# WELCOME

As each year passes, I never cease to be amazed by the invaluable work of Manchester United Foundation - a charity I am proud to represent as Chair of Trustees.

With the life circumstances of many becoming increasingly difficult, particularly for the most vulnerable in our society, seldom has it been more important that Manchester United remains a strong pillar of support in our local community and beyond, through the work of the Foundation.

This report illustrates both the importance of what we do, but also the impact it has on the lives of thousands of young people in our areas of delivery.

I'm delighted to announce that the social value of this impact has increased by over 20% this year, to over £61.2 million. This means that for every pound we spent, the charity generated £11.57 of social and economic value.

Over the course of the past season, we engaged over 41,000 participants with over 49,000 hours of delivery in some of the most socially deprived areas of the UK. This ensures that our young people are supported by us to feel safe, healthy and empowered, no matter their circumstances.

It's important to acknowledge the partnership funding we receive from the Premier League Charitable Fund, Professional Footballers' Association and DXC Technology. Without their support, it would be impossible to deliver at the scale we now operate.

I would also like to take this opportunity to thank the Manchester United fanbase, who remain utterly

constant in their support of the Club's affiliated charity. From coat donations and a Sleep Out at Old Trafford, to raising over £140,000 by conquering Mount Kilimanjaro - whatever the ask, our supporters respond.

The Season Ticket donation scheme and rounding up at online checkouts once again reached a milestone of raising over £660,000 for the Foundation. In addition, Supporters' Club Warm-Up events and matchday lottery purchases raised a further £480,000. That's over £1 million altogether, from a fanbase who - embedded in the history and heritage of their football club - look after their own.

This amazing support is what enables us not only to continue our day-to-day work, but also to offer our participants incredible opportunities such as once-in-a-lifetime trips to Munich, Cyprus and Houston that you will learn more about in this report.

Young people being given the opportunity to thrive is something that Manchester United proudly stands for: on the pitch with our esteemed boys' and girls' academies, and off it through our Foundation. As this report demonstrates, this philosophy is needed more than ever in our communities, and I am proud to see the Foundation setting the standard for providing such vital support.

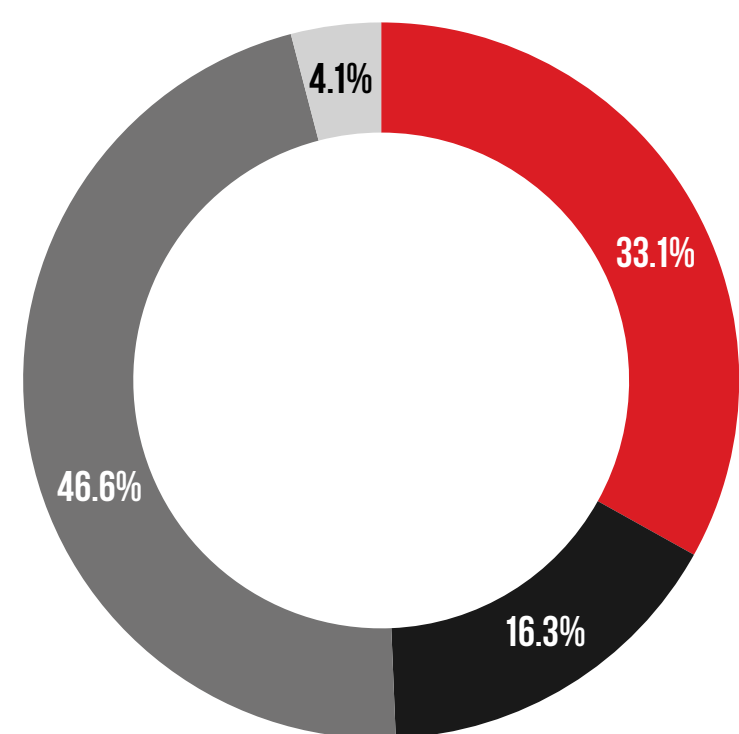

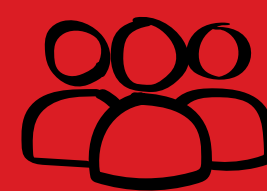

WHO WE ARE



## BLACK HISTORY MONTH

Manchester United players Amad, Andre Onana and Casemiro joined celebratory workshops focusing on champions of Black history and shining a light on impactful figures from yesteryear, both in wider society and those who have represented Manchester United in the past.

