SQUEEZE THE DAY WITH LEROY'S LIPSMACK'N LEMONADE

Ah, lemonade... the quintessential summertime drink. It's a little tart, a little sweet, and a whole lot of refreshing. Making lemonade can also be a life philosophy. And when you put it all together, it's the recipe for success behind Leroy's LipSmack'n Lemonade.

In the last episode of Certified Louisiana's CRAWFISH TALES, Commissioner Strain learns about Leroy's amazing story of triumph and perseverance and one family's drive to squeeze the day and make a difference, one lip-smacking sip of lemonade at a time.

Leroy's mom, Sherilyn Hayward, explains that they didn't set out with the intention of starting a business. Rather, it all started with a shy little boy on the autism spectrum and a lemonade stand in their front yard.

At the time, Leroy was 5½ years old, and they had just found out that he was autistic and had hearing loss. Leroy's parents



had noticed for years that he had never really enjoyed being around people, and they were having a hard time getting him involved in something. That's when they found out about Lemonade Day.

"We said, let's just do a lemonade day, and we can just teach this kid how to give back. Because giving back makes you feel good," says Sherilyn.

That very first year, the Haywards allowed Leroy to be the determining factor in the taste of the lemonade. The lemonade that received Leroy's approval made him (and his parents) literally lick their lips! And that's how the "LipSmack'n" made its way into their product's name.

So, they set up a stand at the house, and Leroy absolutely flourished. He loved interacting with people, pouring his lemonade, and saying "Thank you" and "You're welcome."

When Lemonade Day was over, they took their proceeds and donated them to Our Lady of the Lake (LOL) Children's Health Hospital, and Leroy liked that part even more than selling the lemonade.

"I really believe it gave him a good feeling on the inside," said Sherilyn. Of course, that was his mother's intention all along. So they participated in Lemonade Day again the next year, and got the same response from Leroy.

The first two years, they donated all of the funds raised to the children's hospital. At that point, it still wasn't a business, just a way to give Leroy something that made him feel great and taught him lessons about working toward something and being part of a community.

In their 3rd year of participation, Leroy's stand won a Lemonade Day tasting contest, and that's when they decided to turn their lemonade into a real business, one that makes a difference not just for Leroy, but for others, too.

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LOUISIANA AGRICULTURE & FORESTRY TODAY

2023 Regular Legislative Session: LDAF Update

Each year, the LDAF works with legislators to update the statutes and address issues affecting agriculture and forestry. During the 2023 Regular Session, I worked with legislators on the passage of several pieces of legislation.

One piece of legislation to update the statutes was **Senate Bill 22** (Act 185) by Senator Glen Womack. This legislation removes outdated and obsolete provisions of the soil and water conservation law dating back to 1936.

In response to the issues affecting grain grading following excessive rainfall in 2022, which caused problems for our agricultural producers and damaged crops, the LDAF learned that not all grain was being

graded by persons certified in grain grading. Thus, **Senate Bill 28** (Act 202) by Senator Stewart Cathey, Jr. was introduced. This bill requires all grain, except rice, to be graded by a certified grader.

Additionally, **Senate Concurrent Resolution 31** by Senator Glen Womack was approved to create the Task Force on Louisiana Automated Grain Grading to study and make recommendations on emerging technologies for the grading of grain through automated machinery.

Regarding structural pest control, **House Bill 33** (Act 335) by Representative Jack McFarland removes a requirement that a registered technician who fails the examination must wait 30 days to retake the examination to become registered. This timeframe is no longer necessary as

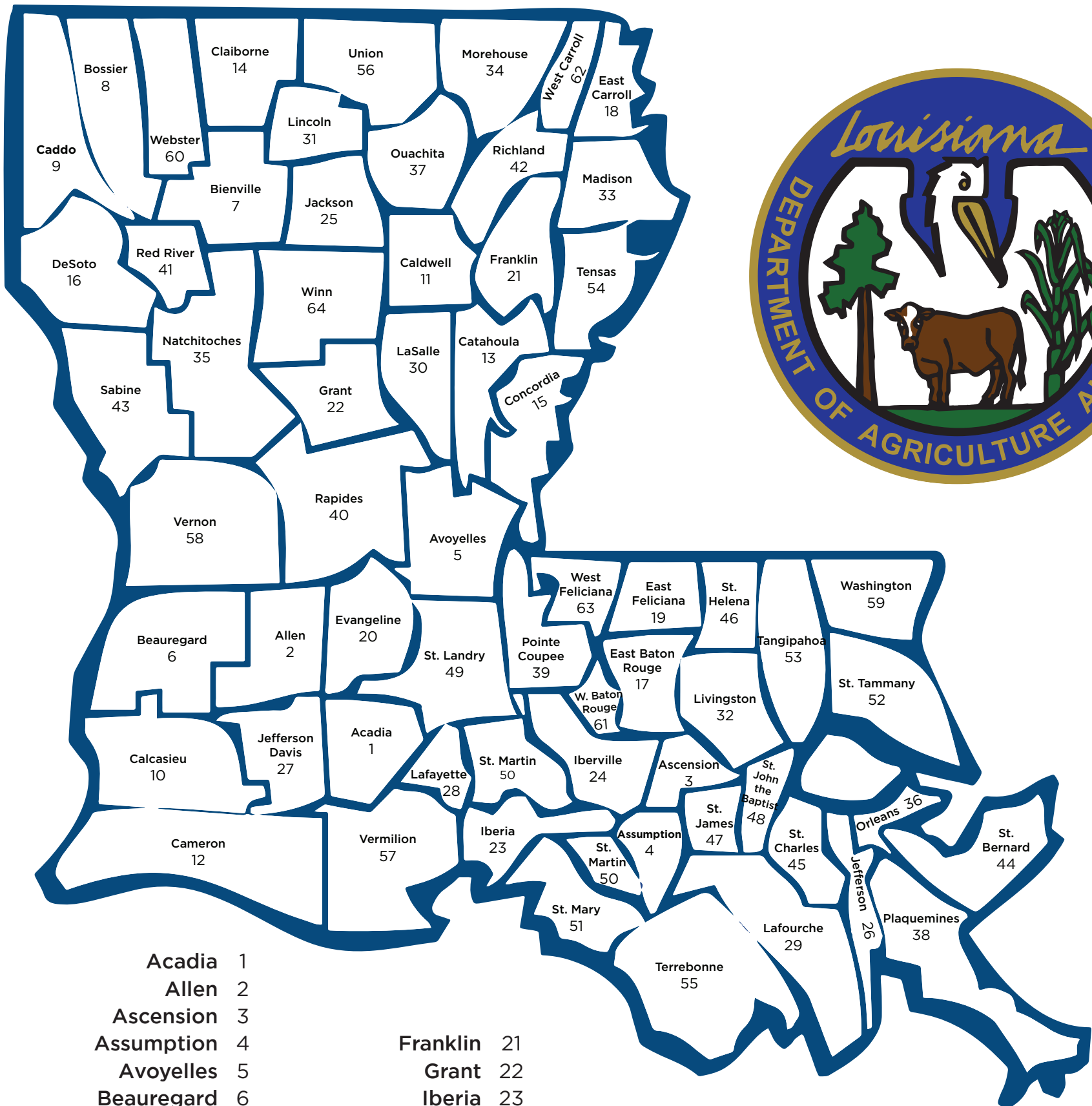

USDA Reminds LA Producers to File Crop Acreage Reports

Agricultural producers in Louisiana who have not yet completed their crop acreage reports after planting should make an appointment with their USDA Farm Service Agency (FSA) service center before the applicable deadline.

“Once planting is complete, call your local FSA office to make an appointment to report your acreage,” said Ronald Guidry, Jr., State Executive Director in Louisiana. “Our FSA staff can assist producers in completing acreage reports, including providing maps.”

An acreage report documents a crop grown on a farm or ranch and its intended uses. Filing an accurate and timely acreage report for all crops and land uses, including failed acreage and prevented planted acreage, can prevent the loss of benefits.

Acreage reporting dates vary by crop and by Parish. Contact your local FSA office for a list of acreage reporting deadlines by crop.

To file a crop acreage report, producers need to provide:

- Crop and crop type or variety;
- Intended use of the crop;
- Number of acres of the crop;
- Map with approximate boundaries for the crop;
- Planting date(s);

- Planting pattern, when applicable;
- Producer shares;
- Irrigation practice(s);
- Acreage prevented from planting, when applicable;
- Other information as required

The following exceptions apply to acreage reporting dates:

- If the crop has not been planted by the acreage reporting date, then the acreage must be reported no later than 15 calendar days after planting is completed.
- If a producer acquires additional acreage after the acreage reporting date, then the acreage must be reported no later than 30 calendar days after purchase or acquiring the lease. Appropriate documentation must be provided to the county office.
- Noninsured Crop Disaster Assistance Program (NAP) policy holders should note that the acreage reporting date for NAP-covered crops is the earlier of the dates listed above or 15 calendar days before grazing or harvesting of the crop begins.

Producers should also report crop acreage they intended to plant, but due to natural

disaster, were unable to because of a natural disaster.

Prevented planting acreage must be reported on form CCC-576, Notice of Loss, no later than 15 calendar days after the final planting date as established by FSA and USDA's Risk Management Agency.

BEEHIVE BUZZ: Summer Dearth By Keith Hawkins, LSU AgCenter Area Horticulture Agent

After the tallowtree, clover, dewberries, and privet have finished blooming, beekeepers are in the season of the year called the “dearth” when there are fewer flowering plants. This dearth ends in the fall when goldenrod and some other wildflowers are in bloom.

The Xerces Society (XS) lists a number of summer sources for pollinators and beneficial insects. This list includes 50 different plants species which bloom in the summer, including some of their favorites (at right), like the purple coneflower and tall thistle below.

Riveting Research at LSU AgCenter's Annual Rice Field Day

It was hot, hot, HOT at the LSU AgCenter's annual rice field day held at the H. Rouse Caffey Rice Research Station in Crowley on Wednesday, June 28. But that didn't stop farmers, researchers, and other stakeholders from gathering to learn more about the latest in new rice varieties and best management practices.

Through field tours, a poster session, and a trade show, LSU AgCenter researchers shared information on a number of topics.

Breeding

- This year, the breeding program has planted over 10,000 yield plots across seven locations.
- The yield test plots include 1,200 new experimental lines in 2,400 preliminary yield test plots being evaluated for the first time.
- In hybrid breeding efforts, over 350 new hybrid combinations are being evaluated in the field. Eight hybrids are being tested in advanced multi-location yield trials.

Pathology

- In 2023, the rice pathology program set forth an ambitious plan of conducting over 10,500 experimental units across 60 field experiments.

- These comprehensive studies encompass a wide range of areas, such as evaluating disease reactions on various genotypes throughout different stages of the breeding pipeline and exploring epidemiology.
- Additionally, there are studies investigating chemical control methods, and the implementation of integrated pest management strategies for combatting the most significant diseases affecting Louisiana's rice industry.

Entomology

- Ongoing studies examine the influence of rice water weevil and stem borer management during the main crop on yield in the ratoon crop.
- Results suggest that protecting roots from weevil feeding during the main crop improves yields of both the main and ratoon crops.

Agronomy

- Some of the rice agronomy research is focused on nitrogen fertilizer recommendations and seeding rates.
- Additional studies examine rice ratooning practices and first harvest dates.

Weed management

- The rice weed management program is currently evaluating a novel herbicide active ingredient (*tetflupyrolimet*) for use in rice.
- Other research trials are focused on surface coated fertilizer techniques, row rice herbicide program, control of *fimbristylis*, and several other areas.

This is just a glimpse of some of the ongoing efforts conducted through the LSU AgCenter's rice research programs.

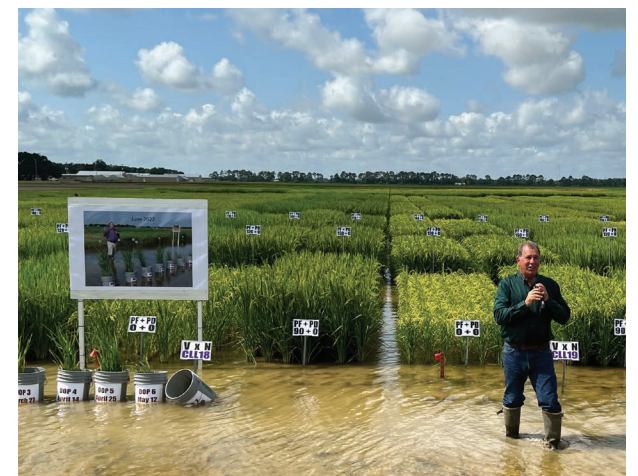

New Crop Disease Reference Book Edited by LSU AgCenter Scientists

A new crop disease reference guide co-edited by two LSU AgCenter-affiliated plant pathologists is designed to aid students, crop consultants and producers for decades to come.

“Diseases of Field Crops,” a 400-page reference guide, details disease symptoms of 22 major field crops with more than 800 high-quality photographs.

G. Boyd Padgett, an AgCenter plant pathologist, and Clayton A. Hollier, AgCenter professor emeritus, partnered with Martin A. Draper, associate dean for research and graduate programs in the Kansas State University College of Agriculture, to assemble the book. They worked with 49 authors to create the guide, which was published this spring by the American Phytopathological Society.

“We wanted to highlight the major diseases that were affecting each crop across the United States and even up into Canada, as well,” Padgett said.

Padgett, Hollier and Draper wanted to produce a comprehensive, up-to-date reference guide that would help readers identify and manage plant diseases.

“Our attempt was to update some existing field crop disease books that have been around for quite some time that are the standards,” Padgett said.

Padgett and Hollier co-authored the book’s first chapter on integrated plant disease management, which, according to the introductory paragraph, “involves looking at every aspect of growing a crop and manipulating what can be done to reduce pathogens and their impact on the crop while minimizing negative effects on the environment and society.”

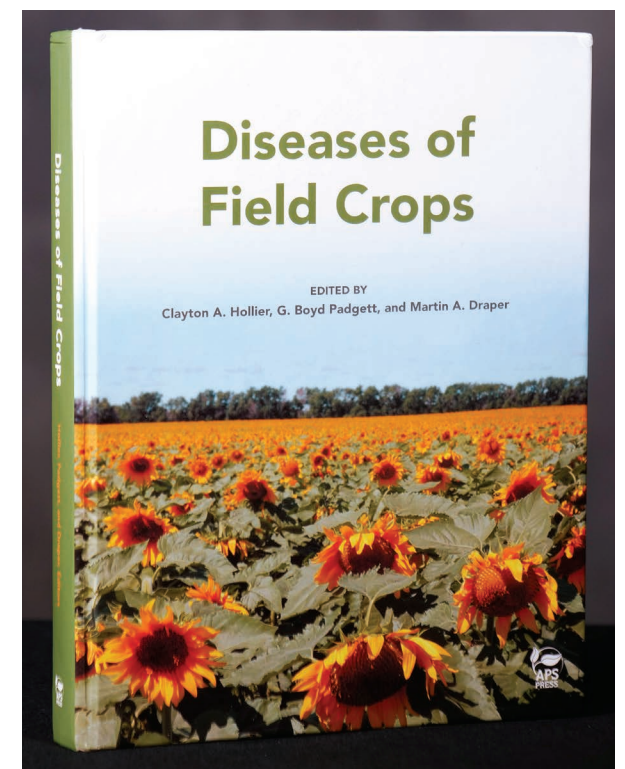
The other 22 chapters focus on individual crops and provide descriptions of diseases and the best management practices for combatting the diseases.

While assembling the book and working with other experts in their field, the editors placed a priority on using detailed color photographs to illustrate each disease as it progresses. Plants exhibit different symptoms at different stages and in different environmental conditions, Padgett said.

“Just like in the human population, a kid who has a cold may exhibit different symptoms than someone who’s 85 years old, and the older population may be more

susceptible,” he said. “So, we wanted to be able to document and photograph the signs and the symptoms of each individual disease on these various field crops.”

Additional AgCenter-affiliated researchers contributed to the volume. Paul “Trey” Price, a plant pathologist at the AgCenter Macon Ridge Research Station, co-wrote the chapter on soybean diseases, and Donald E. Groth, the retired director of the AgCenter H. Rouse Caffey Rice Research Station, is an author of the chapter on rice diseases.

retesting is allowed sooner with computer-based examinations.

Also, the legislation allows Research Committee member terms to run concurrent with the commissioner like the terms for the appointed members of the Structural Pest Control Commission. The Research Committee is a subcommittee of the Structural Pest Control Commission.

Under **House Bill 60** (Act 293) by Representative Michael Echols, the department will now be tasked with regulating electric vehicle fueling stations, like it currently does for gas pumps, to ensure the consumer is getting what they pay for.

Lastly, to ease the financial burden of replacing agricultural fencing, **House Bill 330** (Act 425) by Representative Mike

Johnson exempts 2.45% of state and all of local sales tax on all purchases of agricultural fencing by commercial farmers leaving it taxable at 2%.

Applying for Youth FSA Loans

The Farm Service Agency (FSA) makes loans to youth to establish and operate agricultural income-producing projects in connection with 4-H clubs, FFA and other agricultural groups. Projects must be planned and operated with the help of the organization advisor, produce sufficient income to repay the loan, and provide the youth with practical experience. The maximum loan amount is \$5,000.

Youth Loan Eligibility Requirements:

- Be a citizen of the United States (which includes Puerto Rico, the Virgin Islands, Guam, American Samoa, the Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands) or a legal resident alien
- Be 10 years to 20 years of age
- Comply with FSA's general eligibility requirements
- Conduct a modest income-producing project in a supervised program of work as outlined above
- Demonstrate capability of planning, managing and operating the project under guidance and assistance from a project advisor. The project supervisor must recommend the youth loan applicant, along with providing adequate supervision.

JULY 25 DEADLINE: Funds for Socially Disadvantaged Farmers & Ranchers and Veteran Farmers & Ranchers

The USDA has announced approximately \$45 million available to organizations that help underserved and veteran farmers, ranchers, and foresters own and operate successful farms. Funding is made through USDA's Outreach and Assistance for Socially Disadvantaged Farmers and Ranchers and Veteran Farmers and Ranchers Program, also known as the 2501 Program. This program is administered by the USDA Office of Partnerships and Public Engagement (OPPE).

"This program demonstrates USDA's commitment to advance equity and lower barriers to USDA resources," said OPPE Director Lisa Ramirez.

For more than 30 years, and in partnership

with organizations nationwide, the 2501 Program has helped reach underserved farmers and ranchers who have experienced barriers to service due to racial or ethnic prejudice. The 2014 Farm Bill expanded the program to include assistance to veteran farmers and ranchers. The 2018 Farm Bill increased mandatory funding for the program through fiscal year 2023 with a permanent funding level of \$25 million for each year thereafter.

With 2501 Program funding, organizations conduct education, training, farming demonstrations, and conferences on farming and agribusiness to increase access to USDA's programs and services.

Since 2010, the 2501 Program has awarded

615 grants totaling more than \$194 million. Among recent grantees, the University of Alaska Fairbanks received a 2501 grant to help tribal communities start new gardens, farms, ranches, or other endeavors that promote community food security, resiliency, and economic diversity while upholding traditional knowledge and traditional ways of securing food.

Eligible applicants include nonprofit organizations, community-based organizations, federally recognized tribes and tribal organizations, and a range of higher education institutions serving veteran farmers and African American, American Indian, Alaska Native, Hispanic, Asian, and Pacific Islander communities.

Applications must be submitted through [Grants.gov](https://grants.gov) and received by Tues., July 25, 2023.
