VIA GIULIA



Beginning with an ivy-draped arch designed by Michelangelo, Via Giulia is a cobbled street in Rome lined end to end with churches and historic palazzo. Often contrasted with the vibrant Via del Corso, this picturesque lane invites a contemplative stroll. Yabu Pushelberg's design shares the same intention as Michelangelo's vision for the via—an escape from the rhythms of modern life, creating moments of genuine connection.



VIA DEL CORSO



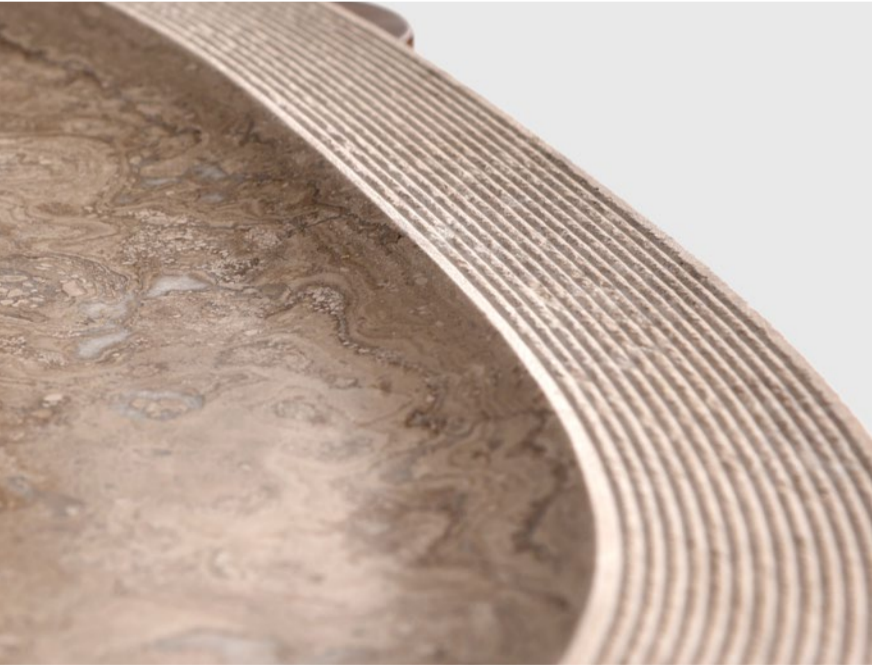
Via del Corso is the centre of life in historical Rome. Meeting at the Piazza Venezia with its three-sided roundabout and monumental churches, "the Corso" is impressive. Yabu Pushelberg's lounge chair has the same imposing profile as the via, balanced by soft curves and a lightness from its floating back.



PRAIA DA GRANJA



A preferred summer destination for Europe's well-heeled travellers, Portugal's Praia da Granja brings together the best of the coastline. Embraced by rugged cliffs and bordered by seaside promenades, the Praia offers a serene seaside escape. The ocean stairs leading to the Atlantic reflect the wide radius and rippled detail of Sebastian Herkner's design.



SANDY COVE

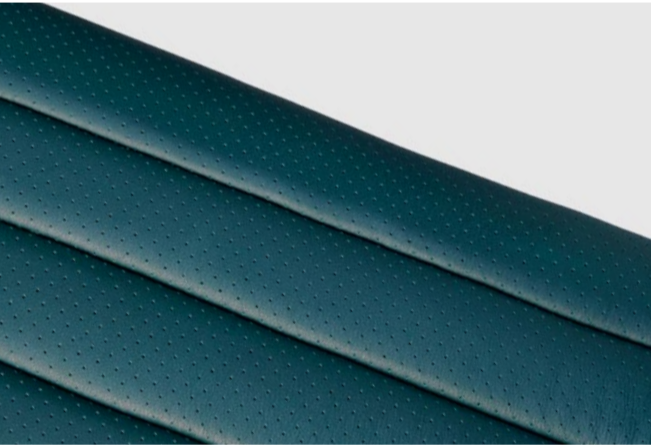




Composed of jutting sea-cliff footpaths and clapboard houses, the offshore of Newfoundland and Labrador's Fogo Island is set against a striking coastline. The design of Sebastian Herkner's gathering place mimics the Cove's curved geography.

