

ENDLESS PASTA-BILITIES

In the latest issue of CRAWFISH TALES with Commissioner Mike Strain, DVM, we got to noodle around with Michael Gardner, creator and owner of Pasta Lab in Lake Charles.

There's a quote from Willy Wonka on the wall of Pasta Lab: "We are the music makers, and we are the dreamers of dreams." Flashing bright eyes and an easy smile, Gardner exudes a delightful exuberance that's indeed reminiscent of the famous chocolatier. Pasta Lab combines art, science, passion, and purpose, in a fun and fabulous environment that's conducive to both learning and laughter.

"When you get pasta at the grocery store, nothing's wrong with it... except everything," jokes Gardner. Here in his Louisiana Pasta Lab, he's trying to fix that by using the correct ingredients and the correct process. To start, that means the right flour and the right liquid, sometimes spring water, sometimes egg yolk.

After grabbing a fresh dough ball, he walked us through a few steps in the sheeting process: breaking down the ball and rolling it ever thinner, until it's in the form of what's known as a "sfoglia," or sheet of dough. Fun fact... sfoglia (pronounced "sfo-lee-ah") literally means "to thumb through" in Italian and refers to a type of handmade fresh egg pasta dough.

Next, Gardner and his white-coat pasta pros cut that sheet of dough into whatever length and width is needed for the type of pasta they're making. Commissioner Strain even got to try his hand at making his own pasta. "I had no idea there were so many different kinds," said Strain. "But I learned a lot today!" And you can too at Pasta Lab's hands-on classes for small groups, parties, and special events.

At Pasta Lab, you'll find all of the standard shapes and varieties. Say it with me now... bucatini, campanelle, capellini, fusilli, linguini, tagliatelle, fettuccine (with chickpea and moong bean flour), shells, radiatori, macaroni, rigatoni, penne, ditalini, and lovely round Oh!s.

> And though the shapes might look familiar, Gardner reminds folks that their pasta may taste and feel different than what they've been eating. "If you're in northern Italy and you're having noodles, they're silky. Silky. They're not like what we have in a grocery store here," he says. "The good news is you don't have to go all the way to Italy," he adds. "You'll find it right here. We're doing it right."

> Pasta Lab plays with lots of infused pasta, some in unique flavors, specially created for Louisiana cuisine. You'll find lemon zest, cracked black pepper, basil, sun-dried tomatoes, and hickory, among others. They've even created a Pastalaya kit made with their hickory-infused shells.

Deadline for RFSI grant applications is April 15

Applications for the Resilient Food Systems Infrastructure (RFSI) program are due no later than 4:30 p.m. CT on April 15, 2024.

The goal of the RFSI program is to build resilience in the middle-of-the-food-supply-chain, increase and streamline markets for small farms and local businesses, and support the development of value-added products for consumers that will lead to fair prices, fair wages, and new job opportunities.

RFSI grants will help fund those in our local supply chain that process, transport, and distribute our food. This funding will create new opportunities, strengthen markets for local farmers, and increase stability for consumers. Funds will support expanded capacity for aggregating, processing, manufacturing, storing, transporting, wholesaling, and distributing locally and regionally produced food products, including specialty crops, dairy, grains for eating, and aquaculture. RFSI funds exclude meat, wild-caught seafood, and poultry products as those products are funded through other USDA programs.







STRAWBERRY CHEESECAKE IN A GLASS

Ingredients:

- 1 pint basket Louisiana strawberries, stemmed and sliced
- 3 tablespoons currant jelly or 2 tablespoons sugar
- 8 ounces light cream cheese, softened
- 3 tablespoons skim milk
- 2 tablespoons lemon juice
- 2 tablespoons sugar
- 1 cup light whipped topping
- 1 cup graham cracker crumbs

Instructions:

In bowl, toss strawberries with jelly; cover and set aside. In mixer bowl, beat cheese, milk, juice and sugar until smooth, fold in whipped topping. Spoon 2 tablespoons crumbs into each of four 8-to-10-ounces stemmed glasses; top each with about 1/4 cup of the strawberries, 1/2 cup of the cream cheese mixture, then the remaining crumbs and strawberries, dividing equally. Serve immediately or cover and refrigerate up to 6 hours.

