Hurricanes are among nature's most powerful and destructive phenomena. Living in Louisiana, we understand that being impacted by a hurricane is not a question of if but when. It only takes one storm to change your life and community. That's why your best tool against a hurricane is preparation.

This month marks the official start of hurricane season. If June 1 sneaked up on

you, there's still time to get into gear and complete your hurricane preparedness activities.

"I urge everyone to have a plan in place for you, your family, your property, and your pets/livestock in the event you are in the path of a storm," said Commissioner of Agriculture and Forestry (LDAF) Mike Strain, D.V.M.

An average season produces three major hurricanes. While most of our state has been relatively lucky for a couple of years, that's no reason to let your guard down. We hope for the best when hurricane season comes, but we still have to prepare for the worst.

### GET A GAME PLAN

As with all hurricane seasons, you may need to leave your home quickly and travel to a safe place outside the affected area. If authorities advise you to evacuate, be prepared to leave immediately with your evacuation kit and plan in place. It is important to sit down with family and/or close friends to decide how you plan to communicate with each other, where you will go, and what your plans

are in the event of an emergency. Write the plan down, make sure everyone has a copy, and keep a copy of the plan in your evacuation kit.

Plan now if you will need help leaving or if you have transportation needs. Know who issues evacuation orders for your area, determine locations where you will ride out the storm, and start to get your supplies now. Ask friends or relatives outside your area if you would be able to stay with them in the event of an evacuation. Plan a meeting place to reconnect in the event you are separated from your family.

By law, the LDAF is designated by the Louisiana Homeland Security and Emergency Assistance and Disaster Act to assist in evacuating and sheltering household pets for evacuated citizens going to shelters during declared emergencies. The LDAF has two mobile pet shelters to assist in keeping family pets close to their owners when an evacuation is necessary. Those pet trailers and LDAF employees are ready to be mobilized if necessary.

Important pet items to take during an evacuation:

- Health records
- Food and food bowls
- Special medications
- Pet carriers
- Collars/leashes

## USDA's NASS Collecting June Agriculture & Area Surveys

During the next several weeks, the USDA's National Agricultural Statistics Service (NASS) will conduct two major mid-year surveys, the June Agricultural Survey and the June Area Survey. The agency will contact nearly 1,000 producers across Louisiana to determine crop acreage and stock levels as of June 1, 2023. In addition, NASS will collect information from farmers and ranchers from randomly selected land area segments across the state.

"The June Agricultural Survey and the June Area Survey are two of the most important and well-known surveys NASS conducts," explained Kathy Broussard, State Statistician of the NASS Louisiana State Field Office. "When producers respond to these surveys, they provide essential information

that helps determine the expected acreage and supply of major commodities in the United States for the 2023 crop year. The results are used by farmers and ranchers, USDA, businesses, exporters, researchers, economists, policymakers, and others to inform a wide range of decisions."

Producers can respond to the June Agricultural Survey online at [agcounts.usda.gov](https://agcounts.usda.gov), by phone, or through mail. They will be asked to provide information on planted and harvested acreage, including acreage for biotech crops and grain stocks. For the June Area Survey, agency representatives will interview farm and ranch operators in randomly selected segments over the phone. Producers will be asked to provide information on crop acreage, grain stocks, livestock inventory, land values, and value of sales.