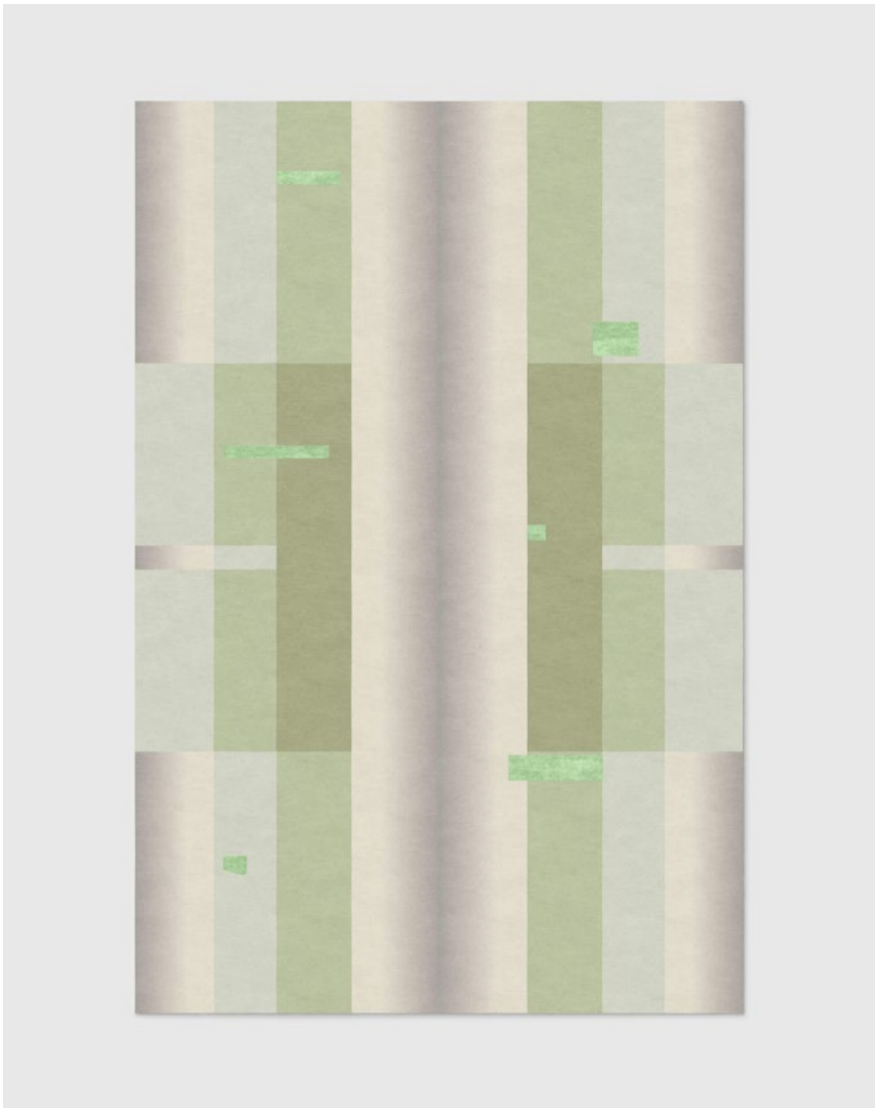


ALEXANDER STREET



Striking an emotional connection for automotive enthusiasts, the Alexander Street design by Philippe Malouin is certain to win a place in future Concours d'Elegance. The perforated leather, lines, and ribs are evocative of the iconic leather seats of sports cars from the 20th century that the designer grew up with on Alexander Street in Montreal. This bench balances nostalgia with modernity.