BOURBON PECAN PIE

Ingredients:

- 1 pie crust homemade or store-bought
- 3 large eggs room temperature and well beaten
- ½ cup light corn syrup
- 1/2 cup brown sugar
- $\frac{1}{2}$ cup granulated sugar
- 1/4 cup unsalted butter melted and slightly cooled
- 1½ teaspoons pure vanilla extract
- 1½ cups chopped pecans
- 1/2 cup Barnabas Duffel Bourbon

Instructions:

Prepare a 9-inch pie plate with the pie dough. Preheat oven to 400°F. Place the pie plate in the refrigerator and allow the dough to chill for about 15-20 minutes while the oven is preheating. Once the oven is preheated, line the dough with parchment paper or foil and fill with pie weights, beans or rice. Bake at 400°F for 15 minutes or until the edges of the crust start to lightly brown. Remove from the oven, carefully remove the parchment paper (or foil) and the pie weights. Return to the oven and bake for an additional 6-8 minutes or until the bottom of the crust looks dry. Remove from the oven. Reduce oven temperature to 375°F.

In a large mixing bowl, whisk together the beaten eggs, corn syrup, brown sugar, and granulated sugar until fully combined. Whisk in the melted butter and vanilla extract until well combined, then stir in the chopped pecans and bourbon. Pour the pecan pie filling into the warm pre-baked crust. Bake at 375°F for 40-45 minutes or until the top of the pie is set. Remove the pie from the oven and allow to cool completely at room temperature.

Fatigue has serious negative impacts on physical and mental health. Operating machinery when you're sleep deprived can be as dangerous as operating machinery under the influence.

Increased physical and mental demands can result in poor sleep, which increases the risk for injuries. While seasonality is a part of farming, it is important to be aware of the consequences fatigue can have, and what you can do to promote safety and health on your farm.

Take a moment, set down the coffee, and review this Farm Safety Check to check in on fatigue and help prevent injuries.

SAFETY CHECKLIST

Learn to recognize the signs, symptoms and possible strategies to address fatique:

- Are you prioritizing rest, recovery, and sleep? Staying wellrested is essential for safe work performance?
- Are you aware of the symptoms of fatigue? These can include drowsiness, apathy, dizziness, headaches, vision impairments, poor concentration, slow reflexes, changes in mood.
- Are you managing stress? Strategies include a regular short walk, talk with a friend, or practice mindfulness. High stress levels can contribute to fatigue.
- Have you maintained a balanced diet with adequate hydration?
- Are you heavily reliant on caffeine? This could indicate fatique.
- Have you had a recent physical exam? Fatigue can be a symptom or caused by multiple medical conditions (depression, anemia, medication side effects, etc.).
- Does your safety plan for employees address fatigue management? This could include work maximums, rest minimums, and working in pairs.
- Have you established reliable and regular communication on the farm? Both fatigue and working alone can be risky to farmers.

The pest advice: Start early, scout often

If you see a farmer wandering along the road this season, odds are his car didn't strand him and he's probably not headed home from the bar now that Mardi Gras has ended. More likely, he's searching for stinkbugs - and if so, he definitely has probable cause.

Data collected in Mississippi in 2022 shows stinkbugs infested over 2.1 million acres of sovbeans across the state, with estimated bushel lost topping 3.9 million. The overall loss plus cost to spray means farmers shelled out over \$79 million to the southern pests.

With soybeans covering significant acreage across Mississippi, Louisiana and Arkansas, seeking out and stymying their efforts in soy sabotage has become paramount season after season.

"For us in Louisiana, our main pest concern is in our soybeans, because our largest acreage is our soybean acreage," said LSU soybean integrated pest management specialist Jeff Davis. "For us in 2023 it was stinkbugs and primarily the red banded stinkbug.'

Eyes on non-native stinkbugs in 2024

Native stinkbug species, particularly green and brown varieties caused roughly 38% of the total stinkbug pest impact on Mississippi crops in 2022, while the red banded stinkbug was responsible for 40% of the total crop impact on its own.

Red banded stink bugs cause the most impacts partially because of their devotion to solely feeding on legumes, which makes soybeans a prime target. Additionally, red banded stinkbugs make their stake in farmers crops early and then endure for a seasonlong siege.

In addition to in-field staying power, red banded stinkbugs are equipped to create more damage to soy seeds thanks to a specialized enzyme that allows them to puncture deeper into the seed, which accounts for a significant portion of the overall bushel loss. However, there is hope for significantly less loss in 2024.

