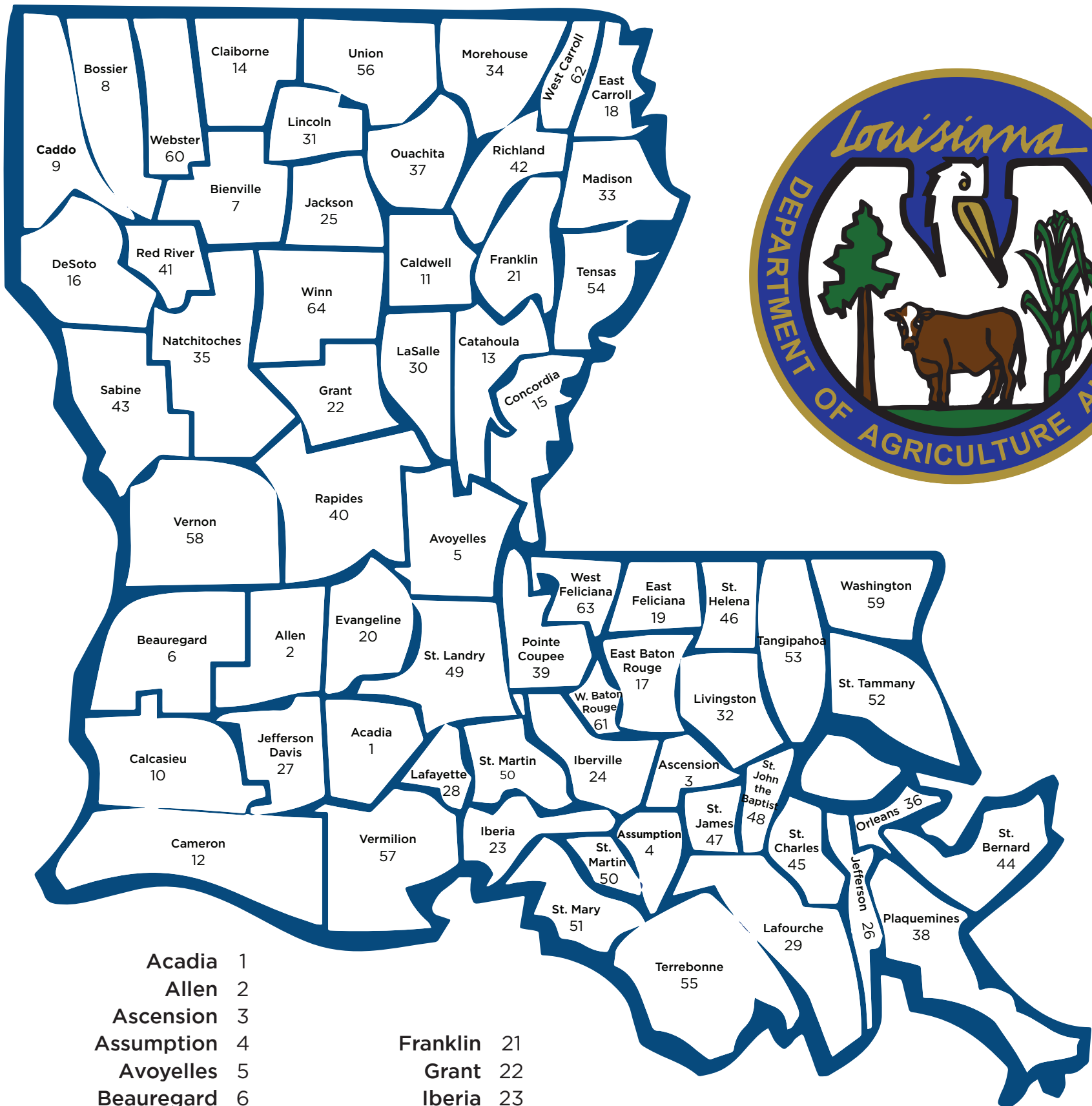

Virgin bulls must have a breeder's certification of virgin status signed by the breeder, the breeder's agent, or an accredited veterinarian. 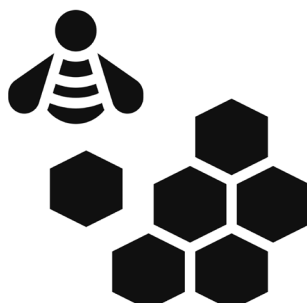

