

EVERY DOG HAS HIS DAY AT LE CHIEN BREWING CO.

In the latest episode of CRAWFISH TALES WITH COMMISSIONER MIKE STRAIN, DVM, we visited Certified Louisiana member Le Chien Brewing Company, a homegrown microbrewery and restaurant serving up good times in Denham Springs, LA.

They say you can't teach an old dog new tricks. But Ron and Brett Dunham, the father-son team behind Le Chien's success, know otherwise. They credit the business's origin as a homebrew kit Ron received as a Father's Day gift. That kit sat in the shop for a year, but once they pulled it out, they never stopped brewing and learning. Through trial and error and relationships formed in local homebrew clubs, they've come a long way, having recently completed two years at their family and dog-friendly operation in Denham Springs' Antique District.

Le Chien Brewing Company sits on the site of an old oil change facility, making for a unique experience. Through the floor grates in the main sitting area, you can see the brewing tanks in the pit below. In addition to indoor seating at the serving bar, most folks enjoy the huge, covered patio filled with picnic tables and plenty of wagging tails.

As self-professed dog people, Ron and Brett wanted to create an environment that welcomed four-legged friends. "When we started brewing, our dogs were always laying around, hanging out, and stealing any grain we dropped," says Ron. "And brewing communities always seem to have dogs. When we started the restaurant and brewery,

we wanted a large patio so folks could bring

their dogs."



Thus, Le Chien, which means 'dog' in French, was born. In fact, you'll find some doggone fun names among many of their brews. For example, Tailwagger is their main staple, a Belgian Wit. There's also Unleashed, a New England IPA, and Puppy Love, a Belgian Pale Ale. They even make beers called Double Dog Dare and Hair of the Dog.

Microbrewing is both an art and a science, and the Dunhams have embraced the process. Le Chien strives to serve the best handcrafted products possible. All of their beer is made in-house, and they source locally whenever possible. Typically, you'll find up to 15 beers on tap at any given time. And there's even a 16th tap for a cold brew locally roasted in Baton Rouge.

Le Chien's ever-evolving line-up offers everything from super light to heavy, dark beers, with some barrelaged brews also thrown in. Take We Bee Buzzin, a stripped-down American lager made with honey; it's crisp and easy to drink. Contrast that with something like a Chocolate Chipotle Stout, a The King (a peanut butter and banana Hefeweizen), or a Pickle Sour variety. It's all good, all fun, and all delicious.

Increasing Access to Fresh Produce through Louisiana's Healthy Food Retail Program

Earlier this month, we celebrated the grand opening of the new Canseco's Market in Gentilly as part of the Louisiana Healthy Food Retail Initiative Program, which seeks to provide more citizens with access to fresh, affordable Louisiana produce.

With Hope Credit Union and the City of New Orleans, the Louisiana Agricultural Finance Authority (LAFA), housed within the Louisiana Department of Agriculture and Forestry (LDAF), partnered with Canseco Properties in an expansion deal that will continue the access to affordable groceries to underserved Louisiana residents.

Louisiana's Healthy Food Retail Program (HFRP) is an innovative financing program created to award low-interest loans to supermarkets, grocery stores, and other fresh food retailers in low-to-moderate

income areas in parishes affected by Hurricanes Gustav and Ike. These loans enable operators to open, renovate, or

expand retail outlets that sell fresh fruit and vegetables to increase access to affordable healthy foods and promote the sale and consumption of fresh fruits and vegetables, particularly those that are Louisiana grown.

"The LDAF is always excited for the opportunity to bring healthy food options to the people of Louisiana," said LDAF Commissioner Mike Strain, DVM. "Everyone should have access to fresh, healthy food. The LDAF is proud to help make that a reality for communities throughout the state just like this one."

In response to growing evidence that supermarket access reduces the risk of developing diet-related





PECAN CRUSTED FISH

Ingredients:

4 5-ounce fish fillets 1/4 cup Those Nuts! 1/4 cup panko breadcrumbs ½ cup fresh parsley Salt and pepper Butter

Instructions:

Preheat your oven to 400 degrees F. In a food processor, combine Those Nuts!, panko, and parsley and pulse until well chopped and mixed. Season fish with salt and pepper and apply a layer of the crust mixture to the fish, gently pressing it in to help it stick. (If you use too much of the crust mixture, it doesn't work as well.)