"Our non-native species like our red banded stinkbug are neotropical species, so it likes the heat." Davis said. "If we get to a certain point below 23 degrees Fahrenheit, research my lab has done shows that after about seven hours of cold, up to 50% of the population could be killed."

After nine hours of low temperatures, up to 90% of the population could be killed. Weather reports from parts of northern Louisiana like Shreveport and Monroe experienced conditions over the winter that could have greatly reduced red banded stinkbug populations, even considering the possibility of bugs taking shelter.

"In the middle part of the state we saw a little less cold, I think those populations will be mainly affected from the drought and heat from the previous year," Davis said. "South and below, we didn't get as many hours of

that like killing cold. Red banded stinkbugs will probably not be affected at all."

Pest load reduced in 2023

In 2023 heat and continued drought caused profound impacts on insects. Because stinkbugs' body temperatures mirror the ambient temperature, the only way for them to cool is to seek shelter. Without heavy canopy cover to provide shade, the insects' populations and overall reproduction greatly declined.

"We did not spray as much in 2023, in part because of the heat," Davis said. "Drought also has an impact because those plants were stressed. In what seeds if they did produce, on our dryland acres there wasn't a lot of stinkbug damage, just because in general, there weren't a lot of things for those insects to be feeding on during that drought period."

Even in years with a reduced need for insecticide, Davis said rotating chemistries is important for complete control and reducing risk of resistance.

"For stinkbugs all we have are acephate, neonicotinoids or pyrethroids and if we lose any one of those two to resistance, we're going to have a problem controlling stink bugs," Davis said. "We always are interested in making sure we still have products that we can use to control insects for our growers."

Check clovers and covers

While roadsides may seem like an odd place to start crop scouting, Davis said ditches are his first place to check for stinkbugs in spring.

"Here in Louisiana, we have crimson clover all along the roadsides," Davis said. "The first place where we go to scout for our stinkbugs is those clovers and your cover crops."

cover crops especially, finding and In identifying stinkbugs early can help producers gain perspective on the overall insect threat they will face during the growing season.

"February is going to be a little warmer and we're going to have active growth going on, especially since we've had rainfall," Davis said. "Our cover crops are really going to be jumping up and doing well. I would go out and sample those right now."

Sampling early can also give growers an idea of the right timing for cover crop termination.

"If you do properly dispose and get rid of your cover crop early then those insects may move out of there and into your crops," Davis said. "So, you want to make sure you're scouting and seeing how many are in that cover crop as is it's a good indication of what you might expect to come into your fields."

Scouting soybeans correctly might look a little silly, especially knee deep in ditch grass without any actual soybeans in sight, but this season scouting early and scouting often could prevent stinkbugs

from causing serious soy losses.

The Louisiana Department of Agriculture and Forestry (LDAF) proudly partnered with other Louisiana organizations to host the 20th annual Louisiana Envirothon, an environmental problem-solving competition, at the LSU AgCenter Botanic Gardens. On Wed., March 6, teams from across the state participated in the environmental competition that included testing in aquatics, forestry, soils, wildlife, a current issue, and an oral presentation.

Staff from LDAF's Office of Soil and Water Conservation manned the Soils and Land Use station of the competition. As a natural resource used by humans to meet many of our basic needs, soil provides raw materials, stores water and nutrients, and supports growing plants that produce food and fiber. It also provides space for cities, highways, recreation, and wildlife. Nothing surrounds us more in our daily lives. At the soil station, students are tested in judging land, soil profiles, and soil factors.

At the Soils and Land Use station, students are tested on basic soils knowledge and their understanding of maps and surveys, land use and decision-making. Students are also tested on their ability to identify characteristics of a soil pit or soil sample, including horizons, color, structure, texture, and special features.

This year recent rains prevented the use of a pit, so students had to use pre-collected soil samples from the site for their testing purposes. After being introduced to the site and structure of the test, students used two soil samples to identify the color of the soil using three specific characteristics — hue, value, and chroma.

The second sample is for students to determine texture of the provided soil. Texture relates to the make-up of the soil, which can include sand, silt, or clay, or a combination of any of them. The soil texture determines the amount of water and air soil can hold, and the ease of which it can be worked. Soil texture provides insight to which plants would grow best in an area.

This year, with no pit, students used a soil monolith with a sample of the soil from the test site. A soil monolith is a vertical slice of soil taken from the ground, including the topsoil and subsoils. Using this soil monolith, students can identify the soil horizons. Horizons are the separate layers, parallel to the soil surface, each with different characteristics.

