Part of that affinity comes from the fact that the midfielder won the FA Youth Cup with Manchester City in 2017/18, as well as watching matches growing up.

Ravening has started both of Burnley's Adobe Women's FA Cup matches to date this season and scored the fourth goal as part of the 12-0 victory over Blackburn Rovers in the first round.

As such, she's looking forward to being involved in this afternoon's third round clash with Peterborough United.

"I won the youth cup with Manchester City, and the FA Cup always feel special," she said.

"We all love the cups and are up for it this weekend, and it would be great to score some goals and boost our confidence ahead of the league games in the new year.

"The aim is to go as far as we can and we want to draw teams that we don't come up against usually, so if we can win this one it would be nice to get a WSL team next and showcase what we can do.

"We've watched Peterborough and they look tough and look like they can play football, so we'll need to do our own thing and then set up to combat their strengths."

The Clarets come into this match on the back of an important league victory on the road at Middlesbrough last weekend.

It finished 3-1 thanks to goals from Thea Paul, Charley Docherty and Charlie Chadwick, with Ravening playing the full 90 in Teesside.

"We're all feeling quite positive," Ravening continued.

"We come into it on the back of another win and we battled hard last weekend, so we'll try and take that into this weekend.

"It would have been nice to have taken more chances than we did, but it's encouraging to know that we are getting into the final third and getting shots off.

"Our defensive contributions have been

really positive in the last few games too.

"We always want to be fighting at the top of the table, so it's a positive that we're around that heading into Christmas and I think that just spurs the girls on to go again in the new year."





THREE GOALS AT MIDDLESBROUGH EXTEND WINNING RUN TO 10

GOALS FROM THEA PAUL, CHARLEY DOCHERTY AND CHARLIE CHADWICK ENSURED THREE LEAGUE POINTS WOULD BE THE PRODUCT OF A TRIP TO MIDDLESBROUGH LAST SUNDAY.

The victory at a wet Map Group UK Stadium in Stockton-on-Tees was a 10th straight triumph for the Clarets in all competitions.

Lou Roberts named an unchanged starting XI to the 1-0 victory at Rugby Borough the week prior, with Kirstie Levell in goal and Yana Daniëls retaining the captain's armband.

Match winner in the Midlands Chadwick started up front alongside Claudia Walker, with Millie Chandarana and Millie Ravening providing the midfield grit.

Levell produced a fine save with just six minutes on the clock, getting down low to her left to turn Abby Holmes' bouncing half volley around the post.

That stop proved vital as the Clarets broke the deadlock nine minutes later. It was a slightly fortuitous moment for Paul, with Boro 'keeper Megan Borthwick unable to stop her powerful cross from flying in.

Docherty's inch-perfect cut back was turned narrowly wide of the left-hand post by Ravening shortly after the half hour, but the former made no mistake to double the lead soon afterwards.

A lovely team move saw Paul slide in Chadwick, and the striker's ball across the face of goal gave Docherty a tap in for her third goal of the season.

Jade Richards later forced a smart save from Borthwick and Boro threatened twice on the counterattack, but it was 2-0 at the half-time interval.

The Clarets had all of the attacking play after the restart, with Walker shooting straight at the Boro 'keeper from 18 yards before Chadwick made it three on the hour.

In what was another slick team move Walker fed Docherty, and the right wing-back squared for our number 19 to finish high into the net for her 13th of the season.

Roberts then turned to her bench for the first time, replacing Docherty, Matthews and Walker with Aimee Kelly, Naomi Hartley and Mel Lawley respectively.

The hosts pulled a goal back through Holmes' instinctive finish with 10 minutes of regular time remaining and that seemed to breathe extra life into our opponents and the home crowd.

Roberts responded with fresh legs in midfield in the form of Louise McDaniel, and Lawley and Richards both had efforts charged down in search of a fourth goal.

The latter was then forced to hook the ball off her own goal line in stoppage-time but despite the slight scare, the Clarets saw out what was a comfortable victory in the end.

ROBERTS NAMED NOVEMBER MANAGER OF THE MONTH

Lou Roberts has been named FA Women's National League Northern Premier Division Manager of the Month for November!

The Clarets enjoyed a hugely productive month under Roberts' guidance, winning all five matches in all competitions by an aggregate score of 13-1.

In there were important league victories over Stoke City, Derby County and Rugby Borough, and Roberts was chosen by a combination of a judging panel and public vote.

"It's a privilege to be recognised for the hard work, but it's really important to remember that this is very much a team effort," she said.

"The staff and players have been excellent over the last eight to 12 weeks, and this feels like recognition for their hard work, persistence, and desire to be better.

"I'd like to say a huge thank you to all the players and staff for being so open minded and embracing change and applying themselves to what we've been trying to do."

INTRODUCING

PETERBOROUGH UNITED WOMEN

**PETERBOROUGH UNITED'S WOMEN'S TEAM
WAS ORIGINALLY FORMED IN THE EARLY
1990S FOLLOWING A MERGER WITH LOCAL
SIDE PETERBOROUGH PYTHONS.**





Early success followed before the turn of the century, with the team winning the Cambridgeshire County Plate in 1997/98 and reaching the FA Cup third round in 1999/00.

Despite that the club folded in the early noughties and it wasn't until 2014 that women's football showed shoots of life again for the Posh.

A Player Development Centre was set up under the guidance of Jenna Lusk and Peterborough United Women were formally re-introduced ahead of the 2015/16 season.

From their modest beginnings in the Northamptonshire Ladies League, the team has climbed the pyramid and now operate in the fourth tier of women's football.

That's known as the FAWNL Division One Midlands, and Posh enjoyed a record-breaking campaign last time out.

Their points tally of 51 was their highest ever and Jake Poole's side finished third in the table with an average home attendance of 206.

Poole has overseen the team since May 2024, replacing Dan Lawlor who was relieved of his duties the month prior.

Having started his career as a coach at Leicester City in the Women's Championship, Poole spent four years at Long Eaton United Ladies before joining Huddersfield Town as an assistant in the third tier.

Peterborough have enjoyed a fantastic start to the current season, taking 28 points from a possible 30 in the league.

That's one point more than second placed Boldmere St Michaels who have played a match more, with those of a Posh persuasion dreaming of promotion to the third tier for the first time in their history.

They head into today's Adobe Women's FA Cup tie on the back of a 4-0 victory over Kidderminster Harriers last weekend.

All the goals came in the second half, with Keir Perkins, Courtney Clarke, Jess Rousseau and Kira Rai finding the back of the net.

They booked their place in today's match with a victory over Wallsend BC by the same scoreline and will be eager to keep their Adobe Women's FA Cup winning run going this afternoon.

Players to look out for include Perkins, who has been with the club since 2015, and attacking midfielder Tara Kirk, whose footballing education came at WSL side Leicester City.