Melt some butter in a hot skillet, and sear the fish, crust side down first, until golden brown. Flip and sear the other side. Repeat with each individual filet. Pop the fish in the oven to finish cooking. This will not take long (5 to 7 minutes) but will vary based on how long you seared the filets on the stove-top and your particular oven.

SHRIMP CREOLE

Submitted by SoLa Seasoning

Ingredients:

½ cup vegetable oil

½ cup all-purpose flour

3 cups onions, chopped (approx. 1 large onion)

1 cup bell pepper, chopped

1 cup celery, chopped

2 cloves, garlic, minced

2 tablespoons SoLa Cajun Seasoning (1T. for milder)

1 tablespoon Salt

3 14.5-ounce cans diced tomatoes

2 15-ounce cans tomato sauce

2 cups water

2-3 Bay leaves

3 pounds raw, peeled shrimp

Instructions:

To make a quick roux: Whisk vegetable oil and flour in a heatproof 1- or 2-quart Pyrex measuring bowl. Cover and put in the microwave oven for 5-7 minutes. Check after 4 minutes and stir. Roux should be a dark caramel color when ready. Transfer roux to a large pot on the stove at medium-high temperature. Add onions, bell pepper, celery, garlic and SoLa Cajun Seasoning to the roux and cook until tender but don't brown and stir often. Add the diced tomatoes, tomato sauce. water and bay leaves and cover and simmer on medium-low temperature for 1 hour, stirring occasionally. Add shrimp and cook about 15 min. on med-high temperature.

Note: The Shrimp Creole is really better made the day before serving. If you are making the Creole the day before serving, omit the shrimp, cool and put Creole mixture in the refrigerator, covered. Add shrimp on the day you are serving and follow above directions. Serve over rice. If you like, you may add chopped green onions on top of the Creole.

CAJUN SMOTHERED GREEN BEANS

Submitted by Le Bon Papa Seasonings

Ingredients:

- 8 cups fresh or frozen green beans, if fresh, snip ends and cut into $1\,\%$ inch pieces
- 4 slices smoked bacon, chopped into 2-inch pieces
- 2 tablespoons all-purpose flour
- 3 cups yellow onion, coarsely chopped
- 2 tablespoons garlic, coarsely chopped or smashed
- ½ pound ham, cubed
- 3 cups chicken stock
- 2 % cups white or red potatoes, cut into halves or quarters
- 1 tablespoon creole seasoning
- 1½ teaspoons kosher salt
- 1½ teaspoons ground black pepper

Instructions:

Place the bacon in a cold Dutch oven over medium heat and cook until the fat is rendered, and the bacon is crispy, about 8 minutes. Sear the ham in the bacon grease for 3 to 4 minutes, until starting to brown. Remove the ham from the oven and set aside. Add the flour to the bacon grease and whisk until a light roux develops, about 5 minutes. Add the yellow onion and fry until the onion are starting to clear, about 5 to 6 minutes. Add the garlic, creole seasoning, salt, and pepper. Stir to combine and cook for about 2 minutes. Increase heat to medium-high.

Deglaze the Dutch oven with about ½ cup of stock, making sure to scrape and stir the fond into the roux mixture. Add the green beans and stir to coat the beans with the roux mixture. Cook the green beans, stirring occasionally until just starting to wilt, about 5 minutes. Add the ham back into the Dutch oven and mix well with the beans. Add enough stock to almost cover the beans. Stir to combine. Increase the heat to bring the stock to a boil for about 5 minutes, stirring occasionally. Reduce the heat to a simmer.


Place the lid on the Dutch oven and simmer for about 30 minutes, stirring from time to time so it does not stick. After 30 minutes, mix the potatoes and continue to simmer, covered, for about 15 minutes, stirring occasionally. Remove the cover and continue to simmer for 15 more minutes. Test the potatoes by probing with a wooden skewer or fork. They should be soft, but not falling apart. Taste the green beans, they should be soft and slightly overcooked. Adjust seasonings as needed. Break the bacon into smaller pieces and add back to Dutch oven. Continue to simmer uncovered for a few minutes until the sauce is thickened and reduced.





Sourcing grain and hops from local farmers, they also love playing with ingredients and spices that offer something different, like orange peels and zest, coriander and honey, or hibiscus and herbs from their own flower beds. And they've even managed to find something productive to do with part of their waste stream.

