



"Of course, you'll have to go to Don's." That was the chorus my Mamaw Priou sang if she, our family, or anyone she knew was headed to south Louisiana. As a Cajun transplanted to North Louisiana in her youth, she never stopped longing for the fresh seafood of her home in Acadiana and would faithfully make trips to Don's when spending summers with cousins in Carencro or visiting family in New Iberia. To her, going to Don's Seafood was the epitome of a good time... delicious local seafood, fun with family and friends, and, let's be honest, probably some drinking and dancing.

Now, after almost 90 years in business, that's still the case for many.

In a recent episode of CRAWFISH TALES with Commissioner Mike Strain, DVM, we found ourselves in Denham Springs where we sat down with Donny and Tracy Landry, President and Vice President of Don's Seafood. This Certified Louisiana restaurant continues to be a local favorite serving fresh Louisiana seafood generation after generation.

It all started in 1934, just one year after Prohibition was lifted. That's when Don Landry,

a young man of 24 years, borrowed \$400 from his uncle to establish a bar and restaurant in downtown Lafayette. It was a small place with a dirt floor. Nothing fancy, but it scratched that itch people had to get together, have a few drinks, and have a good time. At first, they served sandwiches and poboys. Soon, they began offering local seafood... softshell crabs from Charenton, oysters, shrimp, and ultimately crawfish and farm-raised catfish.

As we all know, when you add fresh, local Louisiana seafood to the mix, you've got yourself a party. Four generations later, Don's legacy continues, now with six stores all along the I-10/I-12 corridor... in Lafayette, Gonzales, Metairie, Covington, Hammond, and Denham Spring... where they have almost 600 employees.

Great food is a timeless recipe for success. And Don's Seafood has got your

taste buds covered.

Take their jacked-up shrimp... Chef James Hebert walked us through the process that ends with one of their most popular dishes. It's made in an "aebleskiver" pan, which is used for traditional Danish stuffed pancake balls. (Home chefs like you and me can use a mini muffin tin!) They start with some fresh Gulf shrimp that's peeled and deveined. On top of the shrimp, they put a little garlic butter in each one and then add the homemade "jacked up" mix, which contains pepper jack cheese, bacon, and jalapeno. Pop that in the oven and get ready for flavor!

COMMISSIONER'S CORNER

Federal government urged to aid La. crawfish industry

The Louisiana Department of Agriculture and Forestry (LDAF) urges the federal government to aid Louisiana's crawfish industry after an unprecedented drought.

On February 2, LDAF Commissioner Mike Strain, DVM, wrote a letter to the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) Secretary Tom Vilsack asking that the Emergency Livestock Assistance Program (ELAP) and/or similar programs be properly funded and instituted to assist the crawfish industry. After meeting and hearing from many in the crawfish industry since the initial letter, Commissioner Strain sent a second letter on February 28 as a follow-up requesting the secretary expand the ELAP to include drought as a cause of loss for

the crawfish industry. Three weeks ago, while in Washington, DC, he had the opportunity to bring the issues to the attention of Louisiana's congressional delegation.

The drought in 2023 was one of the most severe droughts in the history of Louisiana and caused significant damage to the sustainability of the crawfish industry. Lack of water and, in some cases, saltwater intrusion decimated the seed stock and has limited the ability to catch crawfish.

"According to the LSU AgCenter, preliminary estimates of crop loss and damage to Louisiana's crawfish industry are nearly



PARMESAN GRILLED CORN

Ingredients:

4 ears of corn, shucked

½ cup Parmesan cheese, shredded

4 tablespoons unsalted butter, melted

½ teaspoon dried thyme

1 tablespoon Slap Ya Mama Original Blend Seasoning

1 tablespoon parsley, chopped

Instructions:

HONEY BBQ SAUCE 1 & 2

Ingredients:

Sauce 1:

1¼ cups ketchup

1¾ cups KJUN honey

1 tablespoon Worcestershire sauce

2½ teaspoons ground mustard

2 teaspoons paprika

½ teaspoons ground garlic

1/4 teaspoon cayenne (to taste)

1½ teaspoons sea salt

1 teaspoon finely ground black pepper

1 tablespoon corn starch mixed in

2 tablespoons of cold water

34 teaspoons liquid smoke (mesquite)

Sauce 2:

8 ounces tomato sauce

34 cup ketchup

34 cup KJUN honey

2½ teaspoons white vinegar

2 teaspoons Worcestershire sauce

1/4 cup lemon juice

1 teaspoon granulated garlic

2 teaspoon coarse black pepper

1/4 teaspoon ground Comino

1/2 ground cayenne

1 tablespoons corn starch mixed in 2 tablespoons cold water

Instructions:

Sauce 1: Combine all of the ingredients except the corn starch/water mixture into a small pot. Bring entire mixture to a low boil for 5-10 minutes until the sauce is slightly thickened. Add the corn starch/water mixture into the pot and simmer for approximately 1 minute or less until it reaches your preferred thickness. Store it in a sealed container in the refrigerator for up to one week.