## AMAD AND GARNACHO AWARD OUR COMMUNITY CAPTAIN

Amad and Alejandro Garnacho visited partner school Claremont Primary in February to present primary school assistant manager Nick Bradshaw with the Community Captain award as part of the Premier League's More Than A Game campaign, recognising his outstanding contribution to Premier League-funded programmes.



## AN UNFORGETTABLE CHRISTMAS

As part of the club's Christmas campaign, Foundation participants received plenty of incredible experiences over the festive period. James, a student at partner school The Oldham Academy North, was invited by Alejandro Garnacho to be a mascot at an Old Trafford matchday, where he also received a full kit and got to take penalties on the pitch with his siblings.

Girls from our Premier League Primary Stars programme were also invited to Carrington, where they were surprised by Ella Toone, Elisabeth Terland and Lisa Naalsund, who gifted the girls personalised kit and joined in with a kick about.



## SANTA RUN

Over 200 pupils from the Foundation's partner primary schools took part in the first Daily Mile Santa Run at the Theatre of Dreams. The festive iteration of the Daily Mile – a year-round initiative, supported by INEOS, which promotes the importance of daily exercise among school children – encouraged pupils to complete laps of Old Trafford, whether by wheeling, walking or running, with many dressing as Santa or elves for the occasion.

## SIR BOBBY'S STREET REDS

In August 2024 we launched a special partnership programme: Sir Bobby's Street Reds, a weekly community football session formed as a lasting legacy to one of United's greatest-ever players.

During Easter, children from the Moss Side community enjoyed free activities and meals at a Sir Bobby's Street Reds half-term camp, funded by the Sir Bobby Charlton Foundation, to ensure children remained active and engaged outside of school term-time.



## CELEBRATING LGBTQ+ REPRESENTATION AT THE CLIFF

More than 50 young people from partner schools came together to celebrate LGBTQ+ representation in sport ahead of Manchester United's dedicated Rainbow Laces fixture.

Students joined representatives from Rainbow Devils, Manchester United's LGBTQ+ Supporters' Club, and the Proud Trust in a special event championing inclusion at The Cliff Training Ground.

## PLAYER VISITS TO PARTNER SCHOOLS AND PROJECTS

Across the season, members of the Manchester United men's and women's teams have paid surprise visits to Foundation partner schools – including Pioneer House SEND School, Buile Hill Academy, Manchester Enterprise Academy and Lime Tree Primary Academy, with players including Maya Le Tissier, Ella Toone, Altay Bayindir and Tom Heaton getting involved in activities such as literacy programmes, environmental workshops and even dodgeball!

Anna Sandberg and Evie Rabjohn also joined a Street Reds session at Partington for a kick about and Q&A, while Harry Maguire surprised a group of participants at Stretford Street Reds, arriving to chants of "Oh! Harry Maguire!" and taking part in small-sided games.

## REMEMBERING MUNICH

For the third consecutive year, participants from the Foundation's Street Reds projects embarked on a commemorative trip to Munich to recognise the 67th anniversary of the air disaster of 1958. The group attended the annual memorial ceremony at Manchesterplatz, where they represented the Foundation and paid their respects by laying a wreath.

Back in Manchester, Foundation volunteer Irene – also a former partner school student – read her poem 'Keeping The Flame Alive' at the Old Trafford memorial service, addressing a large crowd that included Ruben Amorim, Marc Skinner and Sir Alex Ferguson.

## A TRIP OF A LIFETIME TO CYPRUS

Twelve participants from our partner high schools were rewarded with an unforgettable trip to Limassol, in Cyprus, hosted by our friends at the Manchester United Cyprus Supporters' Club. This cultural exchange saw many of the students experience not only their first time on an aeroplane, but their first time out of Manchester, as they headed away on an action-packed five-day trip to a new country, which included a rope adventure park experience, a padel session with professional players and even a visit to a camel park.

Over the season, Phallon Tullis-Joyce has led science-based lessons for students at Stretford High School.

Phallon – who is also a marine biologist and a certified deep-sea diver – has been teaching young people about different ecosystems and marine life, as part of the Foundation's Eco Reds and Premier League Inspires delivery.