In a nutshell, the beer brewing process involves steeping cracked grain, such as barley, wheat, or oats, to break down their starches into fermentable sugars. Later, hops, flavor-enhancing ingredients, and yeast are added at different stages of fermentation.

At the stage when the sugar is mashed out of the grains, brewers are left with husks, which still contain some sugar and protein. Le Chien sends that byproduct to local cattlemen, who feed it to cows, goats, pigs, and sheep. In fact, they've found that the grains help the animals keep their weight on, especially during the winter. "Cows love it," says Brett. "It's considered waste for us, but it benefits farmers and cows, and we feel good about that."



In addition to the microbrews, Le Chien serves food out of their Pie-Eyed food truck parked on the patio. They specialize in artisan hand pies with a flaky crust and offer both savory and sweet options. In addition to traditional favorites like cheeseburger, pepperoni pizza, or spinach and chicken hand pies, you'll also find seasonal specialties like pumpkin pie and mash-up recipes created with area restaurants. There are also homemade French fries and boudin balls, but this time of year, they're also boiling crawfish. Hot crawfish, cold beer, and fun times with family and friends... it doesn't get much better than that!

Still sporting a Pie-Eyed apron after helping in the food truck kitchen, Commissioner Strain said, "Look, I understand how a hobby can become a major business. As a farmer, a beekeeper, and an antique tractor enthusiast, I feel lucky to love what I do every day, both at work and home. The same goes for the folks at Le Chien. You can see that they love it, which is what the Certified Louisiana family is about. It's fresh, local, and Certified Louisiana."Brett agrees, saying, "Le Chien is home for us... we live and breathe it every day and there's no turning it off. We're always thinking about how to make our customers and employees happy."

Le Chien participates in community events and fundraisers, offers tons of live music and family-friendly events, and even has their own running club. Their beers have developed a loyal fan base, but there are also homemade soft drinks, like root beer and cream soda. After all, they're a family-friendly establishment that loves hanging out with people (and dogs, of course) in a relaxed environment.

"We became Certified because we love Louisiana and what it represents," says





Brett. "We have some of the best food in the world here. And we love to be able to support other local businesses. Being part of a brand like Certified Louisiana that helps with that is cool."

"Brewing is a great culture and a lot of fun," says Ron. "I get to work with my sons and meet wonderful people in the community here. I look forward to coming here every day."

Annual Inspector Training More Than Passes Muster

LDAF's Office of Agricultural and Environmental Sciences (AES) hosted a statewide inspector training event in Opelousas on March 7 and 8. AES field inspection staff are charged with a wide range of responsibilities, including the following important tasks:

- Ensuring that animal feeds, pet foods, fertilizers, agricultural liming materials, and pesticides meet all requirements of the law;
- Monitoring, preventing, controlling, and eradicating plant pests and diseases that threaten Louisiana's agriculture, environment, and economy;
- Facilitating agricultural exports through certification of products;
- Overseeing the qualifications and practices of persons engaged in the green industry;
- Protecting human health and the environment by ensuring the proper labeling, distribution, storage, use, application, and disposal of pesticides and by thorough enforcement of all pesticide laws;
- Ensuring that seed sold for planting meets label guarantees and quality standards; and
- Ensuring a safe, abundant supply of food and fiber.

The training was attended by more than 40 inspectors from all four divisions within AES, which comprises programs in Agricultural Chemistry, Horticulture and Quarantine, Pesticide and Environmental, and Seed. It was a great opportunity for colleagues from across the state, many of whom had never met in person, to come together for two days and learn from and with each other.

All AES programs provided updates in their respective areas, including topics like hemp sampling for THC compliance,





apiary inspections, fertilizer safety, and considerations for legal casework. There were also presentations by industry speakers, as well as hands-on training activities across all programs. Because all AES inspectors are cross-trained, demonstrations and breakout sessions allowed them to learn more about all four program areas. In addition to updates from all AES divisions and industry speakers, the event included AES inspector awards, which Commissioner Mike Strain, DVM, presented.

USDA Encourages Rice Farmers to Prepare for New Production Program

New program makes one-time payment to rice farmers based on 2022 plantings

The USDA previewed plans to provide up to \$250 million in assistance to rice farmers and what steps they can take to be prepared to sign up when the program is released later this spring. USDA is sharing information early so producers can prepare for program signup, which will include a prefilled application in an effort to simplify and streamline the application process.

