Enhancing Resilience: Mental Health Training for 5SAB, PNPSAF last January 20-21, 2025

The Rotary Club of Zamboanga City West recognizes the dedication and sacrifices of the 5th Special Action Battalion (5SAB), PNPSAF in protecting communities, especially in high-risk and Geographically Isolated and Disadvantaged Areas (GIDAs). Their demanding roles expose them to extreme stress, trauma, and physical danger, making mental health support essential.

Key Challenges:

- 1. **High-Stress Environment** Constant exposure to danger leads to anxiety, burnout, and emotional strain.
- 2. Trauma & Emotional Toll Witnessing violence and loss increases the risk of PTSD and depression.
- 3. **Risk of Injury** The fear and impact of physical harm add to psychological stress. **Isolation** Deployment in remote areas heightens feelings of loneliness and anxiety.

The Need for Mental Health Support

Unaddressed mental health issues in law enforcement affect decision-making, performance, and well-being. A **Mental Health Wellness Program** will equip 5SAB officers with tools to manage stress, build resilience, and sustain their emotional health.



Today, 20 million people who would otherwise be paralyzed by polio are walking, and 1.5 million people who would otherwise have died are alive.

If all eradication efforts stopped today, within 10 years, polio could paralyze as many as 200,000 children each year. A polio-free world will be a healthier world for children everywhere.

Polio surveillance networks and vaccination campaigns also monitor children for other health problems, like vitamin deficiency and measles, so we can address them sooner.
