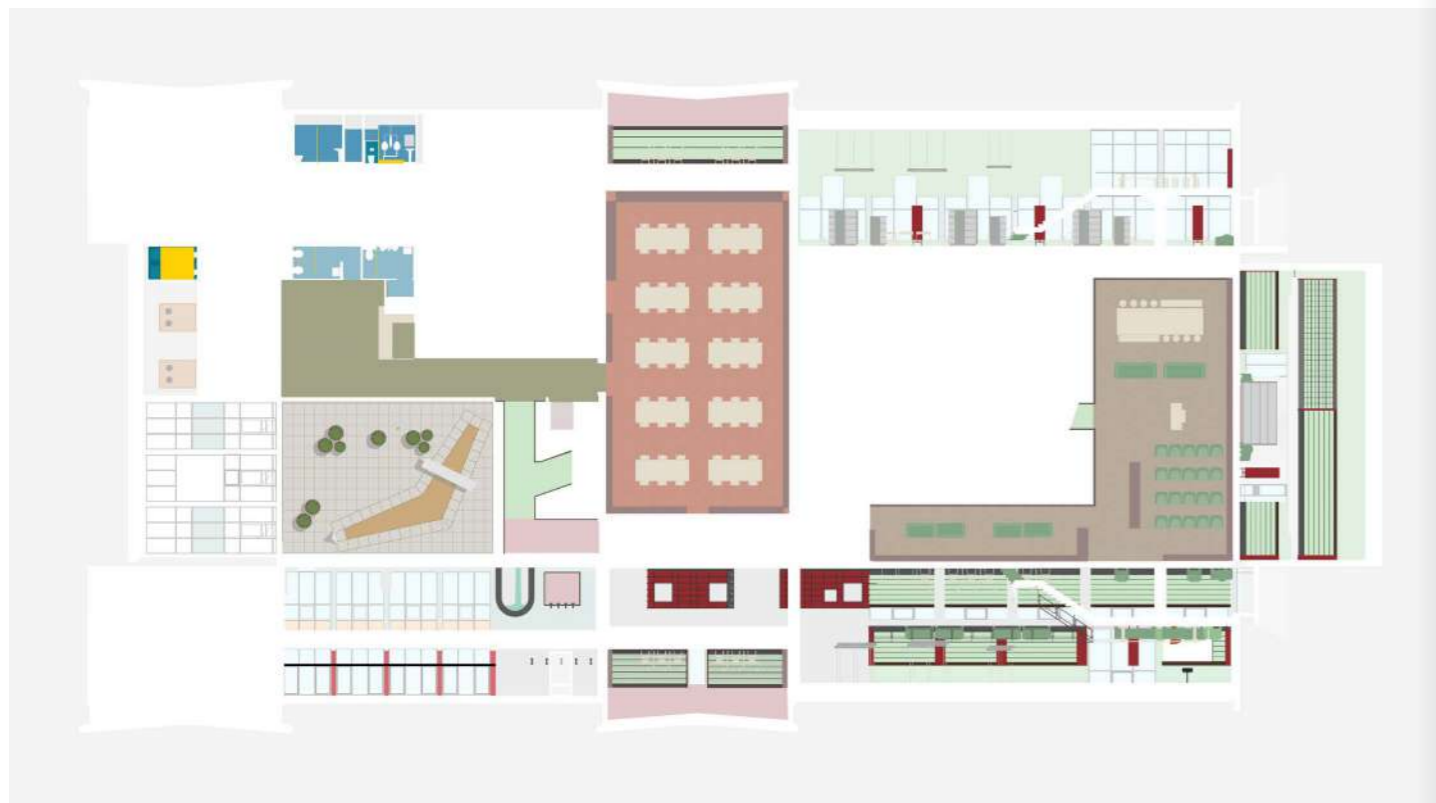
