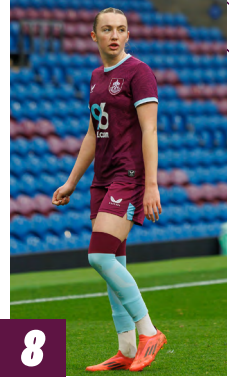

It's Norwich City in the Adobe Women's FA Cup this afternoon and the team head into it on the back of a 2-0 victory over Derby County at Turf Moor last week.

Speaking to 'Turf' during the week, Kelly said: "We're feeling confident and excited.

"We're on a good unbeaten run and come into it on the back of another clean sheet, and are not conceding many goals in general.

"Playing at Turf Moor is always a special occasion with all the fans there, so we all enjoyed that and it was obviously made better by getting the win.

"I felt that we dominated the game, and it was one of our highest possession percentages of the season.

"We could have scored more but we'll try and improve on that going forwards."

The visit of Norwich is in the second round of the competition, following last month's 12-0 victory over Blackburn Rovers at the Daisy Arena in Nelson.

Kelly started up front alongside Charlie Chadwick that day and scored the second goal of the rout with an expertly-taken header off a post from a Maddie Robinson cross.

Reflecting on that victory and looking ahead to what she expects from this afternoon's encounter, Kelly continued: "It was very wet – hopefully this afternoon's not the same!

"The FA Cup's always special – it's a big competition in both men's and women's football and we want to go as far as we can.

"Norwich are a brave team and try to play with some very good individuals, and they'll be a tough opponent.

"We're unbeaten this season though, so that's a positive. Most games we've got a clean sheet too and we continue to build on the training pitch, so we're confident heading into every game."





RAVENING MARKS CENTURY WITH GOAL AS CLARETS BEAT DERBY COUNTY

MILLIE RAVENING
MARKED HER 100TH
BURNLEY APPEARANCE
WITH HER 68TH
CLARETS GOAL AS PART
OF A 2-0 VICTORY OVER
DERBY COUNTY ON
SUNDAY AFTERNOON.

Lou Roberts' side dominated proceedings from start to finish at Turf Moor, with an own goal off the Ewes 'keeper confirming all three points would remain in Lancashire.

There were three changes from the team's last league outing against Stoke City, with Jade Richards and Thea Paul stepping into the back five.

Aimee Kelly earned a starting spot up front following her brace against Real Bedford in the FA Women's National League Cup, while Ravening reached her century in midfield.

The Clarets created their first opening after four minutes, but captain Yana Daniëls' header from a Charley Docherty corner was wide of a post.

After some great footwork Claudia Walker tested Derby 'keeper Lucy Jones with a powerful 20-yard effort, and Jones produced a flying stop to thwart Daniëls' goal bound effort on the half hour.

Daniëls was having a real influence on the match and met a tantalising Paul cross from the left six minutes later, but couldn't quite steer her header on target.

The Clarets huffed and puffed but were unable to find an opening goal before the break, while Kirstie Levell was not called into action at all at the other end.

Play restarted in a similar fashion and after a couple of near misses it was a penalty that eventually broke the deadlock in the 55th minute.

Walker was tripped after great tenacity from Kelly, and Ravening confidently picked out the bottom right corner from the spot.

With the added comfort of a lead Burnley started to purr and Jones was called into action once again – this time getting an outstretched left arm to Walker's ferocious strike.

Roberts' first change of the afternoon saw Docherty make way for Charlie Chadwick with 69 on the clock, and the number 19 was involved in the goal that made it 2-0 six minutes later.

Paul crossed into the six yard box from the left and Chadwick's off-target shot hit Jones before trickling into the empty net.

Kelly and Daniëls made way for Louise McDaniel and Danielle Maxwell respectively with less than 10 minutes remaining, and another double switch saw Tilly Wilkes and Heidi replace Paul and Walker.

The remaining minutes, including six minutes of additional time, passed without any incident of note as Burnley secured a seventh straight victory in all competitions.

WOMEN'S TEAM VISIT LOCAL SCHOOLS WITH BFCITC

Last week, a group of women's team players teamed up with Burnley FC in the Community to surprise children at two local primary schools.

Naoisha McAloon and Dee Bradley visited St John's Read Primary School and Danielle Maxwell and Louise McDaniel took a trip to Ightenhill Primary School, both of which are part of the Premier League Primary Stars programme.

