

Our Co-Founder **DENNIS PRAGER**

As many of you know, Dennis has been sidelined this past year while recovering from a serious neck injury. We know how much you've missed seeing him in new Fireside Chats and hearing his voice on the radio. That's why, in this Annual Report, we want to share with you as much of Dennis's timeless wisdom, love of country, and contagious joy as possible.

Message from Dennis

I am a third-generation American—my parents and my maternal grandmother were born in Brooklyn, New York.

But I didn't know I loved America until my early twenties.

In my third year of college, I studied in England and began a life of travel that eventually took me to 130 countries.

That was when I began to understand how important America was to the world—and still is.

That was when I began to understand how unique America was—and still is.

That was when I began to appreciate

the decency of the American people.

Being away from America for a year, spending the Christmas season in Morocco, where there was no Christmas season, and ending the year with a month in the Soviet Union, where there was no freedom—this all had a life-changing impact on me. I realized how lucky I was to be an American.

I even realized how much I simply enjoyed being an American.

I'll explain:

How important America is to the world.

Without in any way diminishing the enormous sacrifices made by England and France, it was America's entry into World War I that made the defeat of Imperial Germany possible, and ended that horrible war.

It was America that made the Allied victory possible in World War II, and kept Western Europe free during the Cold War.

Thirty-seven thousand Americans died fighting the North Korean and Chinese communist regimes. Were it not for America, all of Korea would have no human rights and would endure the mass torture, starvation, and murder that have been routine in North Korea until today.

The next time you hear the lie that America fought in Vietnam for colonialist reasons, ask that person: Why did America fight in Korea? I'll tell you why: to stop the spread of communism, the greatest genocidal and totalitarian ideology in history, and thereby enable more than half of Korea to live in freedom.

Another 58,000 Americans died in Vietnam to enable the South Vietnamese to live in the same freedom America made possible for South Koreans.

Neither Vietnam nor Korea had any natural resources that America wanted.

Americans died in those two countries solely so that their people could be free.

And, without diminishing the role of the great British prime minister, Margaret Thatcher, and the great pope, John Paul II, it was America that ended communism in the Soviet Union, Poland, East Germany, Hungary, Czechoslovakia, Romania, and Bulgaria, and liberated, among other nations, Ukraine, Azerbaijan, Latvia, Lithuania, and Estonia.

America is unique.

America is the only country that was founded not on a race, ethnicity, or nationality, but on an idea: limited government—because the founders of America believed, first and foremost, in liberty.

America became the freest country in world history, which is why France gave the Statue of Liberty to one country: America. And America has given more liberty and opportunity to more people from more nations than any country in world history. Yes, America allowed slavery in half of its states. But every society in the world practiced slavery. What rendered America unique is that Americans killed one another in its bloodiest war to abolish slavery, and that it eventually became the least racist multi-racial country in history.

It remains the only white-majority country to have ever elected a black leader. And Africans know how good America is, which is why, by the 1980s, more black Africans had come to America voluntarily as immigrants seeking freedom and opportunity than ever came as slaves.

Americans are decent people.

Ask visitors what they think of Americans, and they are likely to tell you how friendly Americans are.

There are mean and bad Americans, and there are kind and good people in every country. But having traveled abroad every year of my life since college, and to all fifty American states, and being sensitive to people's goodness and happiness, I have been continually amazed at the essential decency of most Americans.

I fell in love with America at the age of twenty, and given the freedom, the opportunities, and the religious tolerance I have experienced, I realize all these years later that America has loved me too.

MORE WISDOM FROM DENNIS PRAGER

While visiting Dennis in the hospital, we asked him a few questions about the past year. We trust you'll find his answers inspiring.

Q: Dennis, are you still grateful to be alive despite the physical challenges you've faced over the past year?

Dennis:

You know I talk about everything with callers to my radio show. I don't remember how the subject came up, but about 15 or 20 years ago, some guy called in and said he'd rather be dead than a quadriplegic. And I, in a rare moment for me, sort of yelled at a caller, and I said, "You gotta be kidding. You have your mind and you can speak, and you'd rather be dead because you can't move your limbs?"

