

COMMISSIONER'S COMMENTS: LOOKING AHEAD AT 2024

Merry Christmas, everybody. It has been a wonderful year with some major challenges as well. With devastating events like the historic wildfires and drought, we've weathered our fair share of storms, but amazingly, none of them were hurricanes this year.

The holiday season is a great time to reflect, not just on the past year, but on our many blessings. I'm so grateful for my family, friends, and the opportunity to serve the people of Louisiana.

As you probably know, this year I was reelected to a fifth term as Commissioner of the Louisiana Department of Agriculture and Forestry. Thank you for entrusting me to lead the department for another four years. I'm so proud of my hardworking staff, the boots on the ground who serve and protect the people of Louisiana each and every day of the year.

Looking forward to 2024, I see the agency continuing to modernize. We'll be working very hard with all of our people and technology to make everything we touch more user-friendly, like we recently did with the LDAF website.

We're also going to be working to get new and better equipment for the Office of Forestry. We're very excited about the additional 20 fire units already coming in, and we'll be asking for additional units as well. As we learned this year, we have to be fully prepared to hold the line, whatever that line is, for however long it takes before assistance from other government agencies or teams come in. Our crews did very well this year, but it was a very difficult battle. So we're continuing to learn what we can do to be better, more efficient. Getting more and better equipment is just one step in that direction.

Adapting to issues that we face is so important. Certainly one of those challenges is the unpredictability of the weather. We don't know what it's going to

do. Hopefully, we'll start getting some more moisture beginning February and March. Watching the patterns and dealing with the weather is a major thing we'll be looking at.

We're also looking forward to a very exciting year with a new legislature, a new governor, and a number of new statewide officials. No doubt we'll be busy dealing with good bills and bad bills as we learn to work in tandem for the good of the state and its people.

Regarding commodities, I think you're going to see an uptick in rice. We may see more soybean acres, an increase in rice's value, and a strong year for sugar.

Speaking of Louisiana goods, I am confident that we'll continue to grow our Certified Louisiana program, which is now over 600 members strong, offering a wide variety of unique and fresh Louisiana products, locally grown and crafted, including Louisiana seafood. You know, buying fresh Certified Louisiana products is how we grow a local food economy. It takes all of us, the producers and the consumers. And that's going to be a big push for next year.

2024 should bring a very robust market for all of the commodities. As we have seen, production is falling behind consumption for many commodities. So, I think we will continue to see a brisk challenge to feed the world. Places like Louisiana, where the good things greaux, is big part of that equation.

There's going to be a big push coming from the USDA and from Louisiana on trade. For one, we're going back to Cuba to see what we can do to further open up those markets. The world desperately needs the products that we have here, and expansion of trade opportunities will continue. I think there will be a big push by SUSTA and AMS to to look at new and untapped markets, such as in Africa and other areas where we have not traditionally gone to sell products. There's great potential there.

Back in the U.S., recent numbers show that more than 50% of people under 30 are now living back at home. That's economics. And then you look at the growing trend of people







PALEO SHRIMP AND SAUSAGE **SKILLET**

½ 12-ounce package of Richard's Pork Smoked Sausage, sliced 1 pound of medium or large shrimp, peeled and deveined 34 cup red bell pepper, diced 34 cup green bell pepper, diced ½ of a medium yellow onion, diced ¼ cup chicken stock 1 zucchini, chopped 2 garlic cloves, diced Salt & pepper to taste Red pepper flakes 2 teaspoons Old Bay Seasoning Olive oil or coconut oil

Instructions:

Parsley, chopped (optional)

Heat a large skillet over medium-high heat with some olive oil or coconut oil. Season shrimp with Old Bay Seasoning. Cook shrimp about 3-4 minutes until opaque, remove and set aside. Cook onions and bell peppers in skillet with 2 tablespoons of olive oil or coconut oil for about 2 minutes. Add Richard's Smoked Sausage and zucchini to the skillet, cook another 2 minutes. Put cooked shrimp back into skillet along with the garlic, and cook everything for about 1 minute. Pour chicken stock into pan and mix through to moisten everything. SWEET AND SPICY CHILI

Submitted by Kjun Bees

Ingredients:

1½ pounds ground rabbit

½ tablespoon course ground black pepper

1 teaspoon Cajun seasoning

34 cup onions, chopped

¾ cup celery, chopped

²/₃ cup green bell peppers, chopped

1¾ tablespoons garlic, minced

114.5 ounce can petite diced tomatoes

2 8-ounce cans tomato sauce

2 cups beef broth

2 15.5-ounce cans dark red kidney beans

1/4 cup and 2 tablespoons mild KJUN honey

1½ tablespoon chili powder (see notes below)

34 teaspoon red pepper flakes

Instructions:

Add the ground rabbit, black pepper, and Cajun seasonings to a large skillet over medium heat. Brown the meat until fully cooked. Add the onions, celery, and green peppers. Continue to cook over medium heat until onions are soft and clear. Add the minced garlic and cook until softened and slightly roasted. Add the diced tomatoes, tomato sauce, beef broth, and kidney beans. Stir and cook over medium-low heat until warm. Drizzle the honey, chili powder, and pepper flakes onto the chili. Stir thoroughly to mix. Simmer over mediumlow heat and stir frequently for approximately 45 minutes until slightly thickened. Serve warm over rice. Add shredded cheese and crackers, if desired.

