

# STORM PREP FOR PETS

Midway through hurricane season, there's still time to ensure you're prepared, especially when it comes to pets who rely on you for their care. You never know when it might be necessary to shelter or evacuate with pets and/or livestock, so don't forget to plan for the furry friends in your life. To help keep you and your animals safe, there's no time like the present to familiarize yourself with resources available before, during, and after an emergency situation.

It's understandable that when people must leave their homes during emergencies, they want to keep their pets and service animals nearby. That's why Louisiana's emergency "mega shelters" for residents also include shelters for pets. This enables owners to care for their pets, which not only gives them peace of mind but also reduces the number of shelter workers needed to look after the displaced animals.

State law requires that every parish have a local director for the Office of Homeland Security & Emergency Preparedness. This director must submit a Parish Pet Plan to The Louisiana Department of Agriculture and Forestry (LDAF) by March 1st every year. A Parish Pet Plan outlines the local parish's plans for providing humane evacuation, safe transport, and temporary sheltering of service animals and household pets in times of emergency or disaster.

The type of public shelter where pets will live during emergency evacuation depends upon their owners' health, mobility, and personal transportation options as well as the size and number of pets that need emergency shelter.

During emergencies, people who can transport both themselves and their pets to mega shelter locations and look after the animals while in the shelter will have that option. All Critical Transportation Need (CTN) evacuees who need assistance getting themselves and their pets to safety will first get a ride to their local Parish Pickup Point (PPP). In most cases, they can bring one small (under 35 pounds) cat or dog on their lap along with them in the evacuation vehicle. Larger pets will be linked to their owners at the PPP and transported separately to shelter near their owners; this way, owners can care for both their small and larger pets while sheltering nearby.

Pet owners whose health problems would interfere with their ability to take care of pets at a mega shelter can get shelter for their pets and appropriate medical accommodations for themselves at specialty locations where workers care for people's pets onsite.

#### Louisiana State Animal Response Team

It's hard to imagine all the moving parts that make this possible, right? The team in the spotlight here is the Louisiana State Animal Response Team (LSART), an organization of groups and individuals with an interest in animal well-being related to emergencies or disasters. Developed from the Louisiana Veterinary Medical Association (LVMA) Disaster Committee, LSART's members include veterinarians, animal control officers, humane organizations, and citizen volunteers. After the response to Hurricane Katrina, LSART became a division of the Dr. Walter J. Ernst Veterinary Memorial Foundation (WJE)—the non-profit foundation associated with the LVMA.

LSART members and LDAF staff recently gathered in Woodworth, Louisiana, to plan for this year's hurricane season. In addition to getting a refresher on best practices, attendees shared information, participated in mock pet shelter drills, and took stock of resources. All of these efforts help LDAF and its partners like LSART prepare to best evacuate our furry friends during an emergency.

In addition to LDAF and LSART's multiple mobile and stand-alone pet shelters, the American Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals® (ASPCA®) recently constructed a new mobile pet shelter with Jones Trailer Co. out of Woodson, TX. The \$85,000 trailer was then donated to LDAF through a disaster grant. The new unit contains 43 cages, five of which have removable dividers for extralarge dogs.

> In addition to the expanded capacity it offers, the 25-x-8foot trailer runs on gas and can be used as a stand-alone shelter. It can also be used as a transport vehicle or set up at a human shelter to serve as a pop-up animal shelter.

### Last minute storm prep? Be sure to use a licensed arborist

Three months into hurricane season, we're about to enter what is often the most active part of the season.

> But there's no need to panic... You still have time to complete important preparations, like packing your emergency bag, taking down unhealthy trees, and trimming limbs hanging over your home or business.

I'd like to remind Louisiana residents why it's important to hire only licensed arborists. For one, they're trained to provide for not only the safety of you and your home, but also the overall health of trees.

> Additionally, licensed arborists are required to maintain liability

insurance to perform work around your property.

The Louisiana Department of Agriculture and Forestry (LDAF) also licenses arborist consultants. These professionals cannot perform work on trees and don't require liability insurance. However, they can identify problematic trees and advice you on the types of trees that are best for your propery.

