

Confetti Eggs

Supplies:





- 2 eggs
- A bowl
- 2 Tbsp white vinegar
- A nail
- 2 stickers
- 2 cups filled with hot water
- 2 spoons
- Red & blue food coloring
- Confetti



Steps:

	<p>Step 1: Hold an egg over a bowl and gently poke a small hole in the top of it using the nail.</p>
	<p>Step 2: Use the nail to break up the yoke inside the egg. Drain the contents of the egg into the bowl. Repeat Steps 1 and 2 with the second egg. Rinse both eggs with water and set aside.</p>
	<p>Step 3: Fill the two clear plastic cups with hot water. Add 20 drops of red food coloring to one cup and 20 drops of blue food coloring to the second cup.</p>
	<p>Step 4: Add one tablespoon of vinegar to each cup.</p>



	<p>Step 5: Use a spoon to help submerge one egg in the cup of red dye and the other egg in the cup of blue dye. Let the eggs soak in the dye for 15-20 minutes, and then remove from the cups. Let them dry completely.</p>
	<p>Step 6: Spoon confetti into each egg, filling each halfway.</p>
	<p>Step 7: Place a sticker over the hole at the top of each egg.</p>
	<p>Step 8: Take one egg in each hand and clap together to release the confetti!</p>
