



HERESES AMID THE SMOKE AND FLAMES



August has come and gone but left us with recording-breaking heat, severe drought conditions, and an unprecedented wildfire season. More than 450 fires burned throughout Louisiana during the month of August. The Tiger Island Fire, the largest Louisiana wildfire in decades, scorched Beauregard Parish burning over 31,000 acres. The fire is still active and is currently only 50 percent contained.

What is does "contained" mean? The first step in stopping a wildfire is containing it, which means creating fuel breaks to prevent it from spreading. If you want to stop a fire, you need to remove the fuel source. If a fire doesn't have fuel to spread, it won't go anywhere and will ultimately fizzle out.

Wildland firefighters create a fuel break around a certain perimeter to contain a fire, cutting off the fire's ability to spread further. Firefighters cut and dig, cutting off access to additional burnable vegetation. We've seen our firefighters doing this with bulldozers to clear trees and brush.

Once firefighters have successfully created a fuel break around the entire wildfire's perimeter, they can claim 100 percent containment. At this point, the fire shouldn't spread anymore, and firefighters can devote the rest of their time to putting out what remains of the fire.

The next step is to "control" the fire. Controlled means that the wildland firefighters have

completely extinguished the fire and the fire no longer threatens further spread or resource damage under foreseeable conditions. It takes a long time to control a fire, especially a wildland one that covers many miles.

For a fire to be declared "out," there needs to be ZERO residual heat. Fires are generally not declared totally out until a "season-ending event" — a huge rainstorm or even snowfall in other states.

Aviation resources are an important piece of our firefighting operations as well. Helicopters allow us to drop water on areas that we can't access from the ground, or places it isn't safe to be on the ground. But they can't take the place of a good rain!

"Wildfires this many and of this intensity are unprecedented," said LDAF Commissioner Mike Strain, DVM. Records show Louisiana averages 771 wildfires a year, whereas we averaged 21 wildfires per day in August.

"We are in this fight for the long haul," says Commissioner Strain. "We expect this fight to continue until we get significant rainfall."

Nearly 77 percent of the state is experiencing severe drought conditions, which are affecting 4.2 million residents, according to the U.S. Drought Monitor. Beauregard Parish and the surrounding area, which borders Texas, is experiencing exceptional drought conditions — the most extreme category.

THANK YOU to all of the tireless and dedicated team players who have contributed to this gargantuan effort. UPDATE: Statewide burn ban still in effect; exceptions removed

Due to an increase in fire danger across Louisiana, the previous burn ban order issued August 7th has been rescinded and reissued with an update for all agricultural burns, including but not limited to prescribed burns, to be temporarily prohibited until further notice.

This new burn ban order by Louisiana Department of Agriculture and Forestry Commissioner Mike Strain, DVM, in collaboration with Louisiana State Fire Marshal Dan Wallis, in effect as of August 25, 2023, at 12 p.m., orders an immediate statewide ban on all agricultural burning, including but not limited to prescribed burning.

This order shall remain in effect until rescinded.

The Office of Louisiana State Fire Marshal also issued an updated burn ban order prohibiting ALL private burning, with no limitations, pursuant to authority under R.S. 40:1602. This order is in effect as of August 25, 2023, at 12 p.m., and shall remain in effect until rescinded.

Violation of this burn ban order could result in criminal and/or civil penalties.

LDAF's Office of Forestry is tasked with responding to wildfires at any hour, and crews are hard at work throughout the state. In the event of an emergency that requires their assistance, you can call the LDAF 24-Hour Emergency Hotline at 1-855-452-5323 or dial 911





DEUX GARS BIZARRES WILD PIG PORK CHOPS

Ingredients:

Pork chops

Deux Gars Bizarres Cajun Seasoning

Thick cut bacon

Brine:

4 cups water

2 tablespoons brown sugar

2 tablespoons granulated sugar

½ cup Tabasco Brand Avery Island Salt

1 teaspoon mustard seed

2 teaspoon crushed black pepper

1 clove garlic, smashed

1 fresh thyme sprig

1 bay leaf

2 tablespoon apple vinegar

Instructions:

Get the desired number of chops, individually cut, and brine the meat. Once brining is over, rub the chops liberally with Deux Gars Bizarres Cajun Seasoning and then wrap chops completely in thick cut bacon. Allow meat to rest for at least an hour in the refrigerator. Bring your Traeger, smoker, or oven to 225°F. Add the chops and cook for 1 hour and 20 minutes, give or take, depending on the size of the chops. After 1 hour and 20 minutes, start checking the internal temperature of the meat. Once the meat is between 155 and 160°F, it is ready to be removed from heat. Allow to rest at least five minutes. Serve with baked beans or mac and cheese. Combine all ingredients in a pot and bring to a boil. Remove from heat and let cool. Add meat to a large bowl and cover in the brining mix. Make sure meat is completely submerged. I like to brine overnight; if it is a large cut, I will brine 24 hours. The meat should be patted dry, and then allowed to rest for several hours to 24 hours, depending on size.



DUCK AND SMOKED SAUSAGE JAMBALAYA

Submitted by Guillory's Greatest Food

Ingredients:

1 pound duck breast

1 pound Cajun smoked sausage, sliced

1 cup white onions, chopped

1 cup bell pepper, chopped

4 cloves garlic, chopped

2 cups red wine (dry, Cabernet, Merlot, Shiraz)

2 cups medium grain Louisiana rice

4 cups water

1 cup green onions, chopped

½ cup flat leaf parsley, chopped

Louisiana Love Seasoning Blend to taste

Instructions:

Place a heavy pot over medium-high heat. Skin the duck breasts and place in the pot to render the fat, turning every few minutes. Season and lightly oil the breasts then grill over hardwood fire until 135°F internal temperature. Remove and let rest. Remove the skins and place on a corner of the grill away from direct fire, turning occasionally until very crisp. Add the Sausage and cook until well browned, then remove. Add onions and bell pepper, cooking until well browned. (Patience is key here. The better the browning, the darker and more flavor the jambalaya will have.) Add the wine to deglaze. Cube duck breasts being careful to reserve any liquids. Once boiling, add the garlic, duck breasts, and sausage. Add the water and bring to boil, season with Louisiana Love, and then add rice. Once boiling, reduce to simmer and cover. Rice should be cooked in 15-20 minutes. Taste and adjust seasoning. Mix in green onions and parsley off of the fire.

Note: Be sure the duck you are using has the skin and fat. This is important to flavoring the dish along with the renderings from the sausage. The two flavors match perfectly to make a rich South Louisiana staple.

1 10-oz package frozen chopped spinach, thawed, reserved liquid $\frac{1}{2}$ teaspoon salt

18-oz package shredded part-skim mozzarella cheese, divided use ½ cup grated parmesan cheese, divided use

114-oz jar or 2 cups of spaghetti sauce pizza sauce 30 thin pepperoni slices

Instructions:

Preheat oven to 350°F. Cook rice and basil in a medium skillet according to rice package directions. Remove from heat. Stir in the spinach, reserved liquid and salt until well blended. Add half of the mozzarella, 2 tablespoons of the parmesan cheese and stir gently until well blended. Spoon the pizza sauce evenly over all, top with the pepperoni (overlapping slightly) and sprinkle with remaining mozzarella cheese; bake 25-30 minutes or until beginning to lightly brown on edges. Sprinkle with remaining parmesan cheese.

Note: Most skillets are ovenproof in a 350°F oven, but the ricespinach mixture may be transferred to a 2-quart baking dish, topped with remaining ingredients and baked as directed.

Instructions:

Make incisions (against the grain) ¾ of the thickness of the roast and rub down with black pepper. Stuff incisions with chipotles in adobo sauce, then pack them in with cream cheese, and paste with Fuego Dulce. Cover with bacon and paste again with Fuego Dulce. Bake at 350°F for roughly 45 minutes (depending on the size of the roast).

It's best to use a meat thermometer to make sure it's cooked medium rare (venison roasts are served this way). After 30 minutes of cooking, baste bacon again with Fuego Dulce, 15 minutes later pull it out and enjoy.



USDA invests \$150M to connect underserved and small acreage forest landowners to emerging climate markets

The USDA's Forest Service is making \$150 million from President Biden's Inflation Reduction Act, the largest climate investment in history, available to help underserved small acreage forest landowners connect to emerging voluntary climate markets. These markets can provide economic opportunities for landowners and incentivize improved forest health and management.