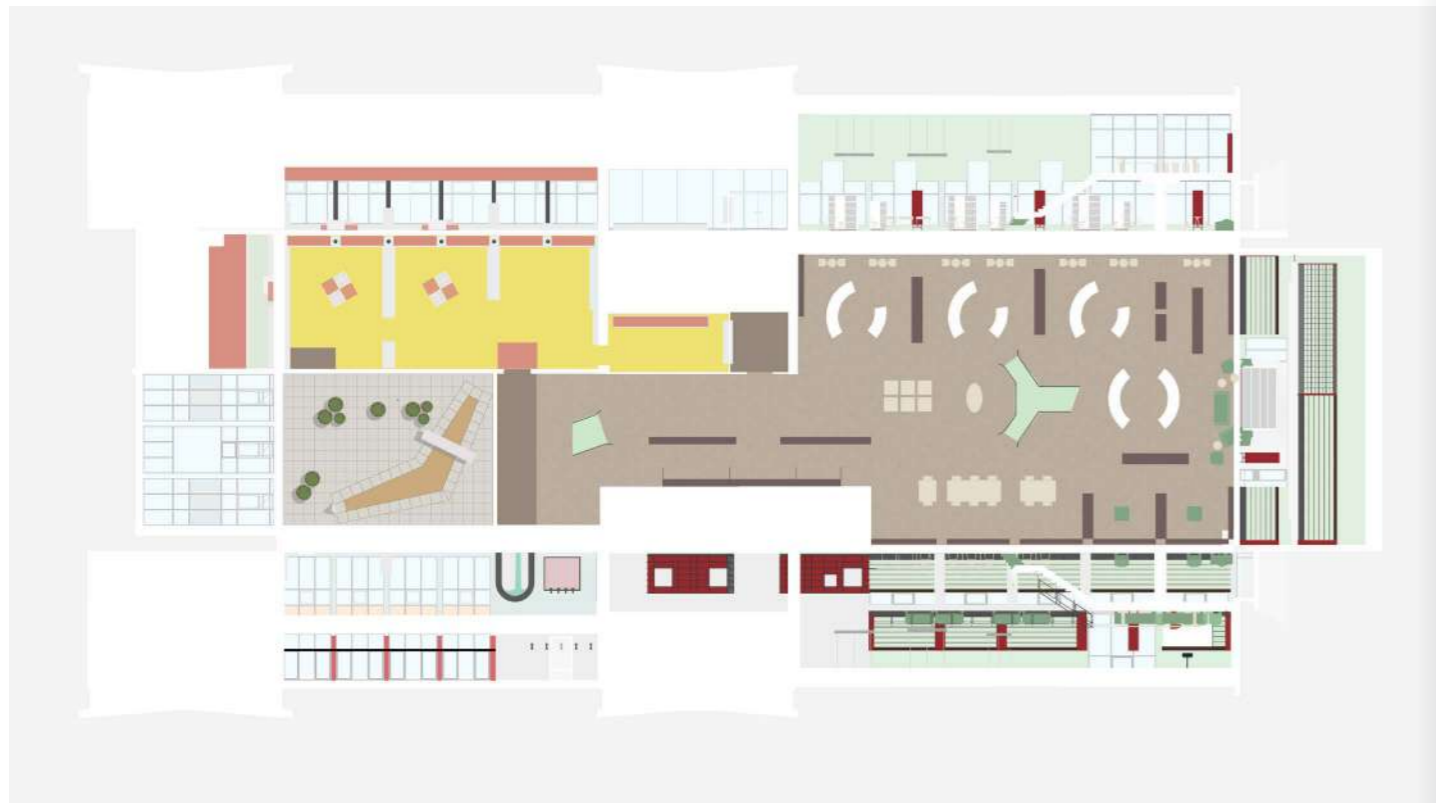