Note: This has a similar flavor to Sweet Baby Ray's Original BBQ sauce except with a honey twang! Any variety of KJUN honey would be an excellent choice for this recipe depending upon the amount of honey taste you want in the completed sauce. For a better smoke flavor, use ground smoked paprika. For a different smoke flavor, try hickory flavored liquid smoke.

Sauce 2: Combine all of the ingredients except the corn starch/water mixture into a small pot. Bring entire mixture to a low boil for 5-10 minutes until the sauce is very slightly thickened. Add the corn starch/water mixture into the pot and simmer for approximately 1 minute or less until it reaches your preferred thickness. Store it in a sealed container in the refrigerator for up to one week.

Note: This has a similar flavor to Rudy's Original Bar-B-Q Sauce except with a little honey sweetness! This is the best with a milder flavor KJUN honey lacking a strong floral taste. A good choice would be either our early spring or prime tallow honey. For a better pepper flavor, use 1-1½ tablespoons fresh ground pepper instead.

Sheep head filets Corn meal Sea salt Deux Gars Bizarres Cajun Seasoning Eggs Vegetable oil

Instructions:

Rinse filets and pat dry. Mix eggs thoroughly, adding Deux Gars Bizarres to taste; in a separate bowl, pour in corn meal, and mix in Deux Gars Bizarres Cajun Seasoning, to taste. Dredge filets in the eggs, then coat with corn meal mixture, then dredge in eggs again. Carefully drop into 375°F oil and cook 3-7 minutes to golden brown. Drain and enjoy. This is a generalized recipe; adjust amounts of filets, corn meal, and eggs as needed for how much you intend to cook.

Tip: Deux Gars Bizzares is not quite officially low sodium, but is somewhat low, so I add some sea salt to the corn meal, to taste. Also, I like to add some Whisker Bomb hot sauce (a delicious sauce from ZZ Top's Billy F. Gibbons—mixed, bottled and labeled in Louisiana); it really pairs well with Deux Gars Bizarres.

Tax mythbusters Part 1:

Farm Tax General Edition

Tax season is here and it's time for producers to file taxes for their operations. To help navigate the challenges of tax filing, USDA has partnered with experts around the country to provide tips and resources for taxes related to USDA programs. In this installment, Jeffrey Tranel, an Extension Specialist with Colorado State University address some common misconceptions about tax filing.

#1 — I do not have to report barter income.

If you're paid for your work in farm products, other property, or services, you must report as income the fair market value of what you receive. The same rule applies if you trade farm products for other farm products, property, or someone else's labor. This is called barter income. For example, if you help a neighbor build a barn and receive a cow for your work, you must report the fair market value of the cow as ordinary income.

#2 — I am past the age where I need to file a tax return.

If you are a U.S. citizen or resident alien your filing obligation depends on your gross income, your filing status, your age, and whether you are a dependent. If you had taxable income in 2022 of \$12,950 (if single) or \$25,900 (if married filing jointly) or more, you must file a tax return. If you are a dependent of another person, the minimum dollar amounts for filing are much less. IRS publication 501 provides more information.

#3 — I can claim my pet or someone who is not my relative as a dependent on my tax return.

No. A dependent must be human. The term "dependent" means a qualifying child or a qualifying relative. There are five tests used to determine if a child is your qualifying child: (1) relationship, (2) age, (3) residency, (4) support, and (5) joint return. Likewise, there are specific tests to determine if another person is a qualifying relative.

#4 — When I move into a higher tax bracket, then ALL my income subject to tax is taxed at this higher rate.