And irony of ironies, my theory was tested. That's exactly my condition, and I'm thrilled to be alive. I am. We are all in our minds and our ability to communicate. Would I wish I could move my limbs? I dream about moving my limbs almost every night. Of course, I would love it. But I'm alive, and I have my loved ones, and I have the public, and I think I could still make a difference. Would I rather be dead? It's inconceivable. Just, I love life, and I love so many people. Of course, I love my wife and my kids and my grandkids...Now, I will tell you one other interesting thing. I have a book on happiness. Twenty-six years ago, it was published by HarperCollins. Happiness Is a

Serious Problem. I would not change a word. That is how philosophically prepared I was for this terrible thing that I have encountered. I mean, when I wrote about expectations, and you know my motto: "If nothing's horrific, life is terrific." And I live by that. I never thought that anything horrific would happen to me.

Q: You're living up to your values. Do you think America is living up to its values?

Dennis

Well, what is it? Was it [Benjamin] Franklin who said it? It's "a republic, if you can keep it." And it is only sustainable by a religious and moral population. That's correct. A moral and religious people. We think we can have secular wisdom. There are secular individuals with wisdom, but there are no secular institutions with wisdom. Wisdom begins with the fear of the Lord, it says in Psalms. And that's correct. There is religious wisdom, but there isn't secular wisdom. And wisdom is the root of goodness. Good intentions are not the root of goodness. Wisdom is. We're in trouble. We send our kids to universitiesand especially prestigious universitieswhere they are taught by teachers with no wisdom. Hence moral confusion. And you can have any number of students and

professors marching on behalf of what is literally today's Nazis, the organization called Hamas. That's really something.

Q: Has America been a force for good or has it been a force for ill in the world?

Dennis:

That patriotic conservative Americans are asking these questions is nothing more than a sad example of how moral confusion has not only affected the left. Let's say there was no America in the twentieth century—would communism have been vanquished? No. Would the Nazis have been vanquished? No. Would Japan have been vanquished? The Japanese empire. The answer is no. Was America a force for good in the least-known major war America has ever fought—the Korean War?

That is as good an example—as clear an example as possible—of America serving as a force of goodness. We had absolutely no interest, no military-, no economic interest in Korea. I would venture to say that most of the 37,000 American men who died in the Korean War in the early '50s could not point to where Korea was on a map of the world. Yet they went. They fought. They died in large numbers to defend whatever part of the country could be defended from being taken over by communist totalitarianism. And if you want to know what South Korea would be like had Americans who fought in Korea and died in the dozens of thousands of numbers, just look at North Korea. That's what it would have been like. A nation of automatons created by communist, totalitarian puppet masters. And I, again, I emphasize, America gained nothing for itself by fighting in the Korean War...



AMERICA NEDS AJULY FOURTH SEDER





erhaps the major reason
Jews have been able to
keep their national identity
alive for 3,000 years—the last
2,000 of which were nearly all
spent dispersed among other
nations—is ritual. No national
or cultural identity can survive
without ritual, even if the group
remains in its own country.

Americans knew this until the era of anti-wisdom was ushered in by the Baby Boomer generation in the 1960s and '70s. We always had national holidays that celebrated something meaningful.

When I was in elementary school, every year we would put on a play about Abraham Lincoln to commemorate Lincoln's birthday and a play about George Washington to commemorate Washington's birthday. Unfortunately, Congress made a particularly foolish decision to abolish

the two greatest presidents' birthdays as national holidays and substituted the meaningless Presidents Day. Beyond having a three-day weekend and department store sales, the day means nothing.

Columbus Day is rarely celebrated, since the European founding of European civilization on American soil is not politically correct.

Christmas has become less nationally meaningful as exemplified by the substitution of "Happy Holidays" for "Merry Christmas."

Memorial Day should be a solemn day on which Americans take time to honor those Americans who fought and died for America and for liberty. But, again, fewer and fewer Americans visit military cemeteries, just as fewer communities have Memorial Day festivities.





