You'll also find monthly growing guides from the LSU AgCenter with tips on bedding plants, lawns, ornamental trees, citrus/fruit trees, shrubs, pruning, vegetables, or specific plants like blackberries and Louisiana vegetables. Whether it's on their website or through in-person, friendly service, you're sure to find the tools and information to succeed in your growing endeavors.

Jessica's parents had owned garden centers in New Orleans East for several decades, so she grew up in the industry. In fact, she helped build many of the greenhouses on the current property. After a stint in Corporate America, she returned to her roots and said, "Coming back to plants was the best thing I ever did." Jessica's passion for what she does is palpable, and it's clearly played a part in why their retail business has flourished.

Aside from their gorgeous plants, some of that success is due to the relaxed, welcoming vibe you'll find at Gene's. There's so much room to browse, relax, and get comfortable, exactly what Jessica wants her customers to do.

COMMISSIONER'S CORNER

RFSI application period: February 7 - April 15

Starting February 7, LDAF will begin accepting grant applications for the Resilient Food Systems Infrastructure program (RFSI). In partnership with the U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) these funding awards are intended for equipment and infrastructure projects to Louisiana food and

nfrastructure projects to Louisiana food and farm businesses and other eligible entities including nonprofits, local government entities, tribal governments, schools, and hospitals. The deadline to submit applications is April 15, 2024.

The RFSI program aims to build resilience in the middle-of-the-food-supply-chain, provide more and better markets to small farms and food businesses, and support the development of value-added products for consumers, fair prices, fair wages, and new and safe job

opportunities. RFSI will serve as an important component of USDA's framework to transform the food system to benefit consumers, producers, and rural communities by providing more options, increasing access, and creating new, more, and better markets for small and mid-size producers.

"There are many people and steps needed to bring locally produced food to our tables. The RFSI grants will help fund those in our local supply chain that process, transport, and distribute our food," remarked LDAF Commissioner Mike Strain. "This funding will create new opportunities, strengthen markets for local farmers, and increase stability for consumers. We look forward to seeing all of the great projects that come out of this partnership with USDA."

Through the cooperative agreement, LDAF will coordinate initiatives to build resilience across





SEAFOOD STUFFED POTATO WITH CRAWFISH SAUCE

Submitted by Slap Ya Mama

Ingredients:

Potato and stuffing:

4 large potatoes

½ pound medium shrimp, peeled and deveined, leaving tail meat

8 ounces Italian 6 cheese blend, shredded

2 tablespoons cooking oil

Olive oil

Slap Ya Mama Original Blend Cajun Seasoning, to taste

Sherry cream sauce:

2 tablespoons unsalted butter

2 large garlic cloves, minced

2 medium shallots, diced

¼ cup brandy, flambéed (ignite) is optional

2 cups sherry wine

1 cup shrimp stock

1/4 cup crawfish juice, drained from crawfish packaging

1 cup heavy whipping cream

½ cup crawfish tail meat

½ cup green onions, sliced for garnish

Instructions:

Potato and stuffing: Rub baked potatoes lightly with olive oil and season with salt if desired. Wrap each potato with aluminum foil and bake in a pre-heated oven at 400°F until the potato is tender to the touch and you can stick a toothpick through it with no problem. This should take about 1 hour and 20 minutes. Remove potatoes from oven and let sit for 30 minutes before removing the foil. Peel shrimp, leaving tail on, and place in a small bowl, set shells aside for stock. Season shrimp to taste with Slap Ya Mama Original Blend Cajun Seasoning and let rest for 10 minutes. Meanwhile, add 4 cups of water and shrimp shells into a medium-sized pot over medium heat and allow the stock to simmer until you have reduced the liquid by half. Set aside.

Note: For more flavor in your stock, you can add a chicken bouillon cube or 2 teaspoons of Slap Ya Mama Original Blend Cajun Seasoning. In a medium-sized skillet over medium-high heat, add cooking oil. Heat oil until hot; add shrimp and sauté until pink all the way through. About 2 to 3 minutes on each side, making sure you are turning the shrimp so it cooks evenly on all sides. When done set aside in a bowl and let cool for easy handling. Slice the potato along the middle; be sure not to cut in half. Using a spoon create a pocket in the potato. Add about 4 to 5 crawfish to each potato and divide the shrimp amongst potatoes, leaving the tail of the shrimp hanging out. Place potatoes on a baking sheet and set aside.

