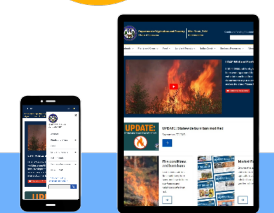
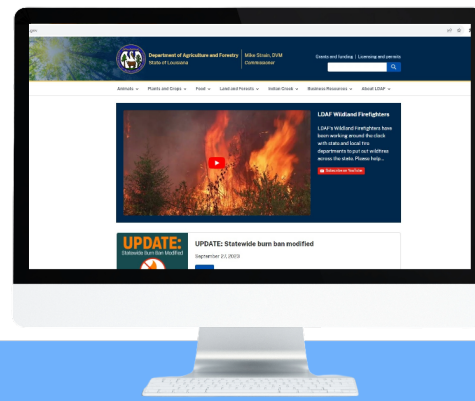
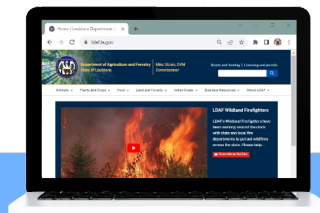

Exceptional drought continues; stay vigilant and follow burn bans

According to the Drought Monitor, Louisiana is experiencing its most widespread "Exceptional" drought in more than two decades. The latest Drought Monitor analysis released on Thursday, October 26, indicated that just over two-thirds of Louisiana has been classified in "Exceptional" drought, the highest level. That's the state's most widespread exceptional drought in the 23-year-plus history of the Drought Monitor.

This is an expansion from 62% to 68% of the state now at a level 5 — "Exceptional." The parts of the state that are not classified as "Exceptional" fall into the "severe" and "extreme" drought categories, leaving 98.8% of the state in serious drought conditions.

With drought conditions as they are, it should be no surprise that parishes that had previously opted out of the stateside burn ban have now reinstated the burn bans for their parishes. As you may recall, the Office of Louisiana State Fire Marshal modified its statewide burn ban, re-issued on August 25, to renew and establish certain exceptions. The active burn ban order in effect as of August 25, 2023,

at 12 p.m., which prohibited all private burning, with no limitations, pursuant to authority under R.S. 40:1602, was modified to include the following provisions:

- Provide for individual parishes to opt out of the statewide burn ban.
- Provide for fire chiefs to resume granting burn permissions.
- Provide for certain live fire training to resume with written permission from the SFM.

We are now seeing parishes reinstate burn bans. If it's not published on your parish government's website or social media sites, you can check the Louisiana Department of Agriculture and Forestry: www.ldaf.state.la.us/programs/parish-burn-bans/.

Please abide by all active burn bans. Violations of burn ban orders could result in criminal and/or civil penalties. In the event of an emergency that requires immediate wildfire assistance, you can call the LDAF 24-Hour Emergency Hotline at 1-855-452-5323 or dial 911.