Forests are powerful tools in the fight against climate change, and emerging voluntary privatesector markets are now creating economic incentives to keep forests healthy and productive through reforestation, improved forest management, and other sustainable practices. However, high acreage requirements and prohibitive start-up costs have caused many small-acreage and underserved private forest owners to be left behind. These investments will expand access to markets that were previously outof-reach, allowing underserved small-acreage forest

landowners to address climate change while also supporting rural economies, maintaining land ownership for future generations, and protecting private forestlands from increasing development pressure.

"Healthy, resilient forests store carbon, provide critical habitat for wildlife, and grow forest resources that are the lifeblood of communities across the country," said Secretary Vilsack.

"Working forests play a key role in mitigating the effects of climate change," said Forest Service Chief Randy Moore. "As private forest landowners face increasing pressures to convert their forests to other uses, we are helping underserved and small acreage landowners to access new economic opportunities to ensure working forests remain intact. Without proper management, forests are more susceptible to pest, disease, catastrophic wildfire, loss of wildlife habitat, and reduced water quality for downstream users," continued Moore.

How can you help? First and foremost, follow the burn ban.

The Louisiana Office of State Fire Marshal updated their burn ban to remove all exceptions, and LDAF rescinded the previous burn ban order issued August 7th.

LDAF reissued a burn ban with an update for all agricultural burns, including but not limited to prescribed burns, to be temporarily prohibited until further notice.

This new burn ban order is in effect as of August 25, 2023, at 12 p.m., and shall remain in effect until rescinded.

Lastly, if you see a fire, CALL 911 for the fire department to put the fire out!!

The burn bans are being enforced and citations are being issued.



BURN BAN FACTS

DON'T BURN ANYTHING. These three words are clear and simple. All three ban orders issued on 8/25/23 read ALL OUTDOOR BURNING is prohibited with NO exceptions.

Any activity that involves fire/ flames outdoors is included in the burn ban. Any activity that could produce a spark or flame is highly discouraged.

Outdoor cooking is not a citable offense, but if your cooking creates a fire that the fire department has to respond to, you will get a citation. It doesn't matter what your fuel source is (propane, pellets, charcoal, etc.), again, if it involves a flame at any point, don't do it.

Mowing and yard work is not banned, however, it is preferred to avoid mowing and/or driving/ operating hot machinery and/or any activity that could produce a spark on or near dry, brown, dead grass because of its flammability right now.

Burn bans enforced, suspects apprehended

In recent weeks, a number of suspects have been arrested and/or issued citations for violations of the burn ban, among other crimes. A summary appears below, but you can read the full news releases at www.ldaf. state.la.us/news-archive/.

Washington Parish

On August 11, 2023, LDAF forestry enforcement agents in the southeast region began investigating a large wildfire in the area of Mount Hermon, Louisiana. Kenneth Beaubouef was taken into custody and booked into the Washington Parish Jail for violations of fire-raising on lands of another by criminal negligence and burn ban violation.

Sabine Parish

On August 24, 2023, investigators with the LDAF Forestry Enforcement Division and the Sabine Parish Sheriff's Department arrested 21-year-old Jeremiah Hill of Many, LA for three counts of communication of false information of planned arson. Communicating false information of arson or attempted arson by

mail, telephone, telegraph, word-of-mouth, or other means of communication or making threats of false information is a felony in Louisiana and carries a sentence of up to 15 years of hard labor. Investigators remind citizens to be mindful of what they post on social media in times of disaster.

St. Helena Parish

On August 24, 2023, LDAF forestry enforcement agents charged Ryan Miller of Independence with fire raising on the lands of another by criminal negligence and violation of the burn ban. The fire on Hano Road, off Highway 16, destroyed approximately 172 acres.

Tangipahoa Parish

On August 26, 2023, LDAF Forestry enforcement agents booked 37-year-old Robin Crawford of Tickfaw, LA, into the Tangipahoa Parish Jail for a number of violations, including simple arson, violation of burn ban, and resisting an officer.

LDAF requests public assistance finding arson suspects

Tiger Island Fire

Multiple wildfires have burned in Beauregard Parish in the past few weeks — most notably The Tiger Island Fire. Wildfire investigators with LDAF's Enforcement Division have determined this fire to be a result of arson. LDAF investigators, Louisiana Office of State Fire Marshal deputies, and the Beauregard Parish Sheriff's Office detectives are actively investigating this matter. The Tiger Island Fire burns east of Merryville, south of Hwy 190, and about five miles east of the Texas state line. The fire originated on August 22 in a wooded pine plantation and has consumed more than 31,000 forested acres. It threatened the town of Merryville and caused devastating damage to more than 20 homes and structures.

