THE PERFECT BITE: SIMPLY CHEESECAKES, COMPLEX FLAVORS



In a recent episode of CRAWFISH TALES with Commissioner Mike Strain, DVM, we got the sweet treatment with Alexandra Benjamin of Simply Cheesecakes & More by Alexandra.

This wholesale manufacturing and distribution company out of Patterson is a Certified Louisiana company offering the perfect bite of cheesecake layered with fresh flavors that are anything but simple.

Commissioner Strain commented on the heavenly smell as soon as we walked through the door. Alexandra says her recipe is "rich and creamy with balanced sweetness." And that's just the basic cheesecake recipe.

Luckily, we were able to taste-test some of their most popular varieties. "This cheesecake is an explosion of flavor," said Commissioner Strain. "Each one is made with a specific melody of flavor in mind, from the crust to the fillings to toppings... each one is unique. It's absolutely wonderful."

All of their homemade cheesecakes are different, from the crust to the fillings to the whipped cream and toppings. Additionally, instead of slices, you'll find small single-serve cheesecakes about the size of a cupcake. They're cute, convenient, and the absolute perfect bite.

Alexandra says she descends from a long line of bakers, including her mom, grandmother, and aunts, and she joined them when she made her first cheesecake in junior high. It was just a hobby, and Alexandra routinely treated her teachers, classmates, and family

members to her cheesecake creations.

Eventually, Alexandra turned that passion into a thriving company that's become a regional favorite at local grocery stores all over south Louisiana.

This story of success hasn't been without its challenges. When Ida came through in 2021, Alexandra's operation was set up in a warehouse in Houma. With no generators and a freezer full of cheesecakes, you can imagine what happened... they lost all of their product. Two years later, with a smile on her face, she has rebuilt, refocused, and is going stronger than ever.

Much of the state remains under burn ban; check with local officials

When fire risk increases, Louisiana's state and local governments restrict outdoor burning with burn bans. Review state burning rules, and know that your local ones may be stricter, so **consult your local government before open burning**. Even when there aren't active burn bans, we recommend checking fire conditions and using safe burning practices.

As of 5 p.m. on September 27, 2023, LDAF modified its burn ban order to allow agricultural burning to resume, including but not limited to prescribed burning except for standing sugarcane. People conducting an agriculture burn are requested to notify LDAF via email (ForestProtection@ldaf.state.la.us). The location, time, and date of the burn should be included in the email.

What qualifies as agricultural burning as it relates to the recent burn ban modification? Agricultural burning is not burning piles of debris on land; it is not clearing land for development. Agricultural burning is burning for the purposes of reducing crop residue, stimulating

yield, controlling diseases and pests, or generally to maintain the productivity of agricultural lands, such as burning of residue after harvesting rice and sugarcane.

The Louisiana Office of the State Fire Marshal also modified its burn ban order to allow individual parishes to opt out of the statewide burn ban, fire chiefs to resume granting burn permissions, and certain live fire training to resume with its written permission effective as of 5 p.m., September 29, 2023. This order is reevaluated weekly. Visit <https://t.ly/Y5b9N> for more information.

Under the State Fire Marshall's burn ban modification, parishes are allowed to opt out of the statewide burn ban. You can view all parishes that have opted out of the statewide ban at www.ldaf.la.gov/land/fire/safety#state-and-local-burn-bans. Each parish should notify LDAF with a letter of intent if they'd like to opt out of the statewide burn ban via email (ForestProtection@ldaf.state.la.us). LDAF will update the Burn Ban Map with information as it is received.

