Working with non-profit Funds and Trusts, who implement strategic initiatives and projects in each region, we remain true to our fundamental conservation principles and our goal to create exceptional experiences driven by purpose.

The work done by these Funds and Trusts is guided by a goal of restoring, protecting, and ultimately expanding the biodiversity of the ecosystems that make up our reserves and concessions. Our model of sustainable ecotourism is designed to support and further these initiatives.

THE MALILANGWE TRUST

In Zimbabwe, Singita partners with The Malilangwe Trust, a Zimbabwean non-profit organization focused on harmonizing biodiversity conservation, community development and commercial ecotourism. The trust carries out large scale programmes across various pillars of conservation - from wildlife management and protection, and reserve and ecosystem maintenance, to the promotion of sustainable ecotourism practices and uplifting community development projects within the 130,000 acre Malilangwe Reserve (in which Singita Pamushana Lodge is situated).

WELCOME TO Singita Pamushana Lodge

Perched on a sandstone ridge within the 130,000 acre Malilangwe Wildlife Reserve in Zimbabwe's remote southeast, overlooking the Malilangwe Dam and expansive bushveld below, Singita Pamushana.

Inspired by the heritage and history of this region, Singita Pamushana has been designed to echo the dynamism and warmth of Zimbabwe's people and culture. This forest-like lodge with its rough-hewn architecture is inspired by the culture of the local Shangaan people who have lived in the region for thousands of years. Remote and intimate, it's made up of only eight suites (each with its own plunge pool) that draw inspiration from the region in both its traditional thatch and stonework architecture and vibrant interiors.

The reserve's abundant wildlife and exclusivity - accessible only to Singita guests - allows for a truly one-of-a-kind wilderness experience. Guests can immerse themselves in nature on twice-daily game drives, bush walks, sundowner boat cruises, excursions to rock art sites and more.



Our location



LOCATION OF MALILANGWE WILDLIFE RESERVE [A]

The Malilangwe Wildlife Reserve is set on 130,000 acres of wilderness in the southeastern corner of Zimbabwe, bordering the Gonarezhou National Park. Malilangwe remains virtually untouched by humankind and occupies a key position in an area that is potentially one of Africa’s largest bio-refuges. The vegetation on the ridges and rocky outcrops is characterized by flat-topped Mountain Acacia woodlands and ironwood thickets. The area is home to hundreds of baobab trees and more than 500 bird species, including many raptors.

LOCATION OF SINGITA PAMUSHANA LODGE [B]

Singita Pamushana Lodge is set amongst towering trees overlooking a lake of 1,500 acres in the remote reaches of the pristine Malilangwe Wildlife Reserve. Beyond the lodge, hundreds of baobab trees punctuate the untouched wilderness of ridges, outcrops, ironwood and Mountain Acacia woodlands which are home to a great variety of rare and abundant wildlife, as well as hundreds of bird species and ancient rock paintings.





Accommodation

Singita Pamushana Lodge has eight suites in total, each with its own private plunge pool.

- Fishing or sunset cruises on the Malilangwe Dam, a unique way to appreciate the landscape with its abundant animal and birdlife
- Spending time in our photographic hide where you are able to capture incredible perspectives of wildlife unobserved
- Join in a community visit to experience local Shangaan culture and learn about the positive impact that tourism has made in the region
- Day trip to Gonarezhou National Park and Great Zimbabwe to explore more of the area





A seamless stay

Your every comfort is considered while in our care. Our amenities cater to every practical, physical and dietary need.

- Wellness treatments available at the treatment rooms or in your suite
- Main lodge infinity swimming pool (in addition to private suite pools)

- Complimentary Wifi. Note that due to the remote nature of the location of the property, this connection can at times be slow or intermittent
- Mobile cellular signal dependent on network and area coverage
- Plug converters are available and hairdryers are supplied in each suite. The electricity supply is 220V AC
- Tailormade activities for children and families. In the interest of safety, childrens' participation in certain game activities will be at the discretion of your Field Guide
- Dietary needs or restrictions are fully catered to and Kosher or Halaal food is available. Please book this in advance





Preparing for your journey

BE GUIDED BY THE WEATHER:

OCTOBER – APRIL:

Shorts and lightweight shirts, with a warm jersey or sweater and jacket for the cooler early morning and evening temperatures.

MAY – SEPTEMBER:

Lightweight clothing with a very warm parker or windbreaker jacket for the cold mornings and evenings.

PACKING NOTES TO ENSURE A COMFORTABLE SAFARI EXPERIENCE:

- Natural, lightweight fabrics in neutral colours (green, khaki and grey) are recommended for bush walks and game drives in order to blend in to the landscape and remain inconspicuous to wildlife
- Layering items of clothing is recommended to navigate the fluctuations in temperature between the cool early mornings and evenings and midday heat
- No formal wear is required at our lodges
- Waterproof ponchos are provided in the case of rain
- Comfortable walking or track shoes, or hiking boots are advised for walks, with sandals sufficient for wear around the lodge
- Bring a bathing suit, sunhat, sunglasses and sunblock
- Mosquito repellent
- Camera, video camera, chargers, and additional memory cards (binocular are provided in the suites)

HEALTH REQUIREMENTS

Singita Pamushana Lodge is situated in a malaria-risk area; it is therefore essential that you consult your medical practitioner regarding anti-malaria requirements prior to your visit.

SINGITA MALILANGWE

Weather and climate

Southern Africa is a year-round destination. Traditionally, the dry winter months, which fall between April and October, are considered best for game viewing due to the sparser vegetation, shorter grass and the improved visibility this provides. Additionally, the scarcity of water means game concentrates around the diminishing drinking resources.

