We were able to look at something a bit different against them and after a short period of adaptation, I thought the players produced an excellent performance.

I was delighted for Claudia Walker, who was able to score a hat-trick after coming on at half-time.

As a coach you encourage your substitutes to have as much

impact as they can in the shortest time possible and she did just that, scoring inside two minutes.

We speak a lot here about the importance of our goals coming from all over the pitch too, so it was pleasing to see nine different players find the back of the net against Rovers.

Despite the scoreline, I'd like to give Blackburn some credit for their display. They came to our place and worked hard in difficult conditions, so I wish James and the team the best going forwards.

Back to tonight, and we're looking forward to a good battle for the three league points.

We've won all of our home games this season and I know from speaking to the players that they enjoy the environment at Leyland.

Home form is so important to any successful season, so we're clear in our desire to earn another victory.

The key word in that sentence was earn – we know the qualities FEDs possess and I'm sure they'll provide a stern test tonight.

Their manager Leanne Duffy has been in charge for a long time and I've always enjoyed sharing the touchline with her. As such, I extend a warm welcome to her and her staff tonight.

19 different players have found the back of the net in just 12 matches, and one of those is Emma Siddall.

The defender has scored in two of her last three matches, in which she came off the bench in both.

They were also both strikes any striker would be proud of, particularly her effort that made it 9-0 in Sunday's 12-0 victory over Blackburn Rovers in the Adobe Women's FA Cup.

Reflecting on the Blackburn match, the 19-year-old said: "Other than the weather, everything went perfectly!

"It was a really good team performance with lots of different scorers, and it's always a positive when it's not just coming from one select area.

"When you look at the bigger games when it's tighter and there's more of a threat to us, there are so many people who can score, whether they're starting or coming off the bench.

"If you have one set goal scorer it's easier to play against, and that's not what we want.

"I'm finding myself in the right positions at the moment!

"In the cup matches I've been playing in different positions and it's been quite enjoyable to get higher up the pitch."

Tonight's match with Liverpool Feds is the first of back-to-back league matches, with the Clarets making the trip to Stoke City on Sunday.

Feds head into it on the back of a big FA Cup victory of their own and will be buoyed by the start to their league campaign, finding themselves 5th in the table.

"Feds are always difficult opposition, regardless of the results we've got against them previously," Siddall continued.

"They're a physical team and you never quite know how they're going to play, or what they're going to bring to the pitch.

"I remember the last time we played

against them away from home, we were only just able to get the win.

"We just have to keep bringing what we've done recently on the training pitch into matchday.

"Every single week we do similar things in training and nothing really changes, regardless of whether it's the league or one of the cups.

"You don't know what you're going to face in any of these games, but we set out to win every match.

"It's always nice to play at home, and to be back at Leyland.

"We're comfortable there and haven't been there for a few weeks, so I guess that works in our favour for what will be a difficult game."





FA CUP VICTORY SEES BURNLEY SCORE DOUBLE FIGURES AGAIN

BURNLEY WOMEN SCORED DOUBLE FIGURES AGAINST BLACKBURN ROVERS FOR THE SECOND TIME IN FOUR WEEKS ON SUNDAY AFTERNOON, WITH THIS ADOBE WOMEN'S FA CUP TIE FINISHING 12-0.

Nine different Clarets found the back of the net in an action-packed match at the Daisy Arena in Nelson, with Claudia Walker netting a hat-trick and Heidi recording a brace.

There were three changes to the team that started the FA Women's National League Cup victory over Norton & Stockton Ancients the week prior, with captain Tilly Wilkes stepping into the defence.

Millie Ravening came into the midfield, while Aimee Kelly partnered last week's hat-trick hero Charlie Chadwick up front.

Wilkes broke the deadlock after just two minutes, receiving the ball 20 yards out and firing it into the top right corner.

Lou Roberts' side were intent on pushing forwards at every opportunity and it was 2-0 with 20 on the clock through Kelly, who guided Maddie Robinson's cross in off the post with her head.

Chadwick made it three with a close-range finish at the second time of asking and it was four before half-time when Kelly's shot

hit Ravening and beat Melany Layza.

Emma Siddall and Walker replaced Ravening and Kelly respectively at the break, and it took just two minutes for the latter to net her third goal of the campaign one-on-one.

McAloon made her only save of the day shortly afterwards when Ellie Rice turned and shot from the edge of the area, but it was a routine save for the former Durham stopper.

Heidi did well to control Robinson's fizzed ball and make it 6-0 on the hour, and during the celebrations Roberts made two more switches, replacing Naomi Hartley and Jade Richards with Jasmine Matthews and Helen Seed.

Brooke Cairns was next to add her name to the scoresheet with a smart finish at the near post and the Clarets then scored three time in four minutes.

After Heidi finished from close range, Siddall expertly picked out the bottom left corner following a set piece and Robinson produced an emphatic finish that hit the bar and post on the way in.

Burnley were really purring at this point and after Cairns and Heidi both had further goals disallowed, Walker scored twice in two minutes to complete her hat-trick and the scoring for the day.

The first was a strike into the bottom right corner after some excellent chest control, while the second saw her react quickest to a loose ball in the area and prod home.

LEVELL AND SIDDALL THE LATEST CLARETS TO HIT APPEARANCE MILESTONES



Congratulations to Kirstie Levell and Emma Siddall, who have both recently made their 50th appearances for the Club.

Goalkeeper Levell hit the milestone in the 2-1 league victory over Sporting Khalsa and now has 52 appearances and 23 clean sheets to her name.

The 28-year-old moved to Lancashire having left Women's Super League outfit Leicester City in August 2023 and enjoyed a successful first season, winning both the Player of the Season and Players' Player awards.

Defender Siddall reached her half century against Blackburn Rovers at the weekend and marked the occasion with a fantastic goal from range.

The teenager originally joined Burnley on a dual registration basis from Manchester City in February 2024, and made the permanent switch just a few months later.

Her versatility has seen her play in both full-back positions, centre-back and midfield, and Siddall will be aiming to keep playing regularly in the coming weeks and months.

INTRODUCING

LIVERPOOL FEDS WOMEN



**FORMED IN 1990, LIVERPOOL FEDS

LIVERPOOL HOPE UNIVERSITY.**



Adopting the 'Feds' tagline because sports teams from the university's played as a Federation of the St Katherine's and Christ Notre Dame Colleges, the side entered the Northwest Women's Regional League.

After winning promotion in the 2008/09 season the team went unbeaten for the duration of the league campaign, winning 19 of the 22 games.

That saw them step up to the Northern Combination Women's league (tier 4) and the Club remained there until a restructure of the pyramid in 2013, which saw the birth of the FAWNL.

Feds were placed into the FAWNL Northern Division One (also tier 4) and moved to Jericho Lane at the same time in 2018.

After two COVID-19 hit seasons, Leanne Duffy's side reached the Northern Premier Division by pipping Newcastle United to the Division One North title.

A solid first season in the tier 3 was followed by an improved 8th place finish in 2023/24, and the Merseysiders continued their improvement by finishing 6th last time out.

Duffy herself has given more than 10 years of service to the Club, having initially joined as assistant manager in July 2015 before being promoted to manager four years later.

She enjoyed a successful playing career too, spending four years with Liverpool before moving on to Everton.

There she was involved in FA Cup and League Cup wins and captained the Toffees in the Champions League.

Feds have started this season well, claiming 10 points from their seven league matches to date.

There have been three league wins alongside a respectable draw against Rugby Borough, and Feds come into the match on the back of a 4-0 victory over Chester Le Street in the FA Cup.

They did lose their last league match convincingly, though, going down 4-1 to Middlesbrough 10 days ago.

An exciting move has seen Feds change their home ground to Walton Hall Park this season, following Everton Women's move to Goodison Park

As a self-funded female only club ranging from U6s right the way through to walking football for the older age groups, the Feds continue to defy the odds and will be looking for another improved finish this season.

What are your first memories of football?

Playing with my brother and my dad, who was my coach. I always played with the boys when I was growing up!

Did you have any idols that you looked up to when you were growing up?