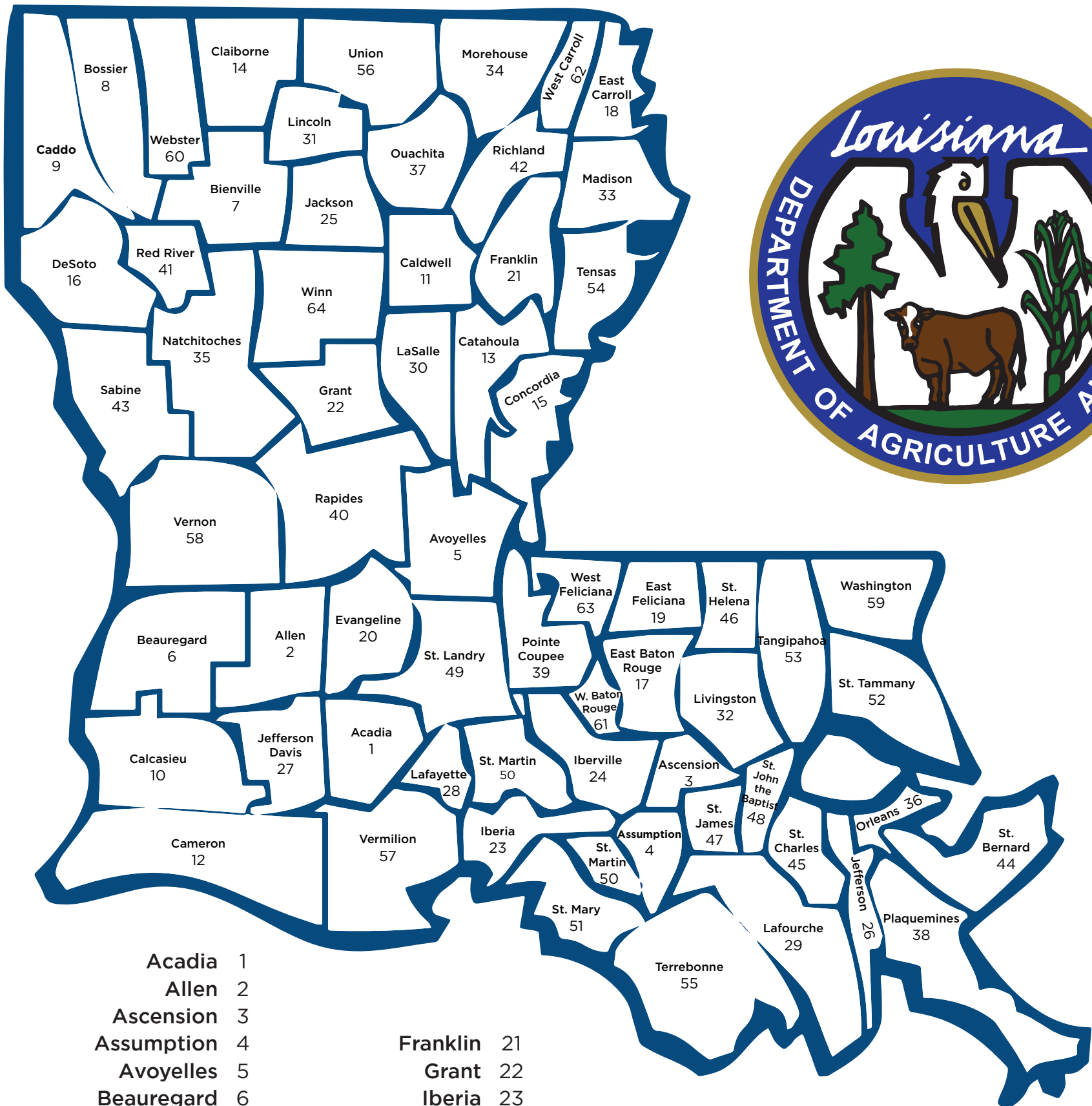

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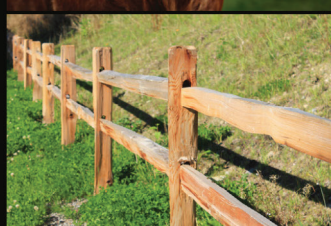

CAJUN BREAKFAST BAKE

Submitted by Richard's Cajun Foods

Ingredients:

½ 12 ounce package of Richard's Smoked Pork Sausage, sliced or chopped
 ¼ teaspoon Richard's Cajun Seasoning
 1 tablespoon olive oil
 2 medium mushrooms or 4 small, sliced
 1 small onion, sliced
 2 eggs
 3 egg whites
 ½ cup low fat milk
 4 cherry tomatoes, halved
 2 potatoes
 ½ pepper, red or green or both, sliced
 Salt and pepper to taste

Instructions:

Preheat oven to 350°F. Pierce potatoes with a skewer a few times and microwave for approximately 10 minutes or until cooked. Take out, set aside to cool, and cut into bite size pieces with skin on. In a fry pan, cook, set aside and when cooled cut into 8 pieces. In the same fry pan, heat olive oil and fry onions and peppers for 5 minutes. Now add Richard's Cajun Seasoning. Add mushrooms and keep cooking on low medium heat for a further 3 minutes, take off heat. Now you will need a small baking dish, approximately 6-7 cups in size. Lay chopped potato on the base, spread the Richard's Smoked Sausage on top. Now the onion/pepper mix. Season with some salt and pepper to taste. Instructions:

Cook the pasta according to the directions on the box and set aside. (I like to rinse the pasta after cooking it.) Boil the chicken in water with about 4 tablespoons of Geaux Creole Dust for about 20 minutes and soak for 20 minutes. Remove the chicken and set aside to cool. Save the water (stock).

In a separate skillet, sauté sausage, onions, and celery until the onions begin to turn clear. Add rotel and corn and bring to a boil. 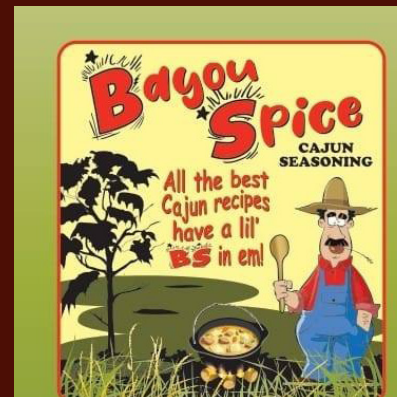

SHIVER ME METERS! Pirates take "lengths" to steal Jefferson's metric dream

In the early years of the United States, there was a fervent desire for uniformity in currency, weights, and measures. In his first State of the Union address in 1790, President George Washington acknowledged the importance of this goal, stating, "Uniformity in the Currency, Weights and Measures of the United States is an object of great importance, and will, I am persuaded, be duly attended to."

Thomas Jefferson, a man of broad interests and scientific curiosity, was particularly intrigued by the metric system that France created and was about to adopt. He believed that this system, with its logical and decimal-based measurements, could bring consistency and efficiency to the young nation. So, he reached out to his friend and renowned French scientist, Joseph Dombey.

Jefferson's request was clear: he asked Dombey to bring metric standards, including a metal rod, representing the meter, and a cylindrical weight, representing the kilogram, to the United States. Dombey, eager to

promote international scientific cooperation, embarked on a journey across the Atlantic in 1793.

However, fate had other plans for Dombey and the metric standards. While en route to the United States, Dombey's ship encountered a violent storm and found itself off course and farther south, in the Caribbean Sea. To make matters worse, France was at war with Great Britain at the time, and the ship became a target for British pirates.

In a daring raid, the pirates overtook Dombey's vessel and made off with the precious metric standards. Dombey himself was captured and held prisoner by the pirates until his unfortunate death later that year. The meter was lost forever; however, the kilogram somehow found its way into the hands of American surveyor Andrew Ellicott. It remained within the Ellicott family for generations, a tangible link to the lost dream of metric standardization in America.

It wasn't until 1952 that the kilogram was finally relinquished by the Ellicott family

and entrusted to the National Institute of Standards and Technology (NIST), marking the end of its long journey.

Tragically, the hope of adopting the metric system in the United States was forever shattered when relations between the young nation and France soured. In 1798, France hosted an international gathering in Paris which would ultimately solidify the metric system as the global standard for weights and measures. However, the United States, excluded from the event due to deteriorating diplomatic ties, missed the opportunity to be a part of this historic transformation.

Thus, despite early enthusiasm and the best intentions of figures like Thomas Jefferson, America's path to metric standardization was fraught with storms, piracy, and international politics. The metric system, while widely adopted worldwide, remained elusive on American shores for many years to come.

USDA launches nutrition hub at SU AgCenter: *Pilot program to combat diet-related diseases*

The USDA has announced the opening of a pilot Nutrition Hub under the Agricultural Science Center of Excellence for Nutrition and Diet for Better Health (ASCEND for Better Health) initiative.

The Nutrition Hub is being launched in partnership with Southern University, a historically black 1890 Land-grant University in Louisiana, and host of the USDA-funded 1890 Center of Excellence for Nutrition, Health, Wellness and Quality of Life.