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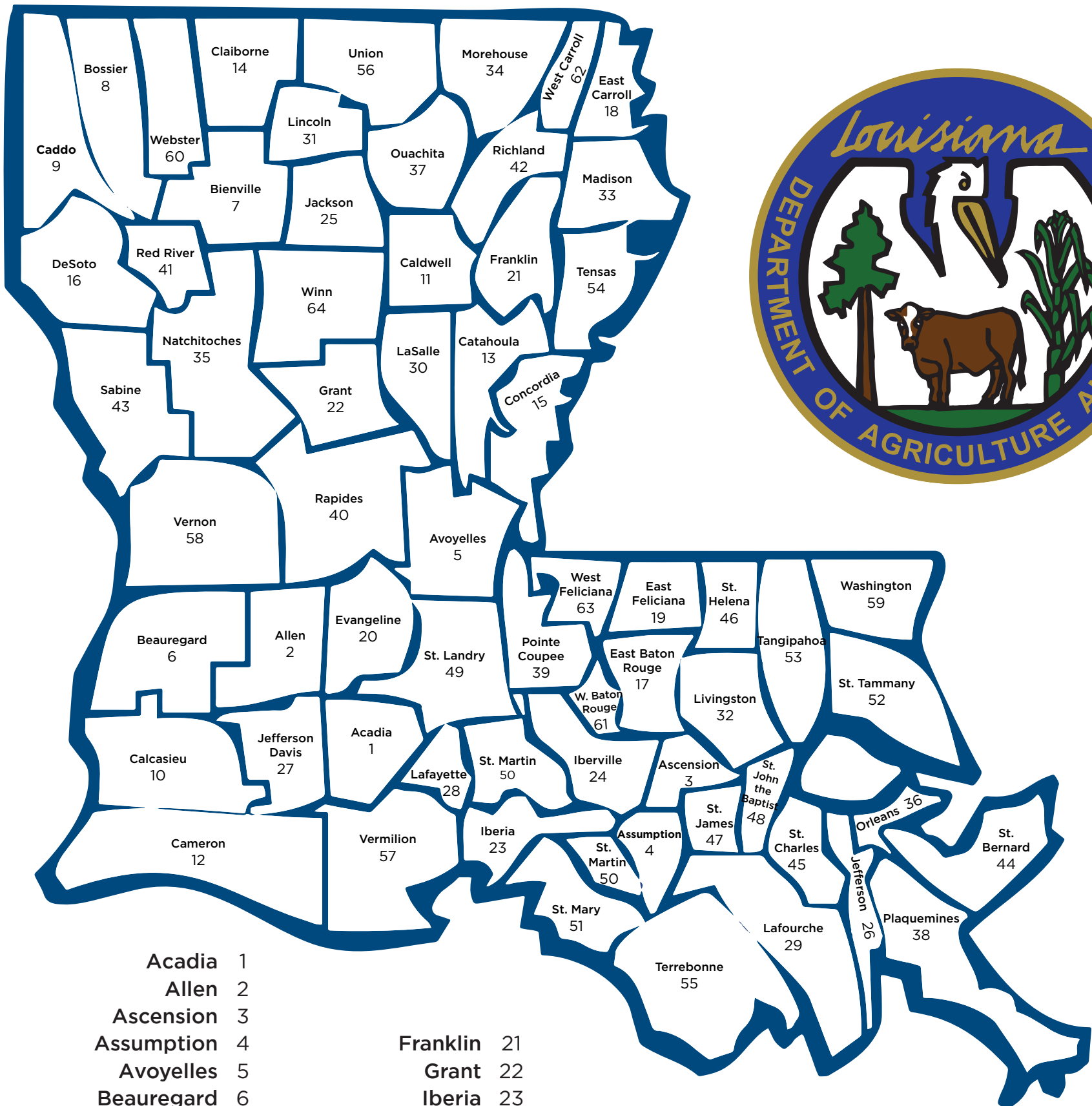

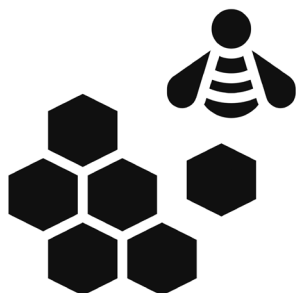

### SPICY SHRIMP AND SAUSAGE SKEWERS

#### Ingredients:

½ 12-ounce package of Richard's Andouille Smoked Sausage

 1 pound raw jumbo shrimp, peeled and deveined, tails on

## REMINDER: OTC Livestock Antibiotics Will Require Rx Soon



Starting on June 11, 2023, over-the-counter (OTC) livestock antibiotics will require veterinary oversight as a result of a new rule from the Food and Drug Administration (FDA).

The new rule follows the FDA's recommendation that manufacturers of medically important antimicrobial drugs that were previously available over the counter and approved for use in animals (both companion and food-producing, regardless of delivery mechanism) be brought under veterinary oversight or prescription status.