FUJI-MICHI



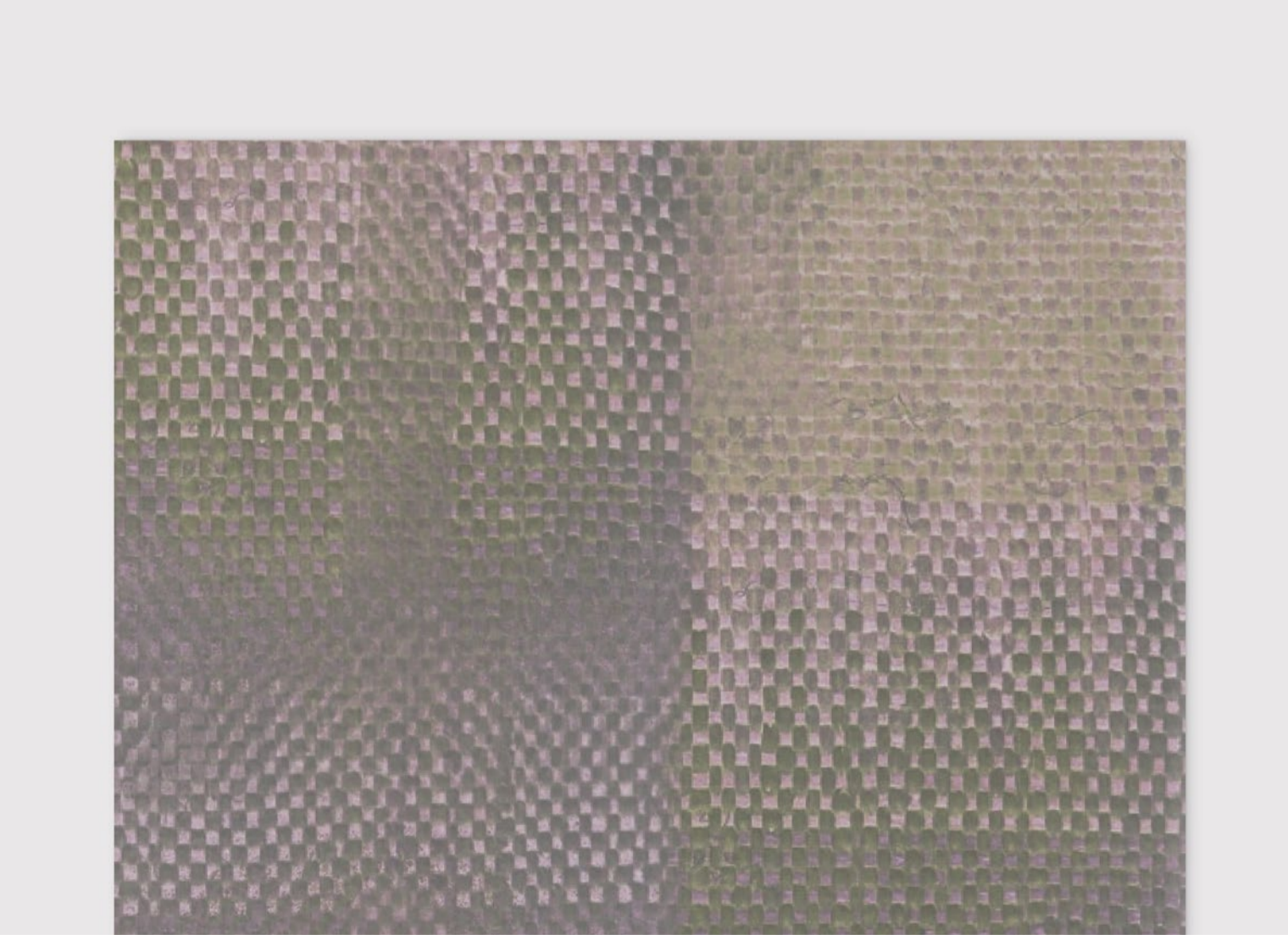
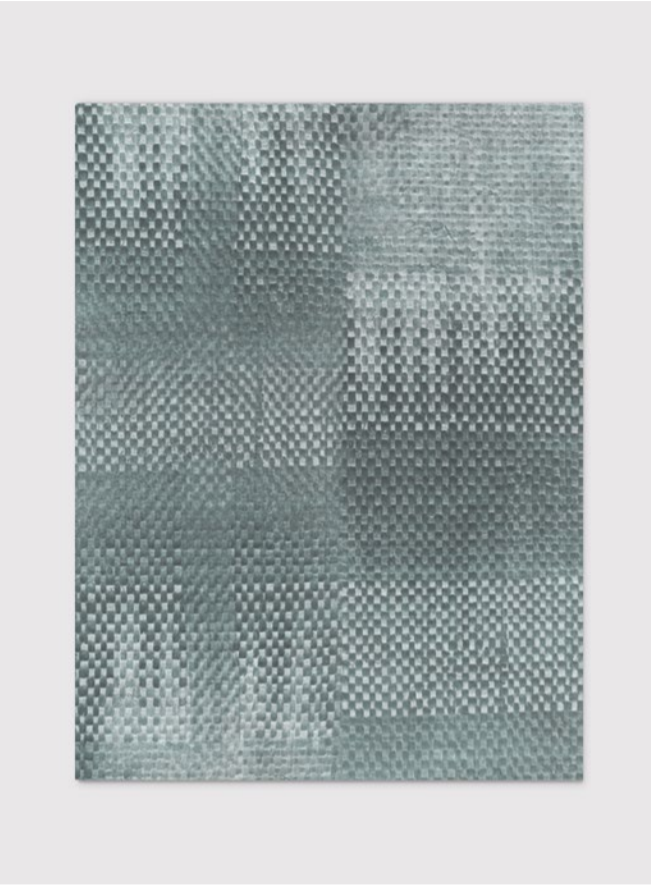
Fuji-michi, otherwise known as Honcho Street, nestled at the base of Mount Fuji, offers picturesque views of the iconic mountain. Historically lined with hataya weaving shops, it served as a vital route for regional fabric trade. Yabu Pushelberg's magnified design pays homage to the intricate patterns of traditional Japanese woven textiles.



HONCHO STREET



Honcho Street, otherwise known as Fuji-michi, runs through "The Weaving City" of Fujiyoshida, Japan, connecting the capital of the country's textile industry to Mount Fuji. Yabu Pushelberg's design is an ode to the woven patterns of traditional Japanese textiles, reworked and magnified.