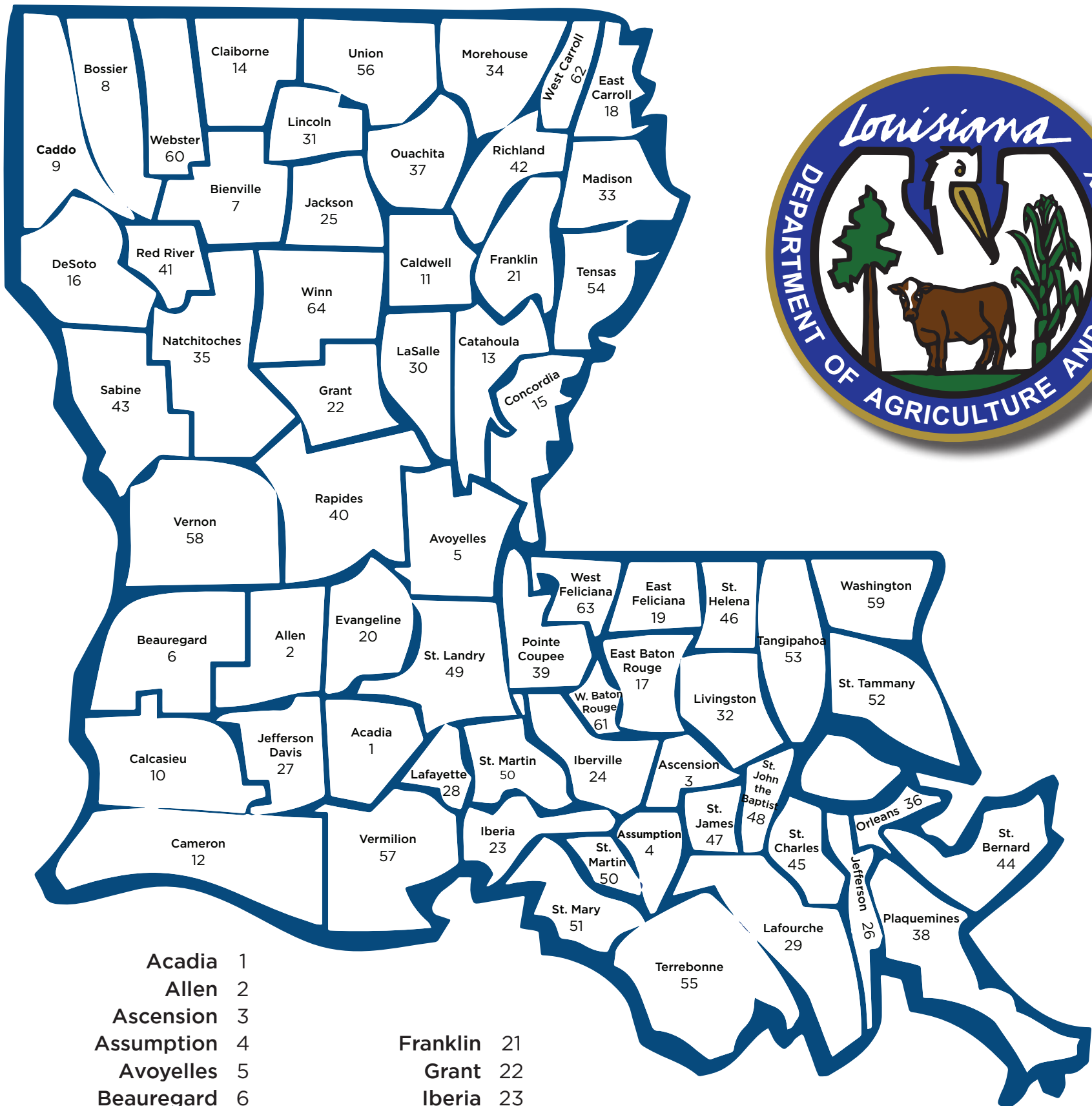

Virgin bulls must have a breeder's certification of virgin status signed by the breeder, the breeder's agent, or an accredited veterinarian. 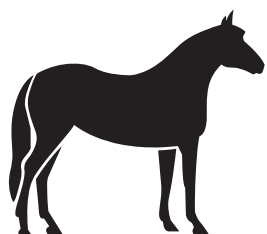

BBQ SHRIMP

Submitted by Shuck-N-Dive Cajun Cafe

Ingredients:

2 dozen jumbo shrimp with heads on and unpeeled.
 (Important: You will need to snip the beak of the shrimp with shears to allow the fat to incorporate into the sauce.)
 ½ cup Worcestershire sauce (We use Cajun Power.)
 1 jumbo lemon or more if desired, rolled and juiced completely
 2 teaspoons ground black pepper
 2 teaspoons cracked black pepper
 2 teaspoons Cajun or Creole seasoning
 ¼ cup Cajun Power Garlic Sauce (or hot sauce, to taste)
 Pinch white pepper
 2 teaspoons garlic, chopped
 3-4 sticks cold unsalted butter, cubed
 Chopped parsley for garnish
 Serve over our toasted crunchy French bread

Instructions:

In a large skillet, combine shrimp, Worcestershire sauce, garlic sauce, lemon juice, peppers, and Creole seasoning. Simmer for 10 minutes, then add the shrimp and garlic and cook over moderately high heat until shrimp turns pink, about 1 minute on each side. Reduce heat to a low simmer and stir in butter, a few cubes at a time, stirring constantly and adding more only when butter is melted. Pour over bread in a large bowl. Save some bread for dipping.