The U.S. tax code uses "marginal" tax rates. This means that only the portion of taxable income that falls within the range of income for a specific marginal tax rate is taxed at that rate. For example, a single taxpayer had \$74,500 of taxable income (after all deductions) in 2022. The amount from \$0 to \$10,275 is multiplied by 10%. The amount greater than \$10,276 but less than \$41,775 is multiplied by 12% plus the amount of tax liability computed from the lesser amount. (\$1,027.50). The amount greater than \$41,776 and not over \$89,075 is multiplied by 22% plus \$4,807.50. Thus, the federal income tax for this taxpayer would be (\$74,500 - \$41,775) times 22% plus \$4,807.50. See below for a breakdown of the computations:

(\$10,275 X 10%) = \$1,027.50 (\$41,775 - \$10,275) = \$31,500 X 12% = \$3,780 (\$74,500 - \$41,775) = \$32,725 X 22% = \$7,199.50 Total Tax Liability = \$1,027.50 + \$3,780.00 + \$7,199.50 = \$12,007

'In touch, not in the way,' Dufour serves central LA farmers

When he first enrolled in college, Justin Dufour thought he wanted to become an athletic trainer. But a few classes into his coursework at LSU Alexandria, he realized that career path wouldn't suit his interests very well.

Ultimately, it was Dufour's part-time job at the neighboring LSU AgCenter research station that helped him settle on a degree in biology and led him to a career in agriculture. Working under scientists at the Dean Lee Research and Extension Center, Dufour learned the ins and outs of conducting agricultural research and sharing information with farmers.

Dufour grew up in what he calls "sweet potato country" in the Avoyelles Parish village of Hessmer.

"But I didn't come from a family farm or anything like that," he said. "My experience at Dean Lee really opened my eyes to what agriculture was and the fundamentals of research and how important it was."

After graduating from LSUA, Dufour worked as a research associate at Dean Lee for a few months before becoming an AgCenter agriculture and natural resources agent based in his home parish of Avoyelles in 2014 — a role he still holds today, and one in which coworkers say he has excelled.

Dufour recently received the County Agent Award from the Louisiana Agricultural Consultants Association. It was presented during the organization's annual Louisiana Agricultural Technology and Management Conference Feb. 7 to 9 in Marksville.

"I would characterize Justin as a hard worker with a servant's heart," said Boyd Padgett, an AgCenter plant pathologist who nominated Dufour for the award and mentored him early in his career. "His focus is on improving Louisiana agriculture and the lives of our stakeholders."

What does it take to be a good extension agent? Being knowledgeable of the eight different crops along with the cattle, crawfish and honey that are produced in his three-parish area is part of the equation. So is adapting to changes, such as a decline in sweet potato and cotton acres and growers shifting to other commodities.

At the end of the day, the job is all about communication, Dufour said. "Relationships are everything in this industry," he said. He has a motto for his approach: "in touch but not in the way." "You don't want to bother

them because they have a lot going on, but you also want to let them know that you're there to help," he said.

In addition to Avoyelles Parish, Dufour also is the ANR agent for Grant and Rapides parishes.

"We have a lot going on," Dufour said. "Whenever I make a presentation about myself, I always call this area a playground for me because there's any and everything you want to see."

It takes effort to build connections with so many different groups — and Dufour has demonstrated "110% buy-in," said Tara Smith, director of the Louisiana Cooperative Extension Service.

"Extension is grounded in relationships, and successful relationships are grounded in trust," said Smith, who first got to know Dufour in her previous positions as a sweet potato specialist and regional director. "An agent being able to earn the trust of the clientele that they're serving helps us effectively disseminate information and execute our mission to help producers be sustainable and profitable."

When farmers, consultants and others call for advice, Dufour usually has the information they need. It's his job to be a resource for constituents, pointing them to growing practices backed by AgCenter research and handling inquiries about issues being encountered in the field.

Being an agent in a region with such a diverse mix of crops and cultures, however, requires a touch of humility. "You're not going to know everything," Dufour said. "But you need to know the resources to find out the answer."

It helps to be a fast learner — another quality Dufour's colleagues admire in him.

"If he calls you with a question, he doesn't have to ask that question again," said Daniel Stephenson, director of the AgCenter Central Region and a weed scientist at the Dean Lee Research and Extension Center.

Stephenson hired Dufour as a student worker in 2009

"I recognized pretty quickly that Justin had a good head on him," Stephenson said. "If my research associate was out, I could rely on Justin to get things done, and that is uber rare. A person with that attention to detail and desire to learn is exceptional — and it's one of the reasons we encouraged him to get his master's."

Dufour earned a master's degree in agronomy and crop science from LSU in 2019.

He said it was an honor to receive the County Agent Award.

"Working with commercial producers and knowing that's their livelihood and how dependent they are on information from the AgCenter, I take pride in being able to do anything I can to help them," he said.

Sign up now for Conservation Reserve Program

General CRP helps producers and landowners establish long-term, resource-conserving plant species, such as approved grasses or trees, to control soil erosion, improve water quality and enhance wildlife habitat on cropland. Additionally, General CRP includes a Climate-Smart Practice Incentive to help increase carbon sequestration and reduce greenhouse gas emissions by helping producers and landowners establish trees and permanent grasses, enhance wildlife habitat, and restore wetlands.