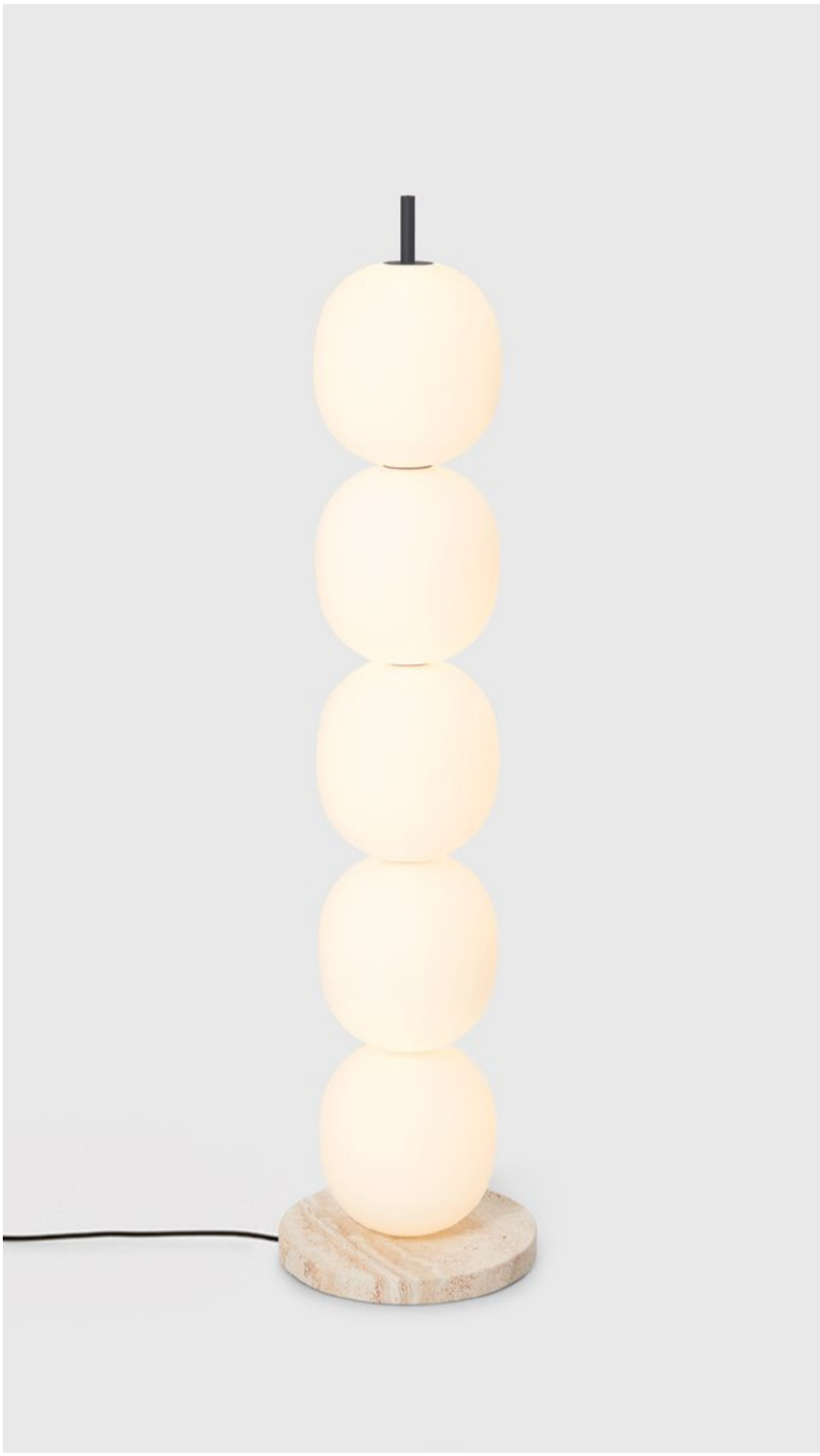
RUE DE BABYLONE



Framed by 19th century Parisian architecture, the Rue de Babylone guides both locals and tourists through the most celebrated and unassuming segments of Paris. Referencing the angles and silhouettes of the rue, Christophe Delcourt's design subtly emulates the stature of the French capital.

