



BRILLIANT BROMELIADS!







On any given day, Mark Mese can field messages from growers and nursery owners around the world about acquiring some of the hundreds of plants in his Baton Rouge nursery. Mese, a retired attorney, has about 3,000 square feet of greenhouses on his property, where he carefully tends each day to bromeliads, rare ferns, begonias, succulents and more.

"One of the things I enjoy the most is that there are so many different kinds

of plants you can work with," Mese said. "The internet has opened up so many avenues because you see plants you want and you can do trades with other nursery owners. I know someone in Portland who wants rare plants native to the Southeast and he grows rare mosses. I can work out a trade with someone like him to help each of us diversify our crops and bring something new to our areas."

Mese runs one of nearly 600 certified nursery crop operations in Louisiana. Such nurseries must be licensed by the Louisiana Department of Agriculture and Forestry (LDAF), who works with the U.S. Department of Agriculture on matters such as controlling diseases and invasive species. LDAF Commissioner Mike Strain said that in Louisiana, such nurseries generate more than \$200 million a year, which

puts the state at 16th in the nation for nursery crop production.

"In Louisiana, nursery crops are considered specialty crops and are a major part of the state's economy," Strain said. "Some nursery owners sell strictly wholesale. Some sell to licensed horticulturalists or businesses. Some sell to big box stores. If you shop at one of those, you'll often see that the plants have stickers identifying them as coming from a Louisiana nursery. That's great because we want local products to be sold locally because they grow better in our environment."

Strain said the size of Louisiana's nurseries vary from a few dozen plants to large operations with thousands growing at any given time. Most nursery owners stick to a handful of crops, although there are a multitude of options in terms of which plants can be grown in Louisiana. For example, there are nurseries in the state with azaleas, camellias, magnolia trees, grasses, Hibiscus, citruses, fig trees and

Extreme heat, drought bring burn bans and state of emergency

Due to the extremely dry conditions statewide and the concern over first responder safety in these dangerously high temperatures, Louisiana Department of Agriculture and Forestry (LDAF) Commissioner Mike Strain, D.V.M., along with State Fire Marshal Dan Wallis, have issued a statewide cease and desist order for all private burning, pursuant to authority under R.S. 40:1602.

This order was effective as of 5 PM, August 7, and will remain in effect until rescinded.

LDAF's Office of Forestry is tasked with responding to wildfires at any hour, and crews stand ready to take action. In the event of an emergency that requires their assistance, you can call the LDAF 24-Hour Emergency Hotline at 1-855-452-5323 or dial 911.

On August 14, Gov. John Bel Edwards declared a state of emergency due to the multiple impacts of extreme heat affecting the state.

"This summer, the National Weather Service has issued a record number of excessive heat warnings for Louisiana," said Gov. Edwards. "The Louisiana Department of Health reports that the state has already exceeded the average number of annual heat-related emergency room visits. Additionally, drought conditions and a significant drop in the Mississippi River's water level have added stress on water supplies and agriculture.

This declaration will allow the state to mobilize resources and aid those most affected. Please continue to take precautions when you are outside and check on neighbors who might need assistance."

A state of emergency is an administrative step that authorizes the use of state resources to aid in emergency response efforts. The Governor's Office and GOHSEP will continue to update the public on heat-related threats, in addition to any other weather emergencies.



CRAB DUMPLINS

Open the can of biscuits and one at a time roll each one out to about 1/8 inch thickness using a light sprinkle of flour to keep them from sticking. Cut the flat biscuits into 6-8 pieces pending size of dumplings you want. Pile the cut biscuits in one corner of cutting board for placing in a pot at a later time. Scrape up the extra flour and place in a bowl, then pour the cream into it and whisk until smooth. Pour in the cream and flour mixture making sure it is stirred frequently by scraping the bottom so it doesn't stick. Once the liquid thickens up and it has a slow bubbling, add in the biscuit pieces a few at a time, stirring softly until they swell up. Once the dumplings are cooked and no longer doughy, gently add in the crab meat. Then add in, if you would like, a few green peas and or carrots. Stir and cook just until heated through. Once the Crab and Dumplings are placed in a bowl, you can sprinkle some finely chopped green onion tops for added color.