Notes: Butter, butter, butter!!! That's the key... lots of butter! Make sure to emulsify the sauce. To achieve that, add a little butter at a time while stirring constantly and vigorously. And don't overcook the shrimp or they'll become chewy and hard to peel.

CHICKEN AND SAUSAGE OR SEAFOOD GUMBO

Submitted by Curvy Creole

Ingredients:

1 whole chicken, cut up
 1 package smoked sausage
 1 16-ounce jar of Curvy Creole Already Seasoned Roux
 8 quarts of water

Shrimp

Instructions:

Preheat oven to 350°F. Fill Gumbo Pot or large cooking pot with 8 quarts water. Add Curvy Creole Already Seasoned Roux and stir till roux dissolves in water and slight boil. (If using turkey neck and Tasso, add now). Continue to cook on medium/high heat for 2 hours stirring occasionally. Place unseasoned chicken and cut sausages in pan and bake in oven for 20 minutes.

At 2-hour mark, add meat (chicken and sausage) or (shrimp, crawfish tails, crab claws, and crab legs) to pot and stir occasionally for additional 30-45 minutes then serve over rice.

Suggestions: First scoop rice into bowl then add gumbo. If desired, add gumbo filé (Sassafras) on top with a dash of Tabasco. Also great with potato salad on the side. Freezes well; when ready to eat, remove from freezer bag and heat with little water over stove.



PECAN POPCORN CHICKEN

Submitted by Sugar Land Pecan

Ingredients:

Pecan mixture:

1 ¾ cup Sugar Land pecans, finely ground in food processor
 ½ teaspoon sea salt
 ½ teaspoon pepper
 ½ teaspoon paprika
 ¼ teaspoon cayenne
 ½ teaspoon garlic powder
 ½ teaspoon chili powder

Egg white mixture:

2 egg whites
 ½ teaspoon salt
 ½ teaspoon pepper

Other ingredients:

1 pound boneless skinless chicken breasts, cut into bite sized pieces
 ½ cup arrowroot flour
 ¼ cup avocado oil, pecan oil, or oil of choice, more as necessary for frying

Cajun garlic dipping sauce (yields 1/3 cup):

1 tablespoon Dijon mustard
 3 garlic cloves minced
 ⅓ cup mayonnaise
 ¼ teaspoon sea salt, more to taste
 ½ teaspoon pepper
 1 teaspoon paprika
 1 teaspoon onion powder
 1 teaspoon garlic powder
 ¼ teaspoon cayenne pepper
 2 teaspoons Italian seasoning
 1 teaspoon lemon juice

Instructions:

Mix all ingredients for the pecan mixture in a medium mixing bowl and set aside. Place arrowroot and egg white mixture in a separate mixing bowl and set aside. Line a baking sheet with parchment paper and set next to the three mixing bowls. Place chicken in the egg mixture, dredge in arrowroot flour, place back into the egg mixture and then dredge in pecan mixture. Make sure to coat the chicken generously in the pecan mix.

Heat the avocado oil in a large skillet over medium heat. Splash a drop of water in it, if it sizzles, it is ready to go! Carefully, place the chicken in the hot skillet and fry for about 8 to 10 minutes, or until the chicken reaches an internal temperature of 165°F.

While chicken is cooking, place the Cajun garlic dipping sauce ingredients into a high-speed blender. Blend until just combined. Taste and adjust lemon and spices as necessary. Pour into desired serving cups and set aside until ready to eat. Serve warm!

To bake the chicken poppers instead of frying:

Pre-heat oven to 400°F. Bake for 12 minutes. Transfer chicken to the top rack of the oven and broil on high for 1-2 minutes on each side, until the outside is golden and the chicken reaches an internal temperature of 165°F.

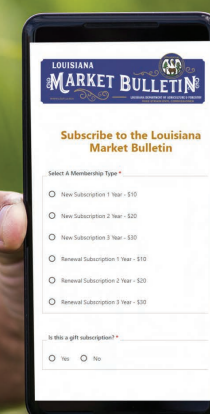

USDA gathering data on Louisiana producers' cost of pollination



During the last week of October, USDA's National Agricultural Statistics Service (NASS) will mail the November Cost of Pollination Inquiry to nearly 16,000 crop producers nationwide, including 85 Louisiana crop producers. The survey results will help producers and beekeepers monitor and react to changes in production costs. Pollination expenditures are a necessary part of agriculture and are directly tied to the health of the honey bee industry.