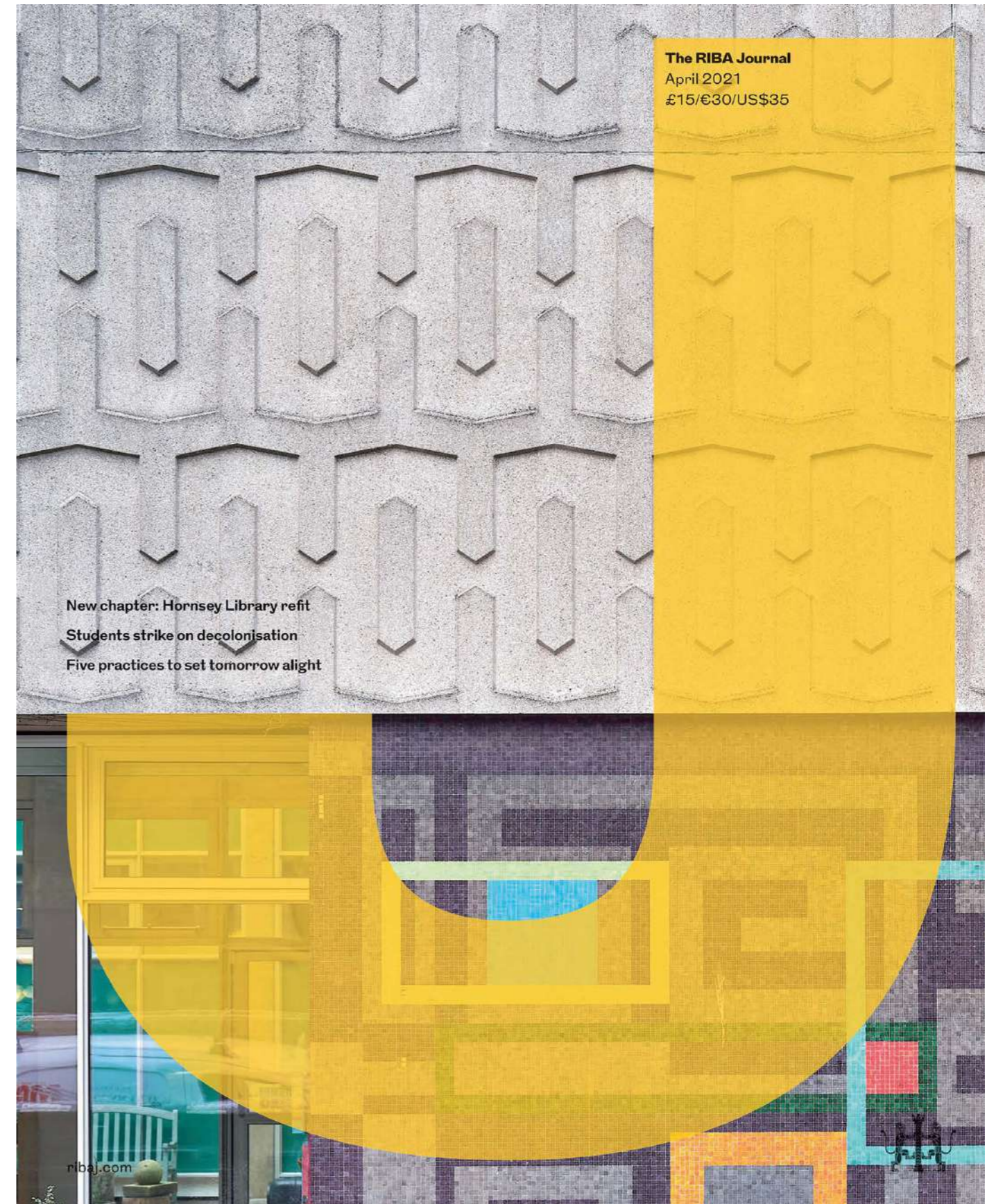