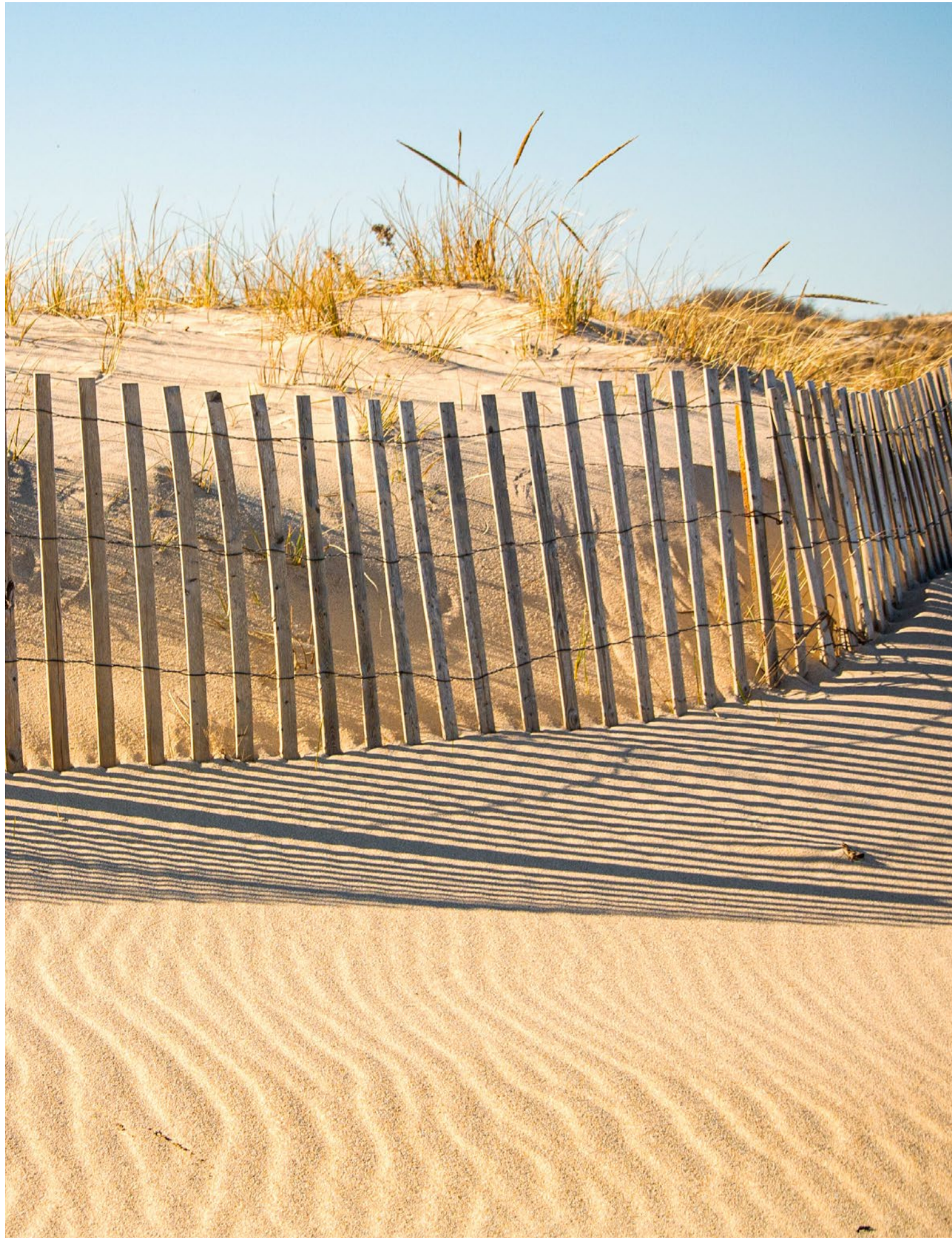


MAINKAI



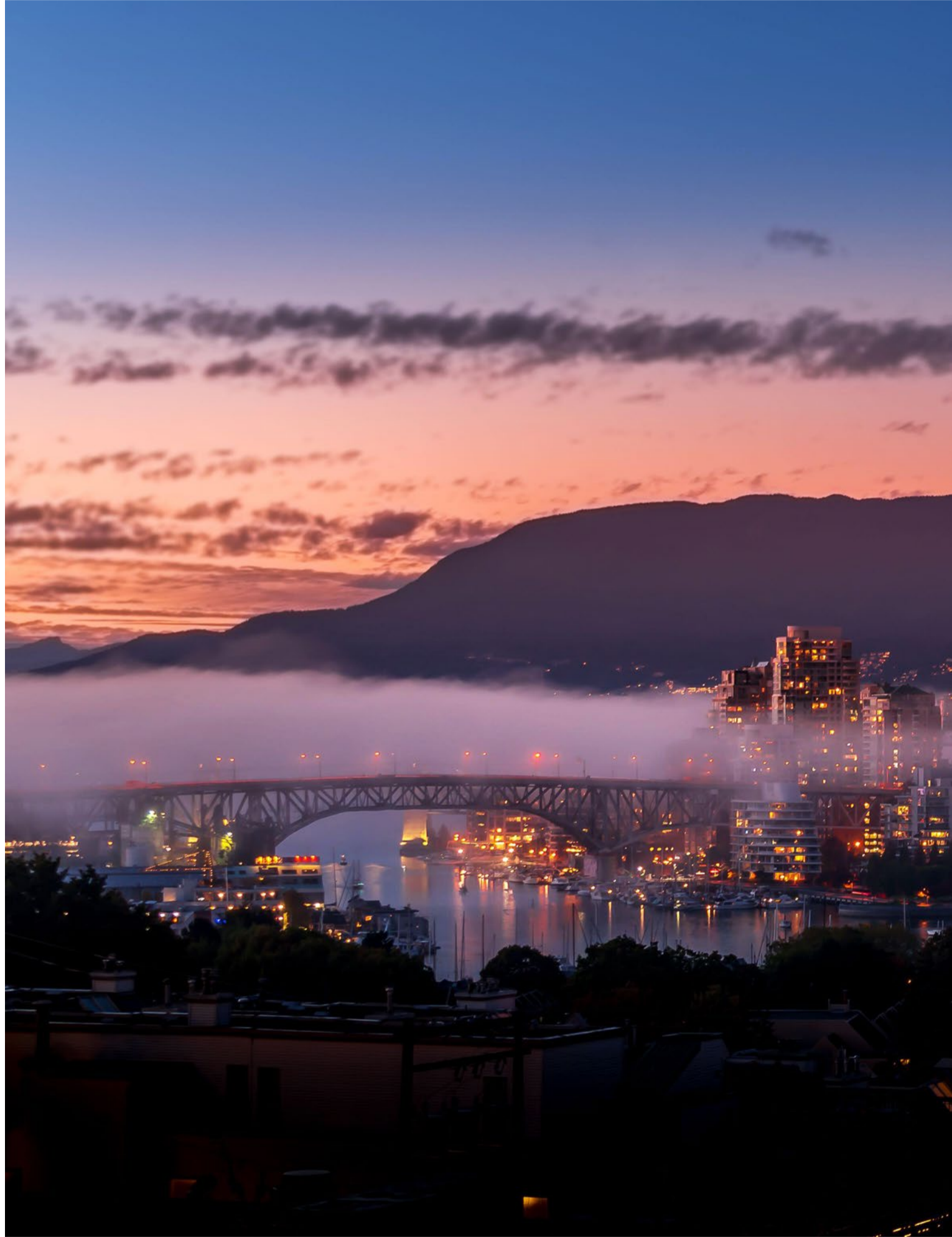
Mainkai or Main River Quay in English, is a riverside boulevard in Frankfurt, Germany. The spherical fishing floats and mooring buoys, bobbing nightly along the river with an ethereal glow, inspired Sebastian Herkner's design.