"Honey bees are important pollinators of multiple crops ranging from flowers to nuts to vegetables," said NASS State Statistician Kathy Broussard. "To help accurately depict the health of the pollination industry in the United States, NASS will ask crop producers about their use of honey bees, the fees they paid for honey bee pollination, and any other

expenses related to pollinating their crops."

Louisiana producers are asked to respond securely online at agaccounts.usda.gov, by mail, or by fax. Those who do not respond by November 6, 2023, may be contacted by a National Association of State Departments of Agriculture (NASDA) representative to arrange an interview to complete the survey.

For more information about the Cost of Pollination Inquiry and the NASS bee and honey program, visit nass.usda.gov/go/bees/. Other NASS honey bee reports include the Honey report published every March and the Honey Bee Colonies report published every August. For assistance with the survey, producers are encouraged to call the NASS Delta Regional Field Office at (800) 327-2970.

All information reported by producers will be used for statistical purposes only and kept confidential, as required by federal law. NASS will publish the survey data on December 15, 2023, in the Cost of Pollination report at <https://www.nass.usda.gov/Publications/> and in the Quick Stats searchable database at <https://quickstats.nass.usda.gov/>.

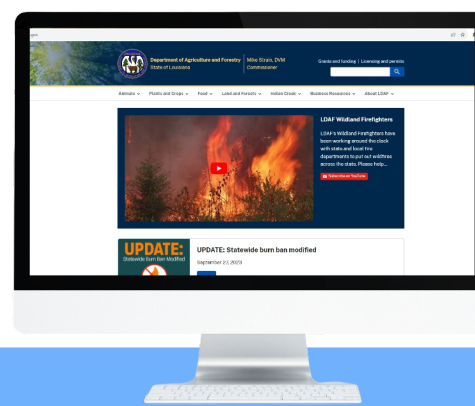
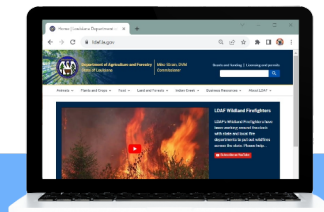
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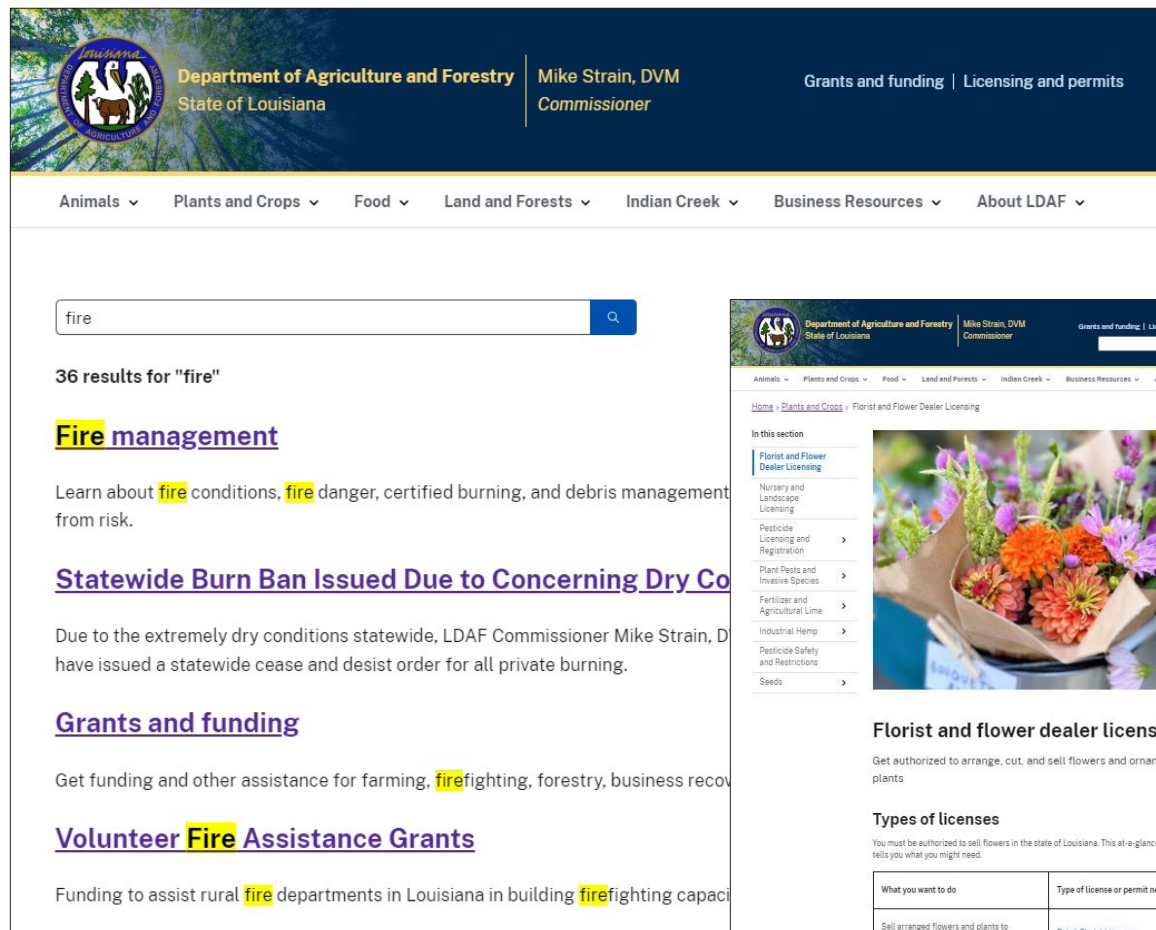
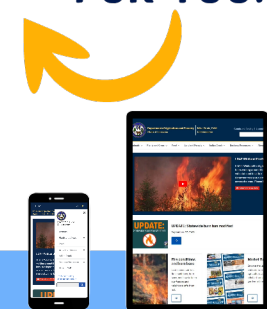


