





LES BON TEMPS ROULER AT CHAMPAGNE'S MARCHÉ

In the most recent episode of CRAWFISH TALES with Commissioner Mike Strain, DVM, we followed our noses to Champagne's Marché in Leonville, Louisiana, just south of Port Barre. It's here in this close-knit Cajun community that husband and wife team Richard and Angela Champagne keep their friends and neighbors well-fed... and entertained.

"My husband is very quirky," jokes Angela. "He likes to make all these crazy commercials, always making people laugh." However, there's more to take in at Champagne's Marché than merely catching a glimpse of Richard's joie de vivre.

Champagne's Marché is a great local grocery store... but it's so much more than that. Right now, leading up to Mardi Gras, their king cakes are in high demand, but they make them year-round. They also have a smokehouse and sell a variety of housemade items, including fresh and smoked

sausage, smoked pork roasts, tasso, and boudin.

Additionally, Champagne's Marché offers daily plate lunches

and has its own line of seasoning blends, the latest of which is called "Cajunality," to help even non-Cajuns put some flavor in their personality.

With 11 different kinds of boudin and their craveable king cakes made on site, the place smells divine. Commissioner Strain
commented on the delicious
aroma before even walking through
the doors of the store. "You can smell
the boudin cooking; you can smell the
king cakes," he said. "I'm a pro at drizzling
icing on a king cake, but I'm ready to work
on my sample-cutting and taste-testing

technique."

Richard's *père* (father) started the store back in 1926. Now knocking on the door of 100 years in business, Richard is proud of his Cajun heritage and the 10,000 square feet of groceries, produce, homemade treats, and good old-fashioned customer service that locals have come to know and love.

"We're doing well, and I think it's because of the way we treat people," says Richard. Indeed, Richard, Angela, and their staff know most of their customers by name.

Likewise, Leonville folks know that if you want to know what's going on in Leonville, call Champagne's. "The cashiers know everything," laughs Angela.

COMMISSIONER'S CORNER

Applications open for 2024 Specialty Crop Block Grant

Louisiana Department of Agriculture and Forestry (LDAF) is now accepting applications for the 2024 Specialty Crop Block Grant Program (SCBGP), funded through the United States Department of Agriculture, Agricultural Marketing Service (USDA-AMS).

Applications must be received no later than the close of business (4:30 p.m.) Friday, March 15, 2024.

The LDAF anticipates at least \$350,000 to be allocated to fund Louisiana projects. The grants will be used for projects that enhance the competitiveness of Louisiana-grown specialty crops like fruits, vegetables, tree nuts, dried fruits, and nursery crops, including floriculture and horticulture in either domestic or foreign markets.

Grant funds will not be awarded for projects that directly benefit a particular commercial product or provide a profit to a single organization, institution, or individual. Projects should focus on issues to help improve specialty crop industries as a whole, such as distribution, production, research, pest and disease control, development, nutrition knowledge and consumption, food safety, promotion, and education. Producer associations, state and/or local organizations, state or local governments, qualified educational institutions, nonprofits, and other specialty crop stakeholders are eligible recipients. Single organizations, institutions, and individuals are encouraged to participate as project partners.



BOURBON PICKLED PEACHES

Submitted by New Orleans Distillers, LLC

Ingredients:

3 cups sugar

1 cup distilled white vinegar

1 cup New Orleans Distillers Bourbon

12 sticks cinnamon

36 whole cloves

18 soft peaches

Instructions:

In a large, nonreactive (stainless steel) stockpot over medium heat, bring 1 cup water, sugar, vinegar, 6 cinnamon sticks,

and 18 cloves to a boil, stirring to dissolve sugar.

Reduce heat to medium-low and add peaches. Gently simmer, without reaching a boil, until peaches are heated through and a fork pierces the fruit with no resistance, 10-15 minutes.

Using a slotted spoon, divide peaches among 6 sterilized 1-pint canning jars, placing peaches cavity side down. Add 1 of the remaining cinnamon sticks and 3 of the remaining cloves to each jar. Mix the bourbon into the cooking liquid and ladle into jars, filling each to within 1/2 inch of rim. Place the lids and threaded ring bands on the jars to seal, tightening completely.

Store pickled peaches in refrigerator for up to 8 weeks. Serve as part of a cheese platter or as dessert.