 12 cups flour
 1 teaspoon baking soda
 1 teaspoon corn starch
 1/2 teaspoon salt
 2 cups of flour

Instructions:

Sift together baking soda, corn starch, salt, and 2 cups of flour. Preheat oven to 350°F. Grease and lightly flour six 6 x 4 inch bread pans, or two 9 x 9 inch cake pans. In large bowl, beat butter at high speed until smooth. Add sugar and beat at high speed until fluffy. Lower speed and add the eggs, vanilla and yogurt one at a time. Allow the ingredients to completely blend. Add bananas and strawberries until evenly blended. Add all sifted ingredients to mixture 1/2 cup at a time until completely blended. Do not over mix! Add the walnuts and stir to mix. Pour the finished batter into the prepared pans and bake for 35-55 minutes. Bread will be browned on top and pull away from side of pan when ready. Place pans on cooling rack for 10 minutes before inverting them. Wrap in aluminum foil to store in refrigerator.

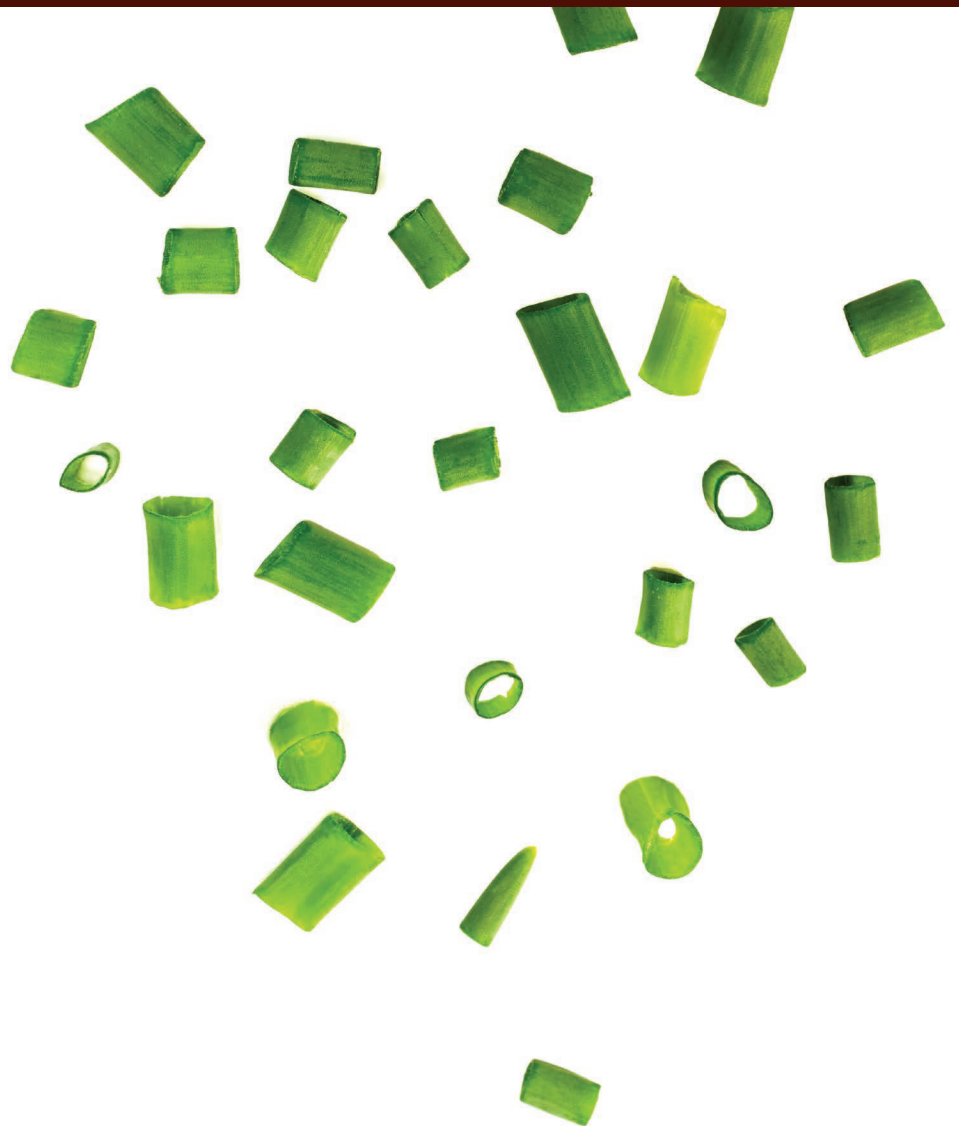

Help for Organic Dairy Producers to Cover Increased Costs

The USDA's new Organic Dairy Marketing Assistance Program (ODMAP) aims to help mitigate market volatility, higher input and transportation costs, and unstable feed supply and prices that have created unique hardships in the organic dairy industry. Under ODMAP, USDA's Farm Service Agency (FSA) is making \$104 million available to organic dairy operations to assist with projected marketing costs in 2023.

ODMAP provides a one-time cost-share payment based on marketing costs on pounds of organic milk marketed in the 2022 calendar year. Eligible producers include certified organic dairy operations that produce milk from cows, goats and sheep.

ODMAP provides financial assistance that will immediately support certified organic dairy operations during 2023 keeping organic dairy operations sustainable until markets return to more normal conditions.