Sherry cream sauce: Preheat oven to 400°F. In a saucepan over medium-high heat, add 1 tablespoon of butter, garlic and shallots. Sauté lightly for about 2 minutes; add brandy and flambé (ignite), stirring constantly. Add the wine, shrimp stock, and crawfish juice and reduce by half. Add heavy whipping cream and continue cooking. When the sauce is at a smooth consistency, stir in remaining butter and mix well. Add remaining crawfish tail meat and cook for another 2 minutes. (The sauce should have the consistency of alfredo sauce.)

Hint: If sauce is too thick, thin it out with a little chicken broth. If sauce is too runny, thicken it by adding more heavy whipping cream until the desired consistency is reached.

Spoon some of the sauce over each potato then top with the cheese. Bake the potatoes in the oven at 400 degrees F for about 6 to 8 minutes or until the cheese is golden brown. Divide the sauce amongst 4 plates, spooning it directly onto the middle of the plate. Add the baked potato to the center of the plate then spoon a generous amount of sauce over each potato and garnish with the green onions. Enjoy!

Instructions:

Preheat oven to 350°F. Prepare purchased crust or roll out pastry for Single-Crust Pie and line a 9-inch pie plate with the pastry. Trim; crimp edge as desired. For filling, combine eggs, corn syrup, sugar, butter, and vanilla. Mix well. Stir in pecan halves. Pour the filling into the pastry shell and place in preheated oven. To prevent over-browning, cover the edge of the pie with foil. Bake for about 45 minutes. Remove foil and bake longer if needed. Pie is ready when a knife inserted near the center comes out clean, or when the pie only slightly "jiggles" when you remove from oven. It will set (get harder/thicker) as it cools. Cool on a wire rack.

Prepare, stay safe in freezing temps

With temperatures still dipping near or below freezing in many parts of the state this winter, LDAF Commissioner Mike Strain. D.V.M., continues to urge livestock and pet owners to take necessary precautions to protect their animals. This is also the time to protect plants, pipes, and, of course, people.

"When we see temperatures start to dip below freezing, it is important to take precautionary measures safely and correctly. For example, while antifreeze is commonly used not many people realize the risk it can pose to our pets. Dogs and cats will drink it if it is left out as it tastes sweet; however, it is highly toxic to them. If you drain any of the fluid from your tractor in preparation for the weather, be sure to dispose of it properly." said Strain. Here are some cold weather tips for livestock, pet, and plant owners:

Livestock

- Owners should check their livestock and look for signs of stress, illness, or injury.
- Pay close attention to young and older animals as they are more susceptible to problems during frigid conditions.
- Provide plenty of hay, feed, energy supplements, and water; check water troughs as they can ice over.
- If possible, make adequate shelter available. Even a wind-break will minimize exposure to cold winds.

Companion animals

If possible, keep all companion animals indoors. If this is not an option, make

sure there is a dry shelter available and have warm blankets for your pet.

- Provide adequate food and water. Monitor water bowls as they can freeze during cold weather.
- Consider a sweater for short-haired dogs.
- Outdoor cats searching for warmth will sometimes crawl underneath the hood of a vehicle. Bang on or open the hood of your car so any animal in there trying to stay warm can get out before you crank up that engine. Cats can be injured or even killed when the car is started.

Plants

- Move all plants in containers and hanging baskets inside. If this is not possible, group them in a protected area and cover them with plastic; larger plants can be covered with fabric or plastic.
- Thoroughly water plants if the soil is dry.
- For plants growing in the ground, mulch them with dry material such as pine straw and leaves

"Mulch should be two to four inches thick. Spreading it too thick can cause roots to grow shallow and make them more susceptible to death during extended dry periods. The mulch should extend a couple of inches from the base of the plant and be higher on the outside edges to help insulate the plant as well as hold and distribute water," said Strain. Baled hay & the imported fire ant

If you buy, sell, or produce baled hay, check out USDA's factsheet titled "Questions and Answers: Moving Baled Hay From Areas Under Quarantine for Imported Fire Ant." This publication contains useful information for farmers, ranchers, hay growers, and suppliers as they respond to livestock needs in drought-hit states while guarding against the further spread of the imported fire ant.