DAF Rapides Parish man arrested for setting fires to come setting fires to company land

On January 26, 2024, investigators with the Louisiana Department of Agriculture and Forestry (LDAF) Forestry Enforcement Division and the Rapides Parish Sheriff's Office arrested James E. Doyle of Elizabeth, Louisiana, for trespassing and setting wildfires on company land in Rapides Parish.

In early January 2024, LDAF investigators were called to investigate two separate fires on company timber land in Rapides Parish. Investigators determined that Doyle had trespassed on the land and set fires that resulted in a wildfire covering approximately 10 acres. Due to the quick and efficient response from LDAF and local volunteer fire departments, the fires were contained and kept to a minimum size.

Upon arrest, Doyle was booked for one count of arson and two counts of criminal trespass. Bond was set at \$15,000.

Louisiana's GOLD: raw sugar by Sam Irwin, American Sugar Cane League

Louisiana's 450 sugarcane farming families and 11 sugar mills make one product really well: raw sugar. Molasses is also a commercial product made from the sugarcane plant, but the gold is in the golden brown hue of raw sugar.

The 2023 sugarcane season produced more than 1.8 million short tons of raw sugar. The most we've ever made was in 2022 when we hit just over two million tons.

Are you confused by the term raw sugar? It does sound like something not cooked but raw sugar is simply the white sucrose crystal covered with a thin layer of molasses. And while the raw sugar our mills make is edible, it's not packaged for retail consumption. Our raw sugar goes to refineries to make the finished product. Sugar refining is done at a sugar refinery, not a sugar mill. There are two sugar refineries in Louisiana. One is in Gramercy, the other in Chalmette.

What is sucrose? Let's start with the basics.

Sucrose is the chemical name for sugar. Just about every food ingredient has a chemical name. For instance, dihydrogen oxide sounds like something that might be part of bomb but it's simply the chemical name for water. Salt is salt, unless you're talking to a chemist, then salt is known as sodium chloride.

So, sugar is sucrose and sucrose is sugar. How do we get sugar from the sugarcane plant? That's an easy question for a chemist...not so much for the lay person. Here goes:

Sucrose is a carbohydrate that is found in fruits and vegetables (nearly all plants make sucrose or some other type of sugar). Plants produce sugars when they are exposed to sunlight, carbon dioxide and water (good ol' dihydrogen oxide!) This is called photosynthesis. Remember, we learned about photosynthesis in junior high science? Sugar for plants is good. It makes them healthy and strong.

Oranges, watermelons, strawberries, blueberries make sugar. Even oak trees make a type of sugar. It just so happens that sugarcane juice and sugar beet pulp makes the most sucrose of any plant. We grow sugarcane in Louisiana and this story is about making raw sugar from sugarcane.

Sugarcane is a perennial grass. That means it can be cut (just like you mow your lawn) and it will grow back. In Louisiana, sugarcane farmers can get four or five harvests from a single planting before fresh cane needs to be planted again. Many hobby growers plant sugarcane throughout the state to make their own cane syrup but the commercial sugarcane crop is grown mainly in the Acadiana region. Louisiana's sugarcane industry has developed

fast growing sugarcane varieties that make a lot of sugar and are cold tolerant, but the plant will freeze and die if exposed to below freezing temperatures for an extended time.

For the last 100 years, Louisiana's sugarcane farmers and millers, with help from the plant breeders, research scientists, agronomists, mechanical engineers and chemists of the United States Department of Agriculture, LSU AgCenter and the American Sugar Cane League, have become extremely efficient in getting the crop planted, harvested and milled to make enough sugar to supply the needs of 75 million Americans. Our variety breeding program is the envy of the sugarcane world.

If you've driven through the cane belt, you know the sugarcane plant grows into a tall stalk much like bamboo. The stalk is fibrous. It looks pretty solid, but the plant is 70-75% water, 10-15% fiber and 13-15% sucrose. The quest is to get as much of the "theoretical recoverable sugar" out of the sugarcane stalk as possible.

Here's the recipe: Squeeze the juice from the plant and boil it to evaporate the water until sugar crystals appear.

This is how it works: The cane plant is mechanically harvested in the fields and brought to the sugar mill. The sugar mill grinds up the cane and squeezes every bit of juice possible from the stalk. The mills, which can handle large volumes of cane, use as many as five grinding mechanisms to extract the juice. Inevitably, during the grinding process, bits of field dirt, mud and leafy material contaminate the sweet juice and must be removed. Lime is added to holding tanks to force contaminants to drop out of the sweet juice.