"Organic dairy producers have faced significant and unique increases in their marketing costs, compounded by increases in feed and transportation costs and the limited availability of organic grain and forage commodities," said FSA Administrator Zach Ducheneaux. "This program will keep our small organic dairies in operation as they continue to weather a combination of challenges outside of their control."

FSA is accepting applications from May 24 to July 26, 2023. To apply, producers should contact FSA at their local USDA Service Center at www.farmers.gov/working-with-us/service-center-locator. To complete the ODMAP application, producers must certify to pounds of 2022 milk production, show documentation of their organic certification, and submit a completed application form.

Organic dairy operations are required to provide their USDA certification of organic status confirming operation as an organic dairy in 2023 and 2022 along with the certification of 2022 milk production in hundredweight.

ODMAP complements other assistance available to dairy producers, including Dairy Margin Coverage (DMC) and Supplemental DMC, with more than \$300 million in benefits paid for the 2023 program year to date. Filter Strips Capture Nutrients & Sediment at Edge of Farm Fields

Healthy soil and plentiful nutrients are key ingredients to productive farms and ranches. But when they move off farms and ranches, they can harm streams and rivers. High concentrations of nutrients in water, such as nitrogen and phosphorus, can be harmful to humans, animals and plants. When the runaway nutrients reach estuaries, they can lead to hypoxic zones, or oxygen-depleted waters.

You can take proactive steps to keep nutrients and soil in their proper places... on the land and out of waterways. Many producers implement filter strips — a belt of plants — at the edge of crop fields and pastures.

Producers station these strips in environmentally sensitive areas on a farm or ranch, especially near ditches and other waterways.

