Easter Resurrection Eggs

What you'll need:

- 12 plastic eggs
- Print out Resurrection Egg squares (on card stock if you have some). Cut only the squares needed.
- An egg carton, basket or container for storage.
- A small leaf to represent a palm branch at Jesus' triumphal entry – or the donkey square.
- 3 quarters/dimes to represent the 30 pieces of silver that Judas Iscariot received.
- Make an origami cup (use a 4x4 piece of paper), <u>https://youtu.be/vK78DLftLVQ</u> or cup and bread square to represent a cup at the Last Supper.
- Roll a tiny piece of paper into a scroll and tie with string or ribbon, or the prayer square to represent Jesus' prayer in the garden.
- A piece of leather or thick fabric to represent the soldiers whipping Jesus.
- Cut out the Crown of Thorns square to represent the crown of thorns.
- 2 nails (any size will do) to represent the nails and the cross, or the cross picture on cardstock.
- Dice (1 or 2) to represent the soldiers casting lots for Jesus' clothes.
- A toothpick with one end broken off to represent the spear piercing Jesus' side.
- A piece of cheesecloth or thin fabric to represent Joseph wrapping Jesus in clean linen cloth.

- A rock to represent the stone rolled in front of the tomb.
- Sharpie to number eggs 1 thru 12. 12 is the Empty Clear egg.
- Print and cut out Easter Story Cards (on card stock if you have some). These cards are companion cards and do not go into the eggs.
- Put items in eggs according to the Easter Story Cards:
 1-Donkey, 2-Coins, 3-Cup,


4-Praying, 5-Whip, 6-Crown, 7-Nails, 8-Dice

9-Spear, 10-Linen, 11-Stone, 12-Empty

Make a game of learning with your kit.


- Open each egg as you or your children read the cards































Resurrection Eggs

I. Bible

The Bible tells us the Easter story. The story is in the books of Matthew, Mark, Luke, and John.

2. Donkey

Jesus rode into Jerusalem on a donkey. Luke 19:28-35

3. Cup and Bread

Jesus ate the Last Supper with his 12 disciples. Matthew 26:26-29

4. Prayer

Jesus prayed in the garden of Gethsemane. Matthew 26:36-40

5. Sword

The guards came to arrest Jesus. Matthew 26:47-50

6. Crown of Thorns

The soldiers put a crown of thorns on Jesus's head. Matthew 27:27-30

7. Cross

Jesus died on a cross. Matthew 27:50

8. Rock

A large stone was rolled in front of the tomb opening. Matthew 27:65-66

9. Three

Three days after Jesus had died, some women went to the tomb. Matthew 28:1-4

10. Angel

The rock had been rolled away and an angel of God was sitting on the stone. Matthew 28:1-4

II. Empty

Jesus wasn't in the tomb. Matthew 28:5-9

12. Risen

Jesus had risen from the dead and was alive. Matthew 28:5-9



Supplies:

12 plastic Easter Eggs per student 1 egg carton per student A copy of the card explanations (pg. 2) A copy of the cards (pg. 1)

Directions:

Give each child a set of mini cards and 12 eggs. As you read the card explanations, have your students place the matching card into his/her eggs. Place the eggs into the egg cartons in the correct order (you may want to label the carton and eggs ahead of time). Send home the explanation page with each child's set of eggs so he/she can retell the resurrection story at home. Option: Cut the explanations into strips and put them into each egg with the matching pictures.