Over the years, techniques have been invented along the way to make boiling more efficient. The multiple effect evaporator was invented by Norbert Rillieux, a person of color in the 1830s. Rillieux's invention is still used in every sugarcane mill in the world. Essentially, the evaporator allows the miller to boil the cane juice safely at a lower temperature with reduced fuel. During the boiling, the water evaporates, and the hot liquid becomes thick and brown. It slowly churns into molasses mixed with solid sucrose crystals. A technician called a sugar boiler monitors the boiling process and when he determines that the juice is saturated with sucrose crystals, he sends the gooey liquid to a centrifugal to separate the sugar crystal.

The best way to describe the centrifugal is to think of a clothes washing machine on spin cycle. Just as the spin cycle removes most of the water from the clean clothes, a sugar centrifugal machine drains away most of the thick molasses until only sugar remains in the basket. This product is called raw sugar, not because it is raw but because it is coated with a thin layer of molasses giving the sugar a golden appearance.

The sugar refineries buy raw sugar from the mills by the truckload. Refineries melt it down and repeat the boiling process to remove the last bits of foreign particles and molasses to make the pure refined "white" sugar you see in the sugar bowl on your breakfast table. Refined sugar complies with federal food grade standards.

Some people think white sugar is bleached. That is simply a wrongheaded notion. When raw sugar is refined down to the pure sucrose crystal it appears to be white. In reality, the sugar crystal is clear but appears white in color when packed in the familiar four-pound bag you see on the grocery shelf.

Louisiana's sugarcane farmers and millers are among the most productive in the world and they are proud of their raw sugar product. They meet the highest labor and environmental standards around. Ultimately, the work of sugar and other farmers means that there is more choice and more affordable food products for American households. So, when you savor your next beignet, king cake or sweet tea, thank a Louisiana sugarcane producer.

'Ice on backs, icicles on bellies.' LA ranchers battle the cold

Vincent Cannatella exited his truck and grabbed a shovel from the back.

Gripping the shovel tightly, he stabbed down repeatedly, eventually breaking through the inch-thick layer of ice that had formed across the top of a water trough on his St. Landry Parish ranch.

Normally, the cows on his ranch will keep drinking from a trough to break up any ice that forms when temperatures drop. But with the thermometer dipping into the teens in many places across the state, the ice was too thick Tuesday.

"I probably could have stood on it," Cannatella laughed. "This was solid."

Cannatella isn't the only Louisiana livestock producer taking unusual measures this week. Across the state, ranchers and farmers are doing what they can to battle temps and wind chills that, in some cases, approached zero.

Tuesday morning, temperatures Cannatella's ranch had risen into the 20s and the sun was out. But his pasture had a



layer of frost and some cattle had ice on their backs from rain that had frozen. Nonetheless, he said, they were handling it well.

"I got some wooded areas where they can get out of the wind," he said. "This morning, they are out in some sunny spots where I am feeding them."

Temperatures into Wednesday morning were expected to be even colder before a gradual

Perhaps the biggest challenge the cold presents to cattle ranchers is putting out extra food that the cows need to eat to help them stay warm. Normally, that would be hay that the ranchers grew the previous year.But with this past summer's record heat and drought, hay production was cut by half or more for many ranchers. Cannatella has supplemented his hay with some baled corn stalks and a cotton plant-based feed he purchased for the first time this year.

"I feed off trailers, usually five bales on a trailer," he said. "I put eight bales on the trailers" this week, he said. With the extra feed, Cannatella thinks he'll just make it through the winter.

Further north and west, Marty Wooldridge said his cows were holding up, despite the

"The cattle had some ice on their backs, icicles hanging from their bellies," said Wooldridge, who has ranch land in northern Caddo Parish. "People are going to burn through a lot of hay."

Wooldridge said some of his pastures are

wooded, and he put cattle in those or in creek bottoms so that they could get out of the wind. His calving process, which for some begins in late December, won't start for about another month. Cold weather can kill calves or put stress on pregnant cows, he said. After a 2021 cold snap, many ranchers saw lower conception rates, Wooldridge said.

The cold also affects equipment. It can cause diesel and other fluids in tractors to thicken and make them hard to start and run, he said. Wooldridge has shut all his extra projects down and is focused on making sure his cattle have enough to eat and drink.

A couple parishes to the east of Wooldridge, Mitch Marsalis took some of the same precautions with the cattle on his Claiborne Parish farm. But Tuesday morning, he was more concerned with the truckload of new chicks he had in two of his four chicken houses. For the chicks to grow, it needs to be about 90 degrees inside the houses, he said.