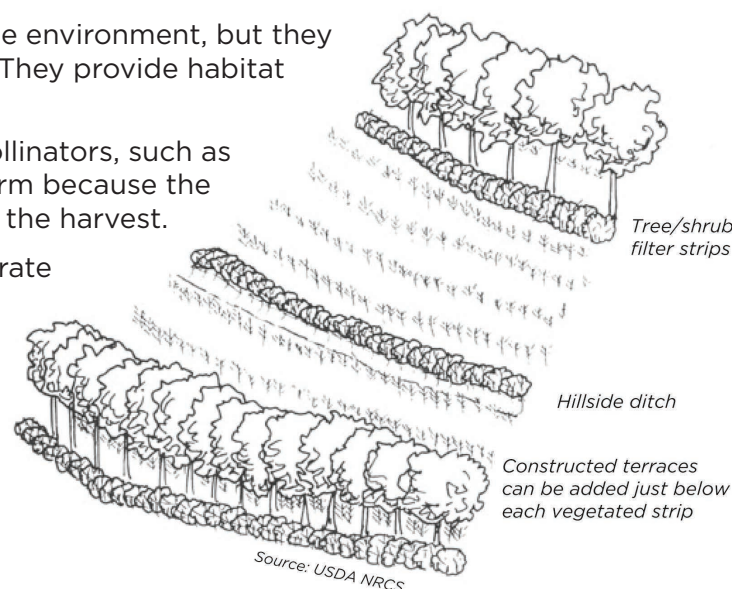
The strips slow the speed of water flowing over fields following a rainstorm, allowing for the plants to capture sediment and nutrients. The best plants for filter strips have stiff stems and are dense near the ground.

Filter strips not only help the environment, but they can help the producer, too. They provide habitat for wildlife and pollinators.

It's always helpful to lure pollinators, such as bees and butterflies, to a farm because the more pollinators, the better the harvest.

"The Century Farm Program is an acknowledgment of where the past meets the future," said Louisiana Department of Agriculture and Forestry Commissioner Mike Strain, D.V.M. "Every year, we love to take this opportunity to recognize the hard-working farm families who have contributed to the rich agricultural heritage of the state of Louisiana generation after generation."

There is no cost to sign up, and no money is given to award recipients. The distinction does, however, recognize your farm, your family's legacy, and your farm's historical relevance to your local area.

Program requirements:

1. Farm must have been in the family continuously for at least 100 years.
2. Farm must still include at least 20 acres of the original founder's land.
3. At least one owner must be a resident of Louisiana.
4. Farm must produce at least \$1,000 annually in farming income.*

**Tree farms are exceptions to this requirement.*

Those interested in participating in the program are encouraged to apply during the annual application process which takes place each fall. You'll need to complete an application, submit any required documents, and have the application signature witnessed and documented by a Notary Public.

Next, the application committee will review and verify your application, and a representative from the Louisiana Department of Agriculture and Forestry will contact you regarding next steps.

Longer Terms for Expiring Voluntary Conservation Contracts

Agricultural producers and landowners with certain Conservation Reserve Program (CRP) contracts can receive additional incentives and extend their contract for another 30 years.

The signup period for the USDA's Clean Lakes, Estuaries, & Rivers enrollment (CLEAR30) ends July 31, 2023. The CLEAR30 initiative is one of several that prioritizes water quality practices as part of continuous CRP enrollment.

The program allows producers and landowners to enroll in 30-year contracts, extending the lifespan and strengthening the benefits of important water quality practices on their land.

Like other CRP enrollments, CLEAR30 is a voluntary, incentive-based conservation opportunity offered by USDA's Farm Service Agency (FSA).

Find Farm Loans that Fit Your Operation @ FARMERS.GOV

Farmers and ranchers can use the Farm Loan Discovery Tool on farmers.gov to find information on USDA farm loans that may best fit their operations.

USDA's Farm Service Agency (FSA) offers a variety of loan options to help farmers finance their operations. From buying land to financing the purchase of equipment, FSA loans can help.

USDA conducted field research in eight states, gathering input from farmers and FSA farm loan staff to better understand their needs and challenges.

How the Tool Works

Farmers who are looking for financing options to operate a farm or buy land can answer a few simple questions about what they are looking to fund and how much money they need to borrow.

After submitting their answers, farmers will receive information on farm loans that best fit their specific needs. The loan application and additional resources also will be provided.

Farmers can download application quick guides that outline what to expect from preparing an application to receiving a loan decision. There are four guides that cover loans to individuals, entities, and youth, as well as information on microloans.