Imported fire ants can harm agriculture and injure animals and people with their painful stings and venom. These invasive pests can move to new, non-infested areas by hitchhiking on agricultural commodities, including baled hay. These ants will feed on the buds and fruits of numerous crop plants, especially corn, soybean, okra, and citrus. They can also girdle young trees. Large nests located in fields interfere with and damage equipment during cultivation and harvesting. Imported fire ants respond rapidly and aggressively to disturbances, and ant attacks inhibit field-worker activities. A single fire ant can sting its target repeatedly. Young and newborn animals are especially susceptible to the venom of these stings.

Best agriculture apps for 2024 By Matt Hopkins, CropLife.com

Artificial Intelligence (AI) in agriculture is booming. Just consider how spending on AI technologies and solutions alone is expected to grow from \$1.7 billion in 2023 to \$4.7 billion in 2028, according to Markets&Markets. That's some serious financial horsepower fueling innovation from leading agricultural companies, as well as the nearly 300 AI-based agricultural startups in the U.S., according to recent analysis.

The AI explosion in agriculture is impacting mobile app development, too, especially as it relates to data. Specifically, AI is allowing apps to work with much larger datasets for analysis, says Reinder Prins, Marketing Lead at Leaf Agriculture, which focuses on data infrastructure in agriculture through API services that are used to power many agtech apps.

"Without AI, the number of data points that can be used by an app while keeping a good user experience is relatively limited," Prins says. "With AI, the number of different data points that can be connected and analyzed at the same time is much larger. This allows for new and novel mobile apps to be developed with features that cannot be created without AI. Especially for the large number of IOT infield sensors now available, being able to tie all the different data points together to form robust analysis is key."

The fusion of AI with mobile app development has ushered in a new era of efficiency and data-centric practices in the agricultural sector. This is playing out, according to industry experts, in a number of different ways, including:

 Precision agriculture: Al enables apps to offer real-time data analysis, helping farmers optimize resource usage like water, fertilizers, and pesticides for higher yields and reduced costs.

With the Aeroview InField app from Aerobotics, farmers gain insights from high-res drone data, leading them directly to stressed trees on the farm to identify, manage, and take action against pest and disease threats


- Crop monitoring / pest and disease detection: Al-driven mobile apps have the capability to identify potential issues such as pest infestations, diseases, or nutrient deficiencies at an early stage. They analyze data from diverse sources like satellite imagery and sensors to provide timely alerts to farmers and suggest interventions.
- weather predictions: Al-powered weather forecasting apps provide accurate, location-specific data, helping farmers make informed decisions regarding planting, harvesting, and irrigation.
- Market insights: Al assists in market analysis, helping farmers make informed decisions on when and where to sell their products for the best prices.
- Data integration: Al streamlines data from various sources, such as sensors, drones, and IoT devices, into a single app, providing a holistic view of farm operations.

While these enhancements are impressive on their own, they're likely just scratching the surface when it comes to what's possible with AI and mobile apps in agriculture.

Key trends to watch in 2024

Sustainability is one area that will continue to benefit from Al-powered mobile apps, says Lior Goren Ruck, Vice President of Products at Prospera, which offers the Insights by Prospera mobile app.

"Sustainable farming practices are increasingly important," she says. "Al will help by optimizing resource use and minimizing environmental impact. Mobile apps will incorporate Al to guide farmers on sustainable practices, such as reduced chemical usage, water conservation, and soil health management."



Agmatix allows researchers, agronomists, and farmers to simplify trial data collection straight from the field. Additionally, it can connect users to local trial coordinators with the benefit of viewing trials completed or ongoing near you.