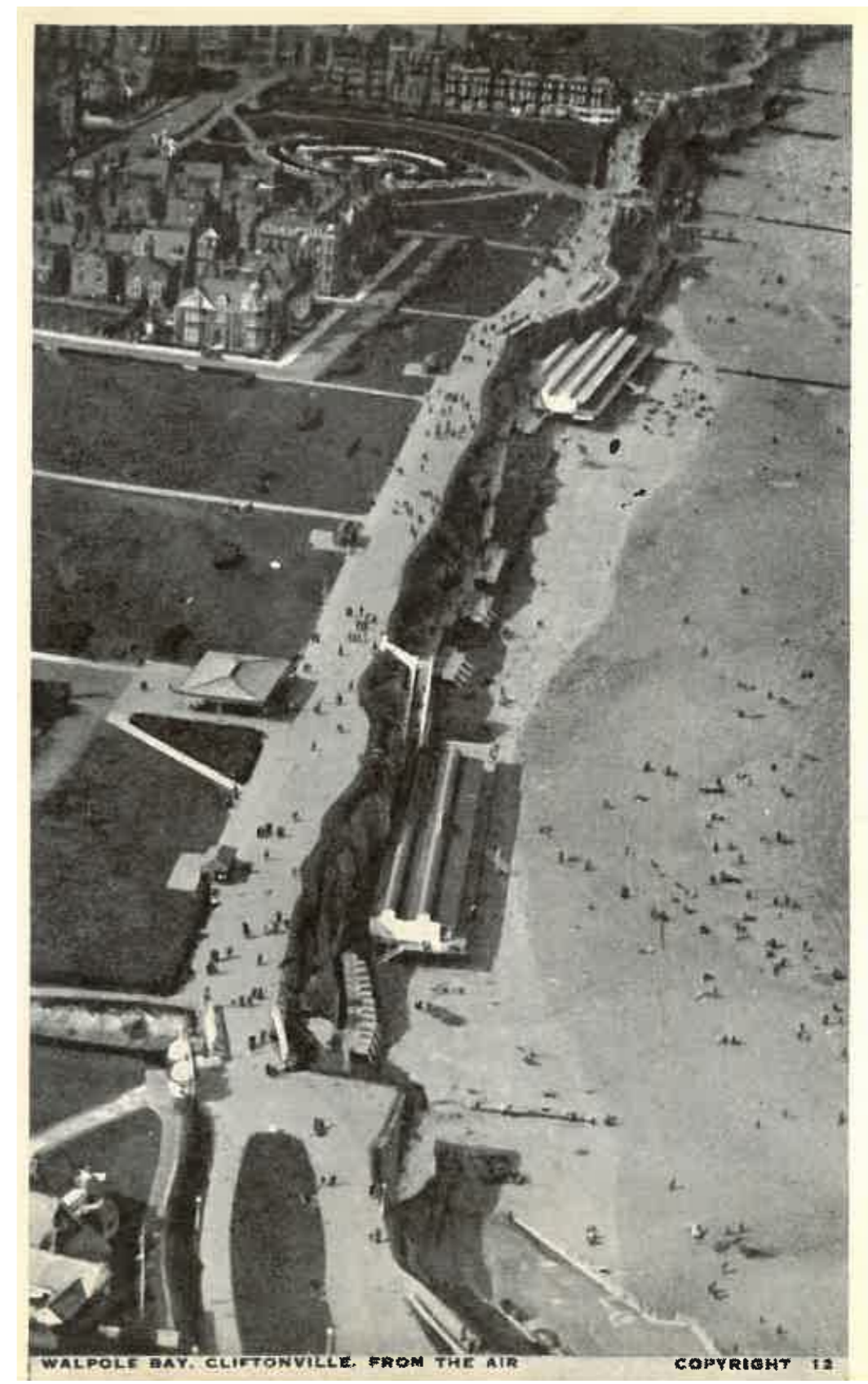