## SKILLS LAB

Joshua Zirkzee and Jonny Evans surprised a group of Year 11 pupils in the Foundation's Skills Lab, joining in with workshops and offering advice about managing pressure ahead of their exams.

The Skills Lab is an inspirational space within Old Trafford, which provides an inclusive, accessible and immersive education programme for all. Over the last season, the Skills Lab welcomed over 14,600 global and online visitors from 31 countries, delivering 387 workshops focusing on areas such as unlocking potential, leadership and managing the big occasion.

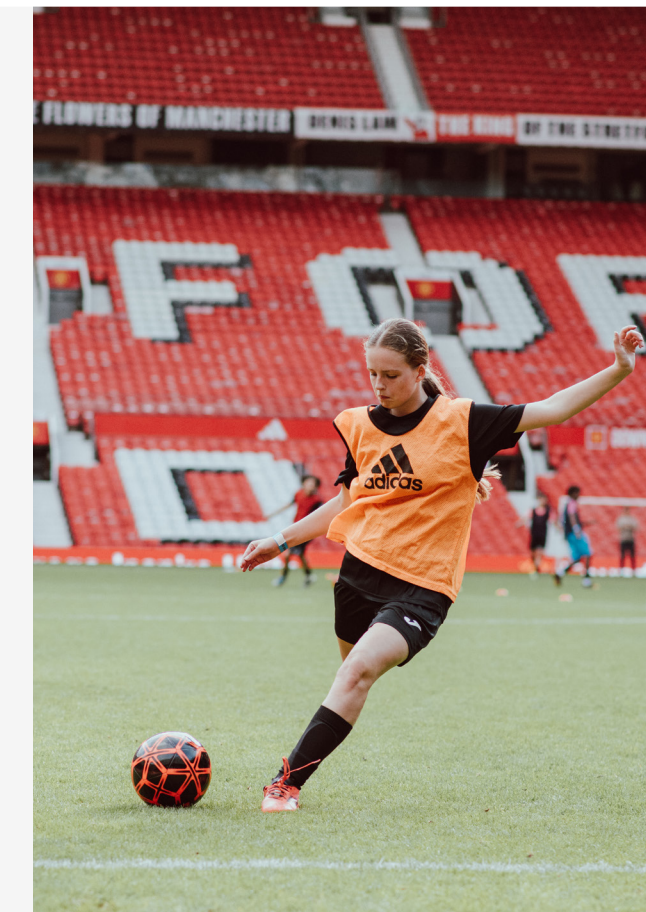


## INSPIRING THE NEXT GENERATION

# HEALTHIER AND HAPPIER YOUNG PEOPLE

**At Manchester United Foundation we strive to support young people to improve their physical and mental wellbeing by offering coaching, mentorship and opportunities across all our projects.**

Petra began playing football at a young age, but having experienced challenges in her mobility and developing her communication skills she fell out of love with the game, choosing to stop playing after her confidence was affected by the environment she trained in.

It wasn't until Petra began attending Ability Counts – the Foundation's PAN-disability football programme – that she redeveloped a passion for the sport and rebuilt her confidence. Her dad, Andy, shares her journey:

*Petra was shy and low on confidence, particularly in big groups. We first heard about Ability Counts through a friend of ours and ever since we came, we haven't looked back.*

*She really enjoys the atmosphere, the coaches, everything about it, and she just wants to come every week. Her communication skills have improved, especially in a larger group. She's made so many different friends here and that's what it's all about.*

*Since she's been at Ability Counts, she's been communicating with lots of different children; she enjoys having that fun side, it helps with her confidence. She loves interacting, she never stops smiling, chasing around and having fun, as well as just playing football.*

*Petra also has difficulty with her gross motor skills, which can affect her lower limbs and coordination, but coming to these sessions has helped her develop her muscles and strength so that she can compete a lot better in sport at school. It's helped her massively.*

Through attending Ability Counts, Petra has also accessed some amazing opportunities with Manchester United Foundation.