In 2017, OTC antibiotics used in animal feed were moved to Veterinary Feed Directive (VFD) status, allowing closer veterinarian oversight of antimicrobial use in animal feeds. At the same time, all over-the-counter antibiotics administered in the drinking water were moved to prescription status.

This new rule concerns the few antibiotics that remained available over the counter in the form of injectables, intramammary tubes, and boluses. By the June 11 deadline, the labeling of all OTC antibiotics for animal use is required to include the statement: "Caution: Federal law restricts this drug to use by or on the order of a licensed veterinarian," and the purchaser must have a prescription or drug order to buy it."

Prescription-only items will include injectable tylosin, injectable and intramammary penicillin formulations, injectable and oral oxytetracycline, sulfadimethoxine, sulfamethazine, and cephapirin intramammary formulations.

Individuals with veterinary-client-patient relationships, VCPR, may purchase antibiotics directly from their veterinarian or from a distributor with a prescription. Producers who already have a VCPR in place and purchase their animal health products through their veterinary office, or through other distributors under an existing prescription system, will likely notice little change.

However, this may have significant impacts on how the livestock owners can access antibiotic therapy for their animals, so contact your local veterinarian as soon as possible.

It is not advised that you stock up on these products as they have expiration dates and are sensitive to storage time and conditions.

Most vaccines, dewormers, injectable and oral nutritional supplements, ionophores, pro/prebiotics, and topical nonantibiotic treatments will not require a veterinary prescription. However, there are some exceptions.

"NASS safeguards the privacy of all respondents, by keeping all individual information confidential and publishing the data in aggregate form only to ensure that no operation or producer can be identified," said Broussard "We recognize that this is a hectic time for farmers, but the information they provide helps U.S. agriculture remain viable and capable. I urge them to respond to these surveys and thank them for their cooperation."

NASS will analyze the survey information and publish the results in a series of USDA reports, including the annual Acreage and quarterly Grain Stocks reports June 30, 2023. Survey data also contribute to NASS's monthly and annual Crop Production reports, the annual Small Grains Summary, annual Farms and Land in Farms and Land Values reports, various livestock reports, including Cattle, Sheep and Goats, and Hogs and Pigs, and USDA's monthly World Agricultural Supply and Demand Estimates.

### **Why participate? How can NASS data help farmers/ranchers?**

Farmers and ranchers can use NASS data in direct and indirect ways. They can consult the data themselves to make better business decisions or use ag-based products and services that rely on NASS data. For example, NASS crop production forecasts can help both livestock and crop producers make forward contracting, feed purchase, and other marketing decisions. In these cases, producers use concrete facts and figures to make well-informed decisions, which helps to eliminate guesswork, reduce risk, and improve profitability.

Similarly, information on the concentration of certain agricultural products and related supplies can help a new farmer determine where to start or expand their operation. It can also enable a business such as a trucking company to determine new routes. Brokers, accountants, lenders, market and investment analysts, appraisers, and others also use the data to serve producers.

## PREPARE YOUR OPERATION

In addition to ensuring your household and employees know your hurricane plan, now is the time to remove debris and secure large objects around your operation.

- **CLEAN OUT** culverts, ditches, and other drainage areas, especially before and during peak hurricane season, to reduce water damage. Most injuries to animals, people, or structures during a hurricane are caused by flying objects. To lessen the risk, minimize the presence of equipment, supplies, and debris that may become airborne during high winds or encountered in floodwaters.
- **INSPECT** all barns, outbuildings, paddocks, and other structures for broken or weak components: look for loose metal roofing, siding, and weak walls that could potentially blow off, fall over, or otherwise fail in high winds. Make all necessary repairs, such as interior and exterior braces and re-nail metal roofing and siding.
- **CHECK** that rafters are secured to the wall studding with hurricane-rated straps or 2" x 6" knee braces.
- **STOCK UP** on nails, screws, and plywood to board up windows and to nail doors and windows shut.
- **PLAN** to turn off electricity at the switch and unplug electrical equipment right before storms strike.
- **MOVE** heavy, expensive machinery to sturdy buildings. It's not recommended to use such equipment to anchor structures.