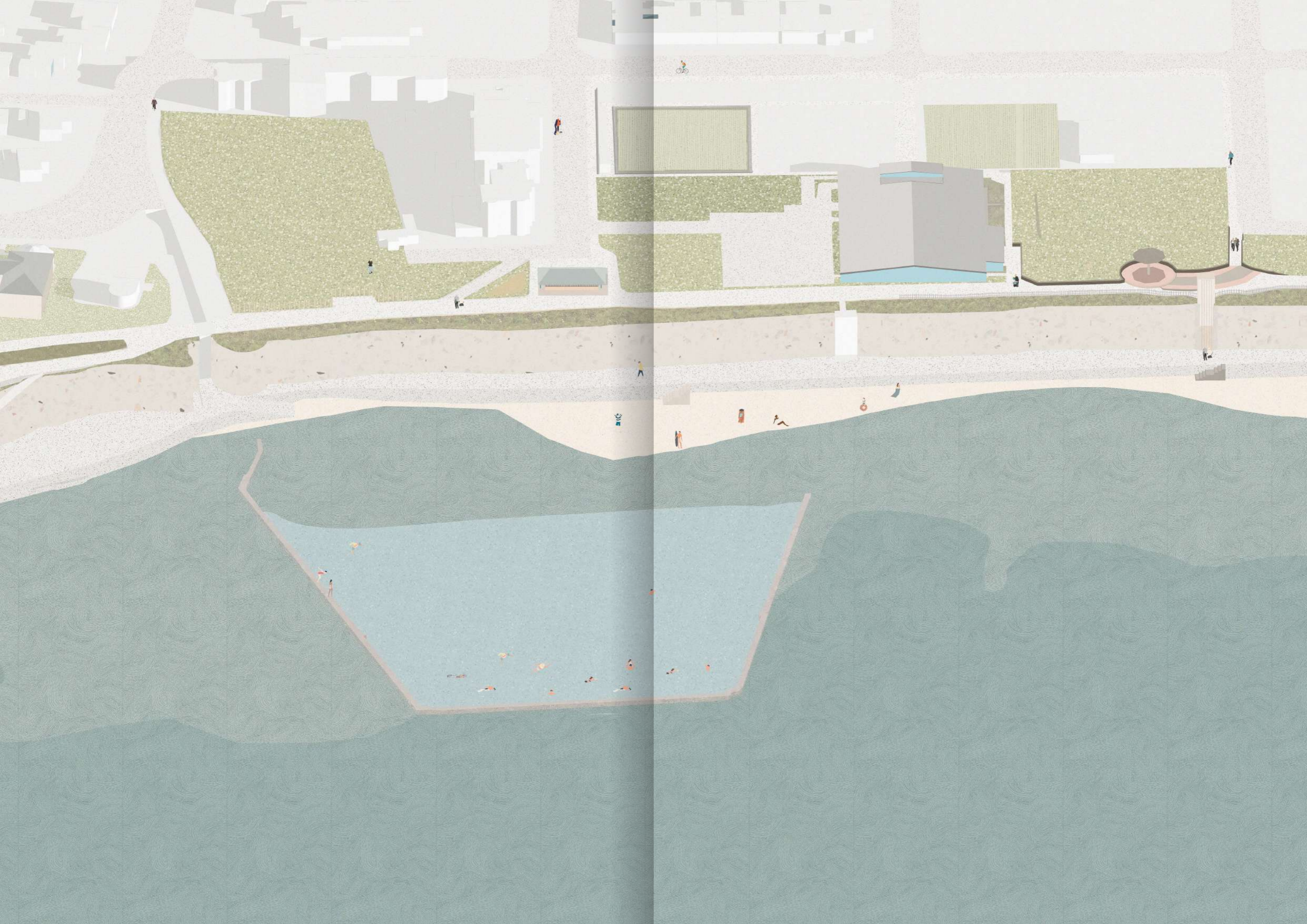