USDA's new Nutrition Hub, informed by community conversations, will be an engine for providing science-based, nutrition-related information at the community level, particularly in underserved communities disproportionately impacted by diet-related chronic diseases such as obesity, type 2 diabetes and certain cancers.

The Hub strives to improve health equity by enabling community members to better understand and integrate USDA-funded nutrition research in culturally responsive ways.

"The Southern University Agricultural Research and Extension Center is extremely excited and honored to be the first university to house a USDA Nutrition Hub," said Dr. Orlando F. McMeans, Chancellor-Dean of the Southern University Ag Center and the College of Ag. "This Hub

will not only assist in combating diet-related chronic diseases in underserved communities, but it will also provide our students with the experience needed to build a workforce of nutritionists, researchers and extension agents that will aid in closing the nutrition gap in at-risk communities."

Diet-related chronic diseases are prevalent among Americans and pose a major public health problem. Today, 6 in 10 people have at least one chronic disease and 4 in 10 people have two or more chronic diseases.

These diseases significantly reduce quality and quantity of life, but many are largely preventable through proper nutrition and healthy living. The primary goal of the Nutrition Hub is to translate nutrition research into impactful solutions that improve public health and well-being, particularly in underserved communities.

Goals of the Nutrition Hub:

- Develop and share science-based nutrition information and connect communities with food and nutrition security and economic vitality programs.
- Develop relationships and partnerships with organizations that serve African American communities and clearly define community needs and opportunities around food and nutrition.
- Foster research and training opportunities in human nutrition research, particularly in underserved and underrepresented communities.
- Build current and future workforce capacity to enhance collaborations between research and those working on the front lines of community nutrition and health.

Terrebonne Parish man arrested for livestock theft

On October 3, 2023, agents with the Louisiana Department of Agriculture and Forestry's (LDAF) Livestock Brand Commission arrested 49-year-old Louis Michael Hess, of Houma, La., on a warrant for theft of livestock. The arrest resulted from an investigation conducted by Livestock Brand Inspectors and a subsequent arrest warrant from Tangipahoa Parish.

The investigation, which is supported by video evidence obtained by brand inspectors, alleges that on the night of September 25, 2023, Hess illegally removed seven head of cattle (valued at \$6,000) from a livestock market in Tangipahoa Parish without the owner's permission. Additionally, on October 3, 2023, Hess allegedly attempted to sell some of the stolen cattle, which resulted in his apprehension. At the time of this report, brand inspectors had recovered some of the stolen livestock. An investigation to recover the remaining stolen livestock is ongoing.

Hess was booked into the Tangipahoa Parish Jail on the warrant without incident. At

this time, a bond has been set at \$25,000.

"LDAF brand inspectors work closely with local and state law enforcement agencies whose assistance is instrumental in solving these cases," said LDAF Commissioner Mike Strain.

"With their help, and as the availability of electronic video to capture suspects' movements on the night of crimes becomes more common, we can continue to identify and prosecute those who perpetrate agricultural crimes and livestock theft such as this."

LDAF's Livestock Brand Commission was assisted in this investigation by the Tangipahoa Parish Sheriff's Department and the Louisiana State Police Analytical and Fusion Exchange.

All persons accused of crimes are considered innocent until proven guilty in a court of law.

Rapides Parish woman arrested for obstruction of justice, a second time

On September 28, investigators with the Louisiana Department of Agriculture and Forestry's (LDAF) Enforcement Division arrested Laura C. McLaughlin of Pitkin, LA, for a second time for obstruction of justice.

McLaughlin was arrested on September 22 for four counts of arson and one count of obstruction of justice in connection to multiple wildfires set in the Union Hill area in Rapides Parish. McLaughlin was taken into custody in Vernon Parish again on September 28 for an additional count of obstruction of justice.

McLaughlin was transported to the Rapides Parish Jail, and bond was set at 5,000. She later posted bond and was released.

LDAF would like to thank the Vernon Parish Sheriff's Office for its assistance in this matter.

When the crime of obstruction of justice involves a criminal proceeding in which a sentence of imprisonment necessarily at hard labor for any period less than a life sentence may be imposed, the offender may be fined not more than \$50,000 or imprisoned for not more than 20 years at hard labor, or both.