On Dec. 29, 2022, President Biden signed into law H.R. the Consolidated 2617. Act, Appropriations 2023. which provided the authority and funding for USDA to make payments to rice producers based on data already on file with the USDA, including acres and planted acres prevented from being planted.

What Farmers Can Do Now

The full details of the program and application will not be available until after a Notice Funding Availability

Federal Register.

But there is something farmers can do right now to be better prepared for the signup, if they qualify for a higher payment limitation (see yellow box).

The payment limitation for the program is set by law and is higher if the farmer's average adjusted gross farm income (income from activities related to farming, ranching, or forestry) is more than 75% of their average adjusted gross income (AGI).

Specifically, a person or legal entity with adjusted gross farm income of less than 75% of their overall AGI, cannot receive, directly or indirectly, more than \$125,000 in payments. AGI is based on the three taxable years preceding the most immediately preceding complete tax year. Farmers with 75% or more AGI from farming qualify for a \$250,000 payment limit.

published later this year in the **Planned Application Process**

After the official notice is published later this year, USDA's Farm Service Agency (FSA) plans to mail prefilled applications to producers using information on file with USDA's Management Agency (RMA) or FSA, as reported by rice producers through their crop insurance agents or FSA county office. This streamlined application process will reduce the burden on producers and minimize errors due to manual data entries on the application form. More information will be provided when FSA announces the signup period in the coming weeks.

Program Payments

As directed by the omnibus legislation. FSA will calculate Production Rice Program (RPP) payments by multiplying the payment rate, individual average actual production history (APH), as reported to RMA, or county yield and an amount of certified rice acres determined by the number of planted acres and acres that were prevented from being planted. FSA plans to issue an initial payment to eligible farmers soon after applications are returned and a final payment after the sign-up has closed. Details on these procedures and the initial payment rate will be in the future notice.

Rice farmers can visit their local county office to submit the appropriate form and certification (FSA-510, Request for an Exception to the \$125,000 Payment Limitation for Certain Programs), if they qualify for and want to seek the higher payment limit and get part of the paperwork done early. Farmers will still have a chance to fill out the AGI form during signup as well. The form should be filled out for the 2022 crop year.

USDA Seeks Applications to Expand Conservation Assistance to Underserved Producers



USDA is seeking applications for projects that will improve outreach to underserved producers and underserved communities about conservation programs and services and opportunities for students to pursue careers in agriculture, natural resources and related sciences.

The U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) is seeking applications for projects that will improve outreach to underserved producers and underserved communities about conservation programs and services and opportunities for students to pursue careers in agriculture, natural resources and related sciences. USDA's Natural Resources Conservation Service (NRCS) is offering up to \$70 million in cooperative agreements with entities for two-year projects that encourage participation in NRCS programs, especially in underserved communities and among urban and small-scale producers.

The Equity in Conservation Outreach Cooperative Agreements will include projects that:

- Promote the benefits of NRCS programs through education or demonstration of conservation practices
- Develop community conservation partnerships that engage underserved producers to plan and protect farmland ecosystems, watersheds, and wildlife habitat in underserved communities
- Inform small-scale/urban agriculture producers about opportunities to participate in conservation programs
- Support education on, planning for and adoption of climate smart conservation practices

Projects should reach underserved groups through a combination of program outreach and technical assistance in one or more of the following five NRCS priority areas:

- Addressing local natural resource issues
- Promoting conservation career opportunities
- Expanding adoption of climate-smart conservation
- Encouraging conservation in small-scale and urban agriculture
- Developing conservation leadership skills and opportunities



Program Impacts

The funding opportunity builds on NRCS' FY 2022 investment of \$50 million in more than 100 partnerships to expand access to conservation assistance for climate-smart agriculture and forestry. Work is underway in 44 states and territories.

In the first six months after last year's outreach cooperative agreements were awarded, 85 new outreach partnerships were established, and 32 existing outreach partnerships were built upon. These partnerships include 15 tribal agreements, seven agreements with Historically Black Colleges and Universities and 1890s' Foundation agreements, and two Hispanic Serving Institutions.

As of January 2023, more than 380 outreach events and workshops had been held with over 7,500 people attending, and more than 14,000 people had been reached by awardee outreach.

Early success stories

Limestone Valley Resource Conservation District has involved over 500 students at Park Creek Elementary School in a new school garden and nature center. A group of 13 local partners, including the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service, are helping to expand garden activities to include a habitat focus, including providing habitat for local threatened and endangered species.