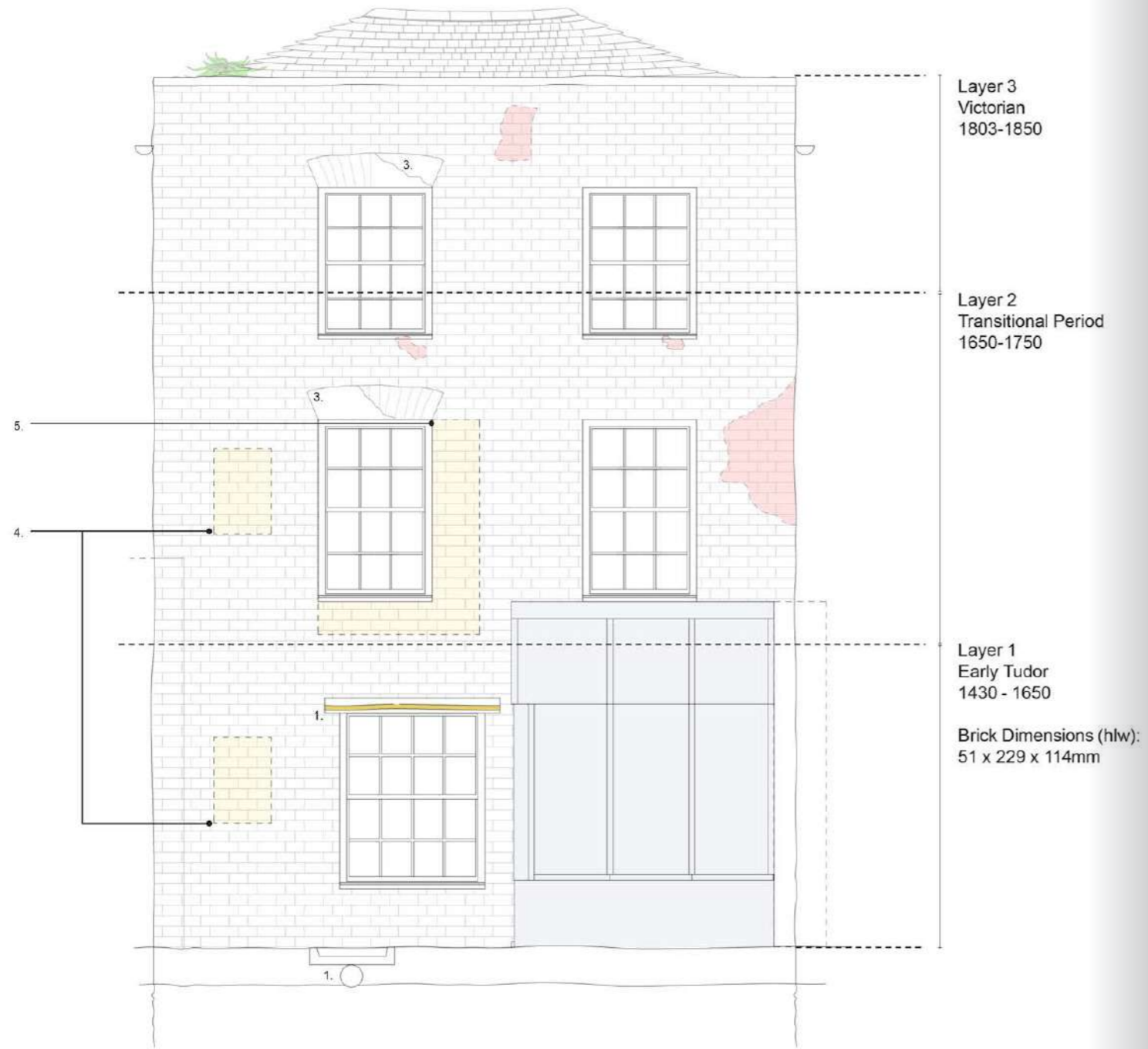