"We are burning probably six or seven times the natural gas than we normally would heating these poultry houses," he said. "It's almost impossible."

When it gets cold, the chicks huddle and won't eat or drink. The ones that survive that will struggle for the rest of their lives, he said.

Marsalis said he would have preferred it snow like it did in 2021, when more than 8 inches fell across portions of north Louisiana. The snow provides a layer of insulation that keeps the ground and buildings warmer, he said. The freezing rain doesn't do that.

"It's like deep freeze ice everywhere," he said.

or educational affiliation must be in) Louisiana. All applicants are required to obtain a Unique Entity Identifier (UEI) number and include that number on their application.

Once the deadline has passed, all applications submitted to LDAF will be carefully evaluated to determine if the projects are qualified based on the criteria listed in the guidelines. Qualified project applications will be reviewed and scored by a panel of industry stakeholders who will make funding recommendations to LDAF. All LDAF approved projects will be incorporated into one state grant request, which will be submitted to the USDA.

LDAF has prepared a Request for Applications (RFA) document detailing application instructions, scoring criteria, federal forms, project format examples, and other helpful information from the USDA. The document can be found at https://www.ldaf.la.gov/food/selling/produce/specialty-crops/program.

LDAF partners with USDA to award over \$4 million to strengthen Louisiana's food supply chain infrastructure

The Louisiana Department of Agriculture and Forestry (LDAF) will work in partnership with the U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) to award \$4.6 million through the Resilient Food Systems Infrastructure Program (RFSI). After a competitive review process, the program will award money for equipment-only and infrastructure projects to Louisiana food and farm businesses, as well as other eligible entities, including nonprofits, local government entities, tribal governments, schools, and hospitals.

The application window opens on February 7, 2024, and will last through April 15, 2024.

In May 2023, the USDA announced the availability of up to \$420 million through the RFSI program to strengthen local and regional food systems. Through this program, the USDA's Agricultural Marketing Service (AMS) has entered into cooperative agreements with state agencies, commissions, and departments responsible for agricultural and commercial activities throughout U.S. territories.

The goal of the program is to build resilience in the middle-of-the-food-supply-chain, increase and streamline markets for small farms and local businesses, and support the development of value-added products for consumers that will lead to fair prices, fair wages, and new job opportunities. RFSI is authorized by the American Rescue Plan.

Louisiana's rice specialist receives national rice award

Ronnie Levy knows rice. For four decades and in various roles with the LSU AgCenter, Levy has helped Louisiana farmers grow many of the state's economically important crops, but much of the focus has been on what is the backbone of so many Louisiana dishes — rice.

For his contributions to the rice industry throughout his career, Levy received the 2023 Rice Industry Award from USA Rice, Horizon Ag and Rice Farming magazine on Dec. 7 at the 2023 Rice Outlook Conference in Palm Springs, California.

"Dr. Levy's vast knowledge and experience of rice production in Louisiana makes him a critical component of the LSU AgCenter's rice research and extension program and a tremendous resource in his service to the Louisiana rice industry," said Mike Salassi, LSU AgCenter executive associate vice president and director of the Louisiana Agricultural Experiment Station.

Levy began his career with the LSU AgCenter in 1979, as a county agent in Calcasieu and Jefferson Davis parishes, working with the area's youth through the 4-H program. He also worked as the county agent in Acadia

Parish, guiding the parish's rich agricultural and natural resource enterprises. He worked with many rice producers over the years in Acadia. He planned educational programs, sent out educational material and made farm visits to rice producers. He also served as Louisiana's soybean, corn and grain sorghum specialist.

He currently is the state's rice specialist and oversees the Louisiana Rice Verification program. In this capacity, he has helped translate the vital research conducted at the H. Rouse Caffey Rice Research Station into valuable knowledge for rice producers across the state.

Levy travels across Louisiana assisting rice farmers and extension agents on the best management practices that are vital to producing viable, profitable and sustainable rice crops year after year.

His work also benefits the U.S. rice industry. He serves as a technical adviser for the USA Rice Federation committees focusing on sustainability, marketability and competitiveness, and regulatory and food safety.

"The Rice Industry Award was such an honor," Levy said. "Rice is so important to Southwest Louisiana and to consumers throughout the world. It was very rewarding to be recognized by the rice industry."
