



TURNOVER REPORT Muti Elementary School and Communal Water Project Barangay Muti, Zamboanga City, Philippines

Date: July 23, 2025

On July 23, 2025, the official turnover ceremony for the Muti Elementary School and Communal Water Project was held in Barangay Muti, Zamboanga City. The event was attended by approximately 100 participants, including members of the Rotary Club of Zamboanga City West, barangay officials, faculty members of Muti Elementary School, parents and students, and notably, Rotary District 3850 Governor Federico "Pip" Acepcion.

This project represents another successful initiative in our mission to provide clean and sustainable water access to underserved public schools, following our earlier installations at **Simanta** and **Niyog-Niyog Elementary Schools**.

Project Overview

The centerpiece of the project is a **solar-powered deepwell water system**, designed and built using a solution we have effectively refined through past implementations. The system includes:

- A 4-inch diameter borehole, drilled to a depth of 100 feet, reinforced with a durable casing.
- A 2HP, 1500-watt high-head submersible pump installed to draw water from the aquifer.

A **3,000-watt direct current solar power system**, composed of **six solar panels** and a controller, ensuring reliable, off-grid power for the pump.

Water drawn from the deepwell is delivered to a **newly rehabilitated elevated water tank**, which now serves as the **main source of clean water** for the entire school. Since the system is powered by solar energy, any **excess water** produced is made available to **nearby residents**, thereby benefiting the broader **Barangay Muti community**.

Background and Rationale

For many years, **Muti Elementary School** struggled with a **lack of access to clean water**. The only existing source was a **rainwater collection system**, which had fallen into disrepair. During our **needs assessment visit**, we discovered the system was non-functional—**gutters were broken**, **tank bases had collapsed**, and **rainfall was infrequent**, rendering it ineffective.

This urgent need prompted action and collaboration, resulting in the implementation of a **long-term**, **sustainable water solution** for the school and surrounding community.

Collaborative Effort

The success of the Muti project is a testament to the **power of collaboration**, particularly between two great Rotary Clubs—Rotary Club of Calgary, Canada (District 5360) and the Rotary Club of Zamboanga City West. Their shared commitment, along with the support of dedicated local partners, made this vision a reality.

Project Cost and Sponsorship

The total cost of the project is approximately **PHP 270,000**. This endeavor was made possible through the generous support of the following sponsors:

The **Muti Elementary School and Communal Water Project** is a **small-scale initiative** with **large-scale impact**. It stands as a symbol of what **compassionate collaboration** and **purpose-driven action** can achieve. We thank all our partners and supporters for their generosity, commitment, and belief in this cause.

Together, we have turned water into a tool for education, empowerment, and lasting change.


"Time is always an issue," one member remarked. "But events like this remind us why we must make time—for friendship, for laughter, and for the kind of bonding that makes our service even stronger."

Polio surveillance networks and vaccination campaigns also monitor children for other health problems, like vitamin deficiency and measles, so we can address them sooner.

4 YOUR GIFT WILL LOWER HEALTH CARE COSTS.

The global effort to eradicate polio has already saved more than \$27 billion in health care costs since 1988, and expects to save \$14 billion more by 2050.

5 YOUR GIFT WILL MAKE HISTORY.

Polio eradication will be one of history's greatest public health achievements, with polio following smallpox to become only the second human disease eradicated from the world.



At the end of the 1980s, more than 350,000 children were paralyzed by polio every year. Today, Rotary and its partners have reduced the incidence of polio by 99.9%. However, until we see the last of the poliovirus, eradication efforts need additional funding to:

more than 400 million children against polio every year

IMPROVE

disease surveillance systems to detect any poliovirus in a person or the environment

HIRE

more than 150,000 health workers to go door to door to find every child