Notes: Using a mild-flavored honey like KJUN "blue dot" honey from Tangipahoa Parish in southeast Louisiana produces the best results for a pleasantly sweet chili. If using a stronger flavored honey (like our Terrebonne Parish honey), reduce the honey to just ¼ cup. If unsure, add ¼ cup of honey and taste your chili before adding the additional 2 tablespoons. Jean Pierre Season-All is a good Cajun seasoning for this recipe because it has a low salt taste. However, any generic season salt is likely to produce a good flavor for this chili. For a spicier chili, add additional red pepper flakes to taste. We recommend Bueno Foods New Mexico Premium Special Reserve Chili Powder, but any great flavored chili powder will work in this recipe.

Substitutions: Although ground rabbit produces the best tasting chili — especially when combined with honey ground deer or beef is a suitable substitute once drained of excess fat.

For a unique alternative, try altering the recipe to use ground chicken or turkey, ground white pepper, chicken broth, and white kidney beans!



USDA reminds specialty crop growers of January 31 application deadline

Assistance for on-farm food safety expenses

The U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) reminds specialty crop growers that assistance is available for producers who incur eligible on-farm food safety program expenses to obtain or renew a food safety certification through the Food Safety Certification for Specialty Crops (FSCSC) program. Producers can apply for assistance on their calendar year 2023 expenses through Jan. 31, 2024.

"The Food Safety Certification for Specialty Crops program is just one of the many ways USDA is helping support local and regional food systems and opportunities for small-scale producers," said Farm Service Agency (FSA) Administrator Zach Ducheneaux. "I'm encouraging specialty crop growers to discover how this program can help mitigate the costs of on-farm food safety certification and meeting regulatory requirements and apply by the January deadline."

Program details

FSCSC assists specialty crop operations that incurred eligible on-farm food safety certification and related expenses pertaining to obtaining or renewing a food safety certification in calendar year 2023. FSCSC covers a percentage of the specialty crop operation's cost of obtaining or renewing its certification, as well as a portion of related expenses.

To be eligible for FSCSC, the applicant must be a specialty crop operation; meet the definition of a small business or very small business; and have paid eligible expenses related to the 2023 certification.

Specialty crop operations may receive assistance for the following costs:

- Developing a food safety plan for first-time food safety certification
- Maintaining or updating an existing food safety plan
- Food safety certification
- · Certification upload fees

- Microbiological testing for products, soil amendments and water
- Training

FSCSC payments are calculated separately for each category of eligible costs. A higher payment rate has been set for socially disadvantaged, limited resource, beginning and veteran farmers and ranchers. Details about the payment rates and limitations can be found at farmers.gov/food-safety.

Applying for assistance

The FSCSC application period for 2023 closes Jan. 31, 2024. FSA will issue payments after the application period closes. If calculated payments exceed the amount of available funding, payments will be prorated.

Interested specialty crop producers can apply by completing the FSA-888, Food Safety Certification for Specialty Crops Program (FSCSC) application. The application, along with other required documents, can be submitted to the FSA office at any USDA Service Center nationwide by mail, fax, hand delivery or via electronic means.

Specialty crop producers can also call 877-508-8364 to speak directly with a USDA employee ready to assist. Visit **farmers.gov/food-safety** for additional program details, eligibility information and forms needed to apply.

USDA surveying cattle, sheep, and goat operations

In January, U.S. Department of Agriculture's National Agricultural Statistics Service (NASS) will survey about 41,000 cattle operations nationwide to provide an up-to-date measure of U.S. cattle inventories.

"This information helps producers make timely, informed business decisions and plan for herd expansion or reduction. It also helps packers and government leaders evaluate expected slaughter volume for future months and determine supplies potential export," said Louisiana State Statistician Kathy Broussard. "Obtaining the current count of cattle will serve as an important decision-making tool for the entire agriculture industry."

During the first two weeks of January, Louisiana producers will have the opportunity to report their beef and dairy cattle inventories, calf crop, death loss, and cattle on feed information Starting in late December, the U.S. Department of Agriculture's National Agricultural Statistics Service (NASS) will measure sheep and goat inventories and wool and mohair production during a nationwide survey.

"Interest in sheep and goat data continues to grow with increased diversification in agriculture and consumer demands," said Kathy Broussard, NASS Louisiana State Statistician. "The Sheep and Goat Survey gives producers the opportunity to report the latest information onconditions and trends in the industry."