GIN LANE



A signature address in the Hamptons, the “gin” in Gin Lane does not actually imply an alcoholic spirit, but an Old English term for grazing area. While Yabu Pushelberg’s design is intended to support libation, it also reflects the simplicity and restrained demeanor of the original residents, hardworking New Yorkers.

GRANVILLE BRIDGE



The soft upholstery of Sebastian Herkner's Granville Bridge chairs reflect the serene grey skies of Vancouver, while the hardwood structure imitates the suspension bridge.



JINBAO STREET



A short walk from China's ancient Forbidden City, Jinbao is Beijing's modern high-street with the world's finest boutiques. Inspired by inventive Chinese architecture, Yabu Pushelberg's design seamlessly blends minimalism with boldness.

BADLANDS



The Badlands of South Dakota showcase a rugged landscape carved by wind and water over thousands of years, boasting geological formations and vibrant colors. Its fossil-rich terrain preserves the history of prehistoric creatures and ecosystems. Sebastian Herkner's rug design is reminiscent of the sedimentary layers and intricate patterns mirroring the dynamic contours of the Badlands' rugged landscape.



SURFSIDE DRIVE





Situated between the town and coast, Surfside Drive curves to follow the natural contours of Nantucket's harbour. Workshop/APD's design emphasizes sustainable material choices which include pressed recycled coffee grounds.



WYNWOOD



Synonymous with Wynwood's vibrant murals, Sebastian Herkner's design disguises abstraction. The visual language of the carved shapes, forms, and lines balance spontaneity and structure.



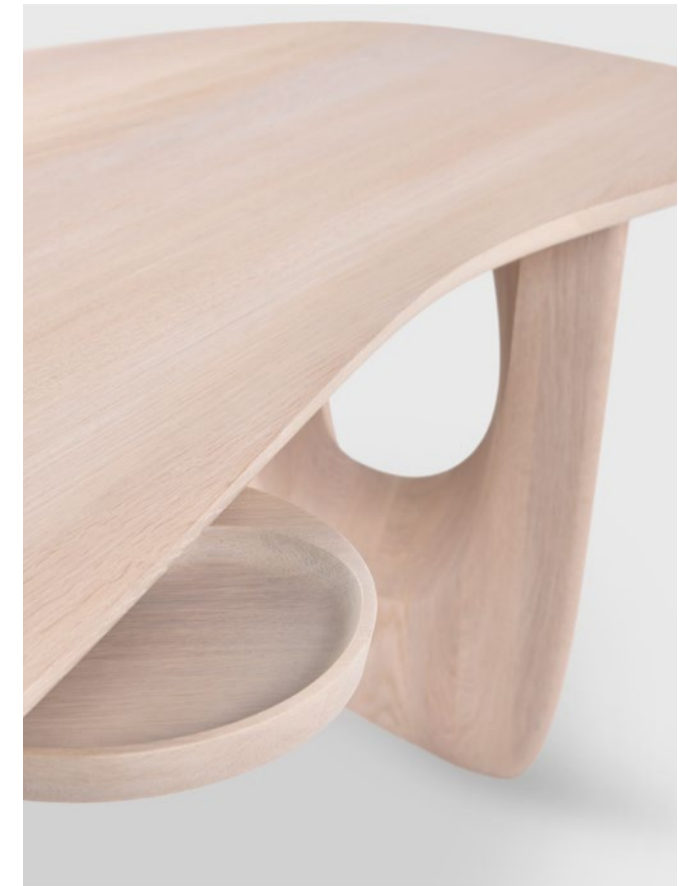
DARLING POINT



Curving its way through Eastern Sydney, Darling Point is home to some of the city's most impressive residences and vistas. The lithe lines and curved wood of Yabu Pushelberg's design are inspired by the docks that hover above the water and the shoreline's irregular beveled edges sculpted by the tides.