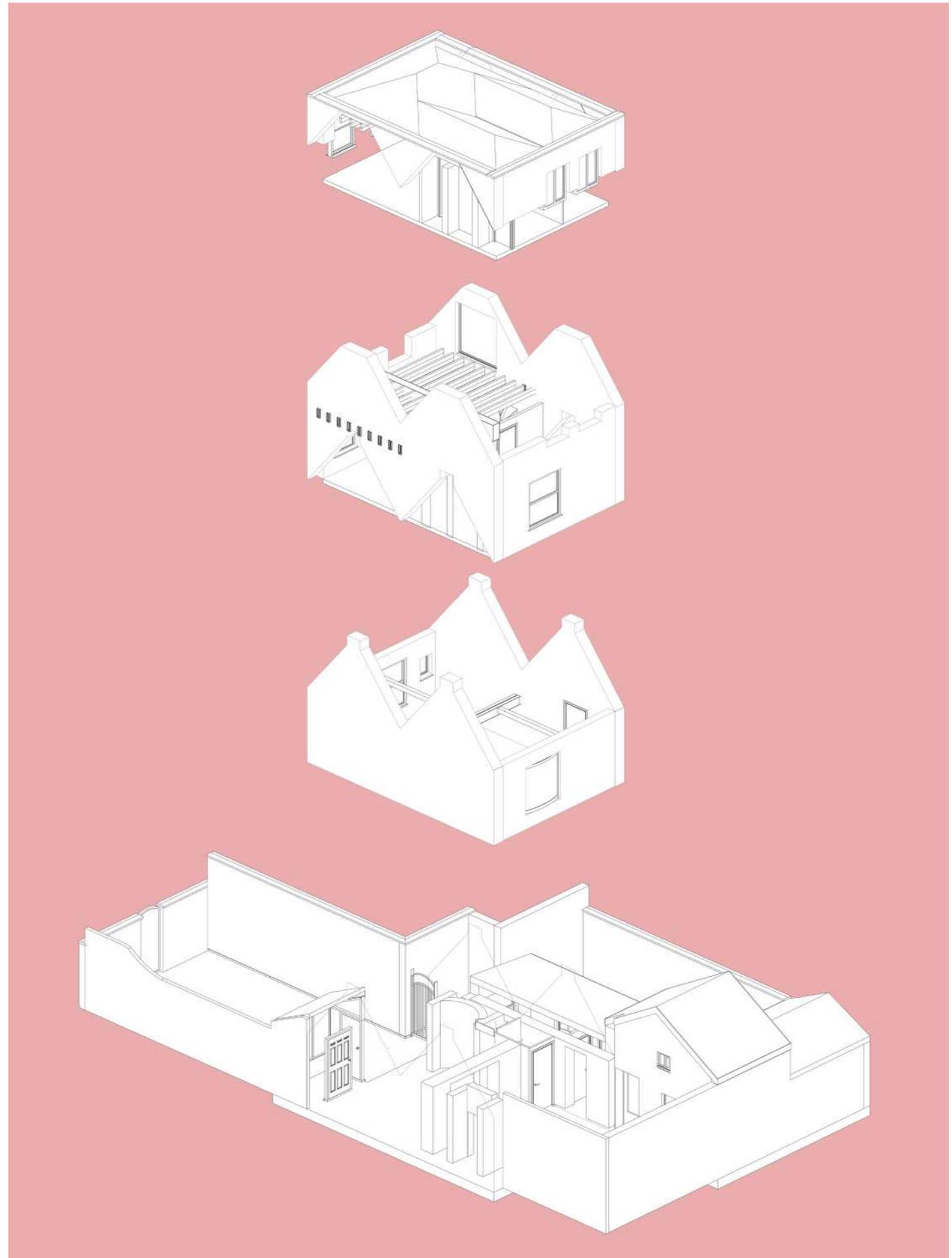