#### STEW IN A FEW CRAWFISH BISQUE

Submitted by Uncle Larry Roussel

#### Ingredients:

2 qt. Uncle Larry's Stew in a Few 3 lbs. peeled crawfish tails, 1 c. reserved 1 c. onion, finely diced 1/2 c. celery, finely diced 1 Tbsp. Uncle Larry's seasoning & flavor enhancer 1 Tbsp. dried parsley flakes 2 eggs 1 c. bread crumbs

<u>NOTE</u>: You will need 40 to 60 crawfish heads/shells cleaned in advance. You may run out of stuffing before you stuff all of the heads simply because the size of the crawfish shells will be a factor on how many crawfish heads you will stuff.

#### Instructions:

Reserve 1 cup of whole crawfish tails (for bisque gravy).

Grind the remaining crawfish tails in a food processor. (This may need to be done in batches.)

Now, reserve 1 cup of the ground crawfish tails (for bisque gravy) and transfer the remaining ground crawfish tails into a large bowl.

Pour both jars of Stew in a Few into a sauce pan or 2-gallon stock pot. Add the cup of whole crawfish tails and the cup of ground crawfish tails and cook on medium heat, stirring occasionally to prevent sticking/ burning.

While the bisque gravy is heating, add the remaining ingredients to the ground crawfish tails you set aside. Using your hands, mix thoroughly. Don't forget to stir the gravy a few times, but be sure wash your hands (or wear gloves) between the mixing and the stirring!

Take the stuffing and thoroughly pack a cleaned crawfish head. Continue repeating this step until you run out of stuffing. Again, don't forget to stir your gravy during the stuffing process.

Turn the burner to medium/high and add the stuffed crawfish heads to the gravy. Carefully stir your bisque until you reach a gentle boil. Now, reduce heat and simmer for 20 to 30 minutes, stirring occasionally.

### **USDA funding for Louisiana specialty crop growers**

The U.S. Department of Agriculture has announced over \$356,000 in funding awarded to Louisiana through the Specialty Crop Block Grant Program (SCBGP). Through this program, the Louisiana Department of Agriculture and Forestry (LDAF) will fund projects that strengthen Louisiana's specialty crop industry through marketing, education, and research.

"We are happy to once again be partnered with Louisiana on the Specialty Crop Block Grant Program," said USDA Under Secretary for Marketing and Regulatory Programs Jenny Lester Moffitt. "The innovative projects funded through this program will strengthen U.S. specialty crop production and markets and ensure Americans have sustained access to fresh, locally grown fruits, vegetables, and other specialty crops and support the region's specialty crop growers to help ensure their long-term success." Through the Specialty Crop Block Grant Program, LDAF will fund five projects. Among LDAF projects, is funding to develop educational programs to help specialty crops farmers meet requirements for Good Agricultural Practices (GAP) food safety certifications. Additional funded projects focus in areas such as youth agricultural education and research.

"Specialty crops play an important role in Louisiana's agricultural landscape and there is plenty of room to grow as the demand for locally grown food increases. These funds will allow new and unique opportunities for Louisiana farm families, all while enhancing the competitiveness of our specialty crops," said the Louisiana Department of Agriculture and Forestry Commissioner Mike Strain, DVM. "These grants provide funding for research to enhance the quality and quantity of specialty crops and to develop new marketing opportunities. The department looks forward to implementing this program, which not only benefits specialty crop producers but consumers as well."

The funding to Louisiana is part of a total of \$72.9 million in non-competitive FY 2024 funding awarded to 54 states, territories, and the District of Columbia through the Specialty Crop Block Grant Program. The funding supports farmers growing specialty crops, including fruits, vegetables, tree nuts, and nursery crops. USDA's support will strengthen U.S. specialty crop production, expand markets, and ensure an abundant, affordable supply of highly nutritious fruits, vegetables, and other specialty crops is available to all Americans.

### **CRCL's oyster shell recycling program**

The Coalition to Restore Coastal Louisiana (CRCL) after operating in New Orleans for 10 years, has expanded its oyster shell recycling program to Baton Rouge. This initiative aims to combat coastal erosion by using recycled oyster shells to rebuild and strengthen Louisiana's fragile coastlines. Spokesperson James Karst says oyster shells are a critical component in creating new oyster reefs, which act as natural barriers against storm surges and help restore marine habitats.

"Oysters that were pulled out the water in Louisiana were being sent to landfills instead of put back in the water where they do a lot of good."

CRCL's program has recycled more than 14-million-pounds of used oyster shells from restaurants, cleans them, and returns them to the water to form new reefs. Karst says the expansion to Baton Rouge allows more restaurants and residents to participate in the program, further increasing the supply of shells for coastal restoration projects. "We work with about 30 restaurants in New Orleans right now, and starting very soon, staring I think the first pick up day is September fourth we'll be expanding to Baton Rouge."