SAVIGNYPLATZ



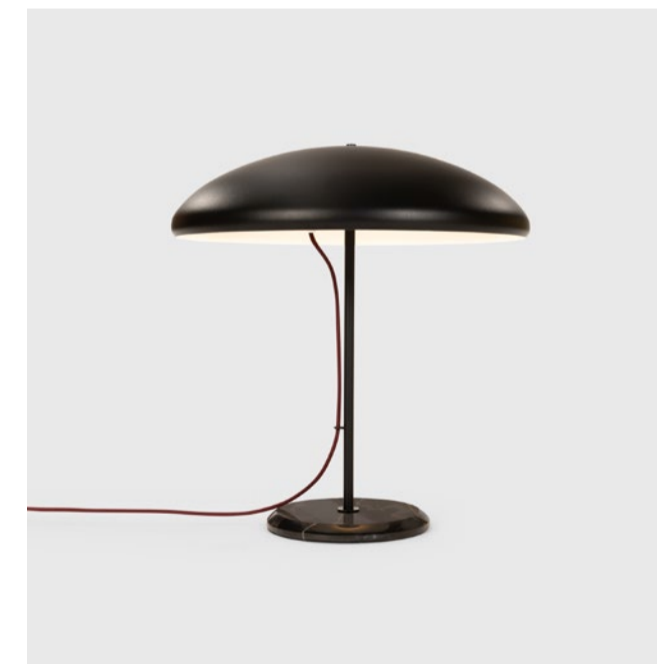


Offering a bucolic escape, Savignyplatz is a secluded park in the heart of Berlin's city square. People from different parts of the city are connected by the asymmetrical streets leading to the park. Imbuing sentiments of discovery, the Savignyplatz is designed to be a meeting place. With sculptural edges, compact twisted forms, and stretching points, Sebastian Herkner's table bears a resemblance to the abstractions of Henry Moore's bronze sculptures.

TAKAYAMA



Takayama, an Edo-era town in Japan's mountainous Gifu Prefecture, is famed for ukai fishing. The Fishermen employ a 1300-year-old technique using trained cormorant birds. The birds swoop in and catch fish illuminated by the light of burning baskets hung on rods over the edge of boats. The arc of the Takayama console lamp by Yabu Pushelberg echoes the form of the fisherman's friend.



RUA IPANEMA



From Oscar Niemeyer's architecture to the signature design of its sidewalks along Rua Ipanema, Rio de Janeiro trades in curves. The Rua Ipanema lounge chair by Yabu Pushelberg has a sultry form on a swivelling base that embraces the samba and relaxed elegance of Brazil.

RUA LEBLON



Rua Leblon's landscape evolves from cityscape to rolling waves, referencing two neighbouring Brazilian landmarks in Yabu Pushelberg's smaller expression of the Rua Ipanema lounge chair.

