

DAVEY'S TREASURES SALSA

Grandma's secret recipe inspires growth

In a recent episode of CRAWFISH TALES with Commissioner Mike Strain, DVM, we visited with the folks behind Davey's Treasures Salsa.

Back in 2015, Davey Woolridge of Baton Rouge attended a summer camp for adults with developmental disabilities. The camp focused on entrepreneurship, and participants were encouraged to find something to share with others. It could be a product they liked, an activity they enjoyed, or even something they wanted to learn more about. The plan was to share that good or service at the camp's market every Friday.

It came as a surprise to his mom Terri, who thought he would pick computers or woodworking, but Davey knew exactly what he wanted to learn and share. "For years, my grandma sold her salsa at the Washington Parish fair," says Davey. "I saw

how everybody loved it, so I decided to learn her recipe." Her salsa was so wellloved she consistently sold out to lines of loyal customers.

Their first step was to get to Grandma's house, where she graciously and patiently

taught Davey all the steps to her salsa recipe, pulled, as Davey says, "from the family vault."

Davey learned the steps. remembered them. meticulously practiced making the salsa recipe all that summer the weekly market

at camp, where participants offered everything from chicken eggs and pet

baths to furniture repair and car washing. And just like his grandmother at the parish fair before him, Davey would sell out of his salsa every Friday.

Salsa

In fact, when the summer camp ended, Davey's loyal customers didn't want him to stop making his salsa. So he continued to make it at home. The process was both time and labor-intensive, and Davey's skills continued to grow as he learned and practiced things like measuring ingredients, stirring hot pots, and pulling heavy jars off the stove. For a whole year, Davey made smallscale batches of his salsa which he sold to friends, neighbors, and repeat customers.

By this time, Davey had set his mind on turning his operation

into a real business, and he had proved to his parents that he was ready. Davey and his family started working with the LSU AgCenter Food Innovation Institute (FOODii), which helps entrepreneurs like Davey start a food business. FOODii provides resources and education, including technical assistance, expert advice, and research on food safety and sustainability.

It was early 2016 when Davey began producing his salsa in the FOODii kitchen. That was around the same time the Certified Louisiana program kicked off. From Day One, Terri says Certified Louisiana was not only a source of information but also encouragement. Through the Certified program, Davey's Treasures Salsa has benefited from its promotional benefits, attending all kinds of marketing events. "This little logo means something special," insists Terri. "Not only to retailers and customers, but it's special to us as a family because of the relationship we've had for so many years."

Restrictions when moving cotton harvest equipment into Louisiana

As Louisiana cotton producers move into cotton harvest season, Louisianians will see an influx of used and custom cotton harvest equipment moving into and through the state. To protect our cotton producers from the reintroduction of boll weevils, the Louisiana Department of Agriculture and Forestry (LDAF) implements restrictions for all cotton harvest equipment entering the state.

Boll weevil reintroductions usually occur when used and/or custom cotton harvest equipment from a boll weevil-infested area travels through the state or stops within the state to conduct harvest operations without being properly fumigated, inspected, and certified as being free of boll weevils. (Cotton harvest equipment includes cotton

pickers, cotton module builders, cotton module trucks, boll buggies, tractors, trailers, and any other equipment potentially harboring cotton debris or boll weevils.)

"Once the equipment stops anywhere within the state of Louisiana, our department must be notified so we may conduct an inspection of the equipment and review all pertinent documentation," said LDAF Commissioner Mike Strain, DVM.

Equipment entering Louisiana from Texas requires a Fumigation Certificate or a USDA PPQ Inspection Form 540. Equipment from all other states where the boll weevil has been eradicated should have a phytosanitary certificate or other official documents, such as a statement on letterhead from a state-of-origin regulatory official certifying that the equipment is free



BACON WRAP CHICKEN/CREAM CHEESE (JOLIE FEMME)

Ingredients:

1 pack boneless chicken thighs or breast 1 jar sliced jalapenos 1 pack Philadelphia cream cheese (12-14 ounces) 1 pack thin sliced bacon 1 tablespoon cayenne pepper 1 tablespoon garlic powder 1 tablespoon onion powder 1 tablespoon seasoning all