A season ticket holder for Manchester United Women, Petra was inspired by Reds representing England's Lionesses in the 2023 Women's World Cup, so was elated to be invited to take a penalty on a women's team matchday at the Theatre of Dreams. Petra says:

*I love to go to the women's matches because I love the players and they play for Manchester United. I got to walk down the tunnel and saw the FA Cup trophy. I also liked taking penalties against Fred the Red, and I did my cool celebration and won a prize! I feel special and proud of myself.*



## CONNECTED AND SOCIALLY RESPONSIBLE YOUNG PEOPLE

**Social consciousness is embedded in the fabric of the Manchester United community, a trait we also aim to instil in Foundation participants.**

Hunter, a long-term attendee at our inclusive projects, has demonstrated those qualities by becoming an admirable volunteer and fundraiser for the Foundation's work. Hunter says:

*I was only seven when I came to my first session with Manchester United Foundation. We found out about Ability Counts when my brother was refereeing at Carrington, and one of the staff told me about the inclusive football sessions.*

*That was just over eight years ago, and I've been coming to Ability Counts ever since. From the very first session, all of the coaches and players made me feel welcome. The sessions are really fun and enjoyable, and it makes me feel happy to play for the club I support. I'm 15 now, and I've been a Manchester United fan for 15 years – all my life!*

*Now, I come to four sessions every week with the Foundation. Being at The Cliff, it makes me feel emotional, playing where Legends like Paul Scholes and David Beckham used to train.*

*Through the Foundation, I've met players at Carrington and been a ball assistant and a mascot at Old Trafford. I've also played in the MUDSA Cup at Carrington; it made me feel like a professional.*

*I wanted to give back after everything the Foundation has done for me. I've raised over £2,000 by doing the Great Manchester Run and climbing Ben Nevis. I've learnt new skills, become more sociable and confident, and developed my leadership skills. I've met friends for life, who I'd never have met without coming here.*

*I'm also more mature and willing to help others. I've been volunteering for over a year and it feels really good to be helping the younger players. I'd like to become a qualified coach and work for the Foundation in the future.*

*I want to thank all the staff from the Foundation; I'm really happy and grateful for all the amazing opportunities I've been given.*

# SKILLED AND EMPLOYMENT-READY YOUNG PEOPLE

**The Foundation supports young people with education, training and employment opportunities to give them an insight into future prospects and open up their career pathways.**

Mwezi is a pupil at Foundation partner school, The Oldham Academy North. He took part in this year's Premier League Inspires Challenge, which helped him to build confidence, improve his self-esteem, and develop skills that will support him in further education and employment.

Alongside his teammates, Mwezi won the regional heats at Old Trafford and went on to represent his school and Manchester United Foundation in the national finals at Wembley. Over the course of the programme, Mwezi has demonstrated excellent communication skills, emerging as a key leader within the group. Mwezi says:

*Taking part has really improved my communication skills and helped me become more confident when speaking. The biggest challenge was presenting to a large audience. I was nervous at first, but by the time I got to my second presentation, it started to feel natural.*

*I've always loved football, and the most important thing I've learned from being part of the challenge is the importance of gender equality in sport.*

*Before the challenge, I was coaching younger children. I not only taught them how to dribble, pass, and work on their technique, but also helped them when they had misconceptions. It was through that experience that I realised I'd be good at taking part in the challenge and it has made me consider future opportunities and how I can develop further as a leader.*

Joe Keeble, the Manchester United Foundation school partnership officer based in Mwezi's school, says:

*Over the past year, Mwezi has grown tremendously not just as a student, but as a leader. He's taken on the role of Year 10 football captain, stepped up as a sports leader, and played a key part in developing the Premier League social action project. I've seen him put himself in challenging situations, from presenting at Old Trafford to confidently speaking at Wembley in front of judges and Premier League clubs.*

*What stands out most is how Mwezi handles these moments with kindness, professionalism, and a quiet confidence that really shines through. He's become a role model in school, showing real respect for others and setting high standards for himself. You can see how proud he is of what he's achieved, and I know his mum is incredibly proud of him, too.*





# FOUNDATION FANS - THANK YOU FOR YOUR SUPPORT

The Foundation is immensely proud to have the support of the loyal and generous Manchester United fanbase, who remain at the heart of everything we do, to make a difference to young people's lives.

Over the 2024/25 season, fans have continued to take part in community initiatives and fundraising events, raising vital funds for the Foundation.