BRAISED BEEF SHORTRIBS

Submitted by New Orleans Distillers, LLC

Ingredients:

5-6 beef short ribs

1½ teaspoons each salt and pepper

2 tablespoons olive oil

3 garlic cloves

1 large onion, chopped

2 celery ribs, chopped

2 carrots, chopped

2 tablespoons tomato paste

1 cup Grantham Cabernet Sauvignon Liqueur

1 cup New Orleans Distillers Gold Rum

2 cups (500ml) beef stock/broth, low sodium

2 sprigs thyme

1 sprig rosemary

2 bay leaves

Instructions:

Preheat oven to 325°F. Sprinkle beef all over with salt and pepper. Heat oil in a large ovenproof pot over high heat. Add half the ribs and brown aggressively all over (5-7 minutes in total). Remove and repeat with remaining ribs, then remove. Turn heat down to medium. Add onion and garlic into the same pot and cook for 2 minutes. Add carrot and celery, cook for 5 minutes until carrot is softened and sweet. Add tomato paste and cook for 1 minute. Add the Cabernet Sauvignon Liqueur, Gold Rum, broth, thyme, rosemary and bay leaves. Stir until tomato paste is dissolved. Return beef into liquid, arranging them so they are submerged. Cover with lid and transfer to oven for 3 hours, or until the meat can easily be pried apart with forks.

Remove beef carefully, keeping the meat on the bone. Cover to keep warm. Strain all liquid in the pot, pressing juices out of the onion, carrot etc. Return sauce into pot, bring to simmer and stir. Adjust seasoning as necessary and simmer to reduce. Place beef on serving plate, spoon over sauce. Serve.













APPLE HONEY RABBIT

Ingredients:

2 rabbits*, quartered or deboned 2 tablespoons Cajun seasoning ½ tablespoons ground white pepper ½ tablespoons dried rosemary ½ tablespoons dried thyme 1 medium apple, sliced thin ½ cup apple juice ½ cup KJUN honey ½ cup butter 12 ounces smoked bacon



Instructions:

Preheat oven to 350°F. Place quartered or deboned rabbit into an iron skillet. Sprinkle rabbit with Cajun seasoning, white pepper, rosemary, and thyme. Place thinly sliced apple pieces over the rabbit. Cover the apples and rabbit with the sliced bacon. Add the butter, honey, and apple juice to a glass bowl and microwave until butter is soft. Mix thoroughly and pour over the bacon covered rabbit. Cover the skillet with aluminum foil and bake for 60 minutes or until cooked throughout. Remove aluminum foil cover, increase oven temperature to 425°F, and bake for 15 minutes until bacon is crisp. Remove from oven and serve. Notes: Use a medium flavored honey for this recipe. A good choice would be any of our southern parish honeys.

*This recipe works great with young wild rabbits or 11-12 week old domestic rabbits weighing 5-6 pounds life and 3-3.5 pounds field dressed. We bake the front and hind quarters whole with the ribs and backbone deboned for this recipe. We recommend a mild, low salt type of season all such as Jean Pierre's Special Blend Season-All for this recipe.

This also works great with chicken. If chicken is used, we recommend not using the sliced apples so that the bacon can be placed directly on the chicken itself.



LA DOTD issues special permits for transporting hay



The La. Dept. of Transportation and Development will begin issuing special permits to vehicles transporting hay during the current gubernatorially declared drought emergency.

Permit fees will be \$10 and will be valid for only as long as the declared drought emergency exists, not to exceed one year.

The following restrictions apply:

- Vehicles transporting hay bales loaded side by side shall not exceed 12 feet in width and 14 feet in height. All other weight and dimension restrictions and requirements still apply.
- Travel is limited to daylight hours beginning at sunrise and ending at sunset and is limited by all nomovement requirements on certain holidays.
- Vehicles must travel with the required signs and flags properly placed and indicating that they carry oversized loads.
- Vehicles must be equipped with mirrors that allow drivers to have a clear view of the highway to least 200 feet to the rear of the vehicle.

- Loads must be securely bound to the transporting vehicles.
- Carriers, owners and drivers of any vehicle being operated are responsible for verifying in advance that the actual dimensions and weights of the vehicles and loads are acceptable for all routes being traveled.
- It is the responsibility of the carriers, owners, and drivers to track the status of the declared emergencies. In the event the emergency expires prior to the one-year period, the owner, carrier, and driver shall be responsible for terminating use of the permit. Information regarding the status of declared emergencies and to obtain a special permit may call the DOTD Permit Office toll free at (800) 654-1433 or (225) 343-2345 for the Baton Rouge area.
- No vehicle shall exceed weight limits posted for bridges and similar structures, or relieve any vehicle or carrier, owner or driver of any vehicle from compliance with any restrictions other than those specified, or from any statute, rule, order or other legal requirement.

"Nursery owners want to diversify their selections because this isn't a monoculture where you only grow one thing," Strain explained. "However, you do often see nurseries that focus on certain types of plants, such as ground cover, grasses, fruit trees, products for reforestation, nut-bearing trees, succulents and more. Just about anything you can imagine grows in a nursery somewhere in Louisiana." In addition to selling or trading plants with other nursery owners, Mese said he also sells occasionally to local gardening societies and sometimes gives small cuttings or plants to people just beginning their own nursery operations.

"We're not open to the public, but we do sell, trade and exhibit at some of the plant societies in the area," he said. "You can have some fun and make some money doing it. Some people do it as their full-time work, but for a lot of people like me, it's more of a hobby that lets you do something you enjoy while connecting with a lot of other people."

Strain said that in his visits with nursery owners across Louisiana, he has seen other benefits as well.

"The money continues to flow locally and you can see it happening in real time," he said. "If you are in the nursery business, you have to build greenhouses and buy equipment. You need fertilizer and plant food. That money is circulating in your area, so it's helping a lot of people. I also find that being around plants is good for the human condition. There's a lot of pride associated with helping something to grow and become beautiful. That's why we



always say buy fresh, buy local, buy Louisiana - that's where the good things grow."

Mese said anyone interested in growing nursery crops should start by focusing on one or two types of plants, then expand their operations as they learn more. He also encourages people to grow plants they enjoy working with and focus on the satisfaction they get from being a grower instead of financial rewards.

There are more than 600 certified nurseries in Louisiana that grow a wide variety of crops and plants.

Strain said many nursery owners can often be found at local farmers markets and gardening

societies, and are always willing to answer questions and offer suggestions to people who are new to nursery operations.

"The LSU AgCenter and Southern AgCenter are other great resources with experts who can help anyone," Strain said. "People can also connect with local master gardeners or garden clubs. You can also contact the USDA to see what kind of programs or incentives you may qualify for. There are people and places out there who are willing to help if you want to get into nursery crop operations."

Nursery crops are considered specialty crops in Louisiana and may be eligible to participate in the Specialty Crop Block Grant Program. This program funds projects related to promotion, research development, advertising, education and more. To learn more, visit www.ldaf.state.la.us/consumers/agro-consumer-services-dairy/specialty-crops-program.

Are you a nursery grower?

If you are a grower, you must have a Nursery Certificate Permit (also called a Grower's Permit) to sell nursery stock, cut flowers, and bulbs that you grow.

After a successful inspection for any major insects or diseases, we will issue your permit. No exam is required, but the following fees apply.

- \$100 per year for NC1: Area greater than 2,500 square feet and/or greenhouse greater than 200 square feet
- \$25 per year for NC2: Home Yard (less than 2,500 sq. ft.) and/or greenhouse less than 200 square feet

If you want to sell nursery stock you have grown or purchased from a single location, you need either a Grower's Permit or a Nursery Stock Dealer Permit, not both. If you grow the majority of your stock, you may operate under a Nursery Grower's Permit. However, if you grow and sell at one location and also sell from other locations, you need a single Grower's Permit plus a Nursery Stock Dealer Permit for each additional location.















The Calcasieu Soil and Water Conservation District (SWCD) was established on May 12, 1939, when landowners in Vernon and Beauregard parishes saw the need to provide conservation resources and assistance to neighboring landowners and producers.

Covering over 1.6 million acres, with **over 3,400 cooperators**, the Calcasieu SWCD creates conservation opportunities for all landowners. Through federal, state, and local partnership initiatives, they make conservation technical and financial assistance available to cropland, pastureland, woodland, and urban landowners.

Conservation enthusiasts and professionals throughout Calcasieu SWCD continue to increase conservation efforts toward soil health and habitat on working lands. **Nationally recognized Soil Health Champion** David Daigle uses agricultural processes and practices to reestablish and maintain beneficial and declining ecosystems through







his successful cattle and longleaf pine timber production operation. Mr. Daigle is a longtime member of the Calcasieu SWCD board and currently serves as the board's chairman.

The Calcasieu SWCD has contributed to **evolving partnerships** with the National Wild Turkey Federation, Texas-Louisiana Longleaf Pine Task Force, Vernon and Beauregard Cattleman's Association, Southwest Louisiana Forestry Association, Louisiana Nature Conservancy, Louisiana Department of Wildlife and Fisheries, Department of Defense (Fort Polk), and the U.S. Forest Service (USFS).

Calcasieu SWCD's growing partnership with the USFS has created the opportunity for a **shared technician** whose purpose is to assist the district's cooperators with technical assistance and conservation planning. This position has facilitated a succession of very productive SWCD agreements for the purpose of prescribed burning for forest health and productivity, enhancing rare and declining longleaf dominated habitats for red-cockaded woodpecker, LA pine snake, eastern wild turkey, and more.

Calcasieu SWCD recently facilitated the nation's first "Good Neighbor Authority" agreement between a soil and water conservation district and the USFS, allowing



critical management work to keep forests healthy and productive. Projects including water quality and quantity improvement, watershed restoration, vegetation management, soil and water improvement, and wildlife habitat improvement will be completed through this valuable partnership.

USDA reminds livestock producers of available drought assistance

USDA's Farm Service Agency (FSA) reminds drought-impacted producers in Louisiana that they may be eligible for assistance through the Emergency Assistance for Livestock, Honey Bees, and Farm-Raised Fish Program (ELAP).

ELAP provides financial assistance in the following areas for eligible livestock in qualifying counties/ parishes:

- the transportation of water to livestock;
- the above normal cost of mileage for transporting feed to livestock; and
- the above normal cost of transporting livestock to forage/grazing acres.*

*Hauling livestock both ways starting in 2023, one haul per animal reimbursement and no payment for "empty miles."

Eligible livestock include cattle, bison, goats and sheep, among others, that are maintained for commercial use and located in a county where qualifying drought conditions occur. A county must have had D2 severe drought intensity on the U.S. Drought Monitor for eight consecutive weeks during the normal grazing period, or D3 or D4 drought intensity at any time during the normal grazing period. Producers must have risk in both eligible livestock and eligible grazing land in an eligible county to qualify for ELAP assistance.

Transporting water

Producers must be transporting water to eligible livestock on eligible grazing land where adequate livestock watering systems or facilities were in place before the drought occurred and where water transportation is not normally required. ELAP covers costs associated with personal labor, equipment, hired labor, and contracted water transportation fees. Cost of the water itself is not covered. ELAP covers \$0.07 per gallon to transport water.

Transporting feed

ELAP provides financial assistance to livestock producers who incur above normal expenses for transporting feed to livestock during drought. The payment formula excludes the first 25 miles and any mileage over 1,000 miles. The reimbursement rate is 60% of the cost above what would normally would have been incurred during the same time period in a normal (non-drought)

Livestock feed that is transported to livestock located on land enrolled in the Conservation Reserve Program (CRP) is eligible if the producer has an approved conservation plan with acceptable grazing practices developed in coordination with the Natural Resources Conservation Service

The payment rate to transport feed is \$6.60/loaded mile for

ELAP provides financial assistance to livestock producers who are hauling livestock to a new location for feed resources due to insufficient feed or grazing in drought-impacted areas. As with transporting feed, the payment formula for transporting livestock excludes the first 25 miles and any mileage over 1,000 miles. The reimbursement rate is 60% of the costs above what would normally have been incurred during the same time period in a normal (non-drought) year.

The payment rate to transport livestock is \$6.60/loaded mile for expenses above what would have normally been incurred and covers hauling livestock one-way, one haul per animal reimbursement and no payment for "empty miles."

An online tool is now available to help ranchers document and estimate payments to cover feed and livestock transportation costs caused by drought.

Reporting losses

Producers should contact FSA as soon as the loss of water or feed resources are known.

Documentation of expenses is critical for ELAP eligibility. Producers should maintain records and receipts associated with the costs of transporting water to eligible livestock, the costs of transporting feed to eligible livestock, the costs of additional feed purchases, and the costs of transporting eligible livestock to forage or other grazing acres.

Producers interested in ELAP assistance can contact their local USDA Service Center to learn more or to apply for programs.

Farm Service Agency (FSA) is now accepting applications for the Livestock Forage Disaster Program (LFP) for grazing losses due to drought in certain areas. The deadline to apply for 2023 LFP assistance is Jan. 30, 2024.

provides compensation to eligible livestock producers who suffered grazing losses for covered livestock due to drought on privately owned or cash leased land or fire on federally managed land. For LFP, qualifying drought intensity levels are determined using the U.S. Drought Monitor.

BE PREPARED: Wildland fire safety

Amid the current drought and with a statewide burn ban still in effect, we all have a part to play in helping to keep our homes and community safer from wildfire.

Before a fire threatens, you can take action steps around your home to prepare for potential wildfires:

- CLEAR leaves and other vegetative debris from roofs, gutters, porches, and decks. This helps prevent embers from igniting your home.
- REMOVE dead vegetation and other items from under your deck or porch and within 10 feet of the house.
- SCREEN in areas below patios and decks with wire mesh to prevent debris and combustible materials from accumulating.
- REMOVE flammable materials (wood piles, propane tanks) within 30 feet of your home's foundation and outbuildings, including garages and sheds. If it can catch fire, don't let it touch your house, deck, or porch.
- PRUNE trees so the lowest branches are 6 to 10 feet from the ground. Wildfire can spread to tree tops.
- KEEP your lawn hydrated and maintained. If it is brown, cut it down to reduce fire intensity. Dry grass and shrubs are fuel for wildfire.
- **DISPOSE** of debris and lawn cuttings.
- INSPECT shingles or roof tiles. Replace or repair those that are loose or missing to prevent ember penetration.

- **COVER** exterior attic vents with metal wire mesh no larger than 1/8" to prevent sparks from entering the home.
- ENCLOSE eaves and screen soffit vents using 1/8" mesh metal screening to prevent ember entry.

Plan, prepare, & practice

A wildfire may make it necessary for you to evacuate. Plan, prepare, and practice these simple tips that can help make leaving your home quicker, easier, and safer.

- Sign up to receive local emergency alerts and warnings on all phones and devices.
- ✓ Know your community's emergency notification and evacuation plans.
- ✓ Plan an evacuation route (including alternates) away from your home.
- Designate a contact who knows your plan and how to communicate with you.
- Plan to help family, friends, or neighbors who have disabilities.
- Maintain roads/bridges on your property; build culverts with materials that won't melt; make sure everyone can open gates roads.
- ✓ Prepack emergency supply kits.
- Practice with your family and participate in community drills.
- ✓ Practice evacuating animals and pets, including how to operate trailers and other vehicles needed to transport them. Plan for the resources needed for their care in case of evacuation.

Suspect arrested for initiating fire during burn ban

On August 11, 2023, Louisiana Department of Agriculture and Forestry (LDAF) forestry enforcement agents in the southeast region began investigating a large wildfire in the area of Mount Hermon, Louisiana. During the course of the investigation, agents determined that the origin of the fire was near a campsite located off Firetower Road.

Forestry enforcement agents, along with Washington Parish Sheriff's Office detectives, executed a search warrant at the campsite in an attempt to determine who was present to ignite the fire(s).

Agents later came into contact with 34-year-old Kenneth Beaubouef, who advised he resided at the campsite. Beaubouef admitted to having started a fire on August 10 and tending to the fire late into the night. Beaubouef further indicated he left the area unattended on the morning of August 11. It appears the

fire subsequently spread into the nearby wooded area, causing severe damage to property and structures. Agents also note Beaubouef started the original fire during a statewide burn ban.

Kenneth Beaubouef was taken into custody and booked into the Washington Parish Jail for violations of Louisiana revised statutes



14:204 (Fire-raising on lands of another by criminal negligence) and 40:1602 (Burn Ban Violation).

The Washington Parish Sheriff's Office and the Louisiana Office of State Fire Marshal assisted in the investigation.

LDAF's Office of Forestry is tasked with responding to wildfires at any hour, and crews stand ready to take action. In the event of an emergency that requires their assistance, you can call the LDAF 24-Hour Emergency Hotline at 1-855-452-5323 or dial 911

USDA unveils cutting-edge map showing planted commodities

Imagine this. You are a new farmer who bought a plot of land in your hometown. You're making important decisions for your operation like what to plant and where. If only you had a tool to identify historical information for what's been grown on your land and in your area that would allow you to make better informed decisions to set up your new business for success.

Thanks to USDA's National Agricultural Statistics Service (NASS) and Economic Research Service (ERS), this tool has become a reality. The public can now access a new geospatial product called **Crop Sequence Boundaries** (CSB).




CSB is a cutting-edge map of agricultural fields that provides crop acreage estimates and historical planting decisions across the contiguous United States. Created using satellite imagery and other public data, it allows users to conduct area and statistical analyses of planted U.S. commodities.

It can help producers make planting and farm practice decisions and researchers conduct analyses at the field level, such as the study of conservation practices. CSB fills a gap between existing data sources; most other field level spatial products offer only small areas of focus.

The CSB data sets for 2015 to 2022 are viewable and available for download at the state and county-level using an interactive map powered by Google Earth Engine. CSB contains no confidential or personally identifiable information.