1 teaspoon dry parsley 1 teaspoon black pepper

1 teaspoon paprika 2 tablespoons mustard

Instructions:

Preheat oven to 375°F. Take out grill pan (This is the pan that comes with your oven, grill top with bottom portion to collect grease). Cut up boneless chicken meat into long strips and place in mixing bowl and season. Place jalapenos in a separate bowl to make it easier to grab individual jalapenos. Take kitchen shears, cut the bacon pack straight down the middle while still in wrapping. Take cutting board to lay bacon flat on for wrapping and open cream cheese packet. On cutting board take one of the halved packs of bacon and start making two rows of bacon with 4 slices going down with no spacing for each row. Place cut chicken strips about 1 inch from edge going down. (The chicken should be laid across the bacon going down; 2-3 strips of chicken is usually needed to finish length.) Now add cream cheese on top of chicken. (Use knife to cut straight across cream cheese for even portions, and easier to place on top of chicken.) Next add Jalapenos all the way down on top of cream cheese. Now take 1 inch at end left out and wrap over layers to begin rolling. Roll layers of bacon covering any spaces between with the bacon to keep entire layers together. Place on grill pan in rows and repeat till enough rows are made to fill the grill pan. Sprinkle black pepper on top and bake about 1 hour-1 hour 45 minutes or until golden brown. (You may have to turn wraps after first hour, if not cooking well, to cook bottom portion of bacon.) Once cooked remove from oven let stand about 5 minutes and slice with electric knife and serve.

Sweetening the deal: Researchers and the sugar industry join forces to refresh the environment

The average American consumes 17 teaspoons of sugar per day, about half from sugarcane. It takes a lot of raw material to create all that sweetness, but there is a downside – what do you do with all the leftover sugarcane processing waste?

Scientists with the Agricultural Research Service's (ARS) Southern Regional Research Center (SRRC), in New Orleans, LA, are working with the sugar industry to improve processing methods and develop new products that will benefit the environment and increase profits.

According to Thomas Klasson, chemical engineer and research leader of SRRC's Commodity Utilization Research unit, the project aims to develop biobased products to replace petroleum-based products, and to refresh the soil with amendments made from sugarcane processing waste.

"Our work with waste utilization will replace products that are now made from dwindling or non-renewable resources," he said. "Our approach is greener and more environmentally friendly."

Mill mud, a gooey mess that is a byproduct of the sugar purification process, is one of the focal points of the research. Also known as "filter cake" or "press mud," it is an enriched sludge that is full of organic carbon, nitrogen, and nutrient minerals.

Sugar mills may be able to generate additional income by returning this waste to the production cycle.

"Mill mud has nitrogen, phosphorous, potassium, and many other compounds that provide excellent fertilizer value," Klasson said. "Right now, we are considering it for field applications because of the amount the sugar mills produce; however, adding it to potting soil may also be an option."

Sugar mills produce about 5 pounds of mud per 100 pounds of processed sugarcane.

"If all the mud from Louisiana sugarcane factories - which process about 1,900,000 tons of sugar cane a year - could be recycled as fertilizer, we would save 2,100 tons of nitrogen fertilizer and 950 tons of phosphorous fertilizer," Klasson said.

Mill mud is frequently used to improve sugarcane fields, where it can help restore fertility to sandy soil and land affected by erosion or biomass burning.

"With some waste, we are making plastics or converting it into chemicals that can replace chemicals that are now made from petroleum oil," Klasson said. "One of the wastes that we work with is bagasse, which is the rest of the sugarcane plant once the sugar is removed."

Often, bagasse never leaves the sugar mill because the industry uses it as an inexpensive fuel source. There are, however, many other uses, including paper,

particle board, mulch, animal bedding, and transportation fuel.

Bagasse has also found a home on cattle ranches and dairy farms as inexpensive roughage for herds, and as a natural filter to remove organic and metal contaminants from water.

"As resources become more scarce and fossil-based fuels and chemicals get more expensive, the use of agricultural byproducts will increase," Klasson said. "As the population grows, we will consume more sugar, and there will be an increased need to find uses for these wastes."