Rapides Parish

In the early morning hours of August 24, 2023, and throughout the day, multiple wildfires devastated the area near Union Hill in southwest Rapides Parish. Investigators with the LDAF's Forestry Enforcement Division were able to determine these wildfires were caused by arson. LDAF Investigators, Louisiana State Fire Marshal Deputies, and Rapides Parish Sheriff's Office Detectives are actively investigating this matter.

Vernon Parish

For over a week now, multiple wildfires have devastated Vernon Parish. A large number of these fires are caused by natural or mechanical causes. However, wildfire investigators with the LDAF Forestry Enforcement Division have determined that the Lions Camp Fire – which threatened multiple residences and grew to 1,204 acres before it was contained – resulted from arson.

HOW TO REPORT INFORMATION:

Investigators urge you to call law enforcement if you or anyone you know has any information regarding these (or any) fires. To report an arsonist or information regarding this fire, call the LDAF 24-hour hotline at 1-855-452-5323 or the State Fire Marshal Office at 1-844-954-1221.

You can also utilize the State Fire Marshal Office's online tip form at **www.lasfm.org**. All calls to the LDAF hotline are anonymous, and the Louisiana Forestry Association is offering up to a \$2,000 cash reward for information that leads to the arrest and conviction of the person or persons responsible for the crime.

Note: All persons accused of any crime are considered innocent until proven guilty in a court of law.

USDA updates payment rate for Livestock Indemnity Program (LIP)

Disaster assistance for producers hard-hit by heat and humidity

The USDA's Farm Service Agency (FSA) has announced an improvement to the Livestock Indemnity Program (LIP) in the form of an increase in payment rates for non-adult beef calves over 800 pounds. This update is intended to support livestock producers in the Midwest who have lost cattle to the extreme

heat and humidity experienced this summer.

FSA is updating the 2023 LIP payment rate for beef cattle over 800 pounds from \$1,244 per head to \$1,618 per head (an increase of \$374), which is more reflective of typical weights and values for older cattle.



"The recent heat domes plaguing many parts of the country have proven to be unsurvivable for some animals and temperatures are not expected to let up any time soon. This is one of the latest, many examples of how a changing climate is creating immediate challenges for farmers and ranchers, and we're finding that our emergency relief programs need to adapt accordingly," said FSA Administrator Zach Ducheneaux.

"Given these circumstances and the trend towards higher weights in feedlots, it became clear that USDA's Livestock Indemnity Payment rates were not reflective of the true market value for cattle. This change will better indemnify the investments producers have in the livestock they raise, and we will continue to find flexibilities where possible to help our farmers and ranchers in the wake of climate-related impacts."

LIP provides benefits to livestock owners and some contract growers for livestock deaths exceeding normal mortality from eligible adverse weather events, certain predation losses and reduced sales prices due to injury from an eligible loss. Indemnity payments are made at a rate of 75% of the prior year's average fair market value of the livestock.

The updated LIP payment rate is effective immediately and will be applied retroactively starting Jan. 1, 2023, for all eligible causes of loss including excessive heat, tornado, winter storms, and other qualifying adverse weather. Producers who have already received LIP payments for 2023 losses will receive an additional payment, if applicable, commensurate with this updated rate.

FSA recognizes that an annual update of LIP payment rates does not account for the volatile nature of livestock markets and is further exploring flexibilities to establish more current payment rates.

Louisiana awarded Specialty Crop Block Grant funding

The USDA Agricultural Marketing Service (AMS) awarded over \$355,000 in Fiscal Year 2023 Specialty Crop Block Grant Program (SCBGP) funding to Louisiana. With this grant, the Louisiana Department of Agriculture and Forestry (LDAF) will fund projects that enhance the competitiveness of specialty crop products and create new market opportunities for the state's specialty crop producers.

"With this year's Specialty Crop Block Grant funding, Louisiana is investing in innovative projects that will help address the needs of specialty crop producers within the region," said USDA Under Secretary for Marketing and Regulatory Programs Jenny Lester Moffitt. "The funded projects will also further USDA's efforts to ensure U.S. specialty crop products remain competitive in markets across the nation and abroad."