Louisiana operators surveyed will be asked to provide information about their sheep and goat inventories, counts of lambs and kids born during 2023, and production and prices received for wool and mohair. In Louisiana, NASS will contact approximately 300 producers to request their responses to the survey.

"Accurate data on sheep and goat inventory and production is a significant decision-making tool for USDA and the industry to be more responsive to domestic and international markets and consumer needs," said Broussard. "The information can also help create public appreciation for the many benefits of U.S. sheep and goats and their needed products."




NASS safeguards the privacy of all respondents and publishes only aggregate data, ensuring that no individual operation or producer can be identified.

Louisiana farmers warned of potential threat in bales of hay

South Louisiana is rich in agriculture and there are many families here that live and work off the land.

Chances are you know of someone who is or was a farmer in South Louisiana and many who do farmland will tell you that there are many dangers when out in the fields.

Well, for those with cattle or horses on their land, one main ingredient to preserving their livestock is hay.

Hay, which is used for feeding cattle and other livestock, is often stored in barns or perhaps even left out for the season. However, when the time comes for farmers to use the hay they must often pull it apart.

Well, with the hay sitting for so long at times things can get into the bales of hay that are being stored for later use. Sure, you



may see rodents, spiders, or even small animals nestled in between the stacks of hay, but you may also encounter some dangerous insects

In the photos shared here, which were posted on social media, you can see a very large nest of Yellow Jackets. The person who separated the hay had no idea that they were there until they were right up on them.

Luckily for the person who came face-to-face with these dangerous insects, it was cold out and the vicious insects were a bit lethargic and did not give chase. Had this been in the Spring or Summer, this could have been a deadly attack.

The person who discovered this huge nest, and there appears to be hundreds of them, was able to escape without any stings and they used their experience here to warn others who work or use hay on the farm.

These Yellow Jackets may be there in the winter, and they will most likely be there in the Spring and Summer too. However, as temperatures increase in the new year, these vicious insects will defend their nests and will attack if confronted or startled.

This is another great story to share with those that you may know who work on the land or have livestock.

Someone who is allergic to Yellow Jackets can go into distress quickly if stung by one or many. Check out these scary photos from the inside of a bale of hay.

LDWF: Deer hunters in NE LA urged to provide deer heads for free CWD testing

Deer hunters in northeast Louisiana are urged to place the heads of any deer they harvest this season in one of 13 free Chronic Wasting Disease (CWD) Testing Collection points located throughout the region to test for CWD

Collection sites are located in Catahoula, Concordia, Franklin, Madison, Morehouse, Tensas and Union parishes.

"CWD is 100 percent fatal to deer and there is currently no treatment," explained Louisiana Department of Wildlife and Fisheries (LDWF) State Deer Program Manager Johnathan Bordelon. "CWD is found in 32 states, and we have had confirmed cases of CWD in Tensas Parish. Deer show no outward signs of the disease until it is very advanced, so testing is required to identify infected animals. We are asking hunters to bring the head of any deer they harvest in the four-parish control area so we can test the animals and help slow the spread of the disease."

Bordelon said the process is quick and free to hunters. They simply fill out a collection card indicating where and when the deer was harvested, place the card in an envelope and then place the envelope and the deer head in a plastic bag and then place the bag in a cooler. All of the supplies needed are provided at the collection site.

Biologists collect the deer heads from the drop-off locations throughout deer season. They then remove the two retropharyngeal lymph nodes from the deer's head as well as a sample of the brain stem. Bordelon explained CWD is a neurodegenerative disease, and the retropharyngeal lymph nodes are among the first places the disease can be detected. If CWD is found in the lymph nodes, brain stem testing can help determine how far the disease had progressed in the animal

If a deer does test positive for CWD, the hunter who provided the sample is notified. The testing process typically takes two weeks. According to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, there is no evidence that CWD can infect humans. However, the CDC recommends caution in handling venison in the infected region and CWD-positive deer should not be consumed by people.

The U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) is seeking nominees for the American Pecan Promotion Board. Nominees are needed to fill five seats for members whose terms will begin Oct. 1, 2024, and end Sept. 30, 2027. *The deadline for nominations is Feb. 16, 2024.*

The American Pecan Promotion Board is seeking nominees for the following seats:

- Three producer seats representing the Central Region
- Two importer seats

The Central Region consists of Arkansas, Kansas, Louisiana, Mississippi, Missouri, Oklahoma, and Texas, plus any U.S. state with the majority of its land mass in the Central Time Zone.

The board is made up of 17 industry members including ten producers and seven importers. To serve

on the board, producers and importers must have produced or imported more than 50,000 pounds of inshell pecans (25,000 pounds of shelled pecans), on average, for four fiscal periods. Producers who produce pecans in more than one region may seek nomination only in the region in which they produce the majority of their pecans.