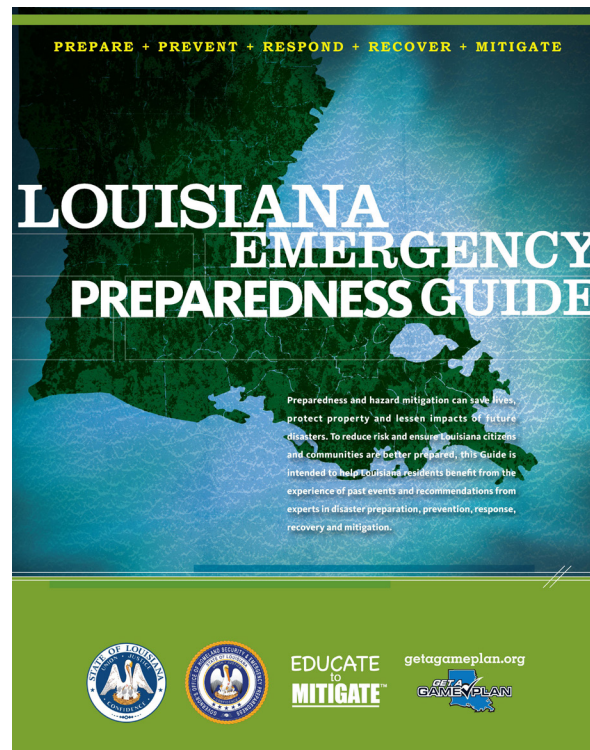
Now is also a good time to remove dead trees or cut back tree limbs hanging over homes or businesses. This act alone can mitigate property damage.

"As always, we urge you to use a licensed arborist to cut trees around your property. In addition to being properly trained, they must maintain liability insurance. To protect yourself, ask to see a

license issued by LDAF before allowing any work to be done on your property. Also, be sure to get a written estimate and never pay for the job up front," said Commissioner Strain.

You can refer to LDAF's website or Business App (on mobile devices) to verify the current license status of an arborist. To download the free app, search "LDAF Business Search" at the iTunes and Google Play stores.

Agricultural operations with livestock have additional considerations. For those with large animals like dairy cows or beef cattle,

turning them loose in a field is usually recommended. However, it's important that the fields are not in low-lying areas that might flood. If flood plains are the only option, you can build dirt mounds for animals to stand on. Smaller animals, like chickens, should be penned indoors in a building that's safe from flooding and has adequate ventilation.

To prepare livestock trailers, it's important to inspect the trailer's overall condition. Additionally, you should check tire pressure and rubber for wear and test the brakes and running lights.

If you must evacuate livestock during a natural disaster, it's crucial to have proper identification for them, including health records (especially proof of EIA testing for horses), food, special medications, and bridles or leads.

**All ag operations with livestock should also consider taking the following actions:**

- **PURCHASE** a gas-powered generator, especially if your operation uses vent fans, water pumps, milking machines, or other critical electrical equipment.
- **STORE** enough feed out of flood zones for livestock.
- **ENSURE** a source of clean water; letting livestock drink flood water is generally not recommended.
- **STORE** fertilizers, pesticides, treated seeds, and other such compounds up high and away from flood waters and animals.
- **COVER** sharp parts or cutting edges of machinery and equipment that could pose a danger to animals.

Livestock owners who need assistance should call their local Office of Emergency Preparedness (OEP).

## SECURE IMPORTANT RECORDS AND DOCUMENTS

Pre- and post-hurricane documentation is extremely important for insurance compensation and recovery assistance. You'll want to have thorough records of damages and losses sustained on your farm as well as documentation of your cleanup and recovery efforts.

Documenting inventory of farm buildings, vehicles, equipment, and livestock is critical before a disaster occurs. Take photos, videos, or make written lists with descriptions. Keep copies of this inventory in multiple places: computer, off-site in a safe location, and on a cloud-based server where information is transmitted and saved weekly.