The Center for Rural Affairs received 22 applications for first round of their Beginning Farmer Conservation Fellows program and curriculum for the program has been developed.

The University of Arizona has increased staff and satellite colleges in the Yuma, Arizona and Imperial Valley, California area, which serve many immigrant farming families, to provide services and information physically closer to these communities.

Who Is Eligible

Entities and individuals who provide outreach assistance to underserved groups are eligible. Eligible entities include:


- Native American tribal governments (Federally recognized)
- Native American tribal governments (State recognized)
- Native American tribal organizations
- Nonprofits having a 501(c)(3) status with the IRS (other than institutions of higher education)
- Nonprofits that do not have a 501(c)(3) status with the IRS (other than institutions of higher education)
- Nonprofit private institutions of higher education
- Public and state-controlled institutions of higher education
- Conservation districts

Underserved producers include beginning, limited resource, socially disadvantaged, and veteran farmers and ranchers, as well as other underrepresented or disadvantaged communities.

Missouri Man Arrested for Livestock Theft in Allen Parish

On March 14, 2023, a Missouri man was arrested for theft of livestock in Allen Parish by the Rural Crimes Investigative Unit of the Missouri State Highway Patrol. The arrest was made on a warrant following an investigation conducted by the Louisiana Department of Agriculture and Forestry (LDAF)'s Livestock Brand Commission.

Sixty-five-year-old Bobbie G. Smith, also known as Bob Smith, of Thayer, MO, was arrested in Thayer for three counts of livestock theft on a warrant obtained in Louisiana by LDAF Brand Inspectors.

An investigation by LDAF's Brand Commission determined that Smith received livestock on three occasions for a total of 70 head and allegedly failed to render proper payment to a local livestock market as required by law. The alleged theft occurred during November and December of 2022.

"Louisiana's livestock industry contributes significantly to the state's economy," said LDAF Commissioner Mike Strain, D.V.M., "To protect producers' property, LDAF's Livestock Brand Commission inspectors investigate all aspects of farm-related crimes in the state, even when the alleged offender lives outside of Louisiana."

The Livestock Brand Commission was assisted in this investigation by criminal investigators with the Missouri State Highway Patrol/Rural Crimes Investigative Unit and the 33rd Judicial District Attorney's Office.

At this time, extradition to Louisiana is pending. All persons accused of any crime are considered innocent until proven guilty in a court of law.


Utilize outreach efforts to increase awareness of soil health, sustainable agricultural practices and best forestry management conservation. Increase participation in NRCS programs and services by socially disadvantaged, historically underserved, limited resource, women, veterans and beginning farmers and ranchers in Louisiana through such methods as described below:

Conducting Conferences, Urban Ag Workshops, Joint USDA Outreach Meetings, Women in Ag Conferences, Farmers Cooperatives Workshops, Regional Summits, Conservation Demonstration Tours, Establishment of School and Community Gardens to function as a living classroom for targeted audiences, engaging youth and community stakeholders in the implementation and maintenance of a walking trail and wetland park within a defined geographical area. Partners will have the ability to host meetings and events virtually utilizing methods such as Facebook Live, Zoom, YouTube, Video blogs, etc.

Use of drones to capture aerial photos and videos of special NRCS projects to be used by outreach and public affairs to promote NRCS programs and objectives.

• Work may include taking aerial photos/videos with unmanned aircraft systems (UASs). All UASs must be registered with the Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) and marked in accordance with 14 CFR Part 45. An FAA-issued certificate of authorization (COA) is required for all UAS operations within the National Airspace System (NAS). If the Contractor has a section-333 exemption, operates under part 107 rules, or other FAA authorization, those may be used instead of a COA. A complete COA package includes, but is not limited to, the operational plan, project aviation safety plan, risk assessment, airworthiness, airspace, pilot qualifications, frequencies, and communication plan. All COAs are developed and submitted using the COA online system (https://ioeaaa.faa.gov). The Contractor will be responsible for obtaining the COA and all reporting and coordination with the FAA. (Additional quidelines apply.)

The five-acre farm on Inglewood plantation serves as an experimental area for research and development. In 2022 their No-Till dryland (SRI) rice trials had, fewer diseases, a shorter crop cycle, and an average of 91% higher yields compared to their other trials.