The expansion to Baton Rouge marks a significant step in scaling up the program to preserve its coastline for future generations. Karst says this initiative is crucial for Louisiana, where the coastline is rapidly disappearing due to erosion, and the impact of hurricanes.

"This shell that would have otherwise gone to a landfill where it was just squandered, but when you put it pack into the water it creates habitat, lowers the rate of erosion, it helps to absorb storm surge during hurricanes. Really a number of good things it does when it goes back in the water."

and you're unsure where to start your planning, take a deep breath and work through the following reminders from LSART.

- Medical records: Be sure that your pet is up to date on all vaccinations, and bring proof of vaccinations and a rabies license with you. If your pet is on medication, bring at least a 2-week supply.
- Identification: Identification of your pet is crucial; the ideal form of ID is a microchip or tattoo. At minimum, your pet should have a collar and tag with her name, your name, and your phone number on it. Photos of your pet that capture identifying features are also a good idea.
- Kennel(s): Bring a kennel to safely contain your pet during travel and while away from home. Your pet's kennel should be large enough for him to stand and turn around.
- Emergency prep list: You need enough pet food for one week, food bowl, water bowl, bottled water, leash, collar, proof of vaccinations, rabies tag, portable kennel, all medications, litter both and litter (for cats), trash bags for stool disposal, newspaper or towels for crate lining, cleaning supplies for waste disposal, heartworm preventative, flea and tick protection.

While most evacuations last only a few days, there are times when you may not be able to return quickly.

Remember, the safest place for your pet is with you. With a little advance forethought and planning, you can ensure that you and your furry friends are safe and prepared if you're faced with an emergency.

# Distributor with ties to Louisiana pleads guilty to mislabeling imported seafood as local

A well-known Mississippi Gulf Coast seafood wholesaler with deep ties to Louisiana restaurants has pleaded guilty to a decadeslong scheme of mislabeling imported seafood as locally sourced premium varieties. Quality Poultry and Seafood Inc. (QPS), the largest seafood distributor on the Mississippi Gulf Coast, and two of its managers admitted to the fraudulent activity in a plea agreement with the U.S. Department of Justice.

For nearly 20 years, QPS and its managers, Todd A. Rosetti and James W. Gunkel, participated in a scheme to deceive customers, including some Louisiana restaurants, by substituting lower-quality frozen seafood imported from overseas for high-grade local species.

According to WBRZ, the mislabeled seafood was sold as a premium local catch to

restaurants and through the company's retail market and café. The company, which boasts a legacy stretching back to 1951, admitted that this fraud persisted from as early as 2002 until November 2019.

As part of the plea deal, Quality Poultry and Seafood agreed to pay \$1 million in forfeitures and a \$150,000 criminal fine. The Department of Justice emphasized the farreaching impact of this scheme, noting that it not only misled consumers but also harmed local fishermen and wholesalers who rely on selling genuinely locally sourced seafood.

"Mislabeling seafood harms local wholesalers and fishermen who compete to sell locally sourced, premium fish in a market unfairly flooded with less expensive fish, frozen and imported from overseas," stated Assistant Attorney General Todd Kim of the Justice Department's Environment and Natural Resources Division. This revelation comes at a time when Louisiana has taken steps to protect its culinary heritage and ensure transparency in the seafood industry. New state laws, passed earlier this year, prohibit misleading descriptions of seafood as "Louisiana-style" or "New Orleans-style" unless all processing is completed locally or within the Gulf region.

The Rosetti family, who have operated Quality Poultry and Seafood for four generations, built their reputation on providing highquality seafood products to the Gulf Coast community. Despite this recent scandal, the company's history is deeply rooted in the region, having grown from a small seafood market in Biloxi, Mississippi, to the largest seafood wholesaler on the Mississippi Gulf Coast. The company, known for its wide range of seafood products and its awardwinning café, has long been a staple in both the local and regional seafood markets.

### USDA updates Farm Loan Programs to increase financial freedom, resilience, and profitability for ag producers

The USDA has announced changes to the Farm Service Agency's (FSA) Farm Loan Programs, **effective Sept. 25, 2024** — changes that are intended to increase opportunities for farmers and ranchers to be financially viable. These improvements, part of the Enhancing Program Access and Delivery for Farm Loans rule, demonstrate USDA's commitment to improving farm profitability through farm loans designed to provide important financing options used by producers to cover operating expenses and purchase land and equipment.