LDAF's partnership with the Natural Resources Conservation Service (NRCS) at the soils station is invaluable. Special thanks to Brandon Waltman of NRCS, who also serves at the Assistant State Soil Scientist. Brandon works with LDAF to make the soils station possible by visiting the test site prior to the competition, assisting with sample collection, and scoring the pit (or monolith). Additionally, Brandon also participates in training teams prior to the state and national competitions.

Participating schools this year included Arden Cahill Academy, Baton Rouge Magnet High School, Caddo Magnet High School, Central High School, Doyle High School, Lafayette High School, Live Oak High School, Patrick F. Taylor Science & Technology Academy, Scotlandville Magnet High School, and St. Anthony's School.

Cover crops to surge under USDA's green initiative

In a significant move towards bolstering sustainable agriculture, the American Seed Trade Association (ASTA) has provided an optimistic projection for the future of cover cropping in the United States. Based on a recent survey, ASTA predicts that the USDA's Partnerships for Climate Smart-Commodities will lead to an increase of 10.5 million acres in cover crop planting over five years.

ASTA's president, Andy LaVigne, emphasized the importance of cover crops in modern agriculture, advocating for their role in economic and environmental sustainability. He further encouraged farmers to leverage ASTA's resources for finding reliable seed sources, illustrating the industry's dedication to supporting American agriculture's shift towards more sustainable practices.

As the agricultural landscape evolves, the partnership between ASTA, USDA, and farmers symbolizes a collective move towards a more resilient and environmentally friendly farming future.

USDA announces new final rule under Packers & Stockyards Act

The U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) announced the finalization of Inclusive Competition and Market Integrity Under the Packers and Stockyards Act.

The final rule will be effective May 6, 2024 (60 days following publication in the Federal Register). The final rule Inclusive Competition and Market Integrity Under the Packers and Stockyards Act (the Inclusive Competition Rule) establishes clearer, more effective standards under the Packers and Stockyards (P&S) Act for prohibited practices relating to discrimination, retaliation and deception in contracting. This will help producers and growers that have suffered from increasingly consolidated markets over the last 30 years by enhancing market integrity and ensuring fair access to economic opportunities.

This rule establishes clearer, more effective standards to govern the modern marketplace, and they are another example of how USDA is focused on building new, fairer, more resilient and more competitive markets for our farmers, ranchers, and producers."

Actions include enhancing independent meat and poultry and other diversified food

processing capacity, expanding domestic, innovative fertilizer production, creating a fairer market for seeds and other agriculture inputs, investing in State Attorney General enforcement capacity and supporting more robust and resilient supply chains. These investments will create better economic opportunities, which will result in more affordable prices and choices for consumers at the grocery store, in addition to more opportunities and revenue for producers.

The rule:

- Prohibits the adverse treatment of livestock producers and poultry growers based on race, color, religion, national origin, sex (including pregnancy, sexual orientation, and gender identity), disability, marital status, or age. It also prohibits discrimination against a livestock and poultry producer cooperative.
- Prohibits retaliation against producers and growers for their engaging in certain protected activities: lawful communications or refusals to communicate, assertion of contractual

and Packers & Stockyards Act rights, participation in associations and cooperatives, exploring or entering into a business relationship with a competing packer/swine contractor/live poultry dealer, and certain other protected activities.

- Prohibits employing false or misleading statements or omissions of material information in contract formation, performance, and termination; and prohibits regulated entities from providing false or misleading representations regarding refusal to contract.
- Supports USDA monitoring, evaluation, and enforcement of compliance with aspects of this rule through certain recordkeeping requirements.

This rule is part of a suite of Packers and Stockyards Act rules proposed by USDA to enhance transparency, stop discrimination, and support market fairness in a range of circumstances. The final rule will be published in the Federal Register.



- WMA Access Permits are included with the La. Sportsman's Paradise License, Senior Hunting/Fishing License, & Lifetime Licenses. Or you can purchase an annual permit (\$20) or a 5-day permit (\$5).

What is a Self-Clearing permit?


• A Self-Clearing Permit is required for all activities on WMAs, refuges, and conservation areas. It consists of two portions: check-in and check-out.

Where is the parking area?

There is parking next to the office.

Can I camp with my horses?

• We offer both primitive camping and over 130 sites with hook-ups. At this time, trailers with bunkhouses can utilize designated areas within the primitive camping area for overnight camping.