From farm loans to crop insurance, and conservation programs to disaster assistance, the U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) is here to support you and your operation.



If you're a new farmer or rancher, the USDA can help you get started or grow your operation through a variety of programs and services, from farm loans to crop insurance, and conservation programs to disaster assistance.

We offer dedicated help to beginning farmers and ranchers. USDA considers anyone who has operated a farm or ranch for less than 10 years to be a beginning farmer or rancher.

The first step is to find your local USDA Service Center by visiting farmers.gov/ service-center-locator.

Call your local Farm Service Agency (FSA) office to make an appointment to establish a farm number. You can establish a farm number for any land being used for agricultural purposes that is over 0.01 acre.

You'll need to bring the following to your appointment:

Proof of identify (driver's license, Social Security card, IRS Employer Identification Number (EIN))

- Proof of Ownership (copy of recorded deed or recorded land contract)
- Lease agreements
- Entity Identification Status (articles of incorporation, trust and estate documents, or partnership agreement)

FSA staff will work with you one-on-one to review your documents and register your farm with FSA. Registering your farm allows you to apply for FSA and other USDA programs.

After your farm is registered, you can meet with FSA and Natural Resources Conservation Service (NRCS) staff to discuss your business and conservation goals. FSA and NRCS staff can help you determine program eligibility and walk you through the application process.

Depending on your operation, you may want to consider crop insurance. The USDA's Risk Management Agency provides crop insurance to help you manage risks on your farm. There are many types of insurance products available for a wide variety of production practices, including organic and sustainable agriculture.

March 15 deadline to enroll in USDA's Key Commodity Safety Net Programs for 2024 Crop Year

Agricultural producers who have not yet enrolled in the Agriculture Risk Coverage (ARC) or Price Loss Coverage (PLC) programs for the 2024 crop year have until March 15, 2024, to revise elections and sign contracts. Both safety net programs, delivered by USDA's Farm Service Agency (FSA), provide vital income support to farmers who experience substantial declines in crop prices or revenues for the 2024 crop year. In Louisiana, producers have completed 6,285 contracts to date, representing 38.5% of the more than 16,312 expected contracts.

"Agriculture Risk Coverage or Price Loss Coverage programs provide excellent risk protection, for market declines, at no cost to the producer. While we always hope for strong markets, anyone involved in production agriculture knows, the only thing certain is uncertainty," said Ronald Guidry, Jr., State Executive Director for FSA in Louisiana.

Many producers may be holding off on making your program planting elections pending decisions or maybe you're working with a local advisor to consider how changes in the effective reference price might impact your election decisions. Please contact your local FSA county office as soon as possible to set an appointment so you're on the books well in advance of the March 15 deadline."

Producers can elect coverage and enroll in ARC-County or PLC, which provide crop-by-crop protection, or ARC-Individual, which protects the entire farm. Although election changes for 2024 are optional, producers must enroll, with a signed contract, each year. If a producer has a multi-year contract on the farm, the contract will continue for 2024 unless an election change is made.

If producers do not submit their election revision by the March 15, 2024, deadline, the election remains the same as their 2023 election for eligible commodities on the farm. Also, producers who do not complete enrollment and sign their contract by the deadline will not be enrolled in ARC or PLC for the 2024 year and will not receive a payment if one is triggered. Farm owners can only enroll in these programs if they have a share interest in the commodity.

Producers are eligible to enroll farms with base acres for the following commodities: barley, canola, large and small chickpeas, corn, crambe, flaxseed, grain sorghum, lentils, mustard seed, oats, peanuts, dry peas, rapeseed, long grain rice, medium and short grain rice, safflower seed, seed cotton, sesame, soybeans, sunflower seed and wheat.

Crop insurance considerations

Producers are reminded that enrolling in ARC or PLC programs can impact eligibility for some crop insurance products offered by USDA's Risk Management Agency (RMA). Producers who elect and enroll in PLC also have the option of purchasing Supplemental Coverage Option (SCO) through their Approved Insurance Provider, but producers of covered commodities who elect ARC are ineligible for SCO on their planted acres.

Unlike SCO, RMA's Enhanced Coverage Option (ECO) is unaffected by participating in ARC for the same crop, on the same acres. You may elect ECO regardless of your farm program election.

Upland cotton farmers who choose to enroll seed cotton base acres in ARC or PLC are ineligible for the stacked income protection plan, or STAX, on their planted cotton acres.