These include the second annual matchday coat appeal, which this season took place at both Old Trafford and Leigh Sports Village for men's and women's first-team games. United fans – plus travelling supporters from Chelsea

and Arsenal, respectively – donated an incredible 2,250 coats to be passed to those less fortunate over the winter months.

Additionally, over 120 fans braved the cold for a night at Old Trafford as part of our third stadium Sleep Out, raising more than £34,000 for the Foundation and youth homelessness charity, Centrepoin.

Season ticket holders have also donated tickets to the value of over £560,000 this season – the scheme allows fans the option of donating the cost of their ticket to the Foundation when unable to attend a match at Old Trafford, and has now raised a fantastic £2 million since the start of the 2022/23 season. Additionally, fans made more than 31,000 donations when rounding up the cost of their purchase at online checkouts, resulting in almost £100,000 being raised.

Similarly, we are proud to work with 334 official Manchester United supporters' clubs from 91 countries across the world, members of which have raised over £41,000 for the Foundation over the 2024/25 season at pre-match Old Trafford Warm-Up events and an end-of-season celebration evening.

These events and initiatives serve to deepen the connection between the club, Foundation and fans both locally and globally, and we are grateful for the continuous support.

## LEGENDS MATCH

In September 2024, a team of United legends took on Celtic Legends at Old Trafford, in front of a crowd of over 33,000 fans.

Former players including Wayne Rooney, Michael Carrick, Darren Fletcher and Dimitar Berbatov returned for the occasion, with over £1 million in revenue raised for the Foundation, making an incredible difference to our community work with young people.

## CLIMBING KILIMANJARO

After leading United Legends against Celtic as manager, Bryan Robson once again showed his unwavering support to the Foundation in October by leading a team of inspirational trekkers to the summit of Mount Kilimanjaro. It was the second time Captain Marvel has completed the challenge, following his inaugural ascent with the Foundation in 2013, and he and the team of 24 fans will take home memories to last a lifetime, having raised over £140,000 for our work.

# CHARITABLE GIVING

Manchester United Foundation is committed to making a difference to those who need it most, whether that's through our community projects or servicing charitable objectives on behalf of the club.

Last season the Foundation donated 1,324 signed items for external fundraising purposes. This included signed shirts, footballs, pennants and photographs to charities and organisations to support their fundraising events. In total this helped to raise over £172,000 for more than 1,157 charitable causes. Alongside our partners we have also donated 2,682 match tickets to our partner schools and projects as well as to fans in need of support at difficult times.

## DREAM DAY AND HOSPITAL VISITS

We are committed to providing once-in-a-lifetime experiences for fans who have endured particularly difficult times. We hosted Dream Days for fans with life-limiting and serious illnesses at the Carrington training complex, with a total of 29 guests across two events during the season. Those attending got to meet their heroes and watch a men's team training session, creating special memories for young people and their families.

Honouring an annual tradition, members of the men's and women's teams also visited Royal Manchester Children's Hospital and The Christie Palatine Treatment Centre at Christmas, meeting families and spreading some festive joy for those experiencing a different kind of Christmas.