Smart spraying will further the sustainability efforts in agriculture, adds Selin Erkök, Marketing Director at agtech startup Doktar, which leverages Al in several of its mobile apps. "Al significantly contributes to the optimization of pesticide utilization by ensuring precise application, which in turn mitigates waste and minimizes the environmental footprint," she says.

Al's ability to scale data standardization will also become increasingly important in 2024 and beyond.

"I think that gathering more standardized and accurate data will be an even higher priority for app developers in 2024 in order to keep improving the role of AI in agriculture," says Leaf's Prins. "Every AI model requires data to operate, and the more data available, the better potential analysis and results become."

Mobile apps that use constant AI learning, based on constantly gathered data, will start to have an even bigger impact in 2024, Prins says. "In-field operations such as planting, spraying, and harvesting require the operators to constantly make adjustments, such as adjusting gauge-wheel depth, increasing fan speed, lowering a boom, and increasing droplet size," he says. "Al models that learn constantly and that can access a huge database of images as examples, will be able to learn which conditions and which results relate to certain adjustments that can or should be made to a machine. Apps that offer this information will be invaluable to growers who have been battling to get enough qualified staff to operate their machines."

Erkök also sees the agriculture sector experiencing a notable expansion in data collection, automation, and crop health monitoring through mobile apps in 2024. "The rising digitalization within this sector will generate a wealth of data encompassing





a wide range of farming activities," she says. "Al-powered mobile apps will play a pivotal role in standardizing field data collection, thereby ensuring data consistency and reliability.

"This standardization will significantly enhance the accuracy and quality of insights delivered to farmers. Furthermore, these Aldriven mobile apps will enable continuous monitoring of crop health, diminishing the necessity for manual oversight and supplying invaluable data that aids in maintaining optimal crop health."

Al-powered mobile apps will also continue to play a pivotal role in precision agriculture

in 2024, says Prospera's Goren Ruck. "These apps will likely offer more advanced predictive analytics, enabling farmers to make datadriven decisions on resource allocation, crop management, and pest control," she says.



BASIC PLANT CARE TIPS FOR BEGINNERS

Water

Your water load will depend on the plant. Watering can be done as a quick fiveminute process or through a saturated watering process, and there are benefits to both. Make your decision based on your reality. Five-minute watering is best for those who are daily waterers or those who tend to be home often and operate in a daily routine. This method involves watering with half to a full cup of water once a day. Saturation watering ensures thorough watering for the plant, allowing you not to water for 5-14 days. Saturation watering is best for those on the move without time or a routine that allows for daily watering.

Pot size

While most of our plants are good to be in the pot acquired in, several plants need to size up after a few months or even years later. When selecting pots, consider if the plant is an indoor plant versus an outdoor plant. Porous or rough pots are best outside as they tend to hold moisture, and we do not want that moisture on your flooring or furniture. Glazed or ceramic pots are great for indoor use and typically do not hold up well during repeated winter freezing and thawing.

Traditionally, it's suggested to size up only 2 inches from the existing pot size at a time. For example, if the plant is in a 4-inch pot, a 6-inch pot is the next choice. However, when sizing up larger items, such as a 3-gallon plant, we size up by 2 gallons into a 5-gallon pot.

Fertilizer & nutrients

Fertilizers and nutrients are needed for all plants in the ground and pots. In pots, we need to 'feed' the plants more often due to nutrient runoff. In-ground plants need fewer applications of fertilizers as the ground will hold the fertilizer nearby with no issue.

We suggest a standard of 2 fertilizations a year. Aim for around Valentine's Day (February) and July 4th (July/August). Some plants, such as roses, are heavy feeders and can take up to 6 feedings a year. Using an all-purpose fertilizer is what we call just getting by; you should aim for fertilizer specifically for the plants/type you have. Use rose fertilizer for roses, evergreen/tree fertilizers for most all outdoor bushes & trees, and fruit/citrus fertilizer for fruit, citrus, and nut trees.

Houseplant food, which is mainly for nonflowering plants, can be used as a general food for all indoor plants.



"This program assists with the return of saddles in the event they are stolen. We've had great success with the program thus far, chipping hundreds of saddles. We are proud to be able to bring this service to our equine community."