Through the SCBGP, LDAF will fund five projects. Among LDAF's projects, is a Louisiana State University Agricultural Center field and laboratory study on the effects of soil fertility and microclimate management practices on the growth of highquality tea plants. Additional funded projects will research the effects of manure usage on soil health and food safety, the application of organic friendly antimicrobial agents, and the effectiveness of cold plasma on reducing pathogens.

"Agriculture is at the center of what we do here in Louisiana, and our specialty crops play an important role in our agricultural landscape. The Specialty Crop Block Grant funds are a great tool to boost the competitiveness of Louisiana specialty crops through marketing and promotion, research and development, expanding availability and access,


and addressing challenges confronting our producers," remarked LDAF Commissioner Mike Strain, DVM.

"Through this project, we aim to develop research opportunities for our specialty crops, ensuring our farmers receive the tools they need to continue growing Louisiana's agricultural industry. Projects include objectives such as evaluating food safety indicators, researching health and fertility regarding specific specialty crops, reducing postharvest deterioration while maintaining market quality for certain crops, and many others. These projects will lead to overall success for Louisiana specialty crop farmers by bringing together science, engineering, technology, and agriculture."

The funding to Louisiana is part of a total of \$72.9 million in non-competitive FY 2023 SCBGP

funding awarded to 54 states, territories, and the District of Columbia. The SCBGP funding supports farmers growing specialty crops, including fruits, vegetables, tree nuts, nursery crops. USDA's support will strengthen U.S. specialty crop production and markets, ensuring an abundant, affordable supply of highly nutritious fruits, vegetables, and other specialty crops, which are vital to the health and well-being of all Americans.

The funding for the SCBGP grants is authorized by the 2018 Farm Bill and FY2023 funding is awarded for a three-year period beginning Sept. 30, 2023. Since 2006, USDA has invested over \$1 billion through the SCBGP to fund nearly 12,000 projects that have increased the long-term successes of producers and enhanced marketing opportunities for U.S. specialty crops products.

USDA establishes new urban service center in Louisiana

The USDA is opening 17 new Urban Service Centers in the next year, including one in New Orleans, and investing in new partnerships to support urban agriculture.

The Urban Service Centers will be staffed by FSA and Natural Resources Conservation Service (NRCS) employees and will offer assistance and risk management programs. USDA works with agricultural producers through a network of more than 2,300 Service Centers nationwide and the new Urban Service Centers will strengthen services to urban agricultural producers.

"Every producer deserves USDA support in their own community, whether that community is in an urban or rural setting," said Richard Kacir, NRCS State Conservationist in Louisiana.

"We encourage people in urban communities to connect with us and learn what programs and services we have to meet their unique needs."

To help strengthen Urban Service Centers and Urban County Committees, USDA is investing American Rescue Plan funds into partnerships with communitybased organizations. This is part of USDA's broad support for urban agriculture and innovative production.

FSA has awarded cooperative agreements to organizations located in cities where USDA is opening Urban Service Centers or will have an urban county committee, including NOLA.

Through outreach, engagement, education, research and technical Sprout assistance. other community-based organizations and stakeholders, will work to improve the coordination and effectiveness of USDA programs and services for urban and innovative producers and help mitigate economic disruptions by funding projects designed to increase equity in urban food systems.

The new cooperative agreements and Urban Service Center is part of USDA's broader USDA investment in urban agriculture in New Orleans.

The new urban service center is located at 2520 Bayou Road in New Orleans.



Who should attend this food safety training?

This training is for fruit and vegetable growers and others interested in learning about produce safety, the Food Safety Modernization Act (FSMA) Produce Safety Rule, and comanagement of natural resources and food safety.

This course satisfies the FSMA Produce Safety Rule requirement outlined in Section 112.22(c) that requires 'At least one supervisor or responsible party for your farm must have successfully completed food safety training at least equivalent to that received under standardized curriculum recognized as adequate by the Food and Drug Administration.'

The \$20 registration fee includes: PSA Growers Training Manual, the PSA/AFDO Certificate of Course Completion, USB drive with educational materials, and light refreshments and lunch on both days. Three potable handwashing stations will be given out to three randomly selected farms.

This training is heavily subsidized by the La. Dept. of Agriculture & Forestry's support through FDA Grant PAR-16-137 and the USDA-LDAF Specialty Crop Block Grant Program.