"USDA recognizes that Farm Service Agency's loan making and servicing activities are critical for producers, especially in tough times. Providing borrowers the financial freedom to increase profits, save for longterm needs and make strategic investments is the best way to ensure the nation's farmers and ranchers can build financial equity and resilience," said Zach Ducheneaux, FSA Administrator.


### in the enhancement or expansion of their agricultural operations.

#### Notable policy changes include:

- Establishing a new low-interest installment set-aside program for financially distressed borrowers. Eligible financially distressed borrowers can defer up to one annual loan installment per qualified loan at a reduced interest rate, providing a simpler and expedited option to resolve financial distress in addition to FSA's existing loan servicing programs.
- Providing all eligible loan applicants access to flexible repayment terms that can increase profitability and help build working capital reserves and savings. By creating upfront positive cash flow, borrowers can find opportunities in their farm operating plan budgets to include a reasonable margin for increased working capital reserves and savings, including for retirement and education.
- Reducing additional loan security requirements to enable borrowers to leverage equity. This reduces the amount of additional security required for direct farm loans, including reducing the frequency borrowers must use their personal residence as additional collateral for a farm loan.

USDA encourages producers to reach out to their local FSA farm loan staff to ensure they fully understand the wide range of loan and servicing options available to assist with starting, expanding, or maintaining their agricultural operation. ### LFA discusses future, recovery after devastating 2023 wildfires

The Louisiana Forestry Association is hosting its annual convention around a year after the state saw unprecedented damage from several wildfires, including one here in Southwest Louisiana known as the Tiger Island Fire.

"One of our worst fire seasons of recorded history. Over 68,000 acres of very prime commercial land was destroyed," Louisiana Forestry Executive Director Buck Vandersteen said.

Along with discussing last year's wildfires, those attending hope to address other issues in the forestry industry, share ideas, and look at changes they can make to help preserve our forests.

"This is a gathering of landowners, loggers, and the forest industry to talk about issues that are helping us grow from here to be a greater contributor to the Louisiana economy and nation economy and local communities," Vandersteen said.

The thousands of acres burned had a major impact on the landowners, but there are plans to help with recovery.

"Part of our convention here is talking about reforestation and making sure all those areas are replanted, helping landowners with financial assistance to get those areas that have burned on the ground and planting a new crop of trees that will be good in 15 or so years," Vandersteen said.

There are approximately 15 million acres of forest in the state, contributing \$13 billion to the state's economy each year.

### St. Landry Parish man arrested for felony theft

On August 22, 2024, inspectors with the Louisiana Department of Agriculture and Forestry (LDAF) Livestock Brand Commission (LBC) arrested Lester R. Johnson, Jr. of Opelousas for felony theft.

Prior to the arrest, an LBC investigation determined that in November of 2023, 32-year-old Johnson fraudulently bid on and was the high bidder on one head of livestock at a local livestock market. The investigation further revealed that Johnson had intentionally bid on the livestock to raise the price substantially above market value. When Johnson failed to retrieve and pay for the livestock within the 10-day period (outlined in LA R.S. 14:67.1), the market was deprived of the proceeds from the sale, which has an estimated value of \$1,400. The bond was not set at the time of the arrest. If convicted, the suspect faces possible fines and jail time.

St. Landry Parish Sheriff's Office assisted the Livestock Brand Commission in this investigation.

The Livestock Brand Commission maintains a 24-hour Crimestoppers Hotline at (800) 558-9741 for the public to report thefts or other agriculture-related crimes. All persons accused of crimes are considered innocent until proven guilty in a court of law.

### **AF WS** Logging equipment set ablaze in Vernon Parish woods, LDAF seeking information

On the night of August 24, Vernon Parish volunteer fire departments and Louisiana Department of Agriculture and Forestry (LDAF) fire crews were dispatched to the area off Highway 465 north of Simpson. Investigators say that on August 23, after the logging crew left for work, several pieces of logging equipment and timber caught fire.



The fire destroyed one skidder and damaged another skidder and loader, with a total value of over \$500,000. (*See photos* below.)

Investigators with LDAF's Enforcement Division determined this wildfire to have been caused by arson. LDAF investigators and Vernon Parish sheriff's detectives are actively investigating this matter.