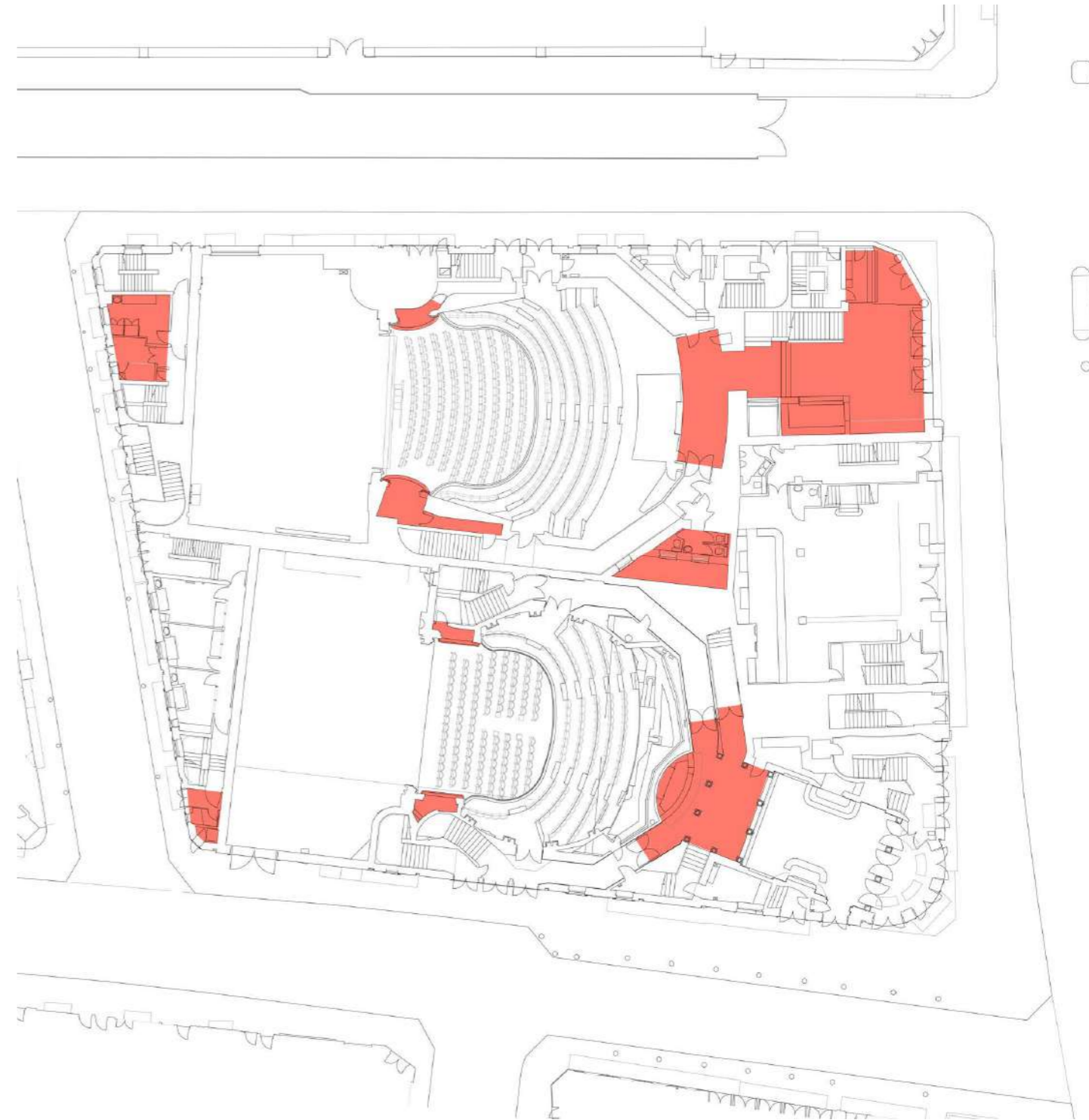