Annual rainfall, usually in the form of afternoon thundershowers that are typically short-lived, occur between December and March. During this part of the year, at the start of the rainy season, many species give birth to their young (due to the abundance of food) and there is a proliferation of newborn wildlife.

The journey

BY AIR

We can arrange scheduled flights or private charters

- Chartered flights can land at Lonestar airstrip, 12 minutes from the lodge. Guests are collected by Singita staff and transported to the lodge in a game vehicle
- Private aircraft pilots land at their own risk at Lonestar airstrip and are advised to broadcast their flight plan on frequency 118.700 MHz
- The Federal Air scheduled flight between Buffalo Range International Airport and OR Tambo International Airport in Johannesburg is currently available on Mondays and Thursdays only (a minimum booking of three nights' accommodation at our lodge is necessary when selecting this option)
- Flight duration is approximately 1 hour 45 minutes and Buffalo Range is located 45 minutes from the lodge
- On scheduled flights, luggage is restricted to soft-sided bags with a maximum weight of 20kg (40lb) for checked luggage and 5kg (11lb) for hand luggage
- Private aircraft pilots land at their own risk at Lonestar airstrip and are advised to broadcast their flight plan on frequency 118.700 MHz . (Latitude 21°03'40" S Longitude 31°53'22" E Elevation 1,205 ft; landing strip surface: gravel; length of landing strip: 1,000m)
- From South Africa, guests need to clear customs at Buffalo Range

BY ROAD

- From Harare, the lodge is approximately a 6-hour drive
- From Johannesburg the lodge is approximately 12-hour drive

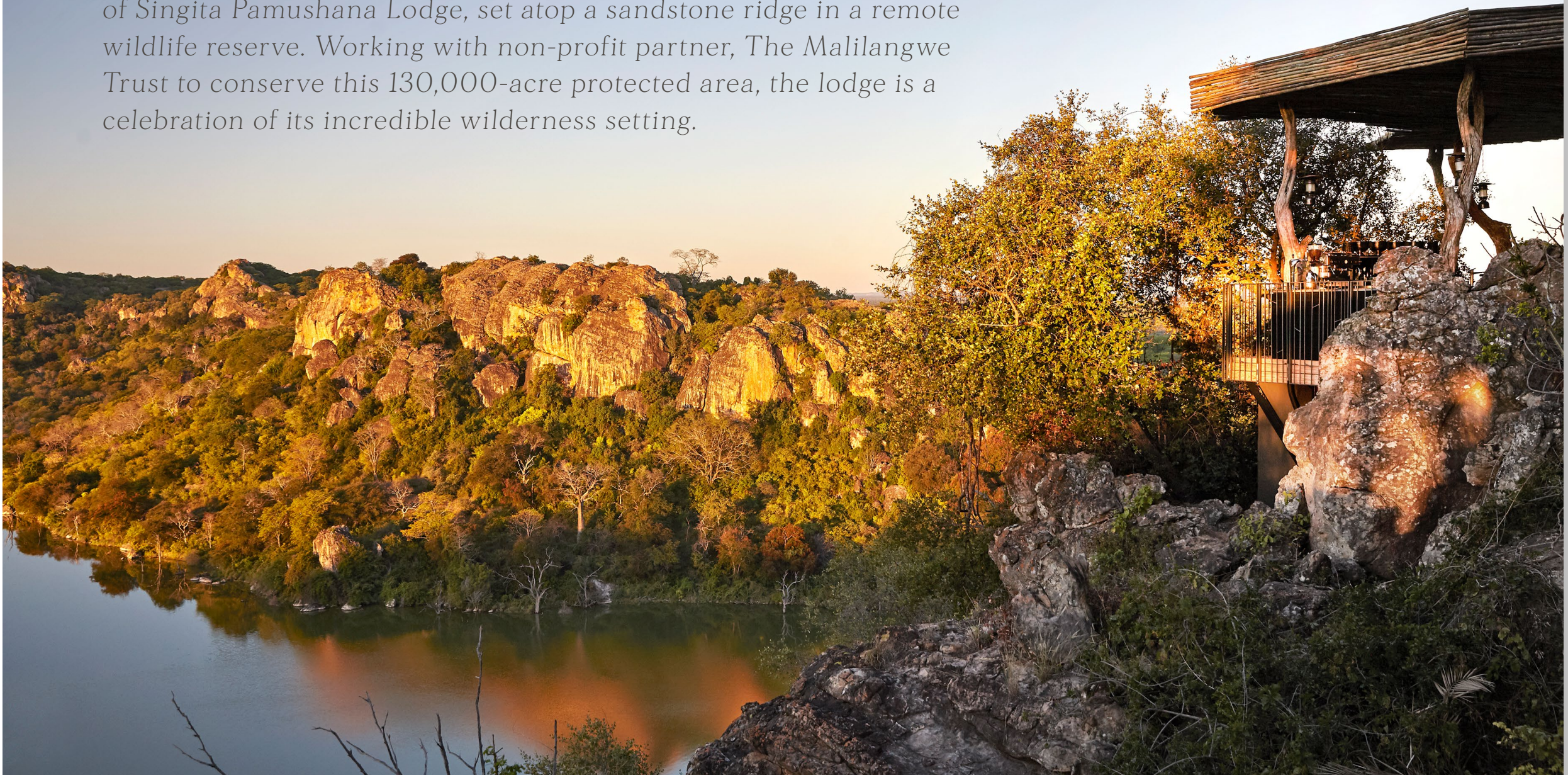
