In 1999, Crossroads was meeting in a middle school in the Hyde Park neighborhood of Cincinnati. There were about 600 seats. We'd been a church for 3 years and were running out of room. It turns out creating a place for our friends who "had given up on church, but not on God" resonated with people.

At that time, an old building supply store (Home Quarters) was going out of business just a few blocks away. Trying to purchase that building was a huge investment and a big risk. But the faithful people at Crossroads had seen enough of their friends coming to know Jesus that they jumped at the opportunity. Our first-ever building campaign kicked into gear. Despite being a relatively small community, people gave sacrificially and God-through a set of multiple miracle circumstances-honored that sacrifice. We secured 3500 Madison Road in Cincinnati, and it became our first permanent location.

THE NEED

Our Dayton site has experienced exponential growth since returning to weekly services last May. Physical attendance has nearly doubled. In the last four months alone, Dayton has seen a 21% increase, with a high of 616 people on Easter weekend. This all happened while meeting in a temporary location for the last four years with dozens of volunteers setting up and tearing down every single weekend. Without a larger, permanent place of our own, there's a limit to how many of our friends and neighbors we can reach. With a permanent, fully-renovated site designed for actual ministry, we can firmly establish Crossroads in the Dayton area and offer the support, services, and outreach we are being called to provide.

> Our plan is to renovate the former Sears location of the Dayton Mall to offer a highly versatile space including a state-of-the-art Auditorium, Kids' Club, Student Section, Meeting Rooms, and Atrium 2.0 (a new model of atrium for Crossroads). This renovated space can accommodate our site to serve over 4,000 attendees.

While we are still actively examining different plans, the current total construction cost is estimated to be \$18 million. The larger Crossroads Church has already purchased the building and will be paying all the operating costs for Crossroads Dayton for the next three years (through Dec 31, 2025), allowing every dollar given by our community over the next three years to go directly to the new building. Our generosity will dictate what we do and how fast we do it.
