NOTE: NZSL grammar structure is different to English. Just sign 'my name what?', then fingerspell your name.




Move your fist onto your chest.



Hold fist up with two fingers extended. Put two fingers on the side of forehead. Move wrist forward and twist palm out.



With lowered eyebrows, extend index finger and move from side to side.





Hold your palm out.

Move to the side twice.



With a flat hand at your chin, move across and make a fist.



Index fingers facing together. Move hands together.



Use your index finger to point to the person you are referring to.