We come, finally, to the mother of American holidays, July Fourth, the day America was born. This day has a long history of vibrant and meaningful celebrations. But it, too, is rapidly losing its meaning. For example, look around—especially if you live in a large urban area—and see how few homes display the American flag. For most Americans, it appears that the Fourth has become merely a day to take off from work and enjoy hot dogs with friends.

Our national holidays were established to commemorate the most significant national events and individuals in our history; they now exist primarily to provide us with a day off. This was reinforced by the nation's decision to shift some of the holidays to a Monday—thereby losing the meaning of the specific date in order to give us a three-day weekend.

National memory dies without national ritual. And without a national memory, a nation dies. That is the secret at the heart of the Jewish people's survival that the American people must learn if they are to survive.

When Jews gather at the Passover Seder—and this is the most widely observed

Jewish holiday—they recount the exodus from Egypt, an event that occurred 3,200 years ago. We Americans have difficulty keeping alive the memory of events that happened less than 250 years ago.

How have the Jews accomplished this? By the ritual of the Passover Seder. Jews spend the evening recounting the exodus from Egypt—and as if it happened to them. In the words of the Passover Haggadah—the Passover Seder book—"every person is obligated to regard himself as if he himself left Egypt." The story is retold in detail, and it is told as if it happened to those present at the Seder, not only to those who lived it 3,200 years ago.

That has to be the motto of the July Fourth Seder. We all have to retell the story in as much detail as possible and to regard ourselves as if we, no matter when we or our ancestors came to America—were present at the nation's founding in 1776.

The Seder achieves the feat not only through detailed recitation of the story, but through engaging the interest of the youngest of those at the table (indeed, they are its primary focus), through special food, through song, and through relevant prayer. Obviously, just as secular Jews tend to avoid the prayer part of the Haggadah, so, too, secular Americans are free to avoid the prayer part of an American Seder Book.

This is why PragerU created the July Fourth Seder—an Independence Day ceremony. We now have a generation of Americans who possess little American identity, precisely because they have been given little American memory. The nation whose Founders saw it as a Second Israel must now look to the First Israel for guidance on how a people sustains itself across generations.

With the help of our friends at the White House and the Department of Education, we have made this ceremony available for all Americans to observe. It is my deep hope that during America's 250th birthday, millions of Americans will take part in this profound ritual of remembrance and appreciation.

White House Ceremony and Founders Museum

In the summer of 2025, PragerU proudly partnered in the launch of the new Founders Museum and the Road to Liberty exhibit at the White House. This historic initiative educates Americans about the courage, vision, and enduring legacy of our nation's Founders.

PragerU was honored to participate in the museum's opening celebration—an event co-hosted by Second Lady Usha Vance, United States Secretary of Education Linda McMahon, and PragerU. The Road to Liberty exhibit, launched alongside the new Founders Museum, features portraits of all fifty-six

signers of the Declaration of Independence, six influential women of the Revolution, and featurettes covering nineteen pivotal events that shaped America's founding. To bring these stories to life, PragerU produced eightyone original videos using cutting-edge AI animation and storytelling technology.

During the opening event, PragerU led an Independence Day Ceremony of our own design. Inspired by the structure of the Passover Seder, this interactive experience honors the bravery, sacrifice, and timeless values that built our nation. The ceremony offers a guided way to reflect on the meaning of American liberty—through storytelling, readings, and symbolic acts of remembrance.

To help families and communities across the country host their own ceremonies, PragerU created a family-friendly book featuring a ready-to-use script, detailed accounts of key Revolutionary War events and turning points, profiles of the Founding Fathers, and fun, educational activities for all ages.

PragerU's Road to Liberty videos are featured on the official White House website and PragerU.com, extending the exhibit's reach far beyond Washington. In addition, a free, downloadable version of the exhibit allows families, schools, and organizations nationwide to bring this powerful tribute to freedom into their own homes and communities.


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
THE GREAT AMERICAN VIRTUAL ARTIFACT VAULT



ragerU is once again at the center of a media firestorm. Two flashpoints dominated the headlines: claims that PragerU is becoming "the next PBS" and the launch of our groundbreaking Teacher Qualification Test.

The White House commissioning PragerU to deliver several major projects helped fuel the narrative, sparking waves of hand-wringing from the left about our growing influence. 




