How RV Travel Is Solving the 2026 World Cup Accommodation Crunch



The Accommodation Problem Is Already Here



The 2026 World Soccer Tournament is expected to draw more than 1 million international visitors, putting immediate pressure on accommodations across U.S. host cities.

Hotel prices surged early following the tournament schedule announcement and have remained consistently high, underscoring how quickly demand is expected to outpace traditional accommodation supply.

To better understand how travelers can navigate these challenges, [RVshare](#) and [Campspot](#) partnered to analyze pricing, availability, and booking trends across host markets.



In key markets, rates have surged by more than 300% according to an analysis by [The Athletic](#) following the match schedule announcement, with average nightly prices reaching:

- **\$540+ in NY/NJ**
- **\$450+ in Los Angeles**
- **\$435+ in Miami**

An average two-night stay for two people now ranges from \$1,150 to over \$1,600 before food, parking, or transportation.



RV Travel and Campgrounds: A Proven Alternative for Major Event Travel

As hotel prices surge around the 2026 World Soccer Tournament, campgrounds and delivered RV stays offer a practical, flexible alternative. One that not only remains bookable within reach of host cities, but also turns the trip itself into part of the experience.

This model solves the three biggest traveler challenges: cost, availability, and flexibility.

Similar to hotels, RV rental stays with destination delivery to a campground can be a turnkey experience, reducing the friction for travelers who do not want to drive or manage setup themselves.

*After battling in a ticketing process that has drawn over 500 million global requests, travelers who secure seats are now confronting a second constraint: **where to stay.***

The Cost Advantage Is Immediate

Across major host cities, the price gap is clear.

RV & Campground Average / 2 nights, 4 people: \$396 to \$552+

Hotel Average / 2 nights for 2 people: \$1,150 to \$1,600+

Fans can save over \$700 per trip, with per-person savings increasing significantly for families and groups sharing an RV stay.

Booking Flexibility Is a Major Advantage

Hotels tend to reward early booking, while campgrounds and RV travel can offer more flexibility closer to departure.

- ➔ Campground bookings commonly occur within 2–4 weeks of travel (46%)
- ➔ Campgrounds maintain 62% availability across all campsites within 100 miles of host markets for match dates*
- ➔ RV inventory shows a 75% availability across all city metros within 100 miles*
- ➔ RV rental booking commonly occurs within 6–8 weeks of travel

Even during peak match dates, including semifinals and finals, regional inventory remains accessible within a 50–100-mile radius. This makes it one of the only viable options for:
