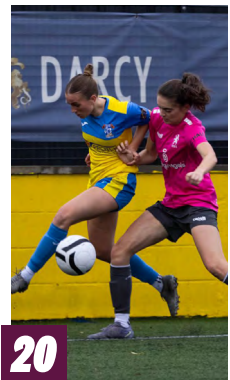

**WING-BACK
LOOKS FORWARD
TO KHALSA TEST**



BURNLEY WILL COMPETE IN THE NORTHERN PREMIER DIVISION OF THE WOMEN'S NATIONAL LEAGUE FOR THE FIRST TIME IN SEVEN WEEKS THIS AFTERNOON, AND IT'S A CHALLENGE CHARLEY DOCHERTY IS RELISHING.

The Clarets' last three fixture have been in the FAWNL Cup or Adobe Women's FA Cup, but the visit of Sporting Khalsa is a chance for Lou Roberts' side to take their league points tally to 35.

Docherty and her team-mates will be aiming to do the double over the Midlanders having earned a 2-1 victory at the Guardian Warehousing Arena back in September.

Looking back at that trip, the 22-year-old said: "I remember it being rainy and miserable!

"We started really brightly and I played a ball across for Claudia to score – I think that was in the first two minutes of the game.

"As the game went on they grew into it, but I felt like we kept our standards and were able to push on for the win.

"We know that they can play well on the counter and have proven to be a threat, though, and I think it was the first goal we conceded in the league this season at Khalsa.

"It's been a long time since we played in the league and aside from the league cup now, it's going to be our main focus."

Burnley head into this afternoon on the back of a 5-0 defeat at Women's Super League outfit Manchester United in the Adobe Women's FA Cup.

Despite the scoreline, Docherty thinks there were positives to take from the game at Leigh Sports Village.

"When you've been in such dominant spaces in the first half of the season it's nice to play people who are in the leagues above you and have been professionals for longer than you," she continued.

"The result wasn't what we wanted and when you concede in the first minute, it's hard to come back from that against a WSL opponent.

"We had a few good spells with the ball, though, and I don't think we panicked under pressure.

"We also stuck to our values and didn't change the way we play."

The Clarets were backed by a healthy away crowd against Marc Skinner's side and to finish, Docherty explained the impact that can have.

"It was nice to have that support behind us," she remarked.

"I went to take a corner one time and I could hear a lot of people shouting.

"It's always nice to have fans, and it's nice hear them as well. If we can keep building on that it will be good for us as we try and push towards promotion."





RED DEVILS TOO GOOD AS CLARETS EXIT ADOBE WOMEN'S FA CUP

DESPITE A BATTLING

AT THE FOURTH ROUND

MANCHESTER UNITED
LAST WEEKEND.

The Women's Super League side were too strong for the Clarets at a rain-soaked Progress with Unity Stadium, following up three first-half goals with two more after the break.

Lou Roberts named the same starting XI for the fifth match running, with striker Claudia Walker wearing Mummery-Walker on her shirt for the first time since getting married.

Welcome additions to the bench included Brooke Cairns and Brenna McPartlan, with the latter featuring in a matchday squad for the first time in almost four months because of injury.

It took the Red Devils just two minutes to break the deadlock through Maya Le Tissier, who gave Kirstie Levell no chance with a rifled effort from 25 yards.

Levell made a strong save when Melvine Malard cut in from the left soon afterwards, but it was 2-0 when Julia Zigiotti picked out the bottom corner with 21 on the clock.

United extended their lead before the break, though, and it was yet another fine finish from outside of the area by Simi Awujo.

Burnley's best moment of the opening 45 came on the stroke of half-time.

A quick counter saw Charlie Chadwick receive the ball in the inside left channel. Her cross eventually made it right the way across to Charley Docherty, who's effort was claimed by Phallon Tullis-Joyce.

Lea Schüller's header made it 4-0 less than two minutes after the restart and Millie Ravening attempted to score straight from the resulting kick-off, but her effort flew narrowly wide.

A double change on the hour saw Naomi Hartley and Heidi replace Jade Richards and Chadwick respectively, and further switches later saw Docherty and Millie Chandarana make way for Danielle Maxwell and Brenna McPartlan.

They weren't able to affect the run of play, though, as substitute Layla Drury latched on to Hinata Miyazawa's through ball to finish one-on-one and make it five.

Our final tweak saw Louise McDaniel replace Millie Ravening and the Red Devils came close to adding a sixth a couple of times, but the Clarets defence held firm.