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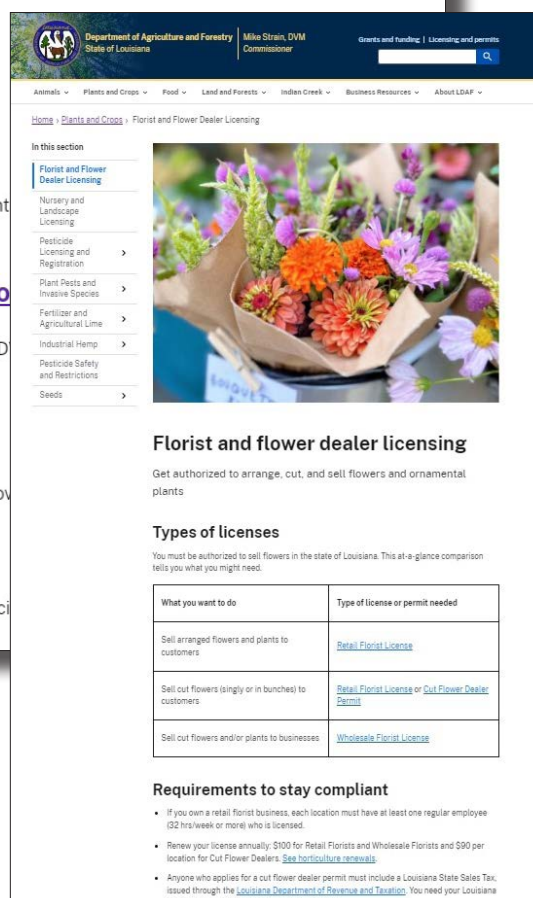
From a new dynamic search function to the mobile friendly design and improved navigation based on user surveys and testing, LDAF's new website was created with you in mind, to help you to connect to all of our resources quickly and easily.

The LDAF and website design team tested its old website's functionality by asking stakeholders to find specific information, measuring the number of clicks, the time it took to find the information, and their confidence level regarding whether they felt they found the correct information. LDAF then repeated this process with the new website and found significant improvement.

