Francesco Arezzo, a member of the Rotary Club of Ragusa, Italy, has been selected by the Board of Directors to become Rotary International's president for 2025-26. Arezzo will become president on 1 July.

The Board conducted a special session following the unexpected resignation of RI President-elect Mário César Martins de Camargo on 8 June. Guided by the RI code and policies, the Board selected the new president-elect from a pool of candidates who were considered by the Nominating Committee for President of Rotary International in August 2023.

The 2025-26 presidential message, announced at the 2025 Rotary International Assembly in February, will remain Unite for Good, which calls on Rotary members to be a force for unity in a world increasingly divided by politics, geography, and ideology. Through service projects, Rotary brings together people of every background — across races, religions, and professions — in a shared mission to do good in their communities.

Arezzo is an orthodontist in private practice. He is active internationally as a member of the Italian, European, and American orthodontics associations. He is vice president of the National Association of Italian Dentists for the province of Ragusa and was the founder and head for seven years of the delegation for Ragusa of the National Trust for Italy. He is a Knight of Honor and Devotion in Obedience within the Sovereign Order of Malta.

A Rotary member for more than 30 years, Arezzo has served as vice chair of the Joint Strategic Planning Committee and as RI director, learning facilitator, and as district conference presidential representative.

Arezzo is a Major Donor and Benefactor of The Rotary Foundation. He is married to Anna Maria Criscione, an entrepreneur in the tourism field. They have two children.





With unwavering spirit, our volunteers braved the elements to install additional **Gardenator units**—an innovative **vertical barrel farming system** that allows households to grow food efficiently, even in areas with limited space and resources.

This phase of the project places special emphasis on **empowering women** and **strengthening local communities** by equipping them with sustainable tools to grow their own food and create healthier, more self-reliant households.

In addition to the installation of Gardenator units, the team also **distributed food packs to 60 households**, offering much-needed support to local residents and further reinforcing our mission of holistic community upliftment.

A transformative step toward healthier and more resilient communities has been achieved in Barangay Muti, Zamboanga City. The Rotary Clubs of Makati and Zamboanga City West, in collaboration with Myler Agribusiness, have successfully turned over a solar-powered communal water supply system to Niyog-Niyog Elementary School, as part of their WASH-in-Schools (Water, Sanitation, and Hygiene) initiative.

This impactful project features a new deep well and pump system that now ensures over 189 students have safe and dependable access to clean water for drinking and sanitation. In addition, more than 50 households in the surrounding community benefit from a shared water access point—helping improve public health and daily living conditions.

This milestone reflects the Rotary spirit of service above self and shows how strategic partnerships and compassion-driven projects can create lasting, life-changing impact.

Latuan-Curuan Water project turnover



June 17, 2025 | Rotary WASH project

The formal turnover of Global Grant No. 2236738: Latuan-Curuan Water Project was successfully held on June 17, 2025, at 9:00 AM at the Curuan Parish Church, Zamboanga City.

This vital infrastructure initiative—funded under Rotary International's Global Grant program—aims to significantly improve access to clean and safe water in the eastern barangays of Zamboanga City. The project harnesses a new permanent water source from a river stream in Barangay Latuan, approximately 6 kilometers west of Barangay Curuan.

The completed system delivers 20 liters per second of potable water, benefiting approximately 4,000 households—or an estimated 25,000 residents—across Barangays Curuan, Buenavista, Quiniput, and Latuan.

This development not only enhances water pressure in existing service areas but also extends access to communities previously without reliable water supply.

RCZC West Presents Telemedicine Project in Pre Convention Symposium at Rotary International Convention in Calgary, Alberta, Canada


The Rotary Club of Zamboanga City West through its representative, Rotarian Afdal Kunting, presented its Philippine Model at the Global OffSite Care Symposium on Telemedicine on June 21, 2025 at the Marriot Hotel downtown, Calgary Alberta Canada.

This symposium is a pre-convention activity of the 2025 Rotary International Convention that ran from 21-25, 2025. The convener, Global OffSite Care is a United States Based Humanitarian Non-Profit Organization that works with Rotary Club sponsored telemedicine projects which advocate improved access to health care using the Internet. There are currently 18 projects across 11 countries and three continents. The RCZC West project is among the three given the opportunity to present along with one from Haiti and Guyana.

Rotarian Kunting presented how the telemedicine model of RCZC West, working together with the Zamboanga City Medical Center with assistance from the Rotary Club of Calgary Downtown and Global OffSite Care through a global grant, is now the biggest provider in the region with 64 partner sites.

Among the important insights presented by Rotarian Kunting, is the development of a Regional Telemedicine Center, the incorporation of a teaching and mentoring component to improve partner knowledge and practice as well as conducting studies to identify enablers and barriers to telemedicine practice. The Rotary Club of Zamboanga City West continues to fulfill its role.