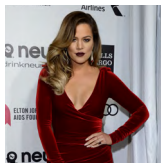

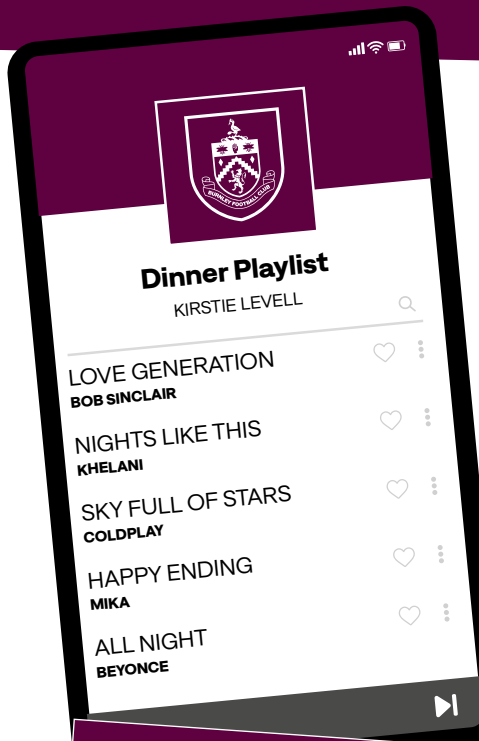

INTRODUCING

SPORTING KHALSA WOMEN



SPORTING KHALSA WOMEN AND GIRLS WERE ESTABLISHED IN 2015 FOLLOWING A MERGER WITH FC REEDSWOOD.



The Women's section spans various age groups and continues to be overseen by Chairwoman and founder Kelly Williams.

In addition to the first team, who compete in the Northern Premier Division of the Women's National League, the Club has a Reserve team that competes in the Reserve Midland Division.

To highlight the scope of their operation, Khalsa also operate a 7v7 Women's Midweek Floodlight League side.

At a younger age level they run a Wildcats Centre for girls aged between five and 11, and have a programme called SQUAD for 12-14-year-olds.

Last season was the club's first ever at third tier level and they comfortably avoided relegation by a 14-point margin.

This campaign has proved to be slightly more tricky, and after 11 matches they sit bottom of the 12-team table with six points from a possible 33.



The Midlanders might take comfort from the fact they have two games in hand on both two teams ahead of them – Loughborough Lightning and Halifax.

Long serving Manager Andy Mulligan left in the summer and was replaced by Juan Dupozo – a UEFA A License coach.

His team head into today's game on the back of a 6-0 defeat to Championship side Birmingham City in the Adobe Women's FA Cup last time out.

Khalsa have lost their last three league outings since a 1-0 victory over Loughborough Lightning in November, in which Daisy Wickett scored the only goal a minute into the second half.

Players to look out for include captain Megan Cann, who scored in the reverse fixture between these two teams back in September, and forward Skye Owen.

Owen is at the club on loan from Wolverhampton Wanderers and is the team's top scorer with four goals in all competitions.

Captain Megan Cann pulled one back for the hosts at the Guardian Warehousing Arena, but the Clarets did enough to earn a deserved three points that kept them top of the table.

Lou Roberts reverted to the team that had started every league fixture prior barring one change – with Jade Richards replacing Jasmine Matthews.

FAWNL Cup brace scorer the week before Charlie Chadwick was on the bench, joined by Heidi who also netted against Huddersfield Town.

The Clarets started like a house on fire once again, scoring twice in the opening 11 minutes.

Walker's goal came after just 23 seconds when the striker got across her defender at the near post to sweep home Charley Docherty's pinpoint pass.

Brenna McPartlan then got her head onto a Tilly Wilkes corner at the back post, giving Ravening a tap in from two yards.

Roberts' side dominated the ball for the entirety of the first half and had two late chances to extend their lead.

After Docherty cut in from the right touchline and forced Elise Stocking into a fine save at her near post, Mel Lawley turned on the left edge of the box and shot straight down the Khalsa 'keeper's throat.

With manager Juan Dopazo's half-time words ringing in their ears, the hosts halved their deficit five minutes after the restart.

Burnley were unable to clear their lines from a corner and captain Cann swept a looping finish into the top right corner from 18 yards.

That gave Khalsa confidence and Clarets' keeper Kirstie Levell prevented an equaliser when she made herself big to deny Skye Owen one-on-one.

Olivia Stubbs and Ania Denham also flashed efforts wide of Levell's goal before Roberts turned to her bench for the first time in the 78th minute.

Daniels and Walker made way for Chandarana and Chadwick respectively, and Thea Paul later replaced Wilkes as the Clarets continued to repel their opponents.

Khalsa were unable to create any chances of note and the Clarets retained their spot at the top of the table, having claimed 10 points from a possible 12.