At both schools, BFCitC's Education Manager Lianne Bradford led an inspiring assembly on the importance of women's football and equal opportunities, before introducing the players to the pupils.

The students quickly rallied behind the players, becoming their newest and biggest fans.

The players then joined a group of budding young footballers, many already part of Burnley FC Women's Juniors, before heading out onto the pitch to play matches and practice their best penalties.

The players generously gifted 30 complimentary tickets to the women's team game against Derby County at Turf Moor to each primary school.

Furthermore, a select number of students were invited to join them on the Clarets Carpet ahead of the fixture too.

Reflecting on her visit, Dee Bradley said: "It was very wholesome, and I enjoyed every minute of it!

"It was great to meet the kids and there was one girl who played for Burnley U12s who bought along a group of her friends to the game on Sunday too.

"Some of them told us that they'd never kicked a football in their life, and left it saying they might try to now. Being able to encourage them is what it's all about."

Year 6 teacher Jade from St John Read shared her gratitude: "Thank you so much for choosing to come to Read School.

"The children had such a fantastic morning, and all the children and staff have said how inspiring the assembly was and what a great opportunity it was to meet the players and ask their questions.

"All the girls were inspired by the visit, even those who normally shy away from sport. It was lovely that the boys could get autographs and speak to the players too, and you've definitely made the year of some lifelong Burnley fans!"

Education Manager Lianne Bradford added: "Every season we invite the women's players into our local primary schools, and each year the visits become even more inspiring.

"We're seeing more and more young female footballers coming through, which shows the powerful impact women's football is having on girls.

"The chance to train with and speak to the players is only strengthening that journey."

The Canaries were formed in 1998 when local rivals Norwich Ladies and Norwich Racers joined forces.

The former team are still the only Norwich side to have lifted the FA Cup trophy, which was won in 1986 after a dramatic last-gasp winner against the favourites, Doncaster Belles.

The club moved to its current home ground The Nest in the 2020/21 season, after moving out of the previous home of Plantation Park.

The 2021/22 season saw the club formally integrate into the men's first team under the guidance of executive director Zoe Webber.

This strategic move saw overall operation and control of the Norwich City Women teams brought in-house with the aim of driving further development and progress in this area.

Flo Allen's appointment in 2022 has provided structure and organisation to the club, supporting the squad on a day-to-day basis.

The Canaries have collected plenty of silverware over the years, including seven Norfolk County Cup trophies, last won in 2024 thanks to a 6-0 win over Wroxham Women in the final.

The club were particularly proud to follow the 2022 Women's Euros coverage, especially of Norfolk-born Lauren Hemp, who started her youth footballing career under the guidance of Norwich City Girls Centre of Excellence.

In the 2023/24 campaign City recorded

their highest ever finish in Division One South East, missing out on promotion by one place and seven points. They remained unbeaten all season until the final day, where they lost 1-0 to Ashford Town.

Norwich have made a fantastic start to the current campaign, claiming 24 points from a possible 27 in the league.

They head into this weekend on the back of a 3-2 victory at Chatham Town, in which Grace Riglar gave the Canaries the lead early doors.

Chatham then scored twice to go in front but Norwich never gave up, with Evie Williams' fine free-kick levelling things up before Natasha Snelling sparked late celebrations with a 91st minute winner.

The Canaries needed more late drama to progress to this stage of the Adobe Women's FA Cup, beating Stevenage 4-3 in the first round

Holly Kennard's brace was accompanied by an Evie Williams strike that day, but it was an own goal the confirmed the result in the 96th minute.

PLAYER INSIGHT

What are your first memories of football?

Playing for Blackburn Rovers when I was 10.

Did you have any idols that you looked up to when you were growing up?

There was somebody at Blackburn called James, who looked after me the whole way through. I still do some one-to-one work with him now too, and I look up to him.

Have you always played in your current position, or have you played elsewhere across the pitch?

I've moved quite a lot. I started as a holding midfielder than played as a 10, then a winger and now as a striker.

I joined Liverpool at 16 and played as a midfielder there.

What's the best game or moment you have seen live?

I went to lots of Liverpool men's team games when I played for them. There are too many to choose from!

If you had to name a stand-out moment from your career so far, what would it be?

Scoring my first professional hat-trick in the FAWNL Cup earlier this season. It's something that I've wanted to do for a long time, and it was great to do it here.