Remember, standard homeowners' insurance doesn't cover flooding. It's a good idea to regularly review your insurance policies with your agent to be sure you have adequate coverage, including flood insurance, for your facilities, vehicles, farm buildings, crops, and livestock. Remember that there are limitations on how soon insurance coverage will take effect, so don't put this off. Generally, insurance policies will not cover damage if the policy was not in place before a disaster.

It's a lot to consider, but having a plan in place is worth it. We're preparing, too, so that we're ready to help you, your family, and your animals if and when you need it.

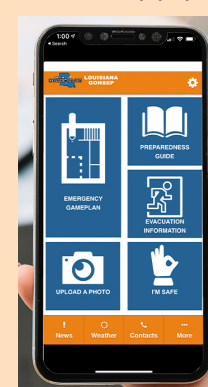

# Master Programs Educate Louisianians on Best Practices

Louisiana's Cooperative Extension Service offers a number of programs aimed at educating clientele about improving management skills, increasing profitability and, ultimately, becoming more sustainable. These "master" programs educate home gardeners, agronomic producers and cattlemen about best management practices that help improve water quality, soil health and overall conservation efforts for long-term sustainability through the Master Gardener, Master Farmer, and Master Cattleman programs.

## Master FARMER Program

The Louisiana Master Farmer Program is a multi-agency effort focused on improving water quality through soil health projects and promoting conservation practices. The three major components of the program include education, demonstration, and implementation of conservation practices.

- **PHASE ONE** includes six hours of classroom instruction on conservation planning, best management practices, watersheds, and management of nonpoint source pollution.
- **PHASE TWO** requires attendance at a conservation-based field day or workshop where best management practices are demonstrated.
- To complete **PHASE THREE**, participants work with the USDA's Natural Resources Conservation Service to develop and implement a comprehensive conservation plan to address any soil, water, plant, air, and animal resource concerns on their entire farming operation.

To be awarded the five-year certification by the Commissioner of Agriculture, a producer must complete all three phases.

Over 4,000 participants that have completed at least one phase of the program. To date, approximately 365 producers have achieved certification or re-certification since 2006 and are

in "presumed compliance" of Louisiana soil and water quality standards. Since its inception in 2001, the program has enrolled almost 2 million agricultural acres with widespread adoption of conservation practices that are helping to mitigate water quality issues related to production agriculture.

## Master CATTLEMAN Program

For nearly 20 years the Master Cattleman Program has taught Louisiana's producers best management practices in beef cattle, as well as soil and forage management. The overall goal is for cattle producers to possess a foundational knowledge of forage and beef production that allows them to effectively improve both production and profitability of their operations.

The program features 10 nights of education on pasture agronomy, weed management, animal health, nutrition, reproduction, breeding and selection, animal handling, Beef Quality Assurance certification, economics and marketing, and end products.

Successful cattle production begins with proper soil and forage management. For that reason, the first two classes of the Master Cattleman Program focus on fundamentals of soil health and forage production, followed by weed management. These lectures provide an understanding of soil pH and fertility, knowledge of forage species, and discussions on how to design grazing plans that promote environmental sustainability. The remaining classes on cattle production then build upon these principles of environmental sustainability and stewardship.

Through the animal handling, health, and Beef Quality Assurance courses, producers are taught that overall wellness and production efficiency are greatly impacted by management practices and livestock stewardship. The relationship between nutrition

and reproduction becomes evident during both of those lectures, further emphasizing the importance of grazing strategies and environmental sustainability.

Producers also learn to further optimize production efficiency with proper breeding and selection of replacement animals. All of this culminates in efficient production of beef as the final product that producers can confidently market to consumers.

## Master GARDENER Program

For half a century, the extension Master Gardener Program has taught individuals how to sustainably grow their own food and improve their communities by conserving water, improving soil health, growing the food-supply chain, sharing knowledge, and teaching the next generation the values of stewardship.

The curriculum focuses on horticulture-based subject matter, including culture of ornamental plants, lawns, vegetables, and fruits; control of plant diseases, insects, and weeds; and safe use of pesticides. Many of those who complete the Master Gardener training go on to volunteer with the gardening public.