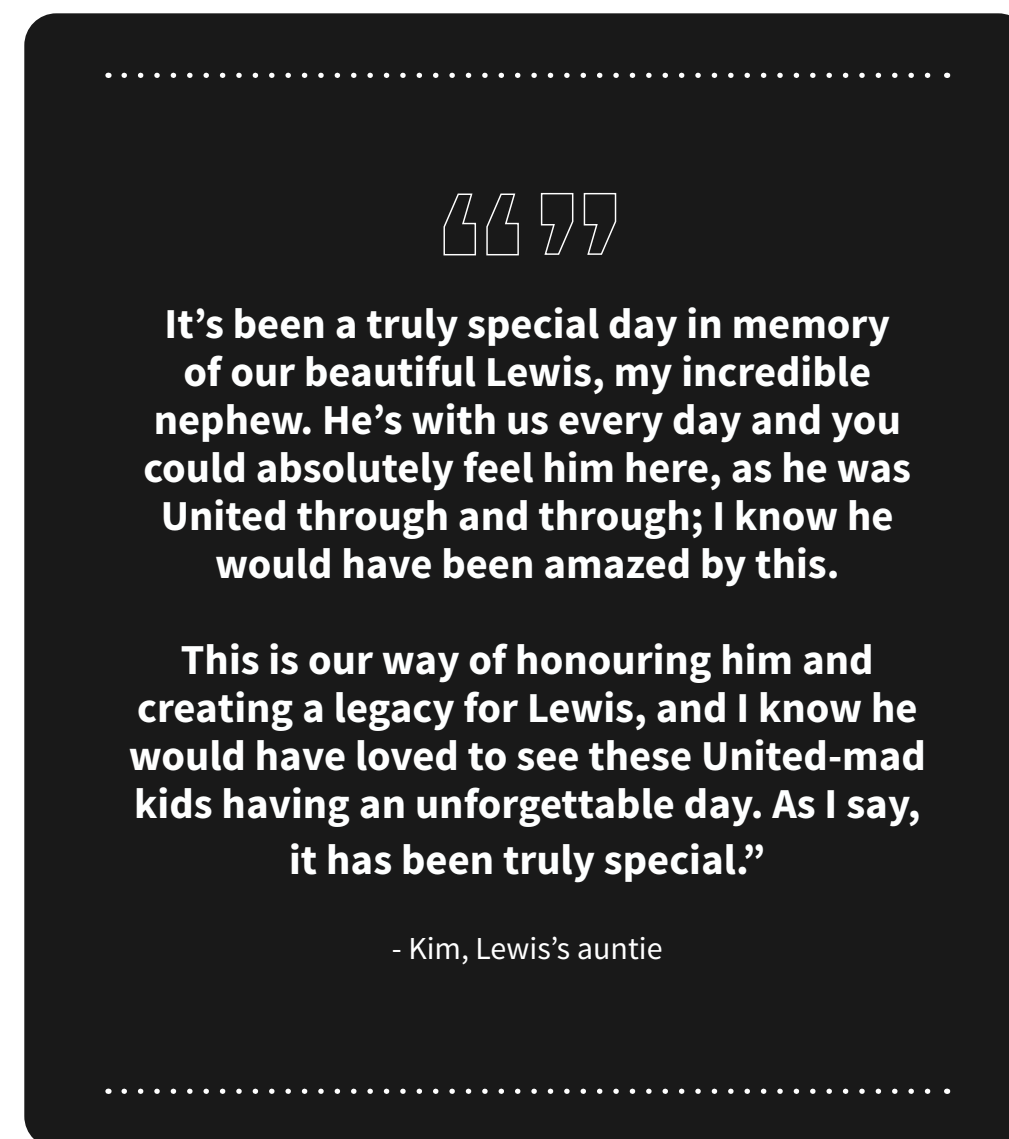


## LEGACY GIVING

We are honoured to receive generous donations from supporters through in-memory giving, where supporters or their loved ones decide to leave a legacy by contributing to our community work. This season we received over £11,000 in such donations.

In August, United's historic training ground, The Cliff, played host to a very poignant event. Lewis Roberts from Norfolk was a huge United fan hailing from a family of passionate Reds. Earlier this year, Lewis tragically lost his life in a car accident, and those closest to him wanted to do something to honour his life and his love of United.

In an incredible act of kindness, his family decided to donate funds raised at his funeral to the Foundation, a generous act acknowledged with a tournament played in his name.



## WINTER GIVING: SUPPORTING FAMILIES IN NEED

For the third consecutive year, the Foundation committed to a winter giving campaign, providing young people from our partner schools with warm items and support, and instigating a community effort to help those experiencing hardship during the winter months.

The widespread campaign aimed to provide a solution for challenges faced by young people and families, such as rising fuel costs and poverty. Meanwhile, through our third annual Old Trafford Sleep Out, the Foundation partnered with charity Centrepont to raise awareness of another important issue: youth homelessness. The community-focused campaign included:

- £100,000 invested by the Foundation to provide 9,000 blankets to young people and families
- 2,250 coats donated by Manchester United fans at an appeal during men's and women's matchdays
- Over 400 gifts of toys were distributed to children who would otherwise not have received a festive gift, thanks to donations by Manchester United staff and players, as well as toys purchased using over £5,650 raised from a 'Warm-Up' event at Old Trafford. This event was supported by 340 fans from across 32 international Supporters' Clubs.
- Over £34,000 raised for vulnerable young people at the Old Trafford Sleep Out, supporting the Foundation and youth homelessness charity, Centrepont.