Tasks successfully completed by website users went from 50% on the old website to 96% on the new website. Users confident they found the information they needed also increased from 54% on the old site to 98% on the new website. Finally, the average number of attempts it took users to complete a task went from 4.7 on the older website to 1.2 on the new site.

"That was very easy. It leads you exactly where you need to go," noted one of the survey respondents. Another added, "It's actually a lot more educational than I thought it was going to be. I honestly didn't realize how many avenues you can go into. For what it covers, this one is like 10 times better than the other one."

USDA allocates \$27.6 million to support underserved & veteran farmers and ranchers

The U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) has announced \$27.6 million in grants to provide training, outreach and technical assistance to underserved and veteran farmers, ranchers, and foresters to help them own and operate successful farms, ranches, and forest lands. Funding is made through USDA's 2501 Program. The 2501 program is administered by the USDA Office of Partnerships and Public Engagement (OPPE).

"The 2501 Program demonstrates USDA's commitment to improving the livelihoods of the country's underserved and veteran farmers, ranchers and foresters by ensuring that they have access to and are equipped with the resources, knowledge and tools to be successful," said OPPE Director Lisa Ramirez. "This program is part of USDA's commitment to equity and inclusion for underserved communities and reducing barriers to USDA programs and resources."

In 2023, USDA is investing \$27.6 million in grants to 41 organizations in 27 states for their efforts to provide outreach and technical assistance to underserved and veteran farmers and ranchers. This funding is made available through the Agriculture Improvement Act of 2018.

Among the 2501 Program awardees is the Recirculating Farms Coalition's Growing Local Veterans in Agriculture project, serving Orleans, Jefferson, and Plaquemines parishes in Louisiana. This project is designed to serve veterans, student-veterans, active military transitioning to veterans, and those from socially and economically disadvantaged populations. Participants will be offered internships at working farms and the VA and matched with local mentor-farmers for long-term support on future endeavors. The project will provide farming education, training, connections to USDA programs

and support, internships, and mentoring to Veterans.

The 2501 Program was created through the 1990 Farm Bill to help underserved farmers, ranchers and foresters who have historically experienced limited access to USDA loans, grants, training and technical assistance. The 2014 Farm Bill expanded the program to include veterans. Grants are awarded to higher education institutions and nonprofit and community-based organizations to extend USDA's engagement efforts in underserved and veteran communities.

Projects funded under the 2501 Program include, but are not limited to, conferences, workshops, and demonstrations on various farming techniques, and connecting underserved farmers and ranchers to USDA resources and services. Since 2010, the 2501 Program has provided more than \$221 million dollars to fund more than 657 projects.

Railroad crossing safety reminders

- Always expect a train and look both ways before crossing.
- Only cross the tracks at designated railroad crossings, located where the street intersects with the tracks.
- Never walk between the rails or areas that are not designated railroad crossings.
- Avoid distractions including loud music, texting or talking on cell phones when crossing the railroad tracks.
- Stay away from trains and other railroad property, including trestles, yards and equipment.
- Report emergencies or suspicious activity on the tracks to Union Pacific's Response Management Communication Center at 888-877-7267 or 911.

Harvest time... practice railroad safety

With the 2023 Louisiana sugarcane harvest in full swing, sugarcane producers should advise their drivers of proper railroad crossing safety.

Railroad crossing safety is always an important matter and Union Pacific Railroad is saying "Call before you haul" and "Find the blue and white to save your life" in a series of English and Spanish language public service announcements.

At all railroad crossings is a blue and white sign with a toll-free number to call if a driver or tractor operator gets stuck on a crossing. Each crossing has a blue and white sign identifying the crossing and a toll-free phone number and the crossing identification number.

Sugarcane farmers can also give advance notice to the train dispatcher of harvesting activities on a particular time and day. Farmers can call the number at a particular crossing to advise the train dispatcher of harvest activities at public and private railroad crossings. Written orders will be issued to train crews about harvest activities and dictate that the crew will sound whistles.

"The advanced notification is a huge opportunity for our Train Crews to know what to expect while operating trains," said Buck Russel of UP's public safety office. "The notification also goes to our police, operating, senior leadership, maintenance, engineering, and safety teams."