The guides include general eligibility requirements and a list of required forms and documentation for each type of loan. These guides can help farmers prepare before their first USDA service center visit with a loan officer.

Farmers can access the Farm Loan Discovery Tool by visiting farmers.gov/fund and clicking the "Start" button. Follow the prompts and answer five simple questions to receive loan information that is applicable to your agricultural operation.

The Farm Loan Discovery Tool is one of many resources on farmers.gov to help connect farmers to information that can help their operations. Earlier this year, USDA launched the My Financial Information feature, which enables farmers to view their loan information, history, payments,



and alerts by logging into the website.

In addition to the interactive farm loan features at farmers.gov, the site also offers a Disaster Assistance Discovery Tool. Farmers can visit farmers.gov/recover/disaster-assistance-tool#step-1 to find disaster assistance programs that can help their operation recover from natural disasters.

Jonesville Man Arrested for Simple Arson for Causing Wildfires

On Thursday, June 8, Forestry Enforcement Officers with the Louisiana Department of Agriculture and Forestry (LDAF) arrested 32-year-old William Ogden Alexander of Jonesville for setting a fire at a Catahoula Parish cemetery.

According to officers, Alexander allegedly set fire to the cemetery property on two separate days. The fire eventually spread into the woods and resulted in a half-acre wildfire that caused local Volunteer Fire Departments and LDAF Forestry Fire Eradication Units to be dispatched to the scene to extinguish the fires.

LDAF officers located a suspect who was observed at the scene of the fire earlier that day. Upon being arrested for one count of simple arson and two counts of possession of a controlled, dangerous substance

(Schedule III), Alexander was transported to the Catahoula Parish Jail, where he is being held on a \$30,000 bond.

“There are 18.9 million acres of land under fire protection by LDAF’s Forest Protection Division,” said Commissioner of Agriculture and Forestry Mike Strain, D.V.M. “Even in a small area, the potential for a resulting wildfire can cause damage and destruction to life and property. Arson is a crime we take very seriously.”

Note: All persons accused of any crime are considered innocent until proven guilty in a court of law.

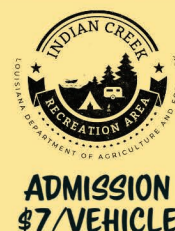

USDA Seeking Nominations for Federal Advisory Committee for Urban Agriculture & Innovative Production

The USDA is seeking nominations for four positions on the 12-member Federal Advisory Committee for Urban Agriculture and Innovative Production. Nominations will be open to public from May 15, 2023, to July 15, 2023. The committee is part of efforts to increase support for urban agriculture and innovative production.

“The Urban Agriculture and Innovative Production Committee is an important opportunity for urban and innovative producers to have their voices heard and give direct feedback to USDA,” said Terry Cosby, Chief of USDA’s Natural Resources Conservation Service (NRCS).

Any interested person or organization may nominate qualified individuals for membership, including self-nominations.

Four positions are open for nominations:

- One representing urban agriculture.
- One representing an institution of higher ed or extension program.

- One representing business and economic development, which may include a business development entity, community development initiatives, a chamber of commerce, a city government or a planning organization.
- One representing related experience in urban, indoor and other emerging agriculture production practices.

Established through the 2018 Farm Bill and led by NRCS, the Office of Urban



Agriculture and Innovative Production works in partnership with numerous USDA agencies that support urban agriculture and innovative production, including the following efforts:

- For fiscal year 2023, investing up to \$7.5 million for competitive grants and up to \$9.5 million for Composting and Food Waste Reduction (CFWR) pilot projects for fiscal year 2023.
- Providing technical and financial assistance through NRCS conservation programs.
- Investing nearly \$133 million in grants through the Agricultural Marketing Service’s Local Agriculture Market Program that develop, coordinate, and expand local and regional food markets and local food enterprises.
- Helping child nutrition program operators incorporate local foods through the Food and Nutrition Services Farm to School Program.