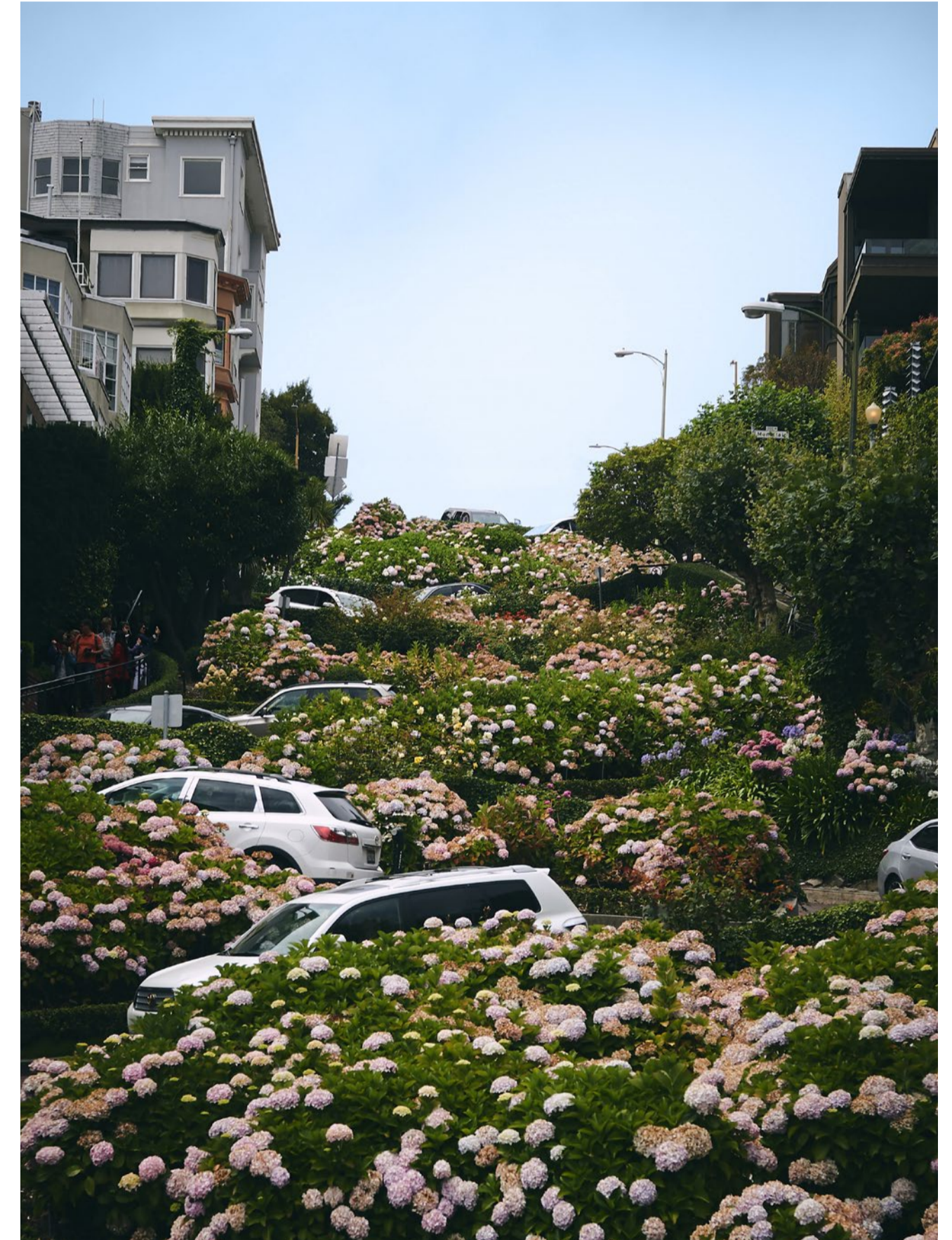


LOMBARD STREET





Lombard Street is famous for a steep one-block section with eight hairpin turns in San Francisco's Russian Hill, designed to help residents descend the hill gracefully. The Lombard Street Sofa by Yabu Pushelberg references the beautifully structured curves and formality of the street, providing both comfort and poise for those who sit.



EL RAVAL



The El Raval neighbourhood in Barcelona is a meeting point for multitudes. Close to the old port, the area was also informally known as Barri Xinès or "Chinatown" in the past, but today people from all parts call it home. Yabu Pushelberg's diverse inspiration references from as many places as the people who meet in its namesake neighbourhood.



PARK PLACE



The strong simple lines of Yabu Pushelberg's Park Place design are reminiscent of the skyscrapers that tower above Manhattan.



RUA DAS PEDRAS



On the most charming street in Búzios, Rua das Pedras traces the ocean peninsula, adjoining cobbled city streets with azure waters and white sand. Printing Brazilian style. Simone Coste's design incorporates shapes inspired by the silhouettes of the shoreline, blending man-made and natural formations.



BOND STREET



Bond Street, an iconic fashion and fine art destination reflects the dual personalities of London. On one side it has elegance, polish, and formality, and on the other, a swinging embrace of eccentricity and a modern sensibility. The Bond Street stool by Yabu Pushelberg has a dual personality with a structured architectural form that comes alive in daring fabrics.



LADDER STREET



The stone steps of Ladder Street help Hong Kong residents traverse the Sheung Wan District towards Victoria Peak. The street itself consists almost entirely of stairs, with streets branching off the stairs full of antique and curiosity shops. The strength, and simple lines Yabu Pushelberg is known for, ensure you'll continue to enjoy it as a place for your found treasures for decades to come.

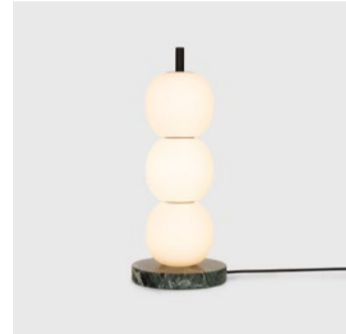

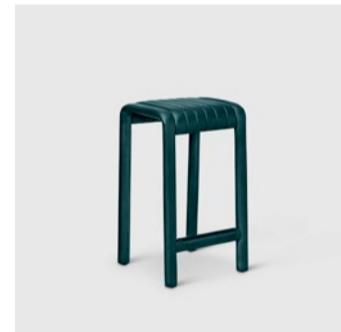

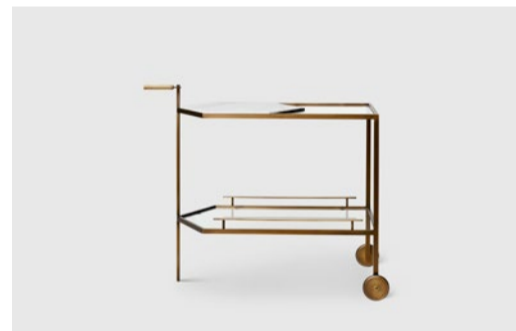
TAKAYAMA CONSOLE LAMP