Stay informed of statewide and parish burn bans

Due to the extremely dry conditions statewide and the concern over first responder safety in these dangerously high temperatures, LDAF Commissioner Mike Strain, DVM, along with State Fire Marshal (SFM) Dan Wallis, issued a statewide cease and desist order for all private burning.

This order is effective as of 5 PM, August 7, and shall remain in effect until rescinded.

The Louisiana SFM, in collaboration with LDAF, only issues multi-parish and full, statewide burn bans, not individual parish bans.

Once the statewide ban is lifted, you can check your parish government's website or social media sites for the latest updates in your area.

You can also check LDAF's burn ban map by scanning the QR code at right. (Please note that LDAF's map will only reflect bans that have been reported to us by those parishes.)

"Multi-parish" generally involves at least five connected parishes facing a similar fire threat at the same time. Multi-parish or statewide burn bans are generally issued due to an extended fire threat.



Parish government leaders have the authority to issue parish-wide burn bans or to opt-out of a statewide burn ban. Fire chiefs have the authority to allow for individual exceptions to a statewide burn ban

About burn bans:

- Burn bans apply to open burning practices (burn piles, burn barrels, etc.) of legal materials like vegetation.
- Burn bans do not apply to approved, agricultural burn practices for farming.
- Burn bans also do not apply to the recreational use of fire pits, campfires, or barbecue grills.

Suspect arrested in St. Helena arson investigation

Forestry Enforcement Officers with the Louisiana Department of Agriculture and Forestry (LDAF) have arrested Steve Harrison of Independence in an arson investigation regarding a wildfire on Hano Road in Independence, LA.

On July 22, LDAF agents in southeast Louisiana began investigating a wildfire that destroyed approximately nine acres of pine plantation on company land. During the investigation, agents identified 55-year-old Harrison, who had several outstanding arrest warrants through the Tangipahoa Parish Sheriff's Office.

On July 25, LDAF agents located Harrison near his residence on Hano Road. Harrison admitted to setting the fire and was subsequently booked for a simple arson violation in the St. Helena Parish Jail.

"It is illegal to purposely set a fire. A person suspected of doing so will be charged even if no one got hurt and regardless of the damage resulting from the fire," said LDAF Commissioner Mike Strain, DVM. "Setting fire to property without the consent of the owner and any subsequent damage is something LDAF and our Forestry Enforcement agents take very seriously."

Caddo Parish man arrested for livestock theft

A Caddo Parish man was arrested on July 24 by inspectors with the Louisiana Department of Agriculture and Forestry's (LDAF) Livestock Brand Commission. The arrest was the result of an investigation by the commission and a subsequent arrest warrant from Caddo Parish.

Twenty-two-year-old Travious D. Johnson, of Shreveport, was arrested on a warrant for theft of livestock. An investigation by the LDAF's Livestock Brand Commission determined that Johnson allegedly illegally removed a palomino horse without the owner's permission from a pasture and stall location in Caddo Parish in August of 2022. Johnson allegedly advertised the horse on social media and subsequently sold it. Brand inspectors were able to locate the horse in Allen Parish. and it was returned to its owner.

Johnson was arrested without incident by the Desoto Parish Sheriff's Department, where he was booked on the arrest

warrant and transported to Caddo Parish. At this time, a bond has been set at \$25,000.

"The LDAF always recommends that buyers use caution when purchasing livestock over social media or anytime you don't know the person you are dealing with," said Commissioner Mike Strain, DVM. "If you suspect foul play, please contact the Livestock Brand Commission, which investigates livestock theft and other agricultural crimes in the state."

The Livestock Brand Commission was assisted in this investigation by the Desoto, Allen, and Caddo Parish Sheriff's Departments.

from boll weevil or that the equipment originated in a boll weevil free area.

The invasive boll weevil, which first appeared in Louisiana in 1903, has cost producers millions of dollars in yield losses and increased damage and control costs. Since the declaration of the boll weevil's eradication from the state in 2012, LDAF continues to implement these protocols to avoid the devastating economic impact weevils can have.