In Louisiana, the first Master Gardener training series was implemented in Baton Rouge in 1994, and it expanded to the metropolitan areas of the state in 1998.

Today there are 30 parish-level Master Gardener programs. Since 2015, the Advanced Louisiana Master Gardener Program has further explored concepts covered in the basic program, but with an increased emphasis on environmental impact and sustainability.

Over the past 30 years, approximately 6,000 individuals have completed the Louisiana Master Gardener training program. Of those, there are approximately 1,600 active Master Gardener volunteers statewide. These Louisiana Master Gardener and Advanced Louisiana Master Gardener volunteers, under the direction of local Louisiana Master Gardener coordinators, complete tens of thousands of hours

of volunteer service annually. Volunteer service hours for 2021 totaled more than 54,000 hours, for an economic value of more than \$1.56 million.

#### **Master HORSEMAN Program**

Like many of the "Master" extension programs across the nation, the Louisiana Master Horseman Program aims to educate horsemen and prepare them to serve as volunteer leaders within the 4-H horse program and throughout the Louisiana equine industry.

Utilizing a hands-on approach to ensure mastery of horsemanship techniques, graduates have indicated that the program has instilled confidence and a willingness to teach technical and management skills

to others. Educated, willing, and confident volunteers are essential to accomplishing the many goals within the Louisiana 4-H Horse program.

Former LSU AgCenter horse specialist Clint Depew developed the first ever Master Horseman Program in 2002. This program includes horsemanship instruction as well as research-based management skills. Upon graduation, participants are asked to volunteer a minimum of 20 hours in some kind of horse-related activity.

Since its inception, over 1,000 men and women have graduated from the program and serve in leadership roles in horse organizations and youth programs throughout the state.

## Local Meat Grant Program

### Apply by July 19, 2023

This program funds independently owned meat and poultry processing businesses to provide more and better options for local livestock producers by modernizing, increasing, diversifying, and decentralizing processing capacity, including support for rendering.

Processing Expansion Projects will fund grants from \$100,000 up to \$5 million to increase the processing and/or rendering capacity of privately, cooperatively, non-profit, or Tribally held processing facilities. Simplified Equipment-Only Projects offer a simplified application to fund smaller grants between \$10,000 and \$250,000 for equipment purchases for meat and poultry processors.

#### Examples of Processing Expansion Projects:

- Expanding processing capacities to increase production volumes, process additional meat and poultry species, or add new value-added product types
- Upgrading processing and manufacturing equipment
- Increasing packaging, labeling, and cold storage capacity
- Improving slaughter and humane handling infrastructure
- Installation of holding pens or wastewater management systems, or other improvements that do not require breaking new ground or constructing new facilities.

**Examples of simplified equipment projects** include smokers, sausage makers, and breaders.

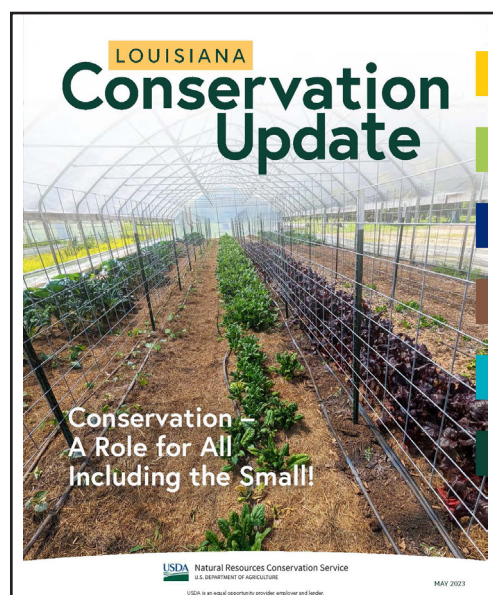

Financial assistance is awarded to those who voluntarily enter into contracts, easements, and agreements to conserve natural resources; it's provided through cost-share/ incentives, easements, grants, and stewardship payments.