Russel recommends calling the phone number on the blue and white sign at the railroad crossing but another emergency number, 888-877-7267 (888-UPRR-COP), is also available. The phone numbers on the blue and white signs and the 888-UPRR-COP numbers call the Union Pacific Emergency Center in Omaha.

There are also educational opportunities for railroad safety teams to go to selected crossings and pass out traffic safety information to farm drivers and other motorists.

LSU AgCenter scientist receives grant for drone research in sugarcane

Technological advances in artificial intelligence are making way for improved data collection for agricultural producers.

LSU AgCenter sugarcane breeder Collins Kimbeng has received a \$288,690 award over three years from The John Deere Company to study remote sensing and artificial intelligence for supporting sugarcane breeding and forecasting sugar yield.

“This project seeks to bring together expertise in artificial intelligence, precision agriculture and sugarcane breeding and also the benevolence of John Deere to solve two recalcitrant issues in the sugar industry,” he said.

The two goals of the study are to obtain accurate measurements of traits in the early stages of a sugarcane breeding program and the ability to forecast the best time to harvest a field to maximize sugar yield.

Kimbeng said the introduction of drones into sugarcane breeding will help his team work smarter rather than harder.

“Without this technology, we would have a number of people in the fields pulling samples to determine variety yield components,” he said.

Each year, the AgCenter Sugar Research Station examines more than 100,000 seedlings, of which

only one or two will make it to the field as a sugarcane variety.

Kimbeng said a major problem is that the selection process is subjective.

“We put a lot of people in the field, and they all think they know what they are looking for,” he said. “But they could all have a personal bias.”

Cutting and weighing thousands of samples is time consuming. Kimbeng and his colleagues can now decrease the time and labor required with the use of technology.

“With this new remote sensing and artificial intelligence technology, we can take the weight of 100 samples,” he said. “We then input the information into the computer program and the drone can take the measurements we need with the help of onboard cameras.”

Drones will be used to acquire hyperspectral images from trials in the breeding program, including thousands of potential new varieties as well as fields planted with existing varieties.

“Data will be collected over several time series, and ground-truthing data will also be collected to accompany the drone data,” Kimbeng said. “Statistical models will be developed to select the best predictive model containing the most appropriate wavelength to predict trait performance.”

If successful, this effort will lead to a more efficient selection process in the breeding program and a better way to predict sugar yield performance in the industry before harvest, he said.

Kimbeng will be joined in the project by AgCenter statistician Thanos Gentimis and precision agriculture expert Tri Setiyono.

Madison Parish man arrested for livestock theft

On October 23, Ammarian D. Reed of Tallulah, La., was arrested for livestock theft by inspectors with the Louisiana Department of Agriculture and Forestry's (LDAF) Livestock Brand Commission. The arrest was the result of warrants in both Madison and Richland parishes.

An investigation by the Livestock Brand Commission alleges that during September and/or October of 2023, 24-year-old Reed illegally removed (without the owner's permission) two horses from one victim and four horses from another victim, both located in Madison Parish. The six horses were subsequently sold at a livestock dealer in Morehouse Parish. The investigation further determined that Reed had allegedly removed two additional horses from a pasture in Richland Parish in December of 2022, without the owner's permission, which he sold to a livestock dealer in Morehouse Parish. At the time of this report, two of the horses have been recovered and returned to the owner.

Reed was arrested in Madison Parish by brand inspectors. He was booked on that warrant with a bond set at \$60,000 and is pending transportation to Richland Parish with a bond of \$10,000.

"LDAF brand inspectors investigate all agricultural crimes in the state," said Commissioner Mike Strain, DVM. "We work closely with local law enforcement agencies and permitted livestock dealers to monitor suspicious activities of individuals and solve these crimes."

LDAF's Livestock Brand Commission was assisted in this investigation by the Richland Parish and Madison Parish sheriff's departments.

The Livestock Brand Commission maintains a 24-hour Crimestoppers hotline at (800) 558-9741 for the public to report thefts or other agriculture-related crimes. Note: All persons accused of any crime are considered innocent until proven guilty in a court of law.
